Tailem Bend's Uneek Animals Attraction

What a wonderful, innovative and imaginative attraction this exhibit is, made entirely of tin.

It demonstrates the depth of creative talent which exists within our community, and the town's ability to bring creative ideas to fruition.

Sponsored by the Tailem Bend Lions, Lions Clubs Australia, the Coorong District Council and by generous community members, it features a collection of more than 50 Australian animals, birds and reptiles crafted from tin, housed in a custom-built shed adorned with murals depicting their typical habitats.

As well as being a "very different" exhibit which interests residents and itinerant visitors from throughout Australia, and from overseas, this exhibit also serves as an educational tool to teach schoolchildren about local fauna.

Crafted by locals, this impressive exhibit took around two and a half years to construct following five years of planning.

It was opened in November 2017 by Member for Hammond, Adrian Pederick, and Project Manager, Councilor Bob Simcock described the facility as "*one* heck of a community project that speaks volumes about us".

Lloyd Downs

This month we have the opportunity to dig into the memoirs of Lloyd Downs, most people would know Lloyd, he was born in Murray Bridge but was raised in Tailem Bend and it has always passionately been his home. We go back to 2004 when he retired after 29 years in the railways.

At the time he was president of the Tailem Bend Football Club and an all round volunteer, a role he loved and was strongly supported by his wife Sharon.

During the season, he was there each Saturday from 8am until the clubrooms closed that night to ensure everything was running smoothly. First up he said he and a band of volunteers check that the oval insurance is in order, then Lloyd goes on to meet with the team manager of the junior sides, to ensure there are boundary and goal umpires, scorers, time keepers and score board attendants all in place. Throughout the rest of the day he is still kept busy talking to club members and supporters and of course barracking for his team.

With his character and quick humour Lloyd is a real people person, and gives full credit to those who volunteer around the club.

It's an enjoyable job when you've got people like I do supporting the club. I remember helping to plant this oval when I was 12 years old, he said it feels good to be still around helping in a much different capacity. It is a good club and community to be part of.

Not only is Lloyd heavily involved in his football club, but is a well-known face around Tailem Bend and was nominated for an Australia Day award for 2004. *"I would be embarrassed if I was awarded something like that, because it's the people around me helping out that makes me look good he said"*

He and Sharon have lived in Tailem Bend all of their lives and have two boys Paul and Todd and one grandson. (All grown up now). Lloyd was a self – funded retiree when he made this interview and worked two shifts a week at a local service station. It was a good job but at times he confessed he spent too much time chatting to the customers. Also he said he got to know nearly all the truckies that called in.

He also looked after the local swimming pool and has been known to play the role of Santa Claus, he did have to wear gloves however, because he joked all of the kids would know from the tattoo's that it was old Lloydy".

Another clipping I came across portrayed Lloyd as the retiring primary school football and cricket teams coach. The photo shows the students honouring Mr. Downs one of their longest serving coaches with a special plaque.

He mainly gave up coaching after 10 years he said because his youngest son Todd was going onto high school. He started coaching the under eights and from there, with other parents moved onto the football club where he coached the under 13 side and the under 15s.

One of the greatest rewards came when eight of the youngsters he coached at school were playing together in Tailem's senior side. I got a lot of satisfaction out of that Lloyd said, and one of them, Tony Hughes, won the club's best and fairest trophy, also he saw three players from his school teams go on to play league football in Adelaide. He went on to say that showed that the introduction of SA Primary School football was the best thing to happen to the game.

Lloyd who played about 300 games for Tailem Bend between 1959 and 1981 said he loved his footy and it was so good to him he just wanted to put something back into the game.

The transition from coaching football was not too difficult, although he admitted to being a lounge – room cricketer. At the age of 42 I played my first full game of cricket at Meningie, I made 2 not out (Run out of partners Lloyd)?? He also played tennis for 14 years. School Principal Neville Gotch said he always knew that the football and cricket teams would be in good hands as long as Lloyd was there.

The plaque is inscribed, in part, from past and present schoolboys and parents.

Lloyd was a bit humble when talking about himself so I called on a lifelong friend Terry Connolly to take over on the footy side of his talents.

Terry Reflects

Lloyd was a very skilful left footer and half forward flanker who was very much underrated. As a junior, he captained the under 16s side and went on to play many fine games for the TBFC, but his defining moment was being a member of the 1970 League premiership side. As a footballer, Lloyd played the game in a courageous, physical and totally fearless manner, but above all he was the consummate team mate.

For us younger players just making our senior debuts it was always nice to know Lloydy was there to look after you. He didn't go overboard by any means, but he did intimidate his opponents by letting them know that they would have to deal with him if they touched one of the young ones, which suited me just fine. We all walked a bit taller when Lloyd was in close vicinity.

To give you an idea on how good a team mate he was - It was late in the 1970 GF, I was on the forward flank and our coach Geoff Lokan was playing at full forward when out of the blue he said to me "can you give Lloydy a run" Although not happy, I wasn't going to argue with the great Geoff Lokan, so I ran towards the boundary where Lloyd was standing and said "you're on mate" and he said to me and I will never, ever forget his response "no mate, you have been on all day so stay on, I'm happy to watch"

Not too many people would do that, as being on the ground in a GF when the siren goes and the team has won is one of the most enjoyable experiences a footballer can experience. His contribution to the TBFC as a player and an administrator, should never be underestimated. *Thanks Lloyd and Terry.*

DISAPPOINTING NEWS FROM THE BEND

In an "Open Letter" to the press on June 19, The Bend Managing Director, Sam Shahin, displaying obvious personal disappointment, announced that due to - no surprise of course - COVID-19 restrictions, the eagerly anticipated 2020 Supercars event due to take place in September has this year been deleted from the Supercars calendar.

The first two years of Supercars 4-day events proved to be an outstanding success with motor racing fans, and received accolades from far and wide from sources within the industry.

Mr Shahin said "We've (The Bend and South Australia) answered the calls, providing the best motorsport facility in the world, but it seems the power of the Eastern States yet again wins the day, and SA misses out."

He added "I am greatly disappointed for the greater public of South Australia who have been sold short of the wonderful spectacle that was to unfold in September".

He further added "South Australians, the wider Australian public and the global community have given unequivocal endorsement for The Bend, culminating in the facility winning Motorsport Facility of the Year in 2019, beating nominations from the UK, Germany and the Czech Republic."

This was an achievement of outstanding proportions for Peregrine Corporation, owner of The Bend Motorsport Park.

"The Bend is here to stay" Mr Shahin continued "It is our livelihood......Australia is awash with great (motor racing) categories that still aspire to race at what is regarded as Australia's best motorsport facility".

Of course, The Bend still has two more years on its current contract to run the so-far highly successful Supercars events.

Positive news arrived the following day that The Bend's Asian Le Mans International Series scheduled for the next two 2021-2023 seasons will return.

The inaugural event last year raced on the purpose-built 7.7 km GT track resulted in highly positive feedback from local and international participants, and spectators.

Local accommodation facilities and other businesses which benefit from The Bend's activities will be disappointed by the cancellation of this year's Supercars event, which would have contributed towards Tailem Bend's economic recovery following Covid-19.

COVID-19 UPDATE

With restrictions slowly easing, TBCC has developed a COVID safe plan to recommence some of our face to face classes from Term 3, beginning on Monday 20th July. Winter Arrives at Pangarinda Botanic Garden

The Central Australian Garden at Pangarinda Botanic Garden, one of the earliest plantings thanks to Dr Phil Gooden, who was spending his little time off travelling with friends to the Flinders and APY lands (here putting in a few days helping community's)

Seeds collected on these trips grown and planted at Pangarinda. Some of the Acacia's grown are in flower at present.

Acacia aneura known to most as Mulga, source of the famous Mulga wood popular for souvenirs. Mulga is the most widespread wattle, dominating many of the red sand areas of the Australian inland. A slow growing, small bushy, long lived tree to 5 m. Killed by hot fires.

Acacia kempeana known as Witchetty Bush as indigenous people eat the edible grub found in its roots. A dull Grey-green, spreading shrub to 4m.

Both the above acacia's flower May - August also odd periods throughout the year, especially after good rains. Golden rods appear in profusion.

Another acacia in this area is **Acacia iteaphylla** named for its willow like foliage. Flinders Range wattle is a neat compact shrub to 5m, with glaucous drooping foliage. Pale yellow globular flowers appearing in clusters during winter.

It's the middle of the night. Prosecutor Alexandra Cooper is called to Harlem's Mount Neboh Baptist Church, a beautiful house of worship originally built as a synagogue. But the crowd gathered there isn't interested in architecture, or even prayer. They've come for the same reason Alex has: to find out why



the body of a young woman has been decapitated, set on fire, and left burning on the church steps.

The only identifiable artifact on the charred remains is the imprint of a Star of David necklace seared into the victim's flesh. Alex wonders if the fire was meant to destroy this woman's body, or to draw attention to it. Her fears are confirmed days later, when a second corpse is found at a cathedral in Little Italy. The killings look like serial hate crimes, but the apparent differences in the victims' beliefs seem to eliminate a religious motive. Convinced that another young woman is bound to die, Alex mines the depths of Manhattan's many houses of worship to find a connection between the victims - and in the process uncovers a terrible and perilous truth that takes her far beyond the scope of her investigation, and directly into the path of terrible danger.

Worrying is like spending time on a swing, it gives you something to do, but it doesn't get you anywhere.

You go back and forth on the swing, but basically you stay in the same place. Worrying is like that. You go over and over the same problem, back and forth, just like on a swing. Then you find yourself stuck in the same place, no closer to a solution and generally, more worried than you were at the beginning.

We start out with a problem and before we know it worry has replaced finding a solution. Of course, some problems simply don't have a solution, or at least the solution is beyond our control. Worrying robs you of the strength to deal with the problem or put it aside. It takes away your ability to think through and come up with solutions, or to recognise that it isn't your problem.

So the first thing is to decide whether you can do anything about the problem at hand. If you can't, then really what is the point of worrying.

Matthew 6:27 Which of you by worrying can add one cubit to his stature?

Matthew 6:26 Look at the birds of the air, for they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?

Phillipians 4:6 Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God;

And there is the key, the answer that most of us tend to leave as a last resort. "Let your requests be known to God." Most of the time we try to manage things ourselves, and certainly we need to take responsibility, but there are some things that are beyond our control. We cannot stop people rioting in America or Sydney or even Adelaide. So decide if you are responsible for the solution, and if you are then the best thing you can do is turn to the One who can help. You would be amazed how often a solution will present itself when you turn to God who created you.

1 *Thessalonians* **5:16-18** Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, in everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.
