





The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #76

Diary of HH Hattam

Annette Hattam has made available to me, a diary full of Tailem Bend history kept by her late husband's father. It contains some amazing and humorous stories, but because it is hand written, it might be a struggle for me to present it as accurately as I would like. To make it easier I will re – produce it as "Barney" recorded it in his own words, and we must remember a lot has changed in Tailem Bend as we go back in time, one moment at a time.

**1982 - My name is Howard Harold Hattam of 5 East Terrace, Tailem Bend, born on the 21st of May 1908, I was three weeks old when I came to Tailem Bend. I am the third son of James and Anny Hattam. There were five boys and one girl in the family and at the age now of 74, I am known as the oldest Tailem Bend resident. At a recent back to Tailem School, my name wasn't even mentioned, perhaps I talk a little too straight for some of the elite.

We lived in a house close to Fred's landing, I was six years old when I rowed my boat across the river and fished. The only thing I didn't like was McFarlane's hydro plane kicking up too many big waves.

In 1914 all our family friends went to war, also in 1914 was the biggest drought Australia experienced. The salt water came down the River Murray as far as Mannum and the Railways had to truck fresh water from Morgan for their locomotives. The shore was littered with dead fish and the sea fish came up the Murray in droves, shoals of Mullet,

Mullaway, Whiting and Bream. This suited me down to the ground, plenty of fish.

There were five houses then, Hattams, Harry Fletcher, an old Englishman, Batchler, Billy Miller, Rolly Kropinyeri and a Mr Wilks, on the southern side of Billy Miller's house. A party of 80 indigenous people came and lived in the area east of our house. I used to go out fishing with Queen Wilizer and King Billy, Queenie always called me her little Grandson. On one occasion, they held a big dancing session on the wharf, holding a stick in each hand while dancing around a fire.

The Duke and Duchess were there and later visited Allan Mcfarlane's place at Wellington Lodge.

I saw the Jervois swamps flooded six times - a Mr Jervois owned the land and used it for grazing, of course they didn't have the banks they have now.

The 1956 flood was the biggest of them all, all the swamps along the Murray went under, the Lakes were so high the water flooded the plains right up to Cooke's Plains and went under the railway lines.

The Meningie-Tailem Bend road was nine feet under water in places, I was Line Foreman with the

PMG at the time and carried a boat on the truck to clear the faults, which were many.**

I'll give "Barney" a spell and narrate a few of his life experiences, as I find them in his diary.

He saw a big change come over Tailem Bend when the rail-ways shifted there from Murray Bridge, he worked on the building of the loco round house and also shoveled concrete, while the railway cottages were being built and remembers that six passenger trains operated in and out every day except Sunday. As time went on, that was brought back to just one, called the 'Bluebird' that went as far as Mt Gambier.

The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #76

When he went to the Tailem Bend Primary School, there was only one room with four curtained partitions - on one side was Grades 1, 2 and 3, on the other was 4, 5, 6 and 7. The play ground caused gravel rash, so it was wise to keep your footing. Barney played the Kettle Drum for four years and the School also had a Pipe Band. Cooke's Plains and Wellington had Schools before Tailem Bend and a Miss Tilbrook walked to Wellington and back each day. (Barney doesn't say if she was a teacher or a student).

Barney was about 15 years old when Tailem Bend held horse racing at Roy Gardiner's farm (1923) just off what is now Granite Road. They used to race around a sand hill, you saw them when they started and after they traversed the hill, then you saw them again as they straightened up for the run home.

Quite a bit about the Main Street came to the fore, citing names, shops and buildings. Clarry Farrell built his home and Garage on the southern end of the street next to where Jaensch's Garage is now and once owned by Len Westphalen. Both buildings still stand today.

Henry Tiller was there, as was Bodley rabbit freezers. Other names were Driscoll's, Charlie Hill and Mason. The hotel went from one story to two, with the best known publican being Herb Smith.

It's a pity Barney didn't include dates in his memoirs but some people he named do go back a long way; Ross Wehl managed Smorgan's rabbit freezer, that was situated in the railway yards opposite the Anglican Church, his father (Pattricia Wehl-Connolly's grandfather) owned a Saddlers shop in the Main Street, making saddles and harnesses for the farmers. This shop was eventually turned into a betting shop.

<u>Porpoises in the River Murray!!</u> This is a most interesting story, so I will present it in Barney's own words as logged in his diary.

**"I was still working for Bill Shankland down the Wellington end of the Murray and was rowing myself over the river on the way home, when half way across I saw what appeared to be a boat turned upside down. Taking a closer look I could see it wasn't a boat, it had fins and a body, I thought sharks, so I took off as fast as I could. Landing on the other side, I caught up with the ferry master, Mr Temby.



I pointed the "Sharks" out to him and he said, "Barney they are porpoise's, three of them".

The Wellington ferry master, Harry Stacey, had rang Mr Temby telling him to watch out for them.

They hung around Tailem for a few weeks but the water was too fresh for them, two disappeared and the third one was found near George Edward's water front, a couple of us roped him and towed him back near the ferry where he was disposed of.**

I'll close with Barney's skill as a fisherman, his biggest haul was 131kg of mullet, caught out of six nets in the Coorong, (not much skill with nets) anyway, he and his grandson Glenmore, were cleaning fish nearly all day. His biggest job was keeping Glenmore's mind on the task at hand.

Barney also noted that in 1988 the local saleyards were bulldozed down, he lamented, "no more yarding sheep, nor cattle for trucking, no more sheep sales". There is a lot more of Barny's history of Tailem recorded, which I will present from time to time. In the meantime, next month we will hear about the life and times of Norm and Margaret Paterson mining gypsum at Cooke's Plains.

Further down the track I have a story and pics about my Uncle, Bert Wachtel and his family who farmed at Naturi. I am sure my "Cocky" friends, Davey and Scotty will find it most interesting.

# **Property Matters**

Recently I replaced gutters on a few homes in the area, including a caravan that also needed flashings.

Two of the homes had very visible wood rot that had developed over time. One only needed a few sections of rot cut out and replaced. The other however, not only needed entire sections of fascias replaced, it also needed roof rafters replaced and strengthened. Eves were replaced in one area, along with some rusted out roofing iron. The previous owner had let things slide for too long, so the current owner called me to help deal with these issues and have them repaired. The house now looks GREAT - back to its former Glory!

Check out photos on my new Facebook page - "Town and Country Tradesman".

I urge you to address any rusty or leaky gutters <u>NOW</u>, before winter really sets in. Often the damage is unseen as gutters often rust on the side you don't see. Over time, timber fascias rot easily when exposed to water.

I got breathalysed recently. The police officer sternly said, "Blow in this tube until I say stop". Of course, I complied. Looking at the screen he said "Driver, I have to inform you that you have tested positive - to Tasty Chicken. But lucky for you it's only high-low range. But you must have consumed more than two standard chicken legs." I had to admit, I had also had a few slices of chicken breast too.!Anyway, he let me go with a warning.

My chicken had of course come from that well-loved 'Tasty Chicken' shop just off the Tailem main street near the highway. It's been there nearly fifty years and the owner for the past 12 years, Cherie Nicholson and her team, have recently upgraded much of the kitchen equipment and have done a very decent job of renovating the customer area. Cherie employs a team of about nine, with three cockerels out the back slaving over hot cookers, and six chicks serving the flock of customers.

Tasty Chicken got off the ground in the 1970's, by an affable and robust Scotsman from Ayr, Scotland, named Alistair McHarg. Alistair has since passed away, no doubt moving to that beautiful chicken coup in the heavens. In earlier years Alistair was famous because of his magnificent bass-baritone voice which saw him perform at many famous English theatres and eventually, when he moved to Australia, he appeared regularly on television, including *Adelaide Tonight*, back in the days of black and white telly. When I called in to interview Cherie, there was a 'truckie' waiting for his order. He comes from Melbourne and visits Tasty Chicken a couple of times every week, without fail. "This is the best chicken shop between here and Melbourne," he said. Nice compliment. If you read reviews on Google, you'll see lots of similar compliments.

Who knows the real reason for Tasty Chicken's popularity? Maybe it's the friendly staff, or maybe, Cherie's got her very own blend of secret herbs and spices! But they've got heaps of other tasty stuff to satisfy the hungry, like tasty fish and chips, tasty steak sandwiches and tasty burgers I asked Cherie if the opening of *Motorsport Park* had resulted in any increase in trade. "Unfortunately, not yet," she replied, "We could all do with some signage on the highway to bring more people into town."

#### Restrictions on Burning in the Open

On 23 July 2016, the Environment Protection (Air Quality) Policy 2016 commenced operation. This policy places restrictions on what can be burnt in backyards across the state.

In general backyard burning is prohibited in all council areas across the state. There are exceptions to this general prohibition including:

- For the purpose of preparing food or a beverage
- For the purpose of heating an outdoor area, if you are in a residential area you must use only charcoal or cured wood.
- The burning of agricultural waste of forestry waste is permitted on non-residential premises
  provided the matter is dry and reasonable steps are taken to avoid the burning of matter within
  200 meters of any adjacent residential premises.

Anyone wishing to undertake burning outside of the above exemptions and outside of the fire danger season (when the Fire and Emergency Services Act 2005 will apply) will be able to apply to council for a permit. Permits may set out any conditions, including restrictions on times of burning and types of fuel.

#### **Efficient Burning with your Combustion Heaters**

Burning right is not only good for the environment and peoples health by reducing wood smoke pollution, it is also good for your wallet hence reducing your heating costs. In winter, smoky wood heaters can produce as much air pollution as cars. Help clear the air and reduce wood smoke pollution in your community. The following tips are recommended for better burning efficiency and reducing excessive smoke:

- Burn only dry, seasoned wood.
- · Never burn rubbish, driftwood, painted or treated wood.
- Wood should be stored under a roof to keep it dry and in a ventilated area.
- Use kindling wood, paper or firelighters to start the fire and add larger pieces of wood when a bed of red-hot coals is established.
- Keep the wood heater air vents open for 20 minutes after lighting the fire.
- Ideally do not use a low setting overnight or when you go out as it will smoulder. Smouldering
  can produce up to 10 times more smoke.
- Remember to have your flue/chimney cleaned every year to prevent creosote build-up.





### Ally's Canine Column

### Dogs and the Law continued from last month....

You are legally responsible for your dog's behaviour, and must maintain "effective control" when taking your dog in public. This means:

- Using a leash no longer than two metres when walking your dog in public.
- Ensuring your dog remains within your sight and responds to basic commands. This means your dog will come when called, and understands other commands. Refer to your local council for a list of on and off leash areas
- Ensuring your dog does not enter a school, kindergarten, childcare centre or shop without appropriate permission.
- Ensuring your dog does not chase or harass other people, dogs or animals, including birds and native wildlife

- Greyhounds must be kept on a lead and muzzled in public places, including off-leash areas like dog parks and beaches. You can apply for a muzzling exemption from the Dog and Cat Management Board. Even if exempted from wearing a muzzle, your greyhound must still be kept on a leash at all times in public places.

You must also clean up after your dog. Dog droppings pose a health risk to the community and other dogs. By law, you must immediately clean up after your dog in public places. Failure to do so can incur an expiation.



Thought for the Month

Consider if you will, why we have just one mouth to speak words out, yet two ears to receive words in.

With just one mouth to control, or attempt to or not control, we have the ability to bless someone, or cause ourselves and others much trouble or pain with what we speak. (Whether intentional or not).

It is just as well we have only the one mouth.

On the other hand, (or is it head) we have two ears to listen with and (understand, or fail to understand), hear what is being said by others as they share their thoughts, opinions and time with us.

Prov.18: 2. A fool has no delight in understanding. But in expressing his own heart. (NKJV) *Fools have no desire to learn; They would much rather give their own opinion. (CEV)

There are times when we all have difficulty in conversation and discerning the words being spoken. Could it be perhaps that there are times we listen too little and speak too much and\or too soon?

Prov.18: 13. He who answers a matter before he hears it, It is folly and shame to him. (NKJV) *It is stupid and embarrassing to give an answer before you listen. (CEV)

To receive instruction (knowledge) we must first listen, and to become wise we must understand. To understand we must pay attention to (the meaning of) what the speaker has to say so that we receive the information correctly. It is only when we receive the correct information of what is said, that we are able to discern the truth of what we hear.

In essence, be guiet and listen to the person you are in conversation with, allow the person to finish their thoughts spoken to you without interruption, don't consider your reply until the person has finished speaking, and ensure you understand the content of what they mean to say. Only then should you reply.

Healthy conversation doesn't always agree, but it does always accept opinion and searches out the truth (agreement) of the matter discussed.




But her early encounter with Logan reveals a man full of contradictions. His deep empathy for horses and those he







