# Pangarinda Celebrates 25 Years

South Australia's renowned Pangarinda Botanic Garden celebrated its twenty fifth year on Sunday, September 23, 2018, in their colourful native gardens situated at Wellington East, South of Tailm Bend.

With a perfect Spring day, guided tours, displays, sausages sizzling on the barbecue and coffee and cake on offer, car parks were filled to capacity, along with visitors parking on both sides of Pangarinda Drive, to join in the festivities.

Kay Bartlett of Wellington recalls a committee of eleven members being elected at a public meeting at Tailm Bend in September 1993.

"At that time the people didn't think it would get off the ground, but here we are twenty-five years on," Kaye said. "I think the key to our success has been that all the original committee were passionate growers of native plants – I think most were already members of the Australian Plant Society."

"It's only with the support of Pangarinda's many volunteers, whether it be long term support or just a few hours here and there, that we can proudly celebrate such an outstanding accomplishment."

The Pangarinda Botanic Gardens, once a weed infested and eroded sand drift, with a few remnant patches of native Pines (*Callitris gracilis*) stands as a testament of what a group of like-minded people can achieve.

# The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #80

This month we continue with the life and times of Jeanette Kozikowski, this time her recollections go back to her 32 years of administration at the Tailem Bend Primary School.

With it Jeanette unveils so much significant history that will rekindle the memories of so many people and enlighten a lot of others.

**\*\*Heather Hindle** was the Administration and Finance Officer at the school and in 1990 when Heather and Richard were expecting their first child I was asked to step into her role during her absence. I took on this position permanently in 1991. Things were very different then. This was before the school data base EDSAS. There was no computer. I used an electric typewriter making corrections more difficult and lots of actual cutting and pasting to create documents, report books etc. Typing is unique as you are working on the original - there is no back-space button so thinking needs to be sharper. It was not long before computers were introduced. I was fortunate that the five appointed Principals that I worked with over the years were committed and progressive and always had the best interest of the students and families at heart. Leadership styles varied but each placed a unique imprint on our school.

Neville Gotch was Principal for 20 years retiring in 1996. During this time, he saw the school grow to a student population of 360, with 10 classes. During Neville's leadership in the 70's and 80's the swimming pool and the

administration building were built, and the school purchased the Sherlock Primary School when it closed and operated it as a campsite. I'm sure many students would remember visiting there and enjoying the bush walks, camp fires and camping in the old school rooms. The school fire in 1984 was quite devastating for the whole community. Two triple blocks, consisting of 6 classrooms, were lost and the activity room was damaged. These rooms were replaced in 1985 with a triple block and a new art science room. The activity room was repaired and continued to be used. It was located where the junior primary playground is now and has since been removed.

At a public meeting in 1993 Neville was instrumental in the school community's decision to form a committee to fundraise and build the community gymnasium. Building commenced in 1999, was completed in 2000 and the official opening was held in 2001. A chook house, vegetable garden and adventure playground were located where the Gym now stands. Neville retired in July 1996 and Mike Innes was acting Principal for the remainder of that year.

John Hackett followed Neville as Principal. He was Principal for four years when things were changing fast. We called the year 2000 the year of the 3G's, the introduction of the Global Budget, the GST and the culmination of 7 years of fundraising saw our community Gym open. During John's time the EDSAS data base was also introduced and this included the new finance programme.

The school colours were also changed from green and gold to blue and gold and the train emblem was replaced with the eagle. The new school motto became "To an eagle the sky's the limit" At the end of 2000, 182 students attended.

Noel Kneebone commenced as Principal in July 2001 and left us at the end of 2009. Monica Williams was our acting Principal for the first 6 months of 2001. I will always remember Noel's wish lists which he handed to students, staff and the wider school community, for them to give feedback on what they would like to see at Tailem Bend Primary.

# The Changing Face of Taillem Bend #80

In 2009 & 2010 the School Pride grant provided funds for the gazebo and new sheds to be erected. The school house fence was removed, raised garden beds added and the surrounding area paved. The administration building was also upgraded increasing the size of the reception area and updating various furniture fixtures within the staffroom and offices. BER (Building Education Revolution) funding was also applied for and plans made for these renovations. Murrayland's Music Festivals became annual events as part of our fundraising. They were held over a weekend in the Town Hall and Willow Street and proved to be big events for the town.

Our motto changed during this time also to become **TBPS : 'To Be Positive and Successful'**. At the end of 2009, 165 students attended. Kay Selth was acting Principal from January to August 2010. Phil Garner then joined us as Principal all the way from Hong Kong just in time to oversee the BER Funding renovations of over two million dollars. The library was refurbished, the canteen relocated and improvements made in the JP area. I think maybe these had all been part of a wish list that Noel had produced at an earlier date. During Phil's tenure, we also celebrated the school centenary in 2011. Phil left us at the end of 2012 and Helen Deans spent a short time as Acting Principal and then Noel Kneebone returned to be Principal in April 2013. Noel left us in April 2015 and Travis Schenke became our acting principal and went on to secure the position of Principal in July 2016. I am always happy to announce that Travis was born in the same year that I started working at Taillem Bend Primary School. He has embraced the role of Principal and is accessible, caring and committed to the success of the students. It is evident that he loves what he is doing and he communicates well with families and the wider community. I look forward to seeing the school continue to thrive under his leadership.

I have been going off to work at school for many years and it really feels like forever. Yes, I miss it. It is a good school and the culture is unique. I have loved working there and have always enjoyed the closeness and support of the whole school community. I miss the students, the ones who need help, the ones who need a band aid, a hand ball, a wet towel, some chill out time or just someone to

listen to their story. I love and will cherish the random memories and I will be forever grateful for the large collection of shared experiences which I will always hold dear. I miss my colleagues, day to day contact, the banter, the everyday routine and I look back with gratitude.

I am a JP married to Alison with two sons and one daughter-in-law. I live on our family farm and also run boarding kennels at Taillem Bend.

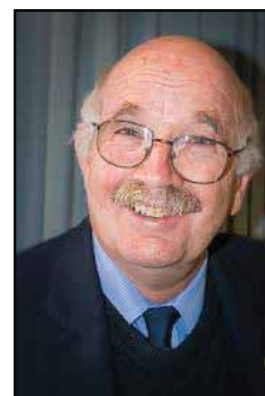

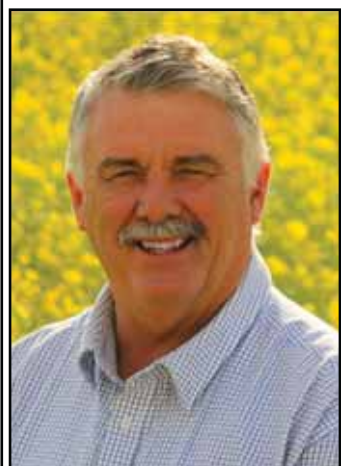

Poppy's is the creation of Tom and Megan Beattie, **PICTURED RIGHT**, who moved to Tailem a few years back and saw an opportunity to open a café in the main street. Their large collection of old 33rpm vinyl records gave them the idea to create a retro-style café unlike any other. They completed all the renovating and decorating themselves and even made all the furniture.

Tom previously worked as a chef for about 50 years and they've constantly worked together as a team in several food-related businesses, Megan gaining experience as Front-of-House Manager and waitress.

A continuous stream of classic popular songs from the era, ranging from beautiful ballads and smoochy love songs to rock 'n roll, is played on an old needle-record player using 33 rpm vinyl discs. Despite most of the songs being more than 50 years old, most of them are still popular today. Music is piped to the street outside as an invitation to passers-by to come inside, and when they do, they are amazed at what they find - a journey back into the middle of last century, when life was fun!

Poppy's is a happy place, a fun place, a family place where you can enjoy a great meal and soak up the friendly atmosphere and leave your worries outside the door!

Since opening in 2016 an incredible mix of people from all over the world and from all walks of life have visited and enjoyed the 'Poppy's Experience'. Hundreds of highly complimentary comments written by visitors, cover one entire wall. One comment reading, "Smile and everyone



knows you've been to Poppy's" - is typical of comments made by visitors.

People are constantly amazed at the quality of Poppy's tasty and healthy meals, supplied at prices which are unmatched anywhere. Good, wholesome meals and beverages promptly prepared and served by staff who are friendly, happy, and always welcoming. Poppy's also cater for small functions for up to 30 persons.

Where possible and to their credit, Poppy's like to support local businesses in the running of their café, including sourcing meat from the nearby Coronation Butcher Shop and other supplies from local shops and growers.

# Probud Report

## SEPTEMBER 2018

President Wes Gowland welcomed 16 members and Neville Medlow competently took over as Secretary for the day due to the illness of Bob Shurville.

The meeting was uneventful apart from six-gun Sheriff Tobiasen imposing \$11 in fines and Joke Master Don Moyes, rattling off a string of very funny jokes.

A respectable number of 11 members will attend the Probud Friendship Day being conducted by the Mobilong Ladies Probud Club on Friday 10<sup>th</sup> October at the Murray Bridge Golf Club.

### GUEST SPEAKER – MAYOR NEVILLE JAENSCH

#### "You ain't seen nothing yet!"

Guest Speaker Organiser Peter Connolly introduced Coorong District Council Mayor Neville Jaensch as Guest Speaker for the day. As a prelude to his presentation, Mayor Jaensch, made the stimulating and thought-provoking comment "If you think you've seen it all at Motorsport Park, well believe me you ain't seen nothing yet!"

He mentioned the overwhelming success of Motorsport Park's first major event which was brilliantly organised, but the overall success was spoiled by the presence of widespread multiple SAPOL breath testing stations which caused frustrating traffic problems, and which resulted in an almost-zero prosecution rate, demonstrating the high standard of conduct by race patrons.

Neville provided much information about projects in progress and on the drawing board at Motorsport Park including the airport development, the 1000-person caravan park, the drag-strip and drifting circuit and the Go-Kart event about to take place which will attract about 5000 visitors.

He mentioned a desire by Peregrine to create their own rail station at Motorsport Park, but this would be opposed by Council who would prefer to utilise facilities already available in Taillem Bend. Many other potentially exciting developments under discussion are the creation of a multi-sports complex in or near the town.

The solar farm is now 50% completed and employs about 170 people including many locals. Around 600 posts are sunk every single day! This is a happening event.



In January 2019, a 20,000 strong Scout Jamboree will be held at Motorsport Park because it is the only area large enough to safely cater for such numbers. Neville also confirmed that rumours suggesting that the iconic stone walls and rail engine features on the approaches to town would be removed were untrue and they would remain in place.

Overall, Mayor Jaensch's address left members with a general air of confidence in the immediate future of our district, with the potential for many other future spin-off ventures to occur.

Building of the town's "long awaited new toilet block", he said "will commence within days". This has been eagerly awaited by the local population for a long time.

The Mayor was warmly thanked by members and was presented with a Probud Certificate of Appreciation by Senior Probud Member, Malcolm Piggott - **PICTURED BELOW LEFT.**

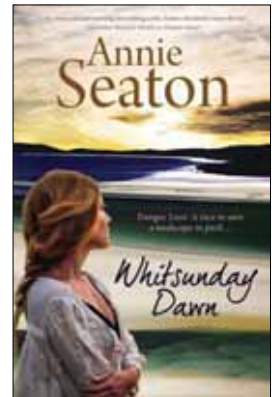

## LETTER TO THE EDITOR – SHOT IN THE DARK

Hi, I'm not sure if you can help me but I felt it was worth sending a mail...just in case!

I have been researching my Grandfather's history and one area that is a stumbling block is his "fiancee" that lived in Tailem Bend. Briefly, my Grandfather, John Charlton, Lived at 52 South Terrace, Adelaide. He was English and was a master carpenter. Having been badly wounded in the first world war, he couldn't find work in England and went to Australia to work on Adelaide College. His wife was left behind with her 3 sons, one of which was my father. His wife died in 1923 and he never returned home. The boys were raised by their Grandmother.

John committed suicide on April 22nd, 1927 at the house in South Terrace. The family he lived with, the Turnbull's, said in their statements that on the day he died he was writing to his fiancee at Tailem Bend to tell her that he was going there on the 23rd April 1927 but later that day he said he was no longer going to see her on the 23rd.

Unfortunately, they did not give her name or address. My hope is that someone may be researching their family history and perhaps John Charlton has been mentioned as being in someone's distant past. If you could help with a contact for Tailem Bend family history site or perhaps pass my details on to someone who may be able to help it would be very much appreciated.

I spent 3 weeks over in Adelaide in 2016 and managed to find where he is buried, not the grave as it's very dilapidated in the section he is in. We found the site where the house was, sadly no longer there.

I have a photograph of him sat on the fountain wall at the Botanical Gardens and I had my photograph taken in the same spot!

Any help would be very much appreciated.

### **ALCOHOL and DRUGS**

It is illegal to drive while under the influence of alcohol or drugs, including some over the counter and prescription medicines, if they impair your driving ability.

Learner, provisional and probationary licence holders must stick to a zero Blood Alcohol Concentration (BAC) – this means no alcohol at all.

Full licence holders must not drive with a BAC of 0.05 or more.

Driving under the influence of drugs including cannabis, speed or ecstasy is an offence. Random roadside drug tests are conducted to detect the presence of these drugs. The presence of any amount of the drugs tested is an offence.

The likelihood of a crash doubles for every increase of 0.05 above zero BAC.

For inexperienced drivers, the risk at any BAC level will be even higher.
