The Hub - Proposed Sports Complex

Focused and united, Tailem's sporting community unites in preparation for a proposed multi-million-dollar Sports/Community Hub to be located next to the Tailem Bend Football and Netball Clubrooms, 73 Trevena Road, Tailem Bend.

Two years into a five-year plan and after a great deal of consultation and club administrative preparation, stage one of The Hub Development is about to be drafted by Architect, Michael Holiday of Wellington East.

For the past two years STARCLUB, Murraylands Field Officer, Marc Maddaford, has been working closely with The Hub committee and local sporting clubs, helping them meet Best Practice Governance to support The Hub's grant submission plans – "Now that the Strategic plan is in place it's now over to the clubs to get things going and follow up on their governance – STARCLUB governance recognition will definitely help secure Local, State and Federal Government support."

Central to the development, will be a two-storey community Clubroom/Function Centre with a regional sporting museum, change rooms, stage, bar and kitchen facilities. The Hub will also boast two Grandstands, Football Oval, Netball, Basket Ball and Tennis Courts, indoor and outdoor Cricket and Bowls facilities, Pool, Gymnasium and Archery Field along with disability accesses to numerous meeting/storage rooms, a creche and ample parking.

The Hub Chair, Duane Edwards of Tailem Bend, emphasises that it's business as usual for all sporting clubs while the committee continues to move forward and prepares the first draft development plan.

"We want the clubs to continue running as normal, but be reluctant to invest in any large infrastructure investments for the next three years or so as the final stages of our community submission is finalised," Duane said.

After two years of discussion, this is The Hub mud map that is to be passed to the Architect for drafting - **ABOVE RIGHT.**

Tailem Bend Community Centre, CEO, Tammy Shepherd is keen to see the Hub established - "For the long-term sustainability of the Tailem Bend Community Centre we would like to see The Hub established as soon as possible," Tammy said. "We're running out of room again at The Centre and The Hub will offer an even greater opportunity for us to engage more with the community - The Hub is a brilliant community initiative and will definitely compliment what is happening out at The Bend - Motorsport Park."

Melissa Edwards representing the Tailem Bend Football Club, can't wait to see the complex come to fruition for so many reasons - "One reason is that so many of us cross over volunteering for numerous clubs, it will be great to just volunteer for The Hub and have one meeting instead of many meetings each month."

Denise Edwards of the Tailem Bend Netball Club is completely behind The Hub concept – "Leonie and I have been 100% behind The Hub from its inception, we've been to all the monthly meetings and think it will be great for the community."



President, Tailem Bend Bowls Club, Peter Connolly is supportive of the idea and has almost completed the Bowls Clubs STARCLUB Governance requirements – "We could contribute about a million dollars to the development as long as we get what our members want, but there's still a long way to go before we can consider anything like that - if all goes to plan, it will be magnificent for the Bowls Club."

Tailem Bend Auto Club Secretary, Michael Holiday of Wellington East, has kindly donated his time to prepare The Hub's Draft Development Plan, as a final discussion plan with all stake holders – "Our auto club is keen to see The Hub up and running, I signed up as 'Member 17' three years ago and now we have 230 members, and growing – we're about to outgrow the Football Club meeting room and we're looking for another facility, but there's nothing else in Tailem Bend," said Michael.

The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #82

LAURIE CONNOLLY - HORSEMAN

Without reminiscing, there wouldn't be much of our favourite history to talk about, so with that in mind, I thought I would touch on some story teller's memories.

My elder brother Laurie Connolly - horse lover, jockey and trainer, a few years ago spent some time with his late trainer mate the late Ron Morgan. At the time he had just celebrated a birthday and admitted to be around the retiring age, with that came the milestone of riding and training horses on the Murray Bridge track for the previous 45 years.

We will go back to where it all started; At 14 years of age, Laurie entered a stable in Adelaide and after 6 months decided city life wasn't for him, so he gained work in a stable at Murray Bridge with Rod Lawrence.

During their working day, he and another stable hand used to ride a horse and lead two others from Beatty Terrace to the racecourse.

Their living quarters were in the end horse stall with straw mattresses and horse rugs for blankets. Wages were two pounds for a seven day week.



He remembers when Bert Crisp maintained the track using a draught horse and dray and two trainers Tom O'Dea and Ferg Dougal would argue over who would supply the chaff for the draught horse.

The committee met and decided to give them monthly turn about.

Laurie remembers when renowned racing man Charlie Smelt led a horse all the way from Beatty Terrace to the races just to get free admission. One thing he did notice over all the years was the healthy rivalry at the time between the Tailem Bend and Murray Bridge trainers.

After two years at Murray Bridge and limited race riding opportunities, he shifted to the South East, settling at Penola and at 17 years of age, had his first ride in a hurdle race.

Laurie's very first track ride was on 'Woodlands Girl' who bolted with him for two laps of the course. One of his favourite trained horses was 'Bachelor's Choice'. The best jumping horse he was connected to was Typique, Tailem Bend trained by Jack Phillips, the local butcher. The horse won the Grand National in Adelaide and the Cup Steeple at Flemington.

Laurie's first ride as a jumps jockey was at Mt Gambier where he fell off at the second to last fence and had the rest of the field go over him. Laurie can remember thinking on the way back to the jockey's room that it was going to be a very short career, but the famous south east horseman Dave Kelly gave him a few words of praise that encouraged him to go on with it. "I rode two winners in my time, but National Service and increasing weight cut short a promising career," he said with a laugh.

In 1974, with prompting from his wife Sue, Laurie decided to take out a Trainer's license and said he trained many useful horses resulting in 87 winners.

Bachelors Choice won nine races, three in the metropolitan area and any thought of retirement was stalled, when Purring came along. Purring turned out to be his most successful performer, winning 15 races, nine in the metropolitan area, eight seconds and two thirds from 49 starts.

Following a track fall and a ride in a helicopter to the Flinders Medical Centre, Laurie began to think perhaps it was time to retire - like a lot of horsemen, there were thrills and spills and he had had his share. Two weeks in intensive care was not enough to deter the Tailem Bend horseman from doing what he knew and loved. Following the nasty fall he evaluated his situation and decided to continue training. He said, "I wasn't put off by the fall, but I did decide the next fall would be my last - I lasted another eight years to the month!"

Then, the career ending fall - Laurie spent eight days in hospital with five broken ribs, bruised lungs and a leg injury. He reflects, "The thrills far outweighed the spills."

A lot of things changed over the years, most for the good, but he did notice once, how a trainer protested because a jockey used the whip too often. "In our day," he said, "if we didn't use it enough, the trainer would use it on us!"

The renowned trainer said he had fond memories of swimming horses in the River Murray. "I did that up until the age of 50 and then it got too cold for me, so I invested in a boat."

He was only too willing to share his secret to getting up at 4.30 every morning for 45 years: being a non-smoker, a social drinker only (??) and not a television fanatic.

Now in retirement, Laurie stays active and is involved with horses in a small way, but allows other trainers to do the work.

Thanks to Laurie for making his story available, he says his affinity with horses, goes back to his mother, who, as a young lady living on a farm, was a very successful Show Ring Champion.

Thanks also to my readers over the past 12 months, your encouragement makes it all worthwhile, more to come in the New Year.

Anne Howell has a story to tell, the Doceff/Long's connection with Tailem Bend and some interesting Jervois history, including Lui and Maria Brion sharing a lifetime in the dairy industry.

Keith Carslake - 30/1/1927-18/10/1999

Keith was born at Medindie, January 30, 1927, to Brice and Florence Carslake, a brother to Harold, Murray, Sylvia and Reg.

He attended school at Naturi, first walking three miles to school and back and later riding a bicycle. He carried his boots to school, only wearing them in the school yard. The family travelled to dances by horse and cart and the children would be put to sleep behind the piano.

Reg and Keith had to help with the milking after school, sometimes climbing onto the cows' backs to bring them home. To do this, they needed to find a stump of the right height, so they could get on the cows.


The family used to attend the Salvation Army at Chapman's Bore one Sunday and the Methodist Church at Naturi, the next, sometimes travelling on Charlie Callis's truck.

Reg and Keith used to ride bicycles to Monteith, to go fishing. They also trapped rabbits and went 'roo shooting, walking miles in the process. As they got older they went 'roo shooting with their mates. On the farm, Keith shore sheep, with blades.

At the age of 18, Keith joined the Air Training Corp.

He first played football for Wynarka, then Monteith, where he played his best football and finally, at Tailem Bend. He also played cricket for Tailem Bend, where he won a trophy.

After leaving school, Keith worked on the family farm until he started his business at Tailem Bend in the early 1950's,



selling motor bikes and second hand cars, trucks and four wheel drives. He travelled to the Northern Territory and all over Australia, buying second-hand vehicles, bringing them home and doing them up and reselling them.

Keith married Avis in 1954, and they had two daughters, Glenda and Janine.

Keith was a very private person, but was always there for his family. He loved family gatherings, especially Christmas Eve with the family. He was so proud helping the girls organise a surprise 60th Birthday party for Avis.

There were few activities that gave Keith special joy:

- Opal mining in Coober Pedy, where he stayed with Darrol, Veronika, Jennifer, Scott and Mathew. Keith and Darrol mined for opal.
- Greyhound racing with Harry and Dorothy McInally, and a dog called Charillo, which Keith owned. Charillo won ten races before he died from a snake bite.
- Fishing with his mates started when he was young, and continued throughout his life. Keith particularly enjoyed fishing with his mate Tubby Hattam.
- He would also travel to Goolwa regularly to go fishing with his two son-in-laws, John and Donald and sometimes he would just go down to the river at Tailem Bend and fish with his coke bottle fishing lines.

He first started his business in a small shed and stayed in a caravan in the yard, until he built the four roomed house onto the existing shed. In 1973 he added the large shed, in which his nephew Darrol Winen ran his mechanical business.

It was a regular occurrence for people to try to steal fuel and radios from the cars and Keith would be there with his gun making sure they didn't run away and his wife Avis, calling the police and the girls keeping watch. He only had a small fence until someone stole a car and drove it straight through the gate (just missing Keith) he then installed the high fence and got his guard dog, Fred, to protect the property. This deterred most of the theives.

In 1989, Keith decided he would build Avis a new house at the other end of the yard.

Keith had a heart attack followed by a double by-pass in 1990. Keith's health deteriorated and he passed away in the Flinders Medical Centre on the 18th October, 1999.

Keith is survived by his wife Avis, their two daughters and their families: Glenda, John, Vanessa and Jason (dec), Brett and Brooke. Janine, Donald, Nicholas and Ben. His great-grandchildren: Hudson, Matilda, Layla and Violet.

<u>GUEST SPEAKER – GRAHAM BUTTLE FROM</u> "OPERATION FLINDERS"

Guest Speaker Organiser Peter Connolly introduced Graham Buttle of Murray Bridge. Representing "Operation Flinders", Graham has been a volunteer worker for many years and his impressive commitment to the organisation was quite apparent. Operation Flinders has the worthwhile objective of aiding young people aged 14-18, both boys and girls, who are considered "at risk" in our community.

These children, Graham said "often have serious behavioural problems, mainly coming from dysfunctional families and underprivileged neighbourhoods." "Most of their problems have not been of their own making" said Graham, "and they deserve help".

"Help" comes in the form of "Operation Flinders", founded in 1991 by a forward-thinking South Australian lady. The program involves taking groups of 10 children on demanding eight-day 100km treks, over rugged terrain through the Northern Flinders Ranges.

"The idea" said Graham "is to put these children out of their 'comfort zone'. "They are entering 'a world of the unknown' and at first are bewildered". They are given challenging and daunting tasks to perform, like abseiling down steep, death-defying cliffs! Children are selected from schools from all over the state, which are aware of the enormous success this program has achieved over many decades.

Part of their 'adventure' includes contact with aboriginal people who tell them about the 'dreamtime' and details of aboriginal life. Graham cited examples of how the program had changed the lives of many of these disadvantaged young people, improving their self-esteem, teaching them the value of respect and comradeship and to have the courage to face up to life's many challenges.

'Operation Flinders' over the years, has justifiably attracted State Government support, but it could not survive without valuable backing from elsewhere, including long-time supporters, The Variety Club and Rotary. So remember, 'Operation Flinders' as a worthwhile recipient of any of your future donations.

Graham received unanimous applause and immediate Past President Neville Medlow, presented him with a Probus Certificate of Appreciation - **IMAGE BELOW.**

Graham drew the door prize - the winner was Bob Ellis.

Gun Alley Tailem Bend

Tailem's infamous Gun Alley is quickly transforming from its legendary 'gangster' status, where tough railway men and the Connolly clan of fifteen roamed, to a more refined lane of property investors.

Gun Alley, gazetted as Webb Street, Tailem Bend, has seen many families come and go over the years, some testifying to mysterious shot gun blasts ringing out in the dark of night, but a few Gun Alley veterans like Big Charlie, Weary Bruce, Glum, King Tom and Baron Michael, remain.

"There are a lot of characters in Tailem Bend, but we



do have a concentration of them in Gun Alley," King Tom said. "Knight Peter (Peter Connolly) still roams the street on occasions."

Gun Alley folklore has it that Webb Street, in it's hey day, was a street that you didn't walk down after dark. Between the gangs and the Connolly's, women feared for their safety and men took their chances. However, these days, Webb Street has been transformed with a new generation of residents.

Mark Lemon, alias King Tom, purchased his first home in Tailem Bend many years ago and moved to live in Gun Alley to be close to his mate, Weary Bruce, ten years ago. "We have a lot of fun in this street, The Baron (Michael Alleman) can tell a tall story – you wouldn't want to believe everything he says."

"The Baron started the rumor of Webb street moving to the Feudal System – that way he reckons we can control our own council rates," laughed Mark.

Webb Street homes were unique for their time, in that they were made of cement poured onsite into molds, making them look almost identical.

Mark now owns four homes in the street and he is one of many Webb Street investors who are happy to have found

Tailem Bend. "Slowly, but surely, the transformation of Webb Street is happening, thanks to the influx of workers on the Solar Farm and The Bend Motorsport Park'.

'We've got investors from all over, I know there's one from Morphett Vale, some from Adelaide and even a few from interstate,' Mark said. 'My old mate Michael, The Baron, and his wife Karen, now live across the road and they're really heavily invested in Tailem Bend.'

Mark's plan is to finish renovating his current home, then sell one of his investment properties, before retiring and living off the rental/super income. And, these days, with Webb Street looking more like a row of English Cottages, the investment gamble has paid off for Mark.

'I'm planning on buying a van, nicking off and start tossing coins. The first coin toss will be at the Meningie turn off – Heads left, Tails right.'

Webb Street was named after William Alfred Webb (1878–1936) an American railroad executive who gained wide experience within US railroads and served in the management of nationwide railroad operations during

WW1, before being appointed Commissioner of the South Australian Railways from 1922 to 1930.

In this role undertook he significant rehabilitation program, lifting the state railways from an inefficient technologically backward system, to a preeminent position in Australia.





# Tailem Bend Community Centre awarded Murray Mallee Community Passenger Network

The SA Department of Human Services (DHS) has awarded the Tailem Bend Community Centre (TBCC) the tender for the Murray Mallee Community Passenger Network (MMCPN), with operations set to commence in the region from 1 January 2019.

The program provides those who are frail, aged over 65, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander (ATSI) over 50, and those under 65 living with disability (or under 50 for ATSI people) and their carers, with transport services that support their access to the community.

Funded by the Australian Government Commonwealth Home Support Programme (CHSP) and the DHS SA Home and Community Care (SA HACC) program, the MMCPN service extends across three local Government areas. (Southern Mallee, Karoonda East Murray, and Coorong).

The MMCPN is a vital service to people who are vulnerable and transport disadvantaged, TBCC is passionate about maintaining this service locally managed.

The Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure currently funds a Special (Medical) Bus Service within the Murray Mallee region which will also be administered by MMCPN. This service area includes another three Local Government area's (Tatiara, Mid Murray and Rural City of Murray Bridge).

Travel on the Medical Bus is based on eligibility criteria, namely:

- Passengers must be aged, have a disability or mobility constraint that limits their ability to access general public transport services operating in the region; and
- Transport must be for a medical or specialist appointment.

TBCC Chief Executive Officer Tammy Shepherd said the MMCPN services compliment similar programs delivered by TBCC.

"We will strive to expand transport opportunities in the six local government regions. We're confident TBCC can deliver a dynamic, effective and valued program. It's exciting to extend our services across land area of 33,580 km squared," she said.





You'll be pleased to learn that Coronation Meats obtain their supplies mainly from local sources, which is so important in a country town such as ours, where we need to support our local farmers. Unfortunately, these days our markets are infiltrated by meat from overseas. Pork's a good example. I've spoken to local pig farmers; despite working long hours seven-days-a-week, they struggle to make a crackling because much of our pork these days is imported from across "the ditch" – New Zealand.

So when you see pork for sale, before you buy it, ask it a question. If it answers you with a funny accent, then it probably comes from New Zealand! Australian pork must surely taste a whole lot better – nice, healthy, tasty white meat, not All Black!

So, get in to Coronation Meat and get some pork on your fork or beef in your teeth or even some fish on your dish - Coronation's the place to go! It's a wonder Harry and Meghan didn't call in, whilst they were in Oz!






