




#### "King of the Road"

Norm Paterson was once headlined the 'King of the Road' a very suitable title as the story will tell, but to the many who knew him he was known far and wide as the Mayor of Cooke Plains and of course his wife Margaret was the Mayoress.

The names 'Paterson' and 'Cooke Plains Gypsum' are synonymous thanks to a business built up by Norm, him being the founder of Cooke Plains Gypsum and Paterson Transport and he is a living example of what can be achieved in the university of life. He was born in Loxton; his parents operated Paterson Bros Butcher Shop, 35 kilometres away at Alawoona. It was a unique brush walled shop/shed lined inside with fly wire which allowed a breeze to flow through keeping the meat cool. Meat bags had to be used during an incredible dust storm, all windows had to be closed and because it became so dark, kerosene lamps needed to be lit.

Norm attended school at Alawoona in the Mallee and also with his brother and sister drove a horse and cart 10 kilometres for further education at Veitch, picking up neighbours on the way. Only one teacher was needed there with, at times, only seven pupils in attendance.

The crippling depression forced the closure of the shop and Norm's father went back to farming until ill health forced him away from the farm, working for several years at Polltalock Station, south of Tailem Bend. It was a wonderful experience for Norm, having Lake Alexandrina as his playground.

Young Norm's first job was for bush-man's outfitter the famous RM Williams, making boots. He next worked for a year for the Chrysler/Dodge/De Soto company, welding seats for Standard Vanguard cars.

Returning to RM Williams, he did a five year boot making apprenticeship and hasn't been near a boot since.


During that time, his love of sport emerged and he played junior football for North Adelaide, men's basketball with South Adelaide and table tennis for the RM Williams firm. He also did National Service Training at Woodside. He first met Margaret in 1954 and they were married in her family Church, St Lutheran's, Wakefield Street, Adelaide. They went on to raise four children.

Having had enough of city life, they moved to Finniss, where Norm worked as a farm hand/manager on a property that carried sheep, cattle and had an irrigation program growing potatoes and peas.

They then made a move that eventually elevated them to Legend status.

The following is in Norm's own words, with a few prompts from Margaret.

\*\*In January 1958, we were offered and accepted a change in life style, relocating to Cooke Plains as manager of Cooke Plain's Gypsum Company and remaining there for 56 years in a wonderful friendly community. Margaret's first impression on the dunes was "It's just a BI\*\*dy big sand hill!" She was later to become, amongst many other things, manager of the screening plant, a real hands on task.

The equipment consisted of two five tonne trucks and a cable operated front end loader, as the business expanded it was necessary to upgrade to larger equipment. Initially gelignite was used to blast down the mine face, ranging around 12 metres high with mallee trees growing over the dunes - **<u>PICTURED BELOW LEFT.</u>** 

Care had to be taken to keep the product clean so in later years screening plants were purchased to make the gypsum cleaner and easier on Margaret. It was then transferred to a rail siding about five kilometres away, tipped into railway trucks from a ramp and sent to the cement and fertiliser works at Pt Adelaide. We purchased more equipment in 1968 and worked contract to the Gypsum Co. eventually purchasing the lease.

In 1958 1,000 tonnes of Gypsum was mined from the site, in 2002 it had risen to 60,000 now in 2018 the production stands at 95,000 with an estimated span of 30 to 40 years of mining to go. The name of Paterson Bulk Transport commenced in 1997, when our son Preston, joined the business.



Preston had a vision, and while I took some convincing at the start I was soon impressed with his enthusiasm and because of it, there are now 14 Paterson trucks on the road delivering all description of consignment.

The oval in the development days of Football Park at West Lakes also benefited from Paterson gypsum with 7,000 tonnes delivered to the site, which was not much more than a swamp. Another sporting client was famed Adelaide Oval former curator, Les Burdett, who insisted that Gypsum be delivered every September, no doubt to coincide with the changeover from football to cricket.\*\*

Back to your scribe;

In 2009 Norm was nominated and awarded an OAM (Order of Australia Medal) for his contribution to the community and the road transport and fertiliser industries. This recognition was a shock and a very humbling experience for him, but without doubt, a very worthy and gracious recipient.

I only found out about the award because Margaret showed Doris and me the award, proudly displayed on the wall. Couldn't be more deserved.

Then I had to do a lot of extracting before I could acknowledge just a few of Norm's awards for a lifetime of volunteering in the community and beyond, as the following list will show.

Cooke Plains Hall Committee; Norm was secretary from 1959 and remained on the committee until it was sold in 2012. He was involved in many activities whilst on the Hall Committee, including the Strawberry Fete, Amateur Hour, Deb Ball and Table Tennis. Norm started Junior Tennis and Football teams. As an inaugural member of Cooke Plains CFS, which was formed in 1961, he gave 49 years of service. He also spent 22 years on the Committee of Tailem Bend Ambulance.

As an outstanding sportsman, Norm played tennis, was Captain/ Coach of Border Downs A Grade football team and later coached Senior and Junior Colt's teams. He is a Life Member of several organisations.

More about the Gypsum; Norm started with a truck carting eight tonne loads of Gypsum and a front end loader with a <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> tonne bucket – today, its truck and trailer holds 32 tonne, B Doubles 42 tonne, also train rated trucks. The front end loaders now have seven tonne buckets all used in mining the gypsum and a bulldozer is also used, a far cry from the early operations. (**IMAGES PAGE 5**)

We move away for a while from the Gypsum and trucks and listen to a heart warming story from Norm and Margaret about the company's first truck - a Red Ford 600, bought in 1959. The truck, having earned its retirement, was dispatched and went missing! Many years later Grandson Sam, made enquiries about the whereabouts of the truck. Nobody knew, so Sam did some research and eventually managed to find it. He then painstakingly restored it (twice) and it now sits majestically on the Paterson property, never to be let out of sight again.

III health slowed Norm down a bit and now he and Margaret are happily retired in the Murray Bridge Lutheran Village Homes, leaving the business in the capable hands of their



son Preston, his wife Janelle and their Grandson, Tim. In closing, Norm said that to have achieved any of his goals, would not have been possible without the outstanding support he received from Margaret and Preston, who keep the family business going.

I hear you say. Well it's exactly as the name describes. It stops your warmed air escaping out of those holes in the ceilings above the oven and shower in your home. I have them in the last two homes I lived and they definitely do work. How do they work? I know you are now thinking. Well simply imagine a black top hat sitting above your vent in the ceiling. With one major difference. There are a couple of flaps that open and shut. They open when you turn on your fan to extract smoke when you burn your chops in the kitchen and then drop close when not in use. Therefore keeping the warmed air in your house. Not up in the roof space keeping those pesky spiders and mice nice and cosy.

The other way we lose heat is through our glass windows. Pelmets do wonders to prevent our warm air as it drops down the cold glass and cools significantly. As well as looking great in your home and being handy for using as a shelf for the kids trophies. They will keep your house warmer. ### Coorong: consumer spending hot spot

Spending in the Coorong grew 13.5% for the twelve months to quarter one (Q1) in 2018, according to the National Australia Bank (NAB) Quarterly Customer Spending Trends (Q1 2018) report, placing our region as the 6th highest of any regional local government area (LGA) in the country. The regional South Australian average was 9.5% during this period.

The Coorong is ranked above the provincial cities of Port Lincoln and Whyalla.

The average monthly spend in regional South Australia was \$1860 in Q1 2018, up from \$1711 in Q1 2017. The strongest growth in regional South Australian spending was in wholesale trade (68.3%), rental, hiring and real estate services (35.3%), financial and insurance services (27.0%), electricity, gas, water and waste services (18.7%), and accommodation and food services (15.2%) during the 12 months to Q1 2018.

Interestingly, Coonalpyn is listed in the top 20 postcodes by spending growth in Regional SA.

The report analyses spending patterns of NAB customers based on 2.7 million daily transactions, including EFTPOS, credit card, BPAY, bank transfers, direct debits, and PayPal services where available. It excludes payment for government services, taxes, direct to consumer manufacturers, and mortgage and other credit facility repayments.

#### Dogs and Cats Online

From July 1 2018 all dog and cat microchip information is required to be recorded on Dogs and Cats Online. Owners are responsible for documenting this information on Dogs and Cats Online if their cats were microchipped prior to July 1. Microchip implanters are responsible for documenting this information on Dogs and Cats Online if they microchip a dog or cat after July 1, 2018.

Owners will be able to login online any time and update their contact details in one place and notify councils if their cat or dog has gone missing.

Like dogs, you are also in charge of your cat's behaviour and containment. Cats that are allowed to roam freely can have a much shorter lifespan than cats that are safely confined by their owners. Outdoor roaming cats have an average lifespan of just three years compared to indoor cats, which can live to 15 years or more.

There are many options available to help you contain your cat to your property. These range from purpose built enclosures to fixtures that can be attached on top of your fences to prevent your cat leaving your yard.

Cats, at the very least, should be kept indoors overnight.

Indoor cats are safe from:

• Cars: cats can be injured or killed, or cause accidents, if allowed near roads

• Cat fight injuries: the most common injury from cat fights is an abscess. Abscesses are incredibly painful and can require costly veterinary treatment. Diseases such as FIV can also be transmitted during cat fights.


• Wildlife: preventing your cat from hunting wildlife and reducing the risk of your cat contracting diseases, fleas or worms from other animals

• Dogs: cats can be killed or seriously injured in dog attacks.



I wish to thank the Council for having the 2018-19 Budget meeting in the evening so that more Ratepayers could attend. Last year we had four people in the Gallery and this year we had 20+.

They also allowed formal & informal deputations and Question time from the Gallery and as requested they actually took minutes, although on reading them, there is some detail missing.

Lots of very interesting questions were asked, but Council seemed unable to answer some of the important questions regarding Finances. There were questions regarding the green hose, which Council seemed unaware DPTI have agreed to remove for us, when MSP will start paying Rates to help take the burden off the Ratepayers, next year apparently, and also the question was asked about Cargo Planes bringing cars and bikes into MSP, with the speaker concerned about Native vegetation. The Chair and the CEO claimed "it has all been taken out of their hands and State Gov. are allowing them to bring the planes in" .... I can tell you categorically there will be NO CARGO PLANES coming into MSP.

At the end of the meeting there was quite a bit of friction witnessed by all between the Chair and one of the Councillors and we all feel the outburst by the Chair was totally inappropriate behaviour and an apology is in order.

On the Budget: While a lot of questions have been asked about the Budget not a lot of changes have been made. We will find out on Tuesday how much our Rates will be going up, to date it is 3% + 1% Growth, awaiting the property valuations. The good news is neither the CWMS charge or the Kerbside Waste charge are going up and the water charge for Wellington East and Peake is going down, they will now be charged for every kl used.

The biggest concern is the level of debt our Council has shown in the Long Term Financial Plan, \$20 million in the next 10 years .... how on earth will the District survive?

CRAG believe it is time for change and are gearing up for the Council Elections in November. Please pass the word you <u>do not have to be a Ratepayer to vote</u>, as long as you are on the Electoral Roll at an address in the District or own a property in the District YOU CAN VOTE. If you know someone that would be good in Council, tell them to give me a call.

## The Elephant in the Room

Region gathers voicing concerns about their Districts financial future and a proposed \$20 million community loan at the Coorong District Council Annual Budget Meeting, Tuesday June 5, 2018.

As prepared deputations and questions from the floor were directed through the Chair, Mayor, Mallee Ward Representative, Neville Jaensch of Tailem Bend, guests in the gallery found themselves being entertained by colourful chest beating and grandstanding by some at the meeting, resulting in some leaving the meeting, not much the wiser.

After some time, it seemed that the elephant in the room was the financial burden of managing and maintaining our districts roads with less support from State and Federal Government. (More details in Tailem Topics soon)

With rumours rife before the meeting, Tailem Topics asked the Coorong District Council (CDC) the following;

- Is it a fact or fiction that the district needs to borrow \$20 million to stay afloat into the future?
- If this is a fact, how will the CDC fund this loan and the substantial yearly interest?
- If the CDC did not borrow the \$20 million, what would need to change and what services would need to be cut from the CDC budget?

As of the date of publication, Tailem Topics has not received a formal response to any of these questions, however, we found that questions one and two were addressed at the meeting resulting in our understanding that;

- The CDC needs to borrow \$20 million to stay afloat into the future.
- The CDC will fund this loan and the substantial yearly interest from general revenue

The last question remains outstanding and would be the most difficult to discuss openly, as many in the community may not want to hear what needs to change and what services would need to be cut from the CDC budget.







### Road Safety Tip - Speed

The speed limit that applies to a road or road related area is the maximum speed you are allowed to drive a vehicle. You should only drive to the speed limit if it is safe to do so. Consider the conditions, for example, poor weather or heavy traffic. The default speed limit on suburban roads is 50km/h and on rural roads 100km/h.

The speed limit on a section of road may be varied from the default speed limits, which will be indicated by speed limit signs.

Learner drivers and provisional licence holders must not exceed the 100km/h speed limit at any time.




