The Changing Face of Taillem Bend #56

Many years ago, I remember Wally Allengame employed as a clerk in the Parcels Office at the Taillem Bend Railway Station. Wally has long passed, but as a dedicated historian, he left us with a lot of memories that go back a long way.

A clipping I came across, portrays him as one of our earliest residents with a remarkable memory for dates. At the time of the interview he could remember the day he came to town as a schoolboy – October 16, 1911, then there was the day he joined the Railways as a junior porter - June 16, 1919 and the day he retired - February 11, 1966.

Of all the dates that stood out in his memory, May 27, 1927, was the most prominent; it was the day the Duke and Duchess of York (later to be King George VI and Queen Elizabeth) visited Taillem Bend.

When Mr Allengame arrived in Taillem Bend, there were only 5 railway cottages in the Town, two of which were occupied by the Stationmaster and the Porter.

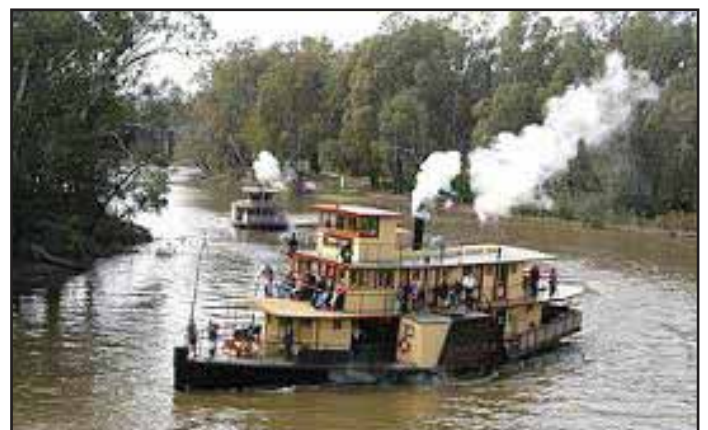

He remembered the names of those two, the Stationmaster was Mr James Beer and the Porter was Mr James Morcombe. Before the Railways expanded in Taillem Bend and the marshalling yards built between 1923 and 1926, river traffic was at its height. Paddle steamers such as the "Milang", "Murrundi" and "Queen" were common sights plying their way through.

On Sundays, some of the boats would run passenger cruisers, leaving Murray Bridge early, picking up passengers at Taillem Bend about 10am. From there, the boats would cruise out onto Lake Alexandrina as far as Pomond Island and return to Taillem around 4pm.

During Mr Allengame's second year in Taillem Bend, a start was made on the railway line to Paringa and ultimately, to Renmark. It was also around that time, that a start was made on building the existing station - before that, Taillem was only a siding.

# The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #56

I did mention last month that I would be on the lookout for more information on our Emergency Fire Service, well Bob Patten made contact and has supplied me with more than I can handle in one issue.

Bob grew up in Tailem Bend with his family, who lived in First Avenue. Bob is a life member of the EFS and a few years ago, he compiled his account as how he experienced the very early days of the fire brigade. I will present it in Bob's own words.

"My first experience with the EFS was in 1962. I was 16 years old and worked at Eudunda Farmers at Tailem Bend. Bill Bristow a work mate, was in charge of what was then the local Fire Service, it was a real "Dads Army" set up (no disrespect to Bill and his crew). The fire shed was situated in the area which is now the Shell Roadhouse - a stone shed on one side was the St John's Ambulance Garage.

The ambulance had the better facilities with a concrete floor and a canite ceiling, painted white inside - both garages were only about three metres wide. The EFS was a ripper, with a dirt floor and no ceilings, the walls were plastered with sand and cement. A telephone and a fire siren reset button were the most modern things in the shed.

When it rained heavily the water would run off the road and into the shed sometimes to about 200mm deep, when that happened you would climb over the Fire Unit (Jeep) to answer the phone or switch off the siren.

On the walls were some khaki overalls hanging on nails someone had whacked into the plaster, on top of them were a couple of fibreglass helmets,

but they were only available to the 'so called' Fire Control Officers. No footwear was issued; I ruined many pairs of shoes in those early days.

One or two pairs of goggles were available if you were fast enough to grab them. The toilets were behind the shed but only used at night for privacy reasons, running water was available from the knapsacks on the back of the jeep.

The fire units were quite modern as far as the District Council was concerned; we had two, a Chevrolet Blitz and a Ford Jeep.

A rope was attached permanently to the Blitz for towing purposes - one of the stories told, was that when it was being towed to a fire across the main railway crossing, the rope broke, leaving the Blitz on one side of the tracks and the jeep on the other, with a steam engine in the middle.

The Jeep was left hand drive with a mechanical indication arm, no doors or roof and two canvas bucket seats, no emergency siren or lights, but it did carry some canvas hoses.

The jeep was actually useless as a fire unit, but we did have a bit of fun flogging it out in some quarries out of Tailem. Both units carried old VHF radios that were ineffective - on a rare day you could just hear Phil Johncock, who ran the base station at Cooke Plains. The siren that went off to warn the crew of a fire, was also used to alert residents of riverbank dangers during the 1956 floods and was positioned behind the fire shed.

The siren was activated from the telephone exchange by the operator and was manned 24 hours a day.

This Month In The Garden

August weather is still temperamental, with frosty mornings and warm days. Cold, wet and windy winter days can be best used by enjoying a cup of your favourite home grown vegetable soup and giving you time to start planning your spring garden.

With time and effort invested last month in the treatment of clay patches and the preparation of vegetable patches, sandy soils can be treated by adding manure and compost.



Now is the time for planting out your seedlings - although frost will kill unprotected seedlings, so hold off until the risk of frost damage has passed. Alternatively, if you are lucky enough to own a glass house, use it if frosts are predicted, to keep your seedlings safe and protected. Small, inexpensive plastic 'glass' houses are available from your local hardware store, garden centre or plant nursery. They are also invaluable if you are starting new plants from cuttings.

If you still haven't planted the last of your deciduous trees & shrubs including roses, do so now, along with any spring and summer flowering bulbs. This is also a good time of the year to relocate plants that are in the wrong spot.

Remove the early buds from spring flowering seedlings, giving them an opportunity to strengthen once planted. Liquid fertilize your garden including




flowers, vegetables and of course, your rose bushes. Prune untidy geraniums and finish any last minute pruning jobs, deadhead camellias and azaleas.

The warmth of the spring sun will see the return of unsightly weeds, plant ground cover now to subdue the growth. Remove flat weeds from the lawn either by hand or by weed killer.

Remember to visit your local nursery or garden centre for all your gardening needs and advice. Check out the extensive range of plants, pots and garden accessories, along with ferns, citrus, natives, topiary, bonsai, herbs and succulents.

"Our military veterans go from having a structured regime to a completely new environment where there's often no understanding of them or their needs. They need help to adjust," says Mark Reidy, the RSL-SA veterans and families activities co-ordinator.

Mark, 45, from Clearview, served in the Australian Army for 16 years: two deployments to Iraq, one to Afghanistan, and multiple peacekeeping missions at trouble-spots as a cargo specialist, often with the SAS. He came out of all that with knee and back injuries, along with a lingering post-traumatic stress condition (PTSD) through the bombs and bullets encountered in the Middle East. "I was in a dark place for a while when I left the army," he says. "But, with exercise and peer support, I'm coming out of it now."

Six months in the making, RSL Active includes cycling, walking and kayaking. Olympic cycling gold medallist Stuart O'Grady (Athens 2004) has enlisted as an ambassador. But there's more to it than sport alone. Cultural development will be nurtured through a wide-ranging art exhibition scheduled for Veterans Health Week (October 21 – 30), with workshops for emerging artists. "Camping trips, social outings and school holiday programs are part of our future plans," says Mark.

Mark also competed in the Invictus Games this year, coming 7<sup>th</sup> in his event.

# Healthly Happenings

Fenugreek

Fenugreek (*Trigonella foenum-graecum*) is one of the oldest herbs recorded that has historically been used for many medicinal purposes. It is a small annual leguminous herb belonging in the fabaceae family. You may know it as a traditional herb used in curries, as it is an ingredient in many curry powders.

Fenugreek grows up to about 1-2 feet in height, it bears long, slender, yellow-brown pods that contain about 10-20 golden-yellow coloured seeds. Seeds are small and hard, resembling tiny, multi-faceted stone pieces. Raw seeds have a bitter taste; however their taste becomes more palatable once they are gently roasted. Look for them in your local health food store - you will find them in the dried herb and seed section.

Fenugreek is one of my favourite herbs, as it has many beneficial actions. It is an all-time wonderful cleanser of the body. Fenugreek can benefit women going through menopause because it helps to restore blood sugar regulation, nourish glands, improve digestion and increase libido. Seeds are a rich source of essential fatty acids, lecithin and phytosterols. Fenugreek tea may also help to improve breast milk secretion in nursing mothers.

Seeds can be sprouted and are a wonderful source of vitamins A, B, C, E, iron, amino acids, magnesium and living enzymes that are required for digestion.

A mineral rich tonic can be made by soaking a tablespoon of seeds in 1 cup of boiling water. Steep covered for 15 minutes, strain and drink warm or cool. Consume 2-3 times a week as a nourishing herbal tonic.

Adjusting to civilian life can be a difficult prospect for people leaving the Australian Defence Force, but a group of Brisbane ex-service people believe they have found the perfect brew for success.

That brew came in the form of 3 Elements Coffee, which would help fund post-military transitional training for veterans, through Ex Military Direct.

Terry McNally, a former serviceman in the Royal Australian Navy, said the idea came “over a few beers” last October.

And the reasoning was simple.

“Everyone drinks coffee,” Mr McNally said.

Named for the three arms of the Australian military, the army, navy and air force, 3 Elements Coffee launched with its aptly named Allied blend on Tuesday.

For every kilogram of 3 Elements Coffee sold, \$5 would go directly to Ex Military Direct’s training and transitioning programs, to help ex-service men and women gain employment in civilian life.

“At the end of the day, we’re saying most of our guys and girls, aren’t broken,” Mr McNally said.

“Give them an opportunity to be part of the community, let them come back into the community and be part of the workforce.”

The coffee was roasted in New South Wales by Caffco and people with disabilities were employed for that process.

For now, 3 Elements Coffee would be sold through its website –www.3elements.coffee – and some local cafes and restaurants.

The team behind 3 Elements Coffee had some lofty ambitions.

“I want it to be as big as it possibly can be,” Mr McNally said.

“I want to see smiling faces along the streets there.

I want to see people who aren’t committing suicide on the streets (or) broken families.

“I want to see people having the opportunity to live a normal life after they’ve left the services.”

Brisbane Lord Mayor Graham Quirk helped launch 3 Elements Coffee in King George Square on Tuesday.

“It’s all about recognising that often our defence forces, whether it be army, navy or air force, when they return to civilian life, it can be very difficult in that transitioning process,” he said.

“We are seeing issues in our city and, in fact, right around this nation where ex-military personnel are struggling to make that transition.

“I always say that the best form of welfare is a job and what they want is a hand up – they don’t want hand-outs – they simply want to be given the opportunity to make that transition.

“Often, in military life, there are skills that are adopted. The language may be different and that language might not be understood clearly by employers.

“So what this is about, through Ex Military Direct, is to make sure that transitioning can be made easier and that there be a growing understanding so that employers will take on these people who are coming out of our military services.

“Our country owes them that.”

Dog Registrations

It's that time of year again, when dog registration renewals are due within the Coorong District Council area. Part of being a responsible dog owner is remembering to register your dog with Council each year. It is an offence under the Dog and Cat Management Act 1995 to leave your dog unregistered.



By registering your dog, you are helping to ensure that your dog can be found and returned to you if they go missing. There are significant reductions to dog fees if your dog is desexed and/or micro-chipped (proof will be required upon registration). If you hold a pension card, or your dog is primarily a working dog, this will also reduce the necessary fee.

Dogs are required to be registered by 31st August 2016, after which fines will start to apply. If your dog is not yet registered within this Council area, please visit one of our offices to fill out the form and pay the required fee to receive a registration tag (forms can also be found at www.coorong.sa.gov.au).

Dogs should be registered at three months of age, or within 14 days of acquiring a new dog. Please keep a look out for your renewal notice, and if you haven't renewed your registration then visit one of Council's offices before 31st August. Let's keep all of our dogs safe this year.

TT Motorsport News - BSA Bantam

This is the Story of a 1950 BSA Bantam Motorbike
- by Doug Twelftree, Culburra.

In 1962, two years after I left school, my Father Tom and I walked into Allmake Motors in Pultney Street, Adelaide and purchased a 12 year old Bantam Motorbike.

The Bantam model D1, is a small bike with a 125cc two stroke motor. They were made in Britain by Birmingham Small Arms (BSA). Production figures are unknown, but estimates place the production number at close on half a million. It became one of the most successful machines ever made in England. They were manufactured between 1948 and 1971.

Originally, the Bantam was designed in Germany as part of the war preparations and was taken over by the Allies at the conclusion of WW2. The British produced the bike in a mirror image, bringing the foot controls to the right hand side, to conform with British bikes. The frame changed slightly over the period, but the 125cc motor and gearbox remained the same over the 23 years of production.

Our bike then began life on the farm at Culburra, South Australia. It was used constantly for around 30 years, rounding up sheep, even carrying the odd one home and for 20 years or more, carted diesel in two 20lt 'jerry' cans, out to the paddock during the day at seeding time, so I could work on into the night.

It was repainted black at one time (house paint) and later with yellow (again, house paint), but eventually, around 1992, a new bike was purchased and the Bantam was stripped down and put into boxes awaiting restoration.

And there it sat!

Around the year 1999, my son Warwick, had left school and had an apprenticeship with the electrical firm, Clipsal in Adelaide. He needed a project as part of this employment. I suggested the restoration of the Bantam. His reply was that he could not afford the project, so I offered to pay for it, if he did the work, and on the condition that the bike would belong to him and he was never to sell it! He was to pass it on to one of his children who were interested in it, carrying with it, the conditions that it not be sold.

Warwick agreed to this and the restoration began. Missing parts were procured and many parts were stripped down and sent away for powder coating and to be re-chromed. A big effort was made to keep it as original as possible.

I estimate the cost of restoration was about \$2500.

Progress slowed down as Warwick found other interests, but a big effort by one and all was made to complete the project in time, to be on display for the Centenary Celebrations of Tintinara and Culburra in 2006.

It is interesting to note that this bike is black with leg guards. I have only seen one other painted black. The normal stock colour paint was "Mist Green".

An aged visitor to the farm went into raptures over the Bantam and told me that he had bought a new Bantam in the 1950s costing £140 and that the black model at the time, was called a "Special" and as such was £15 more expensive than his green model! I guess money was short after the war and not too many "Specials" were made or sold.

Another amazing thing about this particular bike, is that the motor and gearbox has not missed a beat in the 54 years I have owned it.

I have always added a little extra oil to the petrol than was recommended, which resulted in the need of a plug clean occasionally, but it has always been easy to start and runs like a dream.

The sad aspect to this story is that Warwick now lives in Karratha, Western Australia and doesn't have room to store the Bantam, so at the moment, it still lives on the farm, covered in dust jackets and shown off occasionally.

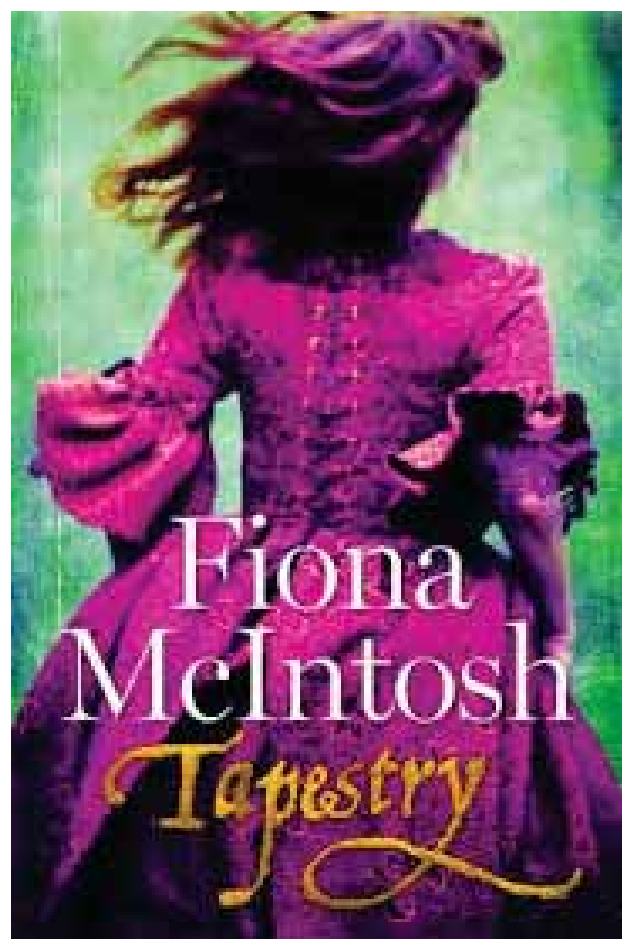
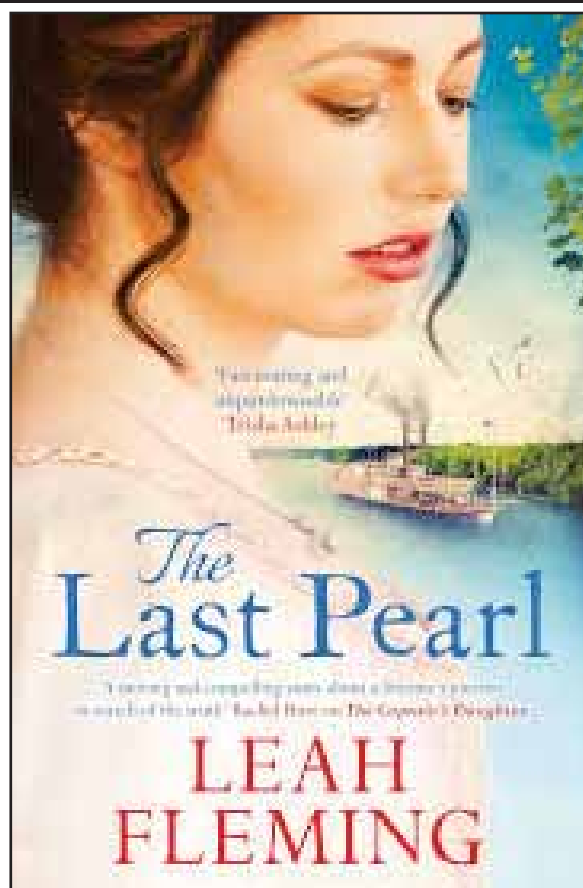
## FLEMING Leah: The Last Pearl – Historical


