Community Centre Celebrates 30 Years

As Tailem Bend celebrates its 130th Birthday, the Tailem Bend Community Centre celebrates three decades of successful operation - attributing its success to the people of this extraordinary town for what the centre is today.

Starting in 1986 with a small group of dedicated communityminded residents, 'Our House', now known as the Tailem Bend Community Centre (TBCC) formed a devoted steering committee to lobby Council to secure a suitable venue for a community centre.

With planning for the centre taking 12 months, the volunteer commitment shone through with the TBCC opening its doors the same day as the Township's Centenary - the 28th of July 1987.

TBCC Coordinator, Tammy Shepherd, is proud that the centre continues to be managed and maintained by volunteers, with all feeling like the centre is their home.

"It's a place where people feel welcome accepted and our staff and volunteers are so passionate about what they do," Tammy said. "Cooperation and collaboration are the keys to our successful community based service - people in need and those seeking social and recreational opportunities, can freely come here and join our family."

With a friendly, caring and non-threatening environment, everyone thrives - the centre supports the goals of local

people regardless of their circumstances and is always open to fresh ideas.

The centre has a courageous committee that is not afraid of trying new things - they proactively engage the community, enabling individuals within their community to gain the knowledge and confidence to make improvements in their lives.

Currently, the TBCC manages \$400,000 of grant funding, delivering services within the Coorong, the Rural City of Murray Bridge, the Mid Murray and Mount Barker Council areas, reaching a population of 60,000 residents - an astonishing Tailem Bend achievement.

The TBCC hosts many activities and events for this page, along with fundraisers, weddings, funerals and they also have many project partnerships with outside organisations, in the planning. Soon, they will be hosting an exciting popupice skating rink in the Tailem Bend Town Hall, developing the town's old Station Master's house for office space and railway themed accommodation, building an outdoor river cliff amphitheatre (similar to the Minack Theatre in Cornwell, UK) and championing a number of skate parks in the Coorong.

The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #67

Local Tailem Bend resident Bob Ellis was employed in the Repeater Station for 30 years with a 5 year stint at Murray Bridge when Tailem Bend closed down.

So who better to tell us all about the repeater station?

Bob arrived in Tailem Bend in January 1958, he knew no one - he moved into singles men's quarters and almost moved straight out. A hot northerly wind was blowing, the thermometer was reading well over a 100 degrees farenheit (about 42 degrees celcius in today's language) and was without air-conditioning. In his own words he remembers saying to himself, "What the hell am I doing here?"

Well 57 years later, he is still here - that is what Tailem Bend does to you.

In earlier days Tailem Bend filled an important role in the delivery of Post Master General telephone communications for the area, by being situated on the interstate telephone trunkline route between Adelaide and Melbourne. Tailem Bend was the first repeater out of Adelaide on this trunk route and was installed in the repeater station building, which had been built in 1948 and was located in the street directly behind the Post Office. The next repeater was at Tintinara, sixty miles further on. The repeater equipment consisted of four 12 channel "J" frequency repeater systems and used heavy copper open wires to carry the interstate traffic along the route between the capitals; 4 x 12 = 48 telephone channels.

The repeater station building also was headquarters for the group of eight technicians responsible for maintaining all other telephone carrier equipment located within it, as well as being a base for the maintenance of the expansive local telephone district. A variety of carrier systems to handle telephone traffic to and from large centres and smaller exchanges within the district were maintained by the technical group. Also, alongside the building was a lines depot building for the line maintenance party.

Tailem Bend was home to a manual switchboard exchange located in the Post Office. This exchange consisted of four trunkline switchboard positions and two local customer





positions. The customer positions were of the Central Battery (CB) type where the customer had only to pick up the phone and wait to hear on the line "Number please" from the telephonist. The manual exchange was closed when it was replaced by an automatic exchange in 1981 after 70 years service. The new automatic exchange was installed in a building built along side the repeater building.

In the mid 1960s a Radio Broad Band route was established between Adelaide and Melbourne and Tailem Bend was the first repeater out of Adelaide on this route.


A new building was built on the hill adjacent to the old racecourse to house this repeater, and subsequently other radio equipment was to come later, with dishes hanging on a new 150 foot tower. This analogue radio equipment was in the Super High Frequency (SHF) range and carried a telephony link to Melbourne containing 960 telephone channels. It also carried a TV link for the Mt Gambier TV station.

There was also a back up link that was available for telephone or TV traffic.

Further broadband digital radio links have since been installed and the old analogue systems have been replaced with digital types. The original automatic exchange, an electro mechanical type, had been replaced with a digital switching system which was eventually shut down. Technology has brought much change to the telephone network with optical fibre cable, mobile phones, NBN and who knows what waits around the corner? Similar to the railways here, where there was employment in the town for a substantial number of people, this has now all disappeared.

Well done Bob, thank you.

The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #67



Not too many present day inhabitants would remember much, if anything, about Patrick and Susannah Murphy. They go back a long way and history will tell they left their mark while in Tailem Bend (in particular, Susannah).

Around 1908, Patrick and Susannah relocated from Chain of Ponds and farmed the Tailem Bend/Moorlands area. Their son Martin, purchased a quarter acre block of land in Pretoria Street, that land was transferred to Mrs Murphy on May 6, 1913. Another block of land purchased by her, was situated in Seymour Street, Tailem Bend East. The blocks remained in her name until she sold them on January 6, 1944.

One block was sold to Mrs Jane Lynch (Rene Lynch's Mother in Law, most people in Tailem know Rene). The Lynch family home that they built on the block, still exists at 6 Stanley Street and is occupied by Steve Phillips, who knows quite a bit about its history, that however, is another story.

Susannah Murphy (nee Gangell)

Tailem Bend, Mrs Murphy became the local mid wife, helpina deliver babies house that Patrick built and served as a hospital - it was situated in Pretoria Street and often flooded, as the photo shows. Her husband Patrick, travelled far and wide for employment

In 1902 he and his son Martin caught the train to Pt Augusta, they then walked 300 miles to Tarcoola, to the new gold fields. I don't know how long they stayed there.

Not a lot of farming was being done at the time, as the railways to Loxton and Pinnaroo were being built, so they settled in Tailem Bend where Patrick died in the local Hospital in 1943. His funeral left his residence at 2pm on a Saturday for the Tailem Bend Cemetery.

Following Patrick's death, Mrs Murphy moved to Glenelg, then to Hindmarsh where she died aged 90 years. A plaque was placed on Patrick's grave in 2002, to commemorate the family of Patrick and Susannah.

Children born at Mrs Murphy's house include, Helen Jaensch 1914 – Nada Jaensch 1917 – Miriam Jaensch 1920 – It is also believed that Ross Gower was born there too, not sure about the date.

The TBFC has significant ties with the Indigenous community, and we believe it is important that we recognise the contribution many Indigenous players have made to the Tailem Bend Football Club.

Since the Clubs entry in to the RMFL in 1946 the Club has been represented by some wonderful players, most notably 1947 Premiership player and Hall of Fame Legend Richard "Dick" Kropinyeri. Phil Kartinyeri was a champion in the 50s, Kevin Kropinyeri, Matt Rigney, Don Tschuna and Alex Stengle were stars in the sixties and seventies. Tommy Smith dual B & F winner was all class. Noel Hartman Jnr and Roger Wilson were stand out players in the 80's and 90's both winning RMFL Mail Medals and the irrepressible Mervyn (Muffy) Kartinyeri won three RMFL Mail Medals and went on to play at SANFL level and of course many, many more, fantastic Indigenous players have represented the Eagles.

An Indigenous medal, the Wilson/Hartman Medal (pictured below), will be presented to the best player on the ground. Both Rodger Wilson and Noel Hartman have been wonderful contributors to both Clubs. Rodger is a Premiership Player for both Clubs and won the Mail Medal whilst representing Tailem Bend. Noel, is a Premiership player, played 200 games, is a B&F and won the Mail Medal all whilst representing Tailem Bend.

An Indigenous Guernsey, especially designed by Harley Hall of the Ngarrindjeri Nation, will be worn on the day. The cross hatch represents the basket weaving, and the 18 dots represent the 18 clans that make up the nation. The line work represents the Ngarrindjeri nation.

The specially designed Guernsey that the team will be wearing on the day will be auctioned post-match.



Healthy Happenings

ELDERBERRY (Sambucus nigra) Carmen Bubner ND

This time of year we are often become vulnerable to the common cold and flu, especially when our immune system is compromised. We often forget the basic nourishing treatments of rest and increasing fluid intake when we are suffering from the winter ailments.

ELDERBERRY is often overlooked as a treatment for supporting immune function.

The tree is grown worldwide traditionally being native to Europe and North America. In traditional herbal medicine ELDERBERRY has been used for the treatment of respiratory infections including those associated with cold and flu.

Berries have a high concentration of vitamin A & C and are a rich source of anthocyanidins (potent antioxidants) that may support immune function by assisting the production of cytokines (chemical messengers).

ELDERBERRY has been shown to reduce the duration of flu and reduces symptoms such as aches, pains and fever. Any form of viral infection (Ross River, Epstein–Barr virus) can be helped with the use of ELDERBERRY.

The main actions of the BERRY include- antiviral, immune enhancing, antioxidant. Berries can be used for influenza, common cold and other viral infections. Berries can be consumed in the form of food, syrup, tincture and tea.

The main actions of the FLOWER include – diaphoretic (reduces fever by promotion of sweating), anti-mucous. Flowers can be used for common cold, influenza, sinusitis, hay fever and bronchitis. Flowers can be consumed in the form of tea, salve, cream, tincture, syrup and cordial.

ELDERBERRY can also be combined with Echinacea root as both complement one another in supporting immune function.

This Month in the Garden

Temperate Zone - South Australia

It's time to get planting! There are some great plants you can put in now, once the frosts have gone. Try beetroot, lettuce, parsnip, peas, radish, celery (in a milk carton), leek, lettuce, onions, seed potatoes, rocket, silverbeet and spinach.

Top up mulch on your vegie patches, herb gardens and ornamental beds. Choose sustainable, low environmental impact mulch, one that will enrich your soil as it breaks down.

If planning on putting in tomatoes next month, prepare a bed now (your tommies will thank you for it). Do this by popping in some organic compost, pelletised chook poo, a small amount of water and top off with some sugarcane or straw mulch. This bed will be awesome come September... and you will have the greatest tomatoes in the street!

Pruning and weeding is a top job to do at this time of year. Deciduous fruit trees will benefit from a pruning now – except for your apricot!

Green manure crops (like clover, barley, wheat or field peas) are good to grow now - they will improve your dormant vegie patch, once dug in!

On really cold days, why not head out to the shed, and sharpen, clean, oil and maintain your garden tools. Sounds tedious, but it's really rewarding, and it will save you money and plant illness in the long run.

Of course, this is just a rough guide, and many of you will find your situation varies from the above listing due to microclimates created in your own garden, location in relation to your nearest major city, extremes of weather and garden type.



But the one thing that remains the same for all zones and regions is that no matter the season, we can all garden more sustainably all year round.

As always, remember to visit your local nursery or garden centre for all your gardening needs, tips and advice.

Motor Sport News

"Everyone waved!"
By Marcus Reseigh

The "Gidday - Wave for Wellbeing" campaign currently attracting media and even international cyclists' attention has long been an historical feature of friendly Tailem Bend folk.

As a student at the Tailem Bend Primary School in the 1950's I remember well the waving that accompanied the Round Australia Redex Trails.

As the mud caked and often dented sedan cars passing on the Princes Highway, lots of excited faces peered through the high cyclone fence. We waved continuously until the cars had passed by or the bell rang to summon us back to the classroom.

One particular driver was picked out for special waving on account of his well known antics.

One 'Gelignite' Jack Murray had a habit of carrying gelignite on board! In the Outback in particular, after leaving a checkpoint, a gigantic explosion to a long drop toilet would announce that Jack was on his way again. This was his calling card or tag.



As railway children we always waved to passengers as the Melbourne Express thundered through town. We got lots of waves in return. Paddle steamers such as the 'Avoca' and others also received their fair share of waves from the cliff top as they passed.



Footnote:

The first Redex Trial in 1953 had 192 entrants and covered 10,000 kms, but was not a true Round Australia event. It went up the east coast as far as Townsville, then west through Mount Isa and north to Darwin, then travelled through the Red Centre via Tennant Creek and Alice Springs, then Port Augusta, Adelaide and Melbourne to the finish in Sydney. That would be a simple trip today, but in the 1950s there were no motels, few service stations and stores, and roads were mostly unmade, poorly maintained and not often signposted.

An incredible 246 starters left Sydney on the 1954 second Redex, this time doing a full circuit of Australia over 15,000 kms. **Gelignite Jack** won in his privately entered 1947 Grey Ghost Ford, beating many works supported teams and achieving lasting fame. He carried sticks of gelignite in his car, allegedly to clear obstructions from the trial roads, but in reality to have some fun at the various rest breaks, blowing up dunnies and the like. The Murrays lost no points during the event.


Other items around the garden that can make us sick can be the fertilisers that you use. They can be in liquid, granule or solid form, all of which can also give us really bad belly aches to say the least.

Tailem Bend wins the pre-selection for Aquatic Camp for Maitland Lutheran School.


The Principal Mr David Field said his School was absolutely delighted with the facilities and river locations of Judy and Bruce Harris' "The Lodge on Murray".




A Good Teacher ANDERSON R.M.






