Neville's involvement in Santa's special ride started way back, when Kevin Priess of Taillem Bend, approached him about building a permanent ride for the big man's seasonal visit.

"We had a running HJ Holden Ute in the yard, the roof was badly rusted out, so we just cut it off and Kevin took the ute away for a green paint spruce up and a little remodelling, in an attempt to meet strict North Pole international traffic regulations."

With costs of Northern Hemisphere livestock freight escalating, Taillem Bend Music Hall Props/Painter, Roger Everad of Taillem Bend, corresponded with Santa HQ to seek permission to use prop kangaroos (Boomers) in place of live Reindeer - with permission granted, Roger and Kevin had the Boomers mounted onto the float.

Years later, Darren and Murray Lutz of Taillem Bend refashioned the float to meet the ever changing and demanding North Pole OH&S regulations - it was painted blue!

The Changing Face of Taillem Bend #59

This month we look at the history of the Taillem Bend Golf Club as recorded over the years by Nigel Kiddie and presented to me by club member, Lois Jaensch. As the story is so lengthy I will present in two parts I am sure you will find it very interesting.

Unfortunately there are no written records of the Taillem Bend Golf Club prior to 1960. However some people who were members prior to 1960 have contributed to this article.

According to the club's oldest member Mr. Sid Phillips (deceased), who incidentally was awarded Life Membership in 1950. When he came to Taillem Bend in 1927, the club was formed on the site which is now the racecourse. This is collaborated by Mr. Howard (Barney) Hattam. The club moved to its present site not long after 1924. At that time the course was a treeless paddock of rock, horehound and onion weed.

It was the town's sporting oval as well. Football was played on Saturday and Golf Sunday as well as cricket in the summer (The pitch remains between the 1st and 9th fairways). As "Barney" recalls from his football days of the 20s and 30s, it was referred to as "Gravel Rash Oval".

The Course also happened to be the town compound. People could keep their cows and horses on the course for a fee of one pound per year.

This led to a problem with animal droppings, which led to such local rules as "if a ball lands in animal droppings, it may be lifted, cleaned and dropped" – without penalty we presume. Besides having to contend with snakes, rabbits and their burrows and because animals roamed the course, wire fencing was placed around the scrapes.



If you happened to hit the wire you were allowed to replay the shot without penalty.

Sid remembers having trouble with one lot of slag the club got from Port Pirie, just before the Second World War. It kept disappearing! After a few lots went missing Sid decided to be night watchman and catch the culprits. It was discovered that the slag in the 1930s wasn't refined to the extent that it is today, therefore, it still contained a significant amount of silver. The culprits had decided to do a bit of their own refining to extract the remaining silver.

After the war, the golf club had the whole area to themselves. Jaensch Park was donated to the town and the football boys played there until 1946, when they came back for two years, after having some disagreement with whoever ran the town oval at the time.

During this period and into the 50s the fairways were maintained by digging out the horehound and onion weed by shovel.

It wasn't until the mid 50s that the club purchased its first mower, a hand steered cutter with 3' cut. You can imagine how long it would take to mow a fairway by walking up and down cutting 3 feet at a time. No doubt, Rolly Dawson remembers this period well.

Bruce Lynn recalls how the horehound was so thick during the 50s (in the car park) that if your ball landed in it, it was automatically declared lost.

In the late 50s, a horse drawn 3-linkage cutter was purchased from the Riverside Golf Club for 100 pounds. It proved troublesome, however.

During the mid 50s, membership fell to only 20 members and at one stage, only six players remained; Max Mathieson, Lawry Rawlinson, Merv Gould, Murray Spears, Bruce Lynn and Doug Braddock. At this stage the club nearly folded up, we are told.

The first club house was a little RED TIN SHED, with no water, power or conveniences, but, as Doug Braddock recalls, many a good time was had there, especially after the club obtained a licence to consume beer.

In 1961, a verandah was built onto the "Old Red Shed", as it became affectionately known in later years, even though it was painted white by then.

That same year, application was made to ETSA for the connection of power.

1961 was also the year that Doug Braddock commenced planting trees on the course; he placed a four gallon tin around each, so that rabbits would not eat them.

An Ashville councilor saw them and demanded that the trees be pulled out, as the club hadn't got permission to plant them. Doug won however.

Later on when the trees were two feet high, somebody drove a flock of sheep through the course. They ate most of the trees.

When the surviving trees were about 5 feet tall the committee decided to burn the weeds on the course. Doug got angry about this, but they went ahead anyway.

The fire got out of control and burnt most of the

trees down to about 12". At this stage he vowed to give up, but fortunately for the club, didn't.

It must be remembered that the course had no water. Doug did all the watering by handcart.

He must be truly proud to see the fruits of his labour, today.

The Volkswagen in the photograph **RIGHT**, belonged to John Hughes of the Tailem Bend Hughes family, he delivered the papers around town and beyond, in the Volkswagen, so he was either on delivery or socializing.

The interesting thing about Bruce, is from my memory he never swam without flippers.

The good news is, without them on the day, he threw caution to the wind and hit the river bank running. Pam also faced difficulty, but wisely tied her petticoat up in knots to keep her afloat.

This Month In The Garden

We're always being told to eat more fruit and vegetables and get more exercise. If the thought of donning the Lycra and heading to the gym has you reaching for the chocolate cake, what about the green gym? Get out into your garden for your daily workout. Sustainable gardening is not only good for the planet; it's good for your health.

There are more and more people using their gardens and growing fruit and vegies to help manage chronic diseases such as type 2 diabetes. Think about all the weeding, digging, mulching, planting and raking you can do in your garden. Wow, what a workout. Not only that, your sustainable garden is a great mood booster too, so it's good for your mental health as well.


Make November your month to start your green gym in your patch!

- Start your gym session by planting capsicums, chilli, cucumbers, squash, tomatoes, sweet corn, eggplant, lettuce, zucchini, rocket and squash.
- While you're at it, plant some healthy herbs. How about basil (both sweet and purple), parsley, sage, pyrethrum daisy, lemongrass, oregano, rue and marjoram. Mint is a great herb for adding to your healthy dinners and drinks, but it'll take over, so plant it in a pot to keep it contained.
- Some colour in the patch isn't only pleasing to the eye, but can help us de-stress and relax. The pollinators and other good guys will love it too. Try some nasturtium, dianthus, gerbera, verbena, snapdragons, petunias, marigolds, phlox and celosia.
- Build some muscle into you and your soil by planting green manure, try cow pea, mung bean, soy bean and millet. Next season's hungry plants will love it and you'll get a great workout when it's time to dig them in.
- Want a solid workout in your green gym? Top up your mulch on all your garden beds. Make sure you choose sustainable, low environmental impact mulch, that'll enrich your soil as it breaks down.
- The hot weather will be here before we know it, so why not make some shade cloth tents! They don't have to be elaborate, just a simple, movable structure that can be popped over

some of the more sun sensitive vegies, as the weather warms up.

- Have a good look at your grafted fruit trees throughout November – if they're sending up shoots below the graft, cut them off to avoid the root stock taking over your precious trees.
- Weeding is a great workout too, so get out there and pull them before they take over your patch.

Healthy Happenings

Menopause Carmen Bubner ND

Menopause can be a hormone hell for many women and honestly in my clinical experience no two women are alike in relation to their symptoms. Therefore the menopausal years need to be acknowledged on an individual basis.

It is important to note that adrenal depletion has an important association with issues relating to menopause. Many women experiencing low adrenal function can have major issues relating to their menopausal experience, therefore nourishing the adrenal glands at this time of life is imperative. Daily magnesium supplementation not only helps to nourish the adrenals but can also play a part in improving bone strength.

Bone mass declines during the menopausal years as bones decline in the production of new cells and pretty much ignore the presence of calcium. Calcium carbonate is a common form of calcium used in many over the counter supplements. This form is relatively non absorbable and I would advise increasing dietary calcium through eating beneficial foods that enhance bone strength. These foods include: almonds, salmon with bones, Brazil nuts, hazelnuts, black strap molasses, tahini, broccoli, sardines and green leafy vegetables.

When taking Calcium supplements they need to be in a bioavailable form and taken at night before bed.



HERBS that may help to relieve common menopausal symptoms include Sage, Wild Yam, Red Clover, Motherwort, Chaste Berry, Saw Palmetto, Licorice and Tribulus.

Avoiding or limiting sugar and processed/refined foods can also help to reduce the occurrence of hot flushes, irritability, anxiety, insomnia, depression, cramping and palpitations that are often experienced in menopause.

Community Pet Page

Thursday's Canine Column

Hello people, yep it's Thursday and Ally, where do the months go? I'm sure they go faster getting closer to Christmas!



Just to keep you on your paws (oops, we mean toes), we thought we would talk about a subject that we are all getting concerned about with the warmer weather approaching.....snakes (or as Ally would call them "SNAKES!!").

Some things that Ally and I didn't know is: Snakes aren't kind, it's just that their eyesight is poor (oops, poor), but they make up for it with the use of their tongues, which detect vibration, taste and temperature. Humans sweat and we deep pant in the hot weather, whereas a snake would cook (yuk), which is why we mainly see them in the morning or the evening. These times are the coolest for them to move around, which also applies to us for our walks.

When we do go for our walks, it tends to be our owners who over react, we tend to be just curious if something seems to move and catch our attention. Plus all the smells, sounds etc keep us busy. But in Mum and Dads head it's a "snake, snake, snake". If they moved us on calmly in another direction we (including the snake) would be none the wiser and continue our day.

Snakes aren't the type, unlike us, to want to be friends and sniff each others bottoms (wow, that would be a sight!)

They want nothing to do with us, the only reason they come close to our kennels (Ally, for mums sake lets say house) is because of the fact that they are affected by the heat and are attracted to water (well, we all are on a really hot day, aren't we?)

On some properties, a shallow bowl of water far, far away from the house, may keep them at bay, but being vigilant works best, as most of us don't have enough room to keep both us and snakes happy in the same backyard. I think snakes and dogs are in agreement on this one.

If we happen to draw your attention to something unusual in the house which turns out to be a snake, Mum and Dad, please attempt to remain calm and subtly move us off into a different, secure place for the time being.

If on further investigation you isolate a snake to one particular room (well how can it be in two places at once, Thursday?) then Mum and/or Dad, leave the room and close the door. If possible, check that the windows are closed, put towels along the bottom of the door (use a broom to push the towel if necessary) and call the snake catcher.

This basic technique to isolate the location which the snake is in, is invaluable in resolving this situation a majority of times. Three out of five times, snake catchers are unable to find the snake, because it has either moved to another part of the house, or another area outside.

If we are bitten by a snake our most worrying concern is "Mum and Dad, stay calm!", don't use a tourniquet, but a pressure bandage, which means using the bandage to put moderate pressure around the whole of the bitten limb from top to bottom. This will slow down the circulation of the venom, then off to the Vet!

Keep us calm by you staying calm, if you know where we were bitten, identify the spot if possible by marking the bandage. This will help the vet to locate the bite (after all we do have hairy legs!)

If possible take note of the snake, any description could possibly help the vet. Surprisingly the baby snakes are more dangerous, because they give all their poison.

Tailem Bend Rowing Club Shines Again

Tailem Bend Rowers Win the 25th Annual Flying Doctor Rowing Marathon

Every year in October, an 82-kilometre race is held at Wentworth, with the first two legs rowed on the Murray River. The race consists of 22 kms up stream and then 22kms back to Wentworth for a lunch break, then a further 19kms up the Darling and back again.

As a result of the removal of the Mildura weir, as well as locks 7 and 8, there was too much water volatility, therefore deeming it unsafe for the smaller class boats. The fast moving current creates eddies (little swirls) and whirl pools which greatly impact the handling of the small coxless boats.

This year, Nanette Farrel (Cox) and Harry teamed up with Symonne Wickman and Tanya Hoepner from Port Adelaide Rowing Club and Rob Ellis from Mildura Rowing Club to form a mixed coxed quad. The team going by the name of The "Twisted Blisters" rowed in the appropriately named 'Rob Ellis' boat from Mildura.

Given the conditions, this year the race consisted of four legs on the Darling River and a slightly shortened course. The pool height was down 400 mm which meant that getting the boats in and out of the river was not very easy. The first leg showed some very quick times as a result of the upstream flow of the current. Rowing back on the second leg and into a head wind was a real challenge.

The Twisted Blisters had the fastest time of the 21 crews at the lunch break, by only 90 seconds.

On the third leg, stroke of the crew Symonne, had developed a swollen forearm which greatly reduced our speed, making us four minutes slower and putting us in second place. The gearing was lightened off for the ladies for the last leg home into the wind. The crew rose to the challenge, rating 26 for the 19km leg and we finished the day five minutes ahead of Melbourne's Men's Crew - last year's winners and second fastest behind us.

Our overall time was 347.8 minutes, or just two and a bit minutes over 5 ¾ hours.

There were two trophies up for grabs: Fastest Time with crew changes, The "Col Roger" Trophy

and Fastest Unchanged Crew - The "Ian Law" Trophy, which we won.

Ian Law was a rover for Hawthorn Football Club and a Premiership winner in 1961, a Victorian State Cricketer and he also rowed for Hawthorn Rowing Club. He established the marathon 25 years ago as a way to help raise money for the Royal Flying Doctor. Back then it was rowed from Boundary Bend to Robinvale, but as the number of entries gradually increased, it moved to Wentworth. The proceeds from this event, supports a remote area mobile dental van, that services the north western area of Victoria.

Over \$10,000 was raised from this year's marathon for Operation Pelican.

Competitors came from Queensland, Act, NSW, Victoria and of course, South Australia for the event.

# Pangarinda Botanical Gardens

Flowering for the first time, *Doryanthes excels* - native to the coastal sandstone of NSW, has a spike with a head of red flowers.

The new entrance gate which was put in place in June - thanks to a generous donation from the Tailm Bend Rotary Club, has bought many favourable comments. Wings are still to be put in place, when finance allows.

Wes Gowland, speaking about Guest Speakers, mentioned that nowadays many organisations (mainly in the governmental field) now charge voluntary organisations such as ours, what appears to be inappropriately large sums of money, to provide a Guest Speaker. Our Guest Speaker this month, Sally Charlton of Tailem Bend, was introduced to members by Guest Speaker Organiser, Peter Connolly. Sally gave a very eloquent, interesting and enlightening presentation. It was quite thought provoking and was a prime indicator that amongst our community, there are many people who

Sally is a long-time member of the Rotary Club of Tailem Bend, which also deserves much credit for being involved in providing backing for Sally's work. Having at one time seen what an organisation called "Helping Hands" does for people, Sally sought more information, and as a result, formed a branch of "Helping Hands" right here, in Tailem Bend. She has since gathered around her, a group of local people, mainly through her involvement in Rotary, who regularly get together to construct an ingenious plastic "gadget" - a hand which is fitted to people who have no hands. The majority of these gadgets are supplied to people in Cambodia, and similar countries where past wars in the region have left thousands of people with no hands. Even now, decades after these horrific wars raged, people are still being killed and maimed by land mines. Remember the outrageous atrocities of the Pol Pot regime? Millions slaughtered!

Thousands of unexploded mines still remain, which makes much of their land unusable for farming, affecting their ability to feed themselves and earn a living from it.

Sally and her compatriots travel to Cambodia at regular intervals, at their own expense, to fit these ingenious hands to these unfortunate (and very appreciative) people. Designed in the US, each hand costs approximately \$100.

THE LILY OF THE VALLEY

The garden is an interesting place to be in this time of the year. It involves labour, some light, perhaps some not so light, depending on the condition of the yard.

My yard has both. There are plants and trees that require pruning for them to develop and bear fruit in season, or a display of flowers. Some people most in fact, are just as these. We need to be cut back, pruned, fed just right, have the bad bits cut out, for us to produce fruit or display our inner beauty by a wonderful display of blooms. If we are not pruned back, we become wild, over run our domain, and even prevent others from developing, just like some plants will, if allowed.

I have cut back some plants in my garden. They had run amok, the lavender and rosemary. I was a little savage with them, but they are survivors and will be better for it and more productive in seasons to come.

But with that, I have observed something - the bulbs are hidden under the soil, dormant and out of sight.

I now know they are there. Tiny sprouts breaking through the soil seeking the light and fresh air to assist their growth to maturity. These fullas don't need pruning, or a lot of care, it would seem, (we all need some love, though) as they were buried out of sight and ignored. Lavender & rosemary holding them back.

Now they will grow, they will become strong...no, they

will display their inner strength already there but stifled, they will produce an array of blooms more wonderful than anything in the garden. And then they will once again return to beneath the soil, to replenish their self and rest. Patiently waiting for the next spring, when once again they will have the opportunity to bloom, having quietly multiplied, out of sight for a while.

Somehow knowing that the gardener, the keeper of the yard, has kept the lavender & rosemary in check, assuring that all of the garden is able to fulfill the purpose given to each.

Bruce's Royal Gesture

Acknowledgement and appreciation at representing our District

Tailem Bend identity, Bruce Harris, has accepted the appointment of being an Ambassador for the Lord Baden-Powell Society. Bruce holds the Queen Scout Certificate, including the Bushman's Thong, and was a past Cub Master and Scout Master.

Bruce accepted an invitation to represent Australia at the 69th Baden-Powell Fellowship Dinner in Melbourne and join with invitees from 38 countries. His Majesty Carl XVI Gustaf – King of Sweden is the Honorary Chairman of the World Scouts Foundation and would be in attendance.

Bruce stated "I don't think I have ever felt the spirit and brotherhood of Scouting so strongly, except perhaps at a World Jamboree, to which I have attended two, representing South Australia."

When King Carl revealed he was about to turn 70, Bruce and his wife Judy turned their minds to what they could send from our Lower River Murray District community of South Australia as a gift. Bruce contacted the Council and Mayor, but unfortunately time was the essence.

A gift of a silver medallion minted by the Tailem Bend Rail Museum and commemorating 100 years of the State Heritage listed Tailem Bend Railway Station Building, inspired by the original building plan of 1913 was decided upon.

"There were only 100 of these medallion minted and I had No 96 and I thought it would sit proudly among all the other honours the world has bestowed on this gracious and humble king.

The medallion was sent to King Carl, in a package which also included 'A Brief History of Tailem Bend, Through the Eyes of Geraldine Dickson', a postcard of the Murray River Queen and fridge magnets displaying the town entry feature wall sign

From all accounts, King Carl was thrilled to receive this package and Bruce is hoping if the monarch again visits Australia he just might step into the Tailem Bend Railway Station Building and museum so artfully commemorated by this thoughtful birthday gift.

Membership of the Taillem Bend Auto Club is growing steadily, as the opening of 'The Bend' Motorsport Park (due end 2017), draws nearer. New member, Glenn Power (Chop) of Taillem Bend, joined the group earlier this year to arrange local club registration for his 1949 6/80 Wolseley, Rat Classic.

"We're looking forward to our first Taillem Bend Primary School Fete and I can't wait to show off Elsie, our old 6/80 Wolseley Rat Classic," Chop said. "To some, the old girl may not look finished, but she is. She's not had a pristine restoration, we just like driving her around and it's such fun, seeing the smiles on people's faces as we do," he said.

Although their shed is looking a lot emptier these days, Chop and his wife, Barbie, are petrol-heads from way back.

"Barbie has had to hang up her Harley boots, after selling her Softail Standard earlier this year, due to back issues, but she still loves a quick cruise in Elsie," said Chop. "We've had a few rides over the years, including riding down from Townsville eight years ago, when I was posted to Edinburgh with the Army. I acquired my current ride in 2003 from Fraser Motorcycles, Homebush and we've been mates ever since."

With many long road trips under the duo's belts, Chop has had to make a few upgrades to his 1996 Harley Davidson Road King (Progressive springs, mild cams, bigger carbies, a True-Track fitted - to name just a few) until in 2011 his bike had major surgery - a full (S&S 93 cube) heart transplant.

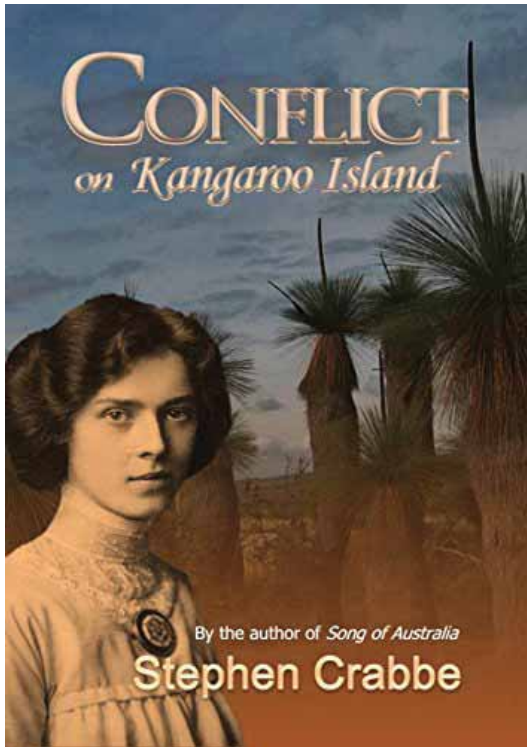

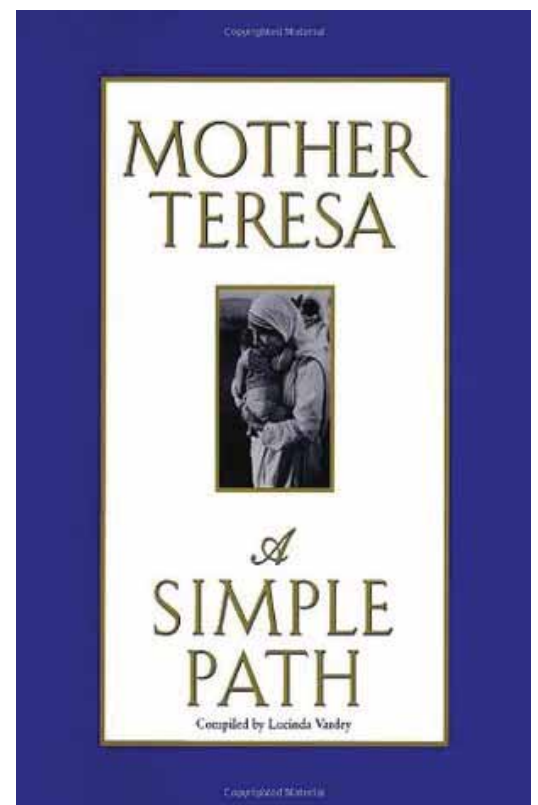

BE ON ALERT FOR FAKE FINANCIAL SCAM

Staff responsible for financial transactions, are advised to be on alert following fraud attempts made on interstate government departments.

Fake suppliers posing as regular suppliers

Information that identifies staff working in finance departments is being 'phished' via email and phone. The scammers then learn details regarding existing arrangements with external goods and services providers.

The scammers use this information to pose as a regular supplier. 'Updated' and realistic bank account details are supplied to finance staff, along with a fake invoice, resulting in finance staff transferring money into the scammer's account.

Fake boss emails

Scammers have also hacked Chief Executive officers' and managers' email accounts. The hackers send email authorisation to junior officers for the transfer of money into an account controlled by the offenders.

The following tactics are recommended to help ensure your workplace is protected from these scams:

- Check that processes around money transfers and controls to confirm changes to accounts are robust.
- Use a secondary validation process – through existing contact details – to confirm changes to account details.
