



The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #94

KEVIN GRIFFITHS

After 26 years in the supermarket trade at Tailem Bend, Kevin Griffiths decided to call it quits, the businessman had become a familiar figure sweeping the footpath outside his IGA Friendly Supermarket in the town, every morning after opening the store. He liked to see a clean street and set an example getting out with the broom around 7.30am.

When he closed the business's door for the last time, fellow trader Robert Hughes, presented Kevin with a golden broom on behalf of the traders - <u>PICTURED RIGHT</u>. The occasion marked the end of an era, Kevin had operated the supermarket for almost 26 years, at times employing up to three girls.

He says he enjoyed the business, but even more, he loved the people he came into contact with through the store. He grew up in the Mallee town of Halidon, the son of farmers Alf and Winifred, one of 13 children. After attending Halidon school, Kevin worked on the farm and came to Tailem Bend looking for a working life, that included driving a patrol grader for East Murray Council, share farming in the Mallee and shearing in the sheds at Tintinara.

It was in 1975, after moving to Tailem Bend, that he took over the then Northcott's Four Square Store, at times working up to 60 and 70 hours a week, but Kevin was adamant it had been lovely - he said, "I loved the business and the people." After a good run of 26 years, he decided it was time for a change and the business was sold. We were lucky enough to have always got on very well with everyone, the customers were fabulous and always right.

Outside of work, Kevin's interests include Bowls, (Life Member) the football club from time to time, boating on the river and he has also been a part of the Tailem Bend Progress Association for several years - If any structure in the town needed painting, Kevin did it!

Every Easter, the family visited the Oakbank Races, they set up camp on the Flat and Kevin developed frog races as an activity for the youngsters. It was so popular, it grew into somewhat of an institution, kids came from everywhere to join in the fun.

I managed to catch up with Kevin and have a chat with him about life prior to Tailem Bend and his growing up in the Mallee. He was born 26/8/42 in the Murray Bridge Hospital, all his younger years were spent in the tiny town of Halidon where his parents were farmers. <u>BELOW LEFT</u> - Kevin attended school at Halidon, where, in its prime catered for 36 children with two teachers employed, over the years the number got down to 14 with just one teacher - always community minded, Kevin transported about six kids to school in a horse and cart - CENTRE LEFT.

Halidon's town population hovered around 10 with four railway homes keeping the numbers up, the East Murray Council Office was also situated at Halidon, with the clerk in residence.

Tailem Bend train crews were familiar with the railway siding, where they were busy handling pick-ups and takeouts for the farmers with their wheat stacks, but also parcels and so on, for the residents.

Kevin left school at 14 and soon found plenty of work rabbit trapping (<u>BELOW RIGHT</u>), driving tractors, spot lighting and seasonal work, bag sewing, shearing and fruit picking at Loxton.

Like all small communities Halidon had tennis courts and Kevin proudly said the team at one stage won five or six premierships straight. The main social night, out was the pictures at Karoonda.

As the photo shows (ABOVE RIGHT) he was the unofficial snake catcher, and there were always plenty in the Mallee to do battle with. He stresses though, that he mostly returned them to the wild, but with this giant one it was either the reptile or him.... Kev is still with us!


He said he share farmed for a while, and while it was hard work, he loved the atmosphere of the shearing sheds, with tongue in cheek, he said he would be still shearing today, if it wasn't for the dreaded bad back that shearers had to contend with.

Another Mallee highlight that stands the test of time are the Mindarie-Halidon horse races, an extremely popular event that has drawn huge crowds for over 100 years.

Kevin and his wife Sue, sold the shop in 2001 and are happily retired in Tailem Bend with no thoughts of moving elsewhere, they enjoy volunteering here and there, and a favourite pastime is simply sitting around their perfectly manicured garden with a gramophone, listening to their Slim Dusty records.

There is quite a few more stories in the pipeline, see you next month.

New CEO for Coorong District Council

COORONG APPOINTS FIRST FEMALE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

In a historic move, the Coorong District Council has appointed its first female CEO, Bridget Mather, (pictured right) an experienced senior executive who has worked for more than 25 years in leadership positions for local and Federal Government organisations. Ms Mather will begin with the Council in late January 2020, and with a strong background in people management and community engagement, will thrive on the opportunity to work alongside staff, elected members and the wider Coorong community. "I'm passionate about working with people and am looking forward to helping create vibrant places and spaces that make people want to live, work and play in the Coorong," Ms Mather says. "I also have the philosophy that if your staff are feeling engaged and genuinely want to come to work, then you can really deliver for your community. With this in mind, one of my priorities will be to help the staff overcome the disruption of recent times and get back to becoming the best organisation we can be."

Ms Mather says that while her move from the Mackay Regional Council will see her take the reins of a Council with a much smaller ratepayer base, the issues, industries and projects she is working on will have similarities. "I come from a farming background myself, so understand the challenges associated with the Coorong's biggest industry. I also see the opportunities the Coorong has to leverage and capitalise on its tourism potential. "This of course, all comes with ensuring a balance of serving the community and ensuring key infrastructure is managed and customer service is exceptional."

Ms Mather plans to live locally in the district with her husband, and has family based in Adelaide as well. She's keen to explore the beauty of the Coorong in 2020 after hearing great reports on the district. She's also passionate about volunteering and human rights, so will look to transfer those interests locally where possible.

Coorong District Council Mayor, Paul Simmons, says he believes Ms Mather will be an exceptional asset for the organisation, helping to lead the community, staff and Elected Members into a strong long-term position as it sets out to develop a new Strategic Management Plan (SMP) in 2020. "It's been a challenging 12 months



for our Council, there's no doubt about that. What we need now is a change in culture and a fresh start for our committed staff, Elected Members and most importantly – our community," Mayor Simmons says.

"Ms Mather will bring an objective vision to our organisation, and her extensive experience working with communities, stakeholders and customers with diverse needs in complex environments, will be vital to helping our Council take positive steps forward in the way we do business. "She also has some exciting projects to lead in 2020, including the development of the SMP and distribution of the \$2 million Federal drought funding."

Mayor Simmons acknowledged the exceptional efforts of the staff during the leadership transition at Council. "I would especially like to acknowledge the significant work of our Acting CEO David Mosel, who has worked around the clock to keep this organisation running. He has shown great leadership in the face of some difficult situations since stepping into the role in April, 2020. "Further, the staff's efforts in adapting to a new Elected Member body and managing the loss of two senior directors has been admirable, and I thank them for their support."

Ms Mather began her role with the Council on Monday, 20 January 2020.

In 1994 after 24 years' service, Kay retired and since then the facility has fallen into foreign ownership but still provides important local employment including many casual positions during the harvest season.



The first three events will be held from 12-5pm on January 5, February 2 and March 8, upstairs at Murray Bridge and Districts Community Club, and feature experienced open mic night host Crafty.

Coordinator Peri Strathearn - alter ego of Murray Bridge ukulele player Barney Rebel - said the network had developed in response to a Music Development Office push to get more live music happening in regional South Australia, and to meet a local need. "There's so much live music happening around the region that perhaps people don't know about," he said.

Old Tailem Town Fire

As told by Proprietor, Peter Squires:

On Friday 20th December, 2019, Marg was woken by a sudden loud bang. She woke me and said it looks like the sun is rising - it was now 1am Saturday morning. We quickly went outside to see what had happened and could see flames seventy to eighty feet in the air.

Seven fire units arrived, along with 15-20 Firemen and the police. It took approximately three hours to contain the fire. Four buildings had been lost:

The Theatre, built in 1906 - along with the projector.

The Murray Bridge Goods Office, built 1906.

The Talking Machine Parlour, this was from Long Flat, along with Records, equipment and the First Edison Recorded Sound. The Lamp Shop from Port Adelaide.

The General Store built in 1895 from Bordertown, of which the counter was made of Cedar. The Menswear Store was badly scorched, as was one of the old railway Coaches.

All the debris was cleared away by Frank Henderson. Peter hopes to make a Memorial Park on the site, until the buildings can be replaced – possibly with some donations from Enfield Historical Society – the estimated value of what was destroyed, is \$250,000.

So much history has been lost and if you have never been to Old Tailem Town, please go - it's well worth your time.

"Once an event like this has happened, you can never return - it's time to move forward," Peter says.

PANGARINDA HOSTS BOTANICAL GARDENS TRAINEES

Two volunteers guided the Trainees around the Garden, taking in the many plants flowering, answering questions and showing them the many Australian plants they had never seen, or even knew existed. Verticordias, (common name feather flower), was one of these, with a number of different species in full flower, even with the heat and low rainfall. Their time went too quickly and all hope to come back, knowing what treasures are to be seen here, so close to Adelaide.

It was the same day the Special Needs Class from Murray Bridge High were working with volunteers (their last day before Holidays), removing a few of the casualties from the dry. These young people have been coming most Wednesdays to work with us and doing a wonderful job. They were presented with a 'Thank You' Christmas card - on it two photos of them working at Pangarinda and a small Christmas decoration to hang on their Christmas tree. They were really thrilled and we did not forget the three teachers, who come with them.

The Rainbow Birds are flying around with young, we hope that most have left their burrow nests, as we have noticed a few that have been dug out by foxes. The White Browed Wood Swallows had many nests amongst the plantings - they also must be close to leaving with their young.

As the dry continues we are watching many plants suffering, hopefully a good rain isn't too far off.

The greatest Australian story never told - until now.

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

A sense of déjà vu...

All this talk of the weir at Wellington and the removal of the barrages in the Lower Lakes is giving me a real sense of déjà vu. What's more is that the information coming out about this is just as inaccurate as it was back in the years between 2006 and 2009. The lakes were originally freshwater lakes. The amount of water flowing down the river and discharging to the sea through the River Murray mouth stopped seawater from entering those lakes. For thousands of years, this was the case. It was not until Europeans started extracting water from the river and altering the amount of water entering the lakes that seawater began invading. This occurred from the late 1800s. The barrages were not built to create a freshwater environment but to preserve one.

Here are the facts as I see it. Opening up the barrages or building the weir at Wellington won't return the lakes to their original state as many people seem to think. Rather it would change what was originally a predominantly freshwater system into a lake with salt concentration levels higher than the ocean. If this was to occur there would be a great risk of salt water moving up the River Murray, compromising the environment (which is protected by the International Ramsar Convention) and risking the water supplies for many South Australians.

I understand that NSW is in a dire situation at the moment but the only thing that will help them is for it to rain, not what the NSW Deputy Premier is proposing South Australia to do. Statements which call for the Wellington Weir and removal of the barrages are as ridiculous as suggesting that all the other 3,500 man made structures should be removed from the system. The men driving piles into the river bed at the proposed weir site a century ago discovered that the piles would simply disappear. A decade ago the former state government encountered a similar situation when they spent tens of millions of dollars and found no suitable foundation for a weir. A healthy river system needs flows all the way to the sea and so we must ensure that the Murray Darling Basin Plan stays in place.


