The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #89

This month we look at Ian in a different light - caring with friends for the environment, I'm sure you will enjoy it.

Ian Millard - Tailem Bend Revegetation Group

After my bowls career, I had time to pursue my other passion, native trees and understory plants.

My interest in trees began in 1988, when, after hearing about Trees for Life on the radio, I became a volunteer grower for local landholders. I was working for Meningie District Council as the Parks, Gardens and Maintenance bloke in Tailem Bend. Putting out sprinklers and hoses in a wheelbarrow and using a walk behind mower! The good old, bad old days.

Dr Phil Gooden and the Tailem Bend Beautification Committee were planting street trees around the town at the time and what a fantastic job they did! I had taken an interest in what species of trees were being used and started to learn about them. When the Beautification Committee ceased operation, I took over street tree selection, propagation and planting as part of my job with Council. We continued the work and many hundreds more trees were planted, until 1997.

In the early 1990's Council was approached by Woods and Forests to provide a test site for direct tree seeding, they wanted a site with shallow soil over stone, well..... they came to the right place! The drainage areas bordered by Jacob St and George St, and Princes Highway - adjacent to the silos, were seeded. Much to everyone's surprise, it was very successful.

In 1997, I became aware of the NHT (National Heritage Trust) grant program for revegetation and vegetation protection projects. Based upon the success of the Woods and Forest trials, it was evident that large scale revegetation was viable in our area.

Through the auspices of the Tailem Bend Development Association, a committee of Council, a successful submission was made under the banner of "Tailem Bend Revegetation Group". Much thanks goes to Evonne Whibley (Chairperson TBDA) and Graham Gates (Coorong LAP) for help with the submission. We received \$50,000 for revegetation works



on Public land around Tailem Bend over three years.

Council agreed to make available the large open areas of unused public land and some roadsides, around Tailem Bend, for revegetation.


The project involved seed collection from a range of local native plants - we expanded on the limited number of species used in the Woods and Forrest trials. Many thanks go to Steve Lawrence, the Council Overseer at the time; he was very supportive of the project.

Council provided machinery as part of their "in kind" contribution and as an appropriately licensed employee, I was the operator, all after hours and weekends of course. Greening Australia's legendary Neville Bonney, provided instruction and lent us a seeding machine for the first year.

Matt Rose approached us early in the first year and became involved, he was just out of High School, but was a wonderfully capable young man, Matt became central to the project to its end.

In the first year we direct seeded; south of Tailem Bend Golf Club adjacent to Princes Highway, then to the Dukes Highway Overpass, both sides of the Princes Highway; from

Meningie turn off to Hector Road – on the River side, Lime Kiln Road- both sides, Kulde Road to Gardner Road - both sides.

The project also involved a Community tree planting day. We planted Golf Course Road from the edge of town to Magpie Drive - both sides of the road. There was a lot of preparation done for planting, a rock breaker was used and the material cleaned up and fresh soil put into the holes. There was a good response to the event, around thirty people came. The Tailem Bend CFS was on hand to water the trees in.

We did tree planting projects with the Tailem Bend Primary School, starting in the first year on the vacant Railway land opposite the School. The planting projects with the School, continued over a number years, beyond the life of the project and moved to Pangarinda with Matt Rose and Teacher Marie Flavel, working together.

Other community tree plantings were done on Racecourse Road - east side and along the rail line boundary in the Racecourse, Princes Highway - on the west side, past Old Tailem Town and at the Tailem Bend Cemetery.

In all, there were over 300 linear kilometres of direct seeding done and around 1000 trees planted, many hundreds of hours of volunteer labour given for seed collection, seed cleaning and sorting, propagation, preparation for planting and watering.

20 years ago, travelling to Tailem Bend from the SE and cresting the Overpass on Dukes Highway in summer, one was greeted with a shimmering, weedy barren plain of limestone. Thanks to this project, it is quite different now. The other approaches and entrances to the town have similarly been transformed by the addition of trees. The reward for the hard work put in by many, is seeing mature trees and shrubs, some 5-6 m high, thriving. This vegetation has created an important habitat for birds, mammals and reptiles and will continue to provide an important ecological benefit to the area. Thanks to all who participated.

Well done lan and friends.

Next month, we look at a mixture of history and with our Historians preparing for an exhibition in the New Year, we need all we can gather of times gone by, and there is a lot out there, waiting to be collected.

# The Nitty Gritty.....by Cr Glynis Taylor

For the last few months the Council staff and elected members have been concentrating on the 2019 - 2020 budget. There is an urgent need to reduce the deficit (highlighted by and of great concern to our independent auditor), which currently sits at well over \$1.5m and which has been consistently rising for a number of years. The incoming council have set about reducing this as a matter of great urgency as continuing to borrow money for this deficit inflicts greater cost pressures on the district, especially when the cost of that borrowing is taken into account. The budget ultimately determines what the rates will be for the coming year and there has been robust discussion over this subject. The valuer general, indicated some months ago we should expect a significant increase in valuations across the district. While we are not yet privy to where these increases will affect, the elected members are deeply concerned about the impact this will have on ratepayers, who are already experiencing cost pressures from static wage growth and the debilitating effects of drought.

In staffing matters, the CEO is still on leave, with David Mosel the Acting CEO, about to take the month of August off, on leave. In his absence council has appointed Graeme Maxwell as the Acting CEO.

Council has also said goodbye, after 32 years, to Director Nat Traeger, who has taken up the role of CEO with Kingston Council.

It's your RSL and we look forward to welcoming you.



Riverland can now complete their university studies closer to home, thanks to the digital launch of the Murray River Study Hub (MRSH). This initiative is being delivered with the support of key partner agencies, including Regional Development Australia Murraylands and Riverland, the Rural City of Murray Bridge and TAFE SA. It's been made possible thanks to funding from the Australian Government's \$7.5 million Regional Study Hubs initiative being rolled out nationally.

The MRSH website has just gone live, meaning people can now apply to study any of the online university courses, knowing they will have the support of two regional campus sites, soon to open in both the Murraylands and Riverland. 

# **Murray Bridge Hospital ED Upgrade**

Plans for the upgrade the emergency department at Murray Bridge Soldiers' Memorial Hospital have been given the stamp of approval.

Minister for Health and Wellbeing Stephen Wade said State Parliament's Public Works Committee recently signed off on final plans for the project.

"It is great to know that this project will roll out in the coming months. The \$7 million redevelopment and expansion of the hospital's emergency department (ED) will deliver state-of-the-art health services to the people of Murray Bridge and the surrounding regions.

"The existing ED faces real challenges in terms of meeting the increased emergency demand in the Murray Bridge region," Minister Wade said.

"The approval of the ED upgrade plans is another key step towards fulfilling our pledge to provide world-class health care to the Murray Bridge community and demonstrates our broader commitment to boosting health services in our regions. twice the size of the existing ED and provide high quality and efficient health care services that directly align to the needs of patients."

Member for Hammond Adrian Pederick said it was exciting to see the project moving forward after extensive consultation with clinicians and other key health stakeholders in the Murray Bridge region to finalise the concept plans.

"This project is especially important given the expected massive growth in tourism and industry in Murray Bridge and surrounding areas in the coming years," Mr Pederick said.

"I look forward to a builder being appointed and construction getting under way in the coming months.

While the Murray Bridge Soldiers' Memorial Hospital had just over 6,600 emergency presentations in 2016-17, this figure is expected to grow to 14,500 presentations by 2026.

KATE Lauren - The Orphan's Song


The Orphan's Song is a sweeping love story about family, music, and the secrets each hold-that follows the intertwined fates of two Venetian orphans.

Mr McInally married Dorothy Hodges at Tailem Bend on April 5, 1958, had together they had two children, Antony and Susan.

Harry played most sports, including football, cricket, tennis, rowing and swimming. Then in 1970 Harry

started training grey-

hounds.

His first greyhound winner was Sutoni, named after his children.

Harry in my opinion was not only an icon to the people of Tailem Bend as a thorough gentleman, but also trained greyhounds for various Tailem Bend people, some that come to mind being his great mate Keith Carslake whom he trained many winners for; Nunga Royal for the Lovegrove family of Tailem; and possibly his favourite, Lady Rhode, whom he trained for the boys at the Wellington Hotel.

I am sure memories of this fond loving sports-man will be remembered for many days to come.


