Our Sporting Past and the Weather

It might be hard to believe but when we talk about famous cricketers, the most famous of them all gets a mention in the history of Tailem Bend. He never bowled a ball and never made a run for us; yes I am talking about the one and only Don Bradman.

I am going back to the organiser of a Tailem Bend Catholic Church Auction Dinner Fund raiser, local St Joseph Nun, Sister Kerry Keenan, who became envy of all cricket lovers when she met the most famous name in Australia and the world – Sir Donald Bradman.

She had earlier written to Sir Donald asking if he would autograph a bat for the Parish Dinner Fundraiser. He did agree and said to call on him. (See Photo - right) Sister Kerry did just that and is quoted as saying, "He was a delightful and lovely man," as she chatted with him while he signed the bat.

The auction dinner was a big success with the signed bat a feature of the night, after some spirited bidding an Adelaide man paid \$4,000 for the prized bat, which Sr Kerry described as a bargain, but was still very pleased with the result and other achievements on the night.

A long time ago if you were keen on sport the options were football, tennis, cricket and basket ball (netball) and of course bowls, when the time came. Rowing was also trendy with some big achievements that we will talk about later. Tailem Bend, in those days filled all teams comfortably and had an amazing record of outstanding athletes and supporters.



Tennis was extremely popular and still is, but not so widely spread in the smaller communities as it was when tennis courts existed almost everywhere. Tailem had two sides in the competition, Town and Railways - I don't know how long Town lasted.

Tailem's history of success is outstanding and I will present just some of it from an article I have from the centenary celebrations in 1987.

The local tennis club "aced' other organisations by being the first with a function to celebrate the Town's centenary. It held a special reunion dinner that committee members were hopeful, many past members would attend.

A spokesman at the time said that what was gleaned from records and investigations, the club was 51 years old. He said that from 1935 to 1939 the club was known as the Railways Institute Tennis Club, opposition teams at that time came from Jervois West, Chapman Bore, Woods Point and Tailem Bend.

A highlight was probably in the 1975/76 season when the association consisted of A, B, C, and D competitions and Tailem Railways won all four, the only club at the time in the history of the association.

The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #83

One of the club's most memorable players was Lottie Nottage, she was a champion player who held the title of State Hard Court Singles Champion during her career. She also won the Ladies singles and mixed doubles in 1951 at the Murray Bridge Jubilee Lower Murray Championships.

The 1987/1988 cricket Grand Final was won convincingly by Tailem Bend, but not without a lot of drama and fairy tale stories. Bowler Phil Kemp paved the way for the win taking 5 wickets for 43 runs. Tail end batsman, Michael Ruddock went in as night watch man and scored 59 runs. Then came a tantalizing state of affairs, he wasn't available for the semi –final, but replaced Andrew Hansen in the Grand Final. Hansen scored 80 not out in the semi final but missed out on the Grand Final due to his wedding day.

Captained by Champion batsman Trevor Krueger, Tailem dominated the 1980's, winning the flag in seasons 1981/82 - 82/83 - 83/84 - 85/86 - 87/88 - 88/89 / 89/90.

The weather has always been a topic of conversation, especially nowadays with climate change and the stormy and adverse conditions we are experiencing. Previous generations will say nothing much has really changed, with that in mind I will refer back to Barney Hattam's scrap book and reflect on some of his tales about the weather. I will present it as recorded by Barney.

"I drove down about two miles south of Policeman Point (Coorong) to do some duck shooting, selected my spot and settled down for the night. Next morning it seemed to become light early and then I couldn't believe my eyes when in the Deep South a huge storm started to form, but this one was so terrific I started to think something was starting to happen to the world. It was frightening to the eye as it rose up and curled like a huge damper.

Coming in the first time it died away and then came again in all its glory, bigger than ever it lasted about 20 minutes then quietly faded away to the north".

"Another time I was trapping rabbits between Moorlands and Kulde around a big sand hill. I was almost finished when a thunder storm broke, it rained very hard and then hailed so hard and big the country was covered in ice. Then after it melted I made my way back to my buckboard, on the way I had to wade through water knee deep coming down a hill. Eventually I found my bus under water, I managed to get the motor started and stayed the night at the ?? brothers farm, their stable was about two metres deep in water, they lived down a hollow and said it was the worst flood they had witnessed." (Barney can't remember the Brother's surname – ED)

Barney tells another couple of stories relating to near cyclone winds, he was around the Cooke Plains/ Elwomple area when the storm hit taking chimney's off farm houses and destroying watertanks in its path. It picked up a sheet of iron and took it about 400 metres and wrapped around a mallee



branch so tight a hammer and nails couldn't have done a better job. Barney took refuge in a farm house and when the storm subsided he went outside and couldn't find his Buggy, it had a hundred traps and harness on it. Eventually it came into sight on top of a giant scrub roller frame. I don't know how he got it down, probably with many helping hands.

Barney, in his memoirs, reminds us that there was plenty of adverse weather about in his day and not just a phenomenon nowadays.

Plenty more coming up including the Doceff - Long Family and dairy farmers Lui and Maria Brion. Anne Howell is also in the pipe line.





Business Profile - Post Office



Jason and Maxine Kiddie – Keeping the Flag Flying for Australia Post!

If there's one facility in town which is maybe taken for granted, it's the Post Office. Yes, our trusty old Post Office. Whatever would life be like without it? Sure, things have changed dramatically over the years but sending mail is still more affordable than most other things we pay for. Council rates, electricity, rego and telephone costs for a start!

Sending a letter to anywhere in Australia costs us a mere \$1, as for service, I recently had a parcel from Hong Kong arrive within 5 days. Beat that! And nowadays you don't even have to lick stamps and envelopes! How spoiled we are!

Australia Post – which in the past has operated under other names, like the original PMG (Postmaster General's Department) - has been around in Tailem since 1887 when mail was collected from the railway station. Back in those early days the poor posties first delivered on foot and then painfully pedalled push bikes around town! At one time it was known as "Royal Mail", but I don't think Her Majesty or any of her entourage ever did much in the way of deliveries!

From the early 1960's Maxine and her late husband, Nigel Kiddie worked in and around the place and became Licensees in 2008. Son Jason joined the workforce in 1992 and became Licensee in his own right in 2008. Our Post Office services a remarkably large area and boasts around 500 boxes and services 620 delivery points.

Allen Burt, our trusty "postie", is a Post Office Veteran since 1975 and holds the letter and parcel contract, so we mustn't underestimate his longstanding contribution to the operation. Allen just keeps on keeping on, rain or shine, with a smile on his face!

Tailem's Post Office was once a frantic hive of activity, the virtual social epicentre of our town. If you think about it, it still is! Of course, technology has changed almost everything in recent times, most significantly the emergence of email, which has caused letter writing to dribble to a trickle and each year reduces by 10%.

Thankfully, to compensate, online internet trading has

resulted in parcel-post booming to the extent that in December 2018 Australia Post experienced the biggest ever month for parcel volumes in its history! To cope, they employed more than 3000 extra staff Australia wide. On one day alone, 17 December, three million parcels were delivered. Not bad eh?

During the recent and very successful Scout Jamboree stationed at Motorsport Park, our post office was inundated with pallet-loads of parcels sent by mums and dads to their children. Fortunately, some of our local businesses experienced extra trade during that time as well.

These days, Jason Kiddie's the Post Office "front man" but is backed up by his cool-as-a-cucumber Mum, Maxine, who's always around when needed, as well as dedicating countless hours of her time to organising our iconic and popular Christmas Parade, without doubt Tailem's most prestigious and looked-forward-to event of the year. 2018's Parade was a ripper!

Tailem Bend is such a lucky town. We have so many people like Maxine who generously donate their time to organising various community events and activities. Let's give all those people three cheers while we are about it!

And let's face it, we've got arguably one of the most efficient, courteous and good-to-deal-with post offices in the country. Let's all appreciate that!
