# The Wachy's

Even though I have never worked the land, farm life fascinates me, and I am not talking about the contemporary day farmers with lounge room tractors and sheep shearing blades 30cm wide, and of course the land has already been cleared for them, we do however appreciate progress even though it is not as glamorous.

I am going back to the days of harnessing and unharnessing a string of horses to do the ploughing, bagged grain, sheafed hay and milking cows by hand. (Something modern day farmers Lui, Davey and Scotty are not familiar with)

This month we trace the life and times of the pioneering Naturi farming Wachtel family.

My Uncle, Paul Herbert Wachtel died in the RAH on January 16th 1969 aged 78, he was still active on his farm as recently as November the previous year. He suffered an illness at that time, but before that he was in excellent health and was able to perform light duties.

He was born at Caloote on June 27, 1890, the first son of Mr and Mrs Robert Wachtel and he was educated at Wall Flat and the Lutheran Day School at Murray Bridge.

His early working career began on his father's Long Flat dairy, and then the family took up land about 20 kilometres east of Tailem Bend.

For a time, Uncle Bert worked on construction of the Brown's Well railway's extension to the upper Murray and Murray Mallee, and in 1916 purchased his own property a few kilometres west of the newly named 'Naturi' railway siding. He built a house there in which he lived until his death and in latter years he worked the farm with his sons Ray and Colin.

I remember growing up in Tailem Bend and making trips out to the farm with a brother or two – it was such an adventure. We would go spotlighting, catch a rabbit or two and if lucky enough, snare a fox among the sheep. Then it was back to the farmhouse, where we would sit around the table with a Tilley Lamp for light, swapping stories. Uncle Bert was a jovial man and when something a bit funny came up he would roar with laughter and thump his fist on the table, shaking the coffee cups!

He married Clara Hilda Elsie Miegel in 1918, in the Tailem Bend Lutheran Church by Pastor JF Hansen. The year before Bert died, the couple celebrated their Golden Wedding Anniversary.

Bert was an avid reader of agricultural and stock research and took a great interest in horses having some fine specimens of heavy and light types on his farm. (He loved his horses so much his sons Ray and Colin worked very hard on him to make the change from his faithful horses to tractors)

In sport, Bert won trophies as a marksman with rifle and shotgun. He maintained a lifelong interest in Cricket and Aussie Rules football. He took an active role in community affairs, serving on the Naturi Hall and Naturi Primary School committees.

Bert was a regular worshipper at the Tailem Bend Lutheran Church and for many years was treasurer of the Church committee. He had two sisters, Mrs HP Connolly and Mrs A Ruth. A brother, Arnold served in the 1<sup>st</sup> AIF and died in action in 1933.

Bert's funeral service was held in the Lutheran Church, Tailem Bend and he was laid to rest in the Tailem Bend Cemetery. Pall bearers were nephews Bob, Peter, Gregory, John and Terry Connolly and Mr L Lynch.

Until 1953/54, Naturi fielded a cricket team and the four Wachtel boys all played, with Alwin managing to get a game in when he was home on leave from the Army. There wasn't a cricket pitch at Naturi so the home games were played at Tailem Bend. Ray and Ken both played football when Monteith had a team in the River Murray B grade competition.

I can say from experience, it was tough going in those days, straight out of school in the early 1950's there was no Junior or Senior colts, so the only option was immediately into B Grade. The oval was situated right opposite the Monteith turnoff going from Tailem to Murray Bridge on the old Prince's Highway. I remember going to a game as a pillion passenger on Kaye Lee's motorbike (I'll never forget it, a BSA 650 Golden Flash!) I'll never forget the change rooms and toilets either, a belt of trees adjacent the oval, did the job. Also, the oval had a farmer's vehicle tracks going right down the centre of it. Who cared? No one, we got a game of footy!

My readers might be querying as to what Naturi has to do with Tailem Bend - well the Wachtel family, after the Naturi and Monteith clubs folded, among other things, had outstanding careers as players and officials with Tailem's Cricket Club.

Colin Ray and (deceased) were awarded Life Membership in 1974, while Colin's wife Gerda (deceased) received the honour in 1987 for her role official scorer at home and away matches. Following distinguished career as a player, Ray is also a life member of Tailem Bend Football Club.

Colin's two sons, Wayne and Gary, played cricket with Tailem for 10 years

before relocating to

Poolajelo in the South East, where they continued their careers. They proudly told me, that while at Tailem, the family trio all scored centuries in the space of a fortnight. They also supplied me with stories and records for this article. Importantly, their collection goes back to games played in Tailem in 1949.





# A Tribute to Roger Strother

### ONE OF THE COORONG'S GREATEST LEADERS

Staff and Elected Members of the Coorong District Council have been devastated by the tragic passing of one of the most fondly remembered Mayors in Council history, the late Roger Strother.

Mr Strother was a community man and regional trailblazer, leading the community and Council through some of its toughest times during the millennium drought. All before helping to rebuild the Coorong's economy and confidence in the decade following, through major investment activity – with high profile projects such as The Bend Motorsport Park project made possible thanks to his exceptional foresight and passionate leadership.

Mayor Neville Jaensch has said of his friend and past-colleague:

"I'm incredibly saddened to hear of the loss. I had the privilege of serving with Roger on the District Council of Meningie and then Coorong District Council. Under his tutorage as Mayor, our district struggled through drought and then into prosperity. He was a person of great community spirit and dedicated many years to the benefit of our district. Our thoughts are with Mary and family at this difficult time."

Previous Council Chief Executive Officer Tim Drew worked closely with Mr Strother during his most recent term as Mayor (2008 – 2014), and remembers him as a great man, and exceptional leader.

"I will always remember Roger coming in as Mayor at Council during a difficult time and doing his best to work with local communities through the drought. Roger worked extremely hard during that time and never lost sight of the needs of local people. Nor did he lose his sense of humour or fair play, giving so much of himself for the area and the people he loved so much."

Mr Strother began serving the Coorong in his role as an Elected Member with the former District Council of Meningie in 1993. In 1997 he moved across to the newly amalgamated (inaugural) Coorong District Council where he held roles on various committees. From 2006 to 2008 he was voted in as Deputy Mayor, before being promoted to Mayor in 2008 and continuing into the 2010 to 2014 term.

During this time, he served on more than 30 committees across the Coorong district and wider Murray and Mallee region, representing the interests of his beloved Coorong.

## COORONG PROPOSES MAJOR ROADS AND INFRASTRUCTURE INVESTMENT

The Coorong District Council has this week adopted its 2018-19 Annual Business Plan and budget, and 2018-2029 Long Term Financial Plan reiterating its focus on roads and key district-wide infrastructure projects for the year ahead.

Key areas for investment outlined in the 18-19 plan, include:

- · an increase of \$200,000 on its unsealed roads replacement program;
- an additional \$500,000 to improve unsealed roads service standards;
- a \$446,000 upgrade to the Tailem Bend public toilets and associated amenities;
- · a \$100,000 upgrade to the Coonalpyn public toilets sewerage system;
- \$165,000 to continue upgrades at Tailem Bends Dickson Reserve;
- an \$87,000 replacement and upgrade of the Peake water tank infrastructure;
- · \$55,000 for Tintinara's Lake Indawarra Precinct;
- \$22,000 to support development of a Meningie off-leash dog park; and
- \$44,000 to support ongoing construction of the Murray Coorong Trail.

Coorong District Council Mayor Neville Jaensch says its been a period of exceptional economic growth for the district in recent years, and a focus on built environments was part of accommodating this.

"We've listened to the community and adopted plans which set out a responsible approach to the future," Mayor Jaensch says.

"We're a small Council in terms of population, but a big player in terms of the State's strategic growth plans. Both the ABP and financial plan recognise this and allow us to invest in key local projects needing attention, while also looking to partner with State and Federal agencies on major projects.

"We want to ensure the momentum continues in terms of industry and tourism investment in the Coorong, so will continue to focus on our public spaces and facilities, while also doing the groundwork in planning and development to ensure we don't miss any opportunities."

The Council also remains committed to its exceptional work in community wellbeing and will continue to deliver a range of grass-roots activities already underway, while continuing to seek external funding for large-scale arts, health and social programs across the district.

Chief Executive Officer Vincent Cammell says the adoption of the ABP will see a rise in general rates by three per cent plus growth. Further, an adjustment will be made to the primary industry rating differential from 85 to 87 per cent.

"We have one of the biggest and busiest rural road networks of any local government area nationally, so it's imperative that we look to invest in our sealed and unsealed sections," Mr Cammell says.

"As part of a long term management approach, we'll also be looking to divert heavy traffic from some of our smaller council roads back onto the State and national highways. This will help maintain our roads and improve safety.

"We'll also be working to attract major road funding and partnership opportunities to assist with projects such as the Kulde Road upgrade, Murray Coorong Trail construction and Princes Highway entrance statements."

Other significant factors outlined in the ABP (and Long Term Financial Plan) include:

- · real growth of \$100,000 per year, over the next decade for capital renewal of unsealed roads as part of the long term financial plan;
- a new bi-annual playground renewal budget to start in 2018-19;
- · removal of the early rates payment incentive to encourage quarterly payments, and allow for the community newsletter to be circulated with quarterly rate notices (thereby reducing printing and circulation costs); and
- · introducing a fairer, transparent user-pays system for ratepayers benefitting from the water scheme at Wellington East and Peake i.e. there will be a connection fee of \$235 (\$315 in 2017-18) for every property connected to the scheme and 0.60c/kl charge for those consuming water from the scheme.
- · increase in total debt by 2028-29 to \$11.2 million (increase over 10 years by \$7.3 million) to fund the \$11.9 million in additional road funding as set out in the long term financial plan

"It's an exciting time for our region, and our team is looking forward to working alongside the community, businesses, industry and supportive government agencies to ensure it continues," Mr Cammell says.

All ratepayers will receive their 2018-19 ABP Summary document with their first quarter rates notice in August this year. In the meantime, those wishing to read the full plan can visit the website: <a href="https://www.coorong.sa.gov.au">www.coorong.sa.gov.au</a>.

# **Recipe - Slow Cooked Beef Ribs**

# SLOW COOKED BEEF RIBS IN APPLE AND RHUBARB CHUTNEY

My mum loves to make chutneys, pickles and preserves. I think she's drawn to the sweet and sour flavours, the sense of a well-stocked pantry and the ability to use up all her home grown produce. She is actually not that keen on eating the preserves herself and often gives them away. Being the editor of the Tailem Bend community newsletter, <u>Tailem Topics</u>, I thought it fitting to include this recipe for beef ribs, slow cooked in Mum's apple and rhubarb chutney. This is such a great way to use those jars of chutneys that may have been sitting in your cupboards for longer than you care to remember.

## **Ingredients**

- Chutney of your choice
- Beef or lamb ribs
- 2 tablespoons water

### **Method**

Preheat an oven to 160 degrees.

Line a baking tray with baking paper (this makes cleaning up so much easier)

Cut the ribs in half and cover them in chutney. Rubbing them all over.

Leave to marinade for 20 minutes or overnight.

Place the jammy ribs on the lined baking tray and add a few tablespoons of water before covering with foil.

Bake the ribs until the meat is soft and cooked (check every hour).

Remove the foil and bake until dark (but not burnt) and sticky.

Serve with rice and a refreshing salad like my fennel, celery, apple and mint salad with apple cider and honey vinaigrette.

Veteran Trophy was won by G Mack, on 36 points.



# **ALLY'S CANINE COLUMN**

Dogs and Cats Online
New Desexing Laws

From 1 July 2018, all dogs and cats born after 1 July 2018 must be desexed by a registered veterinary surgeon:

- Before it is 6 months of age; or
- Within 28 days after the owner takes possession of the dog or cat; or
- If the owner of a dog or cat is granted an extension of time, before the day specified in the exemption.

There are exemptions for desexing prescribed in the Act and in the Regulations:

- Vets may grant an exemption based on it posing an undue risk to the health of the dog or cat adversely affecting the growth, development or wellbeing of the animal.
- Dogs and cats born before the 1 July 2018 do not have to be desexed.
- Dogs defined as a "Working Livestock Dog" as per the definition in the Act are exempt from desexing.
- Dogs belonging to Dogs SA members are exempt.
- Cats belonging to a FASA or Cat Fancy of SA members are exempt.
- Greyhounds currently registered to Greyhound Racing SA members are exempt. (retired greyhounds are not exempt).
- Board exemption

### **Mandatory Microchipping**

Owners must microchip their dogs and cats by 12 weeks of age or at the point of sale. This includes dogs and cats that are more than 12 weeks of age on 1 July 2018. If you acquire a dog or cat that is not microchipped, it must have one implanted within 28 days of taking ownership. All dog and cat microchipping details must be recorded on the state wide database, Dogs and Cats Online.

Veterinarians may exempt an animal from microchipping if satisfied the procedure would pose an undue risk to the health of the animal or adversely affect the growth, development or wellbeing of the dog or cat. Exemptions can be recorded directly into Dogs and Cats Online in the animal's record from 1 July 2018.



### To the Editor - Entrance wall to Tailem Bend

Over a 15 year period the Tailem Bend Rotary Club submitted three different proposals for an entrance wall into the town of Tailem Bend. These proposals were all rejected by Council, while their suggestion was far too complex for the volunteers to manage.

With the support of every community organization in the town, the fourth plan was submitted and accepted by Council and was erected by volunteers in the year 2008.

The stone wall was built of local stone. The cut out of the RX Locomotive was cut from an 8'x 4' sheet of \(^1\)4 inch steel plate. The funnel had to be shortened to fit on the sheet of steel. The Council front end loader was used to erect the above structure because it was too heavy for volunteers to handle.

The Locomotive was selected to be put on the wall, because the railways virtually made Tailem Bend, employing 500 people at one stage. The RX type locomotive was chosen because this was the main type of locomotive used on the six main mallee lines for about 75 years, making it worthy of a place on the wall. Many adults and children have had their photos taken by this wall - it has been said that this entrance wall is among the best in the state.

After 10 years there is a move to remove the Locomotive from this place and replace it with a more modern arrangement of unknown dimensions at an unknown cost. The existing wall contains a message, is clear cut and should be retained.

Rather than wasting money on changing the existing low cost structure just for the sake of change, wouldn't it be better to put the money into a press button commentary into the Railway Museum? This could be used when there is no experienced person on hand to explain the workings of the varying functions of the old Railway Station to the many visitors who come through. Loxton has a good sound system in their Heritage Village.

Words are so powerful. They can stir anger, hatred, lies, and destruction.


They can also bring love, healing, acceptance and peace.



# The Lighthouse Keeper's Daughter - RADFORD Cherry



# Road Safety Tip: Mobile Phones

You cannot use a mobile phone in a vehicle while driving, even when the vehicle is at traffic lights or in a traffic jam. You can only use a mobile phone if it is secured in a commercially made cradle affixed to the vehicle and is only used to make or receive calls. It is an offence to create, send or look at text, or video message on a mobile phone. You cannot touch the body or screen of the phone, if the phone is not secured in the mounting affixed to the vehicle. If you are a learner or a P1 licence, you must NOT use a mobile phone in a car at any time while driving, including hands-free technologies.






