## The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #88

Ian Millard - Lawn Bowls

This month we look at Ian Millard (pictured below) as a champion sportsman, who brought many accolades to the Tailem Bend Bowling Club, with an amazing story about his time as a Lawn Bowler.



I can only add that I am thankful that I played with him and not against him !!!!

lan begins: "I came to Tailem Bend in January 1985 to work for my brothers at the Tailem Bend Bakery. I had only been playing bowls for a couple of months after starting as a fill-in for Kyneton Golf/Bowls Club in Victoria. I loved the game immediately, it was magic and I soon became obsessed with learning and improving.

I played in the Division 2 side for Tailem Bend until the end of the 1985 season. Noel Fairweather was my first Skipper. No bowls were played at Tailem Bend Club after the end of the season, Murray Bridge had greens open throughout the year and I joined as a practice member. Weather permitting I was there 3-4 days a week through the off season, pounding away! (A baker's life).

I was selected in the Tailem Bend Division 1 team for the 1986 season, leading for John "Tiger" Lyon, a man I would learn a great deal from. Over a couple of years I progressed to Skipper and my first rink was; Sam Shepherd leader, Peter Connolly second and the great Dick Allen, as my third. It was a terrific rink and we had a lot of success. It was a great era for the Tailem Bend Club; we won five Pennants

in a row and seven in ten years. I picked up a Club title or two, along the way.

As for my career in State Bowls, it was a case of right place, right time. State bowls was undergoing a transition to a younger, more dynamic, professional style. The South Australian Institute of Sport (SASI) began supporting and funding elite bowls and appointed a full time professional coach, Paul Richards.

A net was cast across the State for young talent and I was selected in the first State Development squad in 1987. From there I was invited to State trials in 1988 and spent two years trialling and playing in the State Second team against visiting Interstate sides.

In November 1989 I was selected in the State Team to play Victoria in the annual Loy Carroll Trophy in Horsham Victoria (IMAGE BELOW). My first state skipper was the legendary Alf Sandercock of Maitland, Alf had represented Australia 78 times and he was lured back to State bowls to help with the transition to a new era. Although he was 60 years old, he was still an extraordinary player and it was a privilege to have played with him.

SA was the national leader in taking bowls to a new level, coloured shirts, team track suits, exercise programs, psychology, diet etc, it must have shocked the Vic's in 1989 - we beat them for the first time in 10 years. We went on to defeat them for the next six years in a row.

I was fortunate to play in a most successful era for SA, I played across all states and territories representing the state 70 times. SA won test series in Victoria, NSW, Queensland and WA in this era, no mean feat when you consider the numbers of players and depth of talent in the eastern states; we would often be playing against three or four current or former Australian representatives.

The highlight of the State bowls calendar was the National Sides Championship, played out between all states and territories annually. I played in five series in six years, only missing one due to the birth of my daughter Ellie.

We went so close to winning on three of those occasions, particularly in Adelaide in 1993 where we literally lost on the last bowl played after a week of fierce competition.





## The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #88

Among the highlights of my career was playing in the final of the Australian Fours Championship in Hobart in 1990. While we were beaten, it was a great experience to play in a big national final, so early in my career. In 1993 I won the state fours with a composite team of fellow state players, Ron Rudiger of Holdfast Bay, David Chapman of Mt Barker and Neil Lemmey of Berri. We had been runner up the previous year and it was a thrill to get a state title to my name.

One of my fondest memories is playing against a five man New Zealand National side at the Murray Bridge RSL Club in 1991. They were playing a series of matches against SA and our local zone was picked to play a warm up game. The Old RSL Club was a great venue, the green, being set down below the clubhouse made for a great atmosphere, and there was a good crowd in attendance. In the morning I skipped the triples with Alan Forest of Meningie and Ralph Zacker of Tintinara on the lead and we had a good win, in the afternoon I played 3rd man for Bruce Atrill in the fours, we had a really hard fought close game and were lucky enough to scrape in with the win. It was great to play in front of a local crowd. NZ returned to SA in 1993 and I represented SA Country this time, playing in Berri. We were lucky enough to win all games, so I remain undefeated in international competition!!

Playing bowls at the elite level is all encompassing; you are required to play in a multitude of events in addition to State trials, practice and games. Weekends, holidays, after work practice are all dedicated to the game. In 1996 I decided to retire from State Bowls to spend time with my family. It caused a great controversy within the State ranks, I think I was the first one to do this; most players keep going until they get the boot. I played for six years without ever being dropped, a rare thing.

I stopped playing altogether in 1998.

I had great support from my family, Tailem Bend Bowling Club and the Meningie District Council (my employer at the time). Many thanks to all.

Work took me to Tintinara for a few years and I played two seasons there, we won the pennant in 2005 and in 2006 I won the club singles and the Upper South East Champion of Champions. In 2009 I returned to Tailem Bend and played the pennant season. The highlight was having my brother Graeme as leader in our rink and winning the Pennant that year.

Bowls is a great game and a great leveller, as "Tiger" Lyon used to say "you had better learn how to loose laddie, because it happens a fair bit in bowls". He was right and among the success there were plenty of defeats. It probably took me longer to learn than it should have. That is the nature of bowls.

## **Probus Report**

### **MAY 2019**

President Joyce Medlow welcomed 15 members to the May meeting. There were seven apologies.

### <u>VISIT TO "AUSSIE APRICOTS" AND MYPOLONGA</u> PRIMARY SCHOOL

The President summarised the Club's visit to Mypolonga on May 17th firstly visiting "Aussie Apricots", whose confectionery line is sold as far away as Western Australia. They then visited Mypolonga Primary School where Principal Rita O'Brien (a daughter of Probus member Anny Mussger) spoke enthusiastically about the school's much praised programme which centres not only upon providing a sound education, but also concentrating upon important characterbuilding activities. The school's glowing reputation is such that there is a long waiting list for new students. No mean task!

Brenton, who comes from a "volunteer background", previously served on council in 1997 and now enjoys the responsibility of playing an important role in Council activities. He currently serves on several committees and panels.

Brenton said that his own personal agenda as a council member is "to reduce council costs by improving efficiency".

### The Nitty Gritty - Cr Glynis Taylor

A lot has happened since the election in November. Council has created a number of new committees after many concerns were raised with what has been perceived as high rates. The Finance Committee consists of all elected members who delve into Council's finances with high levels of detail. An Infrastructure and Assets Committee has also been created to address how the asset management plans and capital works planning is tracked. Council has a number of issues to work through to reduce the burden of costs on the ratepayers and looking at the assets which Council holds, will go some way to addressing this. One of the problems with holding so many assets is, over a period of time they depreciate in value and need repairs or replacement. Money has to be set aside or borrowed in order to deal with this depreciation or replacement. One way to reduce this burden is to sell off excess assets which is something council might look at in the near future. One of our biggest and most costly assets of course, are roads. We can do very little to reduce the burden on the ratepayers for repair and maintenance of the unsealed road network, but hopefully adding extra grading will over time, bring the roads back to an acceptable level of use. We are currently working on next years budget and ultimately, the rates. The Audit Committee is a legislative requirement of all councils which acts as an oversight committee. It has three elected members and an external accounting expert - the Auditor. What is clear from the Auditor, is that council is currently in an unsustainable position and is in fact, in deficit. The original deficit was projected to be in the region of \$1.7m for the next budget year, but with some work, the elected members have managed to get this down closer to \$1.4m, with a commitment to reduce it further. That is not however, where it stops, as we are working hard to reduce the capital borrowings and amend and adjust the Long Term Financial Plan. There will be more regular updates in Tailem Topics for you all, now that the elected members have got through the mandatory training sessions.

## **Snail Farm at Coonalpyn**

A small community is changing how we approach dementia care

In the Mallee region of South Australia, is a very special woman, passionately leading her community, and changing how we approach dementia care. Claudia Ait-Touati, from Coonalpyn, (PICTURED RIGHT) has spent years establishing Careship Coorong, a care farm that is providing people living with disabilities and dementia, a holistic alternative to traditional care.

Claudia is originally from the Netherlands, and migrated to Australia several years ago with her young family, where they settled in Coonalpyn. When her father was diagnosed with dementia back home, Claudia came across care farms. She was intrigued by the concept, which focuses on providing opportunities for sufferers to be outdoors, engaging all of their senses and interacting with nature, in a safe and relaxed environment.

'We see tremendous joy and pleasure in our guests, when they are able to help on the farm. They feel they are contributing their time and skills to a worthwhile cause, and we can see the benefit that a sense of self-worth and belief gives them. I have a background in disability care, and I can see really positive results from this approach to care.'

Careship Coorong is run by a dedicated group of community volunteers, operating a snail farm in Coonalpyn. Care farm guests assist with the breeding, feeding and harvesting of thousands of snails, which are destined for the tables of some fabulous Australian restaurants. The volunteers are currently hosting about ten guests on each visit.

Claudia's initial interest in care farming and dementia care grew into a real vision with many years of hard work, fundraising, and building a dedicated group of volunteers. It's amazing how those seeds of interest have grown over the years. It's so pleasing to see so many volunteers giving their time for others,' Claudia said.

'It is an ongoing battle to secure funding, and I spent many months studying how to write grants and proposals, and learning how to form a board, and the many legalities and requirements of forming an organisation such as Careship Coorong. Despite the many hours of work and some frustrating setbacks, every time we see the community coming together to support us and our guests, we know it's worth every minute of effort.'

Claudia is a very busy woman, like most dedicated volunteers. She operates a small business, the waffle shop at Coonalpyn (more about that success story in a future post), has a family to look after, and she is a tireless community volunteer. But most importantly, she is a great example what hard work and passion can achieve in small communities.



## Vinnies CEO Sleepout - The Bend Action

The Vinnies CEO Sleepout is a one-night event held across Australia during Winter. Hundreds of CEOs, business owners, community and government leaders sleep outdoors to support Australians experiencing homelessness. Approximately 6,220 people are currently classified HOMELESS in South Australia, 1 in 5 are aged between 25 and 30 years, and 60% are men (Law and Justice Foundation of New South Wales 2019). Each CEO Sleepout participant commits to raising thousand of dollars to help Vinnies provide essential services to the people who need it. In 2018 Vinnies raised 6.9 million and the current total (at 9:30am 21st June 2019) is \$7,010,172 of a \$7m target.

Last night (Thursday 20th June), 96 "CEOs" slept (or rather didn't), including me on concrete at Sultram Place in central Adelaide raising \$651,524 (so far). It was one of the coldest nights of the year (so far) hovering between 5 and 6 degrees. For the first time in its 8 year history, the venue had a roof. Previous locations have included the lawns of Government House and the pitch at the Adelaide Oval. I think in a way I got off lightly. Possessions were strictly limited to a sleeping bag, a pillow and whatever we could wear. Cardboard was provided along with endless tea, coffee, hot chocolate, fresh fruit, energy bars and water. The evening started with official photographs, registration, then hot soup in Vinnies mens crisis centre next door at Whitmore Square. We then had some sobering videos, talks and presentations from people who have experienced homelessness and who wanted to share their story. There is particular interest to keep the spirit of F1 alive with an invitation for historic F1s to still come and roar in South Australia.


By mid-July The Bend will announce further details on event scheduling and categories following registrations of interest



### \*\*\*\*\*PANGARINDA BOTANIC GARDENS – JUNE 2019\*\*\*\*\*

Pangarinda Botanic Gardens recorded 29ml of rain in the second week of June, the most received since November 12 months ago. It is amazing how quick the plants have responded to this much needed rain. Plants that were looking very dry, are showing green leaves, some coming into flower.

If walking the gardens take a longer walk to the back west corner to see the two forms of Eucalyptus caesia flowering. Eucalyptus caesia \*subsp magma\* a tall weeping tree to 6m, with bluish grey leaves, red to dark pink flowers hanging amongst glauous clusters of seed pods. Known as Silver Princess. Eucalyptus caesia \*subsp caesia\* has a more open appearance, smaller leaves and buds, with lighter pink flowers. A very pretty tree. The Minniritchi bark adds beauty to both. Native to Western Australia found growing in Granite rock habitat.

The exhibition features eight large-scale camera obscura photographs by the contemporary Australian artist Robyn Stacey, **PICTURED LEFT**.

First shown as part of the 2016 Adelaide Biennial of Australian Art: Magic Object, Stacey's mind-bending camera obscura photographs depict an optical device of wonder, whereby the external world is trapped and inverted within the room.

Included in the exhibition are camera obscura photographs of iconic and well-known sites around Adelaide, including the Brookman Building at the University of South Australia, Carrick Hill, The Cedars at Hahndorf, the Institute Building, The Lighthouse Wharf Hotel in Port Adelaide, Parliament House and the South Australian Health and Medical Research Institute (SAHMRI). In the artist's words, these bewildering photographs become "a mash up of inside and outside".

## **Bowel Cancer Screening Awareness**

Health organisations are urging all country South Australians aged over 50 and those who have any potential bowel cancer symptoms to 'Get Screened and Get on With Living' as part of the National Bowel Cancer Screening program.

Keen to help spread the word is 48 year-old Clare viticulturist and father of four, Scott (Scooter) Smith (below right). A few years ago Scooter had what he now knows were bowel cancer symptoms. He didn't think too much of it at the time and carried on. But when Scooter continued to have blood in his stools, he knew he needed to get himself checked out.

Scooter went to see his GP. A few days later a colonoscopy revealed he had a tumour the size of a small apricot and was told it was more than likely cancerous. He had a CT scan straight after, to see if the cancer had spread.



"Waiting for those results was the worst four days of my life. There were definitely a few tears with my wife and my four kids," said Scooter.

"I didn't know

where else in my body it had spread and all the worst possible thoughts go through your mind when your mortality is questioned."

Four days later we found out the cancer hadn't spread. Scooter was booked in for surgery the next day to remove the tumour and 40 centimetres of bowel, along with 19 lymph nodes around the bowel. They were sent away to pathology, five days later, he was told that the cancer had spread into only one of the lymph nodes, which was situated next to the tumour. The rest were clear.

Scooter's message is shared by the 'Get Screened and Get on with Living' campaign developed in partnership between Cancer Council SA, Country SA PHN and Adelaide PHN. "We're very pleased to be involved in encouraging country South Australians to get screened. It's very important that we help spread this message as much as we can. The simple test literally helps save lives," said Kim Hosking, Country SA PHN Chief Executive Officer.

"If I hadn't gone into my GP when I did and waited until I had my routine screening at 50 years of age, it could have been too late. The cancer wouldn't have been detected until I was at stage four and nothing could help me then. I was statistically at a stage three instead," said Scooter.

He added, "I can't encourage people to get tested strongly enough. Don't ignore anything. Listen to your body – if something feels not quite right, chances are they're not and you need to get checked out.

Thomas Foods rebuild will lead to thousands of jobs Member for Hammond Adrian Pederick welcomes Thomas Foods International big announcement that it will build a state of the art meat processing facility at Murray Bridge.

Thomas Foods International Chief Executive Office Darren Thomas has today confirmed the new facility will be built 10km outside the town on a greenfield site.

True to their word Thomas Foods will rebuild in Murray Bridge.
