



The Lost Garden

Established in the year 2000, Taillem Bend's forgotten Bush Tucker & Wildflower garden has finally been rediscovered and is destined for a facelift, as concerned residents forge an alliance with the nationally recognized Wellington Pangarinda Botanic Garden group.

Situated on the southern end of the town's historic walking trail, it's obvious that the native garden had fallen off the town's radar, however, in spite of years of neglect, Sandy Douglas of Taillem Bend and her band of local residents, have found that most of the tree and bush plantings have survived.

"Members of our group put out the word via social media and quickly found a number of locals keen to see the garden brought back to it's former glory," Sandy said. "We've even got one of the original Taillem Bend Re-Veg Group members, Matt Rose now of Ulverston, Tasmania on board, providing invaluable advice on what can be done."

The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #73

Migrants or New Australians, as they were known began to arrive in Tailem Bend in the late 1940's. Leaving behind family and war torn countries, they were keen to start life anew and soon blended into our community, introducing much of their culture, especially food and way of cooking.

One such new comer was Jan Kozikowski - he was better known as John, because Jan was more a Ladies name in his new country. John was a railway man for 36 years and spent his first four months in South Australia, living in a tent.

Living under canvas, was something he had become used to, however, he did it as a soldier in the Polish division with the British Eighth Army from 1942 to 1948 - an army which served under Field Marshall Montgomery in the Middle East and Italy during World War II. **(PICTURED RIGHT)**

He was discharged in NSW and offered a job with the then South Australian Railways and had to live under canvas at Islington until housing became available. In January 1949, he was transferred to Tailem Bend as a porter first class and lived there, working as an assistant shunter, shunter and guard, until his passing in 1997.

As a guard, he worked all the Mallee lines including trips from Tailem Bend to Yinkannie, Peebinga, Barmera and Loxton, each taking between nine and 10 hours, stopping at every little siding, picking up eggs and cream and many other takeouts. (These lines have long since been closed down.)

Communication would have been difficult in those early days, but a Certificate showed John passed all the exams required to progress through the railway ranks.

He and his wife Helen married in 1951 and lived in one of the railway prefabs for nine years before moving to Railway Terrace West, Wurtun, suburb of Tailem Bend.

At his retirement send off, about 40 workmates attended and the area manager presented John with all his certificates and a wall clock. **(PICTURED BELOW, CENTRE).**


At the function, Helen said the best part of it all would be having her husband home at nights and not having to wake him between one o'clock and five o'clock in the mornings, or having him come home between those times. It will be a welcome break after all those years.

Thanks to Helen for sharing her story with us, we will hear more about her busy life in a later edition including her involvement in the Community Centre, Taberefta and much more.



The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #73

We regularly talk about shops and business establishments that were once situated in the Main Street, Progress Corner and other places.

There is one however, that we tend to overlook - it was a delicatessen on Karoonda Road and the proprietor was Mrs Sheila Hill. **(PICTURED RIGHT)** Sheila operated it for 25 years and it has a fascinating and sometimes amusing history, like the time a woman "up the road" looked after the shop for a while, in return, Mrs Hill would look after her birds, while she was away.

At other times when Sheila needed someone to help out with the shop, she would call upon an in-law, Debbie and in return, would take a turn of babysitting....(The good old days.)

Sheila widowed at an early age, lived with her parents after her husband's death, until she and her father built the shop in 1959. **(PICTURED BELOW)**

The dwelling was added in 1963 and Mrs Hill moved in with her children, Christine and Tony. Her father died in 1977 and her mother was admitted to the Tailem Bend Hospital soon after.

Sheila took up playing bowls - indoor during winter and lawn bowls in summer (made possible with the help of Debbie).

Her most vivid memory over the 25 years was when a full bottle of beer was thrown through the shop window from a passing car. After coming through the window, the bottle shattered when it hit the refrigerator and made a terrible mess. Sheila didn't know whether it was a malicious attack or just some youngster in high spirits.

Sheila said it had once been a good business, but wasn't doing as well since Eudunda Farmers introduced self service in Tailem Bend , Woolworths expanded in Murray Bridge and the railways in Tailem Bend were downgraded, , so she made the decision to quit.

After the shop, Sheila and her sister Ursula volunteered for many years as managers of St Vincent de Paul's, here in Tailem Bend. She is now retired in the same house, her and her father built all those years ago.

COORONG REVEGETATION PROJECT WINS \$100,000

A three-year re-vegetation project will begin across the Coorong and Tatiara district this year, following the announcement of \$100,000 in funding for the Coorong Tatiara Local Action Plan group (CTLAP).

More than 61,000 native plants will be planted across the 117 hectare site, helping to restore critical native habitat and areas of refuge for native wildlife.

This project will deliver benefits to threatened species such as the Orange-Bellied Parrot, Mallee Fowl, Bush Stone Curlew, and the Red Tailed Black Cockatoo.

The project was awarded funding from the Australian Government's *20 Million Trees Program*, which as the title states, aims to see 20 million new trees planted across Australia by the year 2020.

Enlightening Community Meeting



Hundreds of residents from all over the Coorong District joined Equis Energy at their Community Information Session held in the Town Hall, on Tuesday, February 6, 2018 - many discovering that Tailem Bend's exciting Solar Farm Project was commencing that very month.

Equis Energy, Asia-Pacific's largest renewable energy Independent Power Producer (IPP), announced that they had finally achieved financial closure on its 127 MW Tailem Bend Solar Project (Tailem Solar).

Key highlights from the meeting:

- Construction is due to commence in February 2018 and the \$200m project is expected to begin delivering power to the grid in the first quarter of 2019.
- Equis has signed a Power Purchase Agreement with Snowy Hydro Limited under which Snowy Hydro will purchase 100% of the power from Tailem Solar for at least 22 years.
- Tailem Solar will be one of the lowest cost solar projects in Australia and will create hundreds of jobs, training opportunities and economic growth within Tailem Bend



- and surrounding local communities.
- Equis is also developing Tailem Bend 2, a 111 MW solar project adjacent to Tailem Solar

David Russell, Equis Energy Director, said, "Australia represents one of the most exciting solar power generation markets globally and Equis expects to build over \$1 billion of new projects over the next 24-36 months."

As Asia's largest renewable energy developer, Equis is able to leverage its economies of scale to deliver large scale, low-cost, reliable renewable energy, which Australia needs, as well as providing employment opportunities and supporting economic growth in local communities."



Probud Report

FEBRUARY 2018

President Neville Medlow welcomed 21 members to the meeting and there were two apologies. Secretary Bob Shurville provided minutes from the last meeting and Treasurer

Gordon Le Gallez presented the Financial Statement - both documents were passed unanimously.

President Neville Medlow confirmed that he had attended the Primary School's End of Year concert and as the result of the club's donation two students were rewarded with books for their performance during the year. As usual, the event was very well presented and entertaining for the "packed house" in the Town Hall.

The President reminded members that the ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING would be held March 18. Nomination Forms were handed out and he invited members to consider making a contribution to the club by taking up a position.

The President advised that he would approach Alan Hewitt to ask whether he would be prepared to act as the Club's Auditor.

GUEST SPEAKER.

Coorong District Council Mayor, Councillor Neville Jaensch was able to take time from his busy schedule and was welcomed as our Guest Speaker for the month, by Guest Speaker Organiser, Peter Connolly.

Mayor Jaensch gave an interesting summary of major developments taking place in our region which included details of Equis Energy's Taillem Bend 2 Solar Energy Project. This will provide up to an additional 100 Megawatts of power and will be dedicated to accommodate future battery installation. Eventually this project will cover approximately 1000ha.

Mayor Jaensch also provided a summary of some aspects of The Bend Motorsport Park project by Peregrine Corporation which is due in the immediate future to hold its first race meeting – a motorcycling event. Its first V8 Supercar event will be run in August 2018. Building the facility is progressing at amazing speed.

He also mentioned specific aspects of the development including the proposed "airport" which, apparently, is now being forecast to become not only a destination for aircraft bringing race competitors and visitors, but may possibly be considered also as a destination for freight-carrying aircraft.

There will also be a camping ground which would cater for events such as the upcoming Scout Jamboree in 2019. Peregrine are also building 440 storage sheds for use by competitors.

He forecast that the company will be spending very substantial additional money on many other aspects of the development, including a hotel and accommodation facilities.

Neville was presented a Certificate of Appreciation and a Probud pen as a "thank you" for his interesting presentation. He drew the door prize ticket with the lucky winner being Ray Bolt.

Murray Cod Fingerling Release



The Rural city of Murray Bridge will release 10,000 fingerling cod into the Murray River as part of a collaborative project between SARDI, PIRSA, DEWNR, Recfish SA and the SA Murray-Darling Basin NRM Board.

Work continues on a three year trial to restore populations of the iconic Murray Cod. 100,000 fingerling cod were introduced to two sites, Renmark and Kingston-on-Murray, in February 2016, with a second release of 43,000 fingerlings at Renmark in late February 2017.

Fish monitoring has shown that some of the first introduced fish have survived and some have migrated further downstream. This three year trial hopes to demonstrate that, along with habitat protection and restoration of river flow, a restocking program can restore this iconic fish species within the river.

The Murray Cod is listed as vulnerable under the Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 due to severe declines in population. Over exploitation together with habitat modification have had significant negative impacts. Restoration of this fish species is expected to have significant ecological and economic benefits, supporting tourism initiatives based on recreational fishing and the potential to restore a commercial Murray Cod fishing industry.

On Sunday, 11th February another 100,000 will be released into the Murray River with 10,000 being released near Piawalla Wetlands and at the Swanport Wetlands.

Pangarinda Gardens

Visitors to Pangarinda Botanic Garden in campers and caravans will no longer have to debate whether or not to take the gravel road, as thanks to Coorong District Council, Pangarinda Drive is now a bitumen road.

Many plants are starting to show stress from our long dry summer, with the odd death. Watering at Pangarinda is kept to new plantings hand watered every fortnight. Dripper lines are at our entrance gates and turned on when volunteers are working on Wednesday. Kangaroo Paws are also watered by a series of dripper lines on Wednesdays on a six week rotation. Watering does not begin until end of September, stopping when opening rains come.

Even with the dry, anyone visiting the Garden will be surprised by the beautiful display of *Banksia victoriae*. A 2-3 m high shrub, with greenish to grey-white, woolly foliage. Terminal spikes of orange and white flowers cover the tops of these shrubs. One of the three banksias with acorn shaped flowers.

This Month in the Garden

March heralds the beginning of autumn, so there's lots of tidying up in the garden after our hot and dry summer. It's an ideal time to plant new trees, as the weather is milder and there is some time for the trees to establish before winter arrives.

Pick marrows, pumpkins and squash before the flesh becomes coarse. Only pick pumpkins when fully ripe (no green skin or stem), cut when stalk begins turning brown and withers.

It's also time to lift root crops such as beetroot, carrots, onions, potatoes and turnips for storage and winter use. Leave parsnips in the ground, they need some cold to taste the best.

If tomatoes have not ripened, the plants can be laid down flat on the ground and covered with a cloche (plastic covered frame) to speed up ripening. Plant garlic now, as it prefers a period of cold weather to grow well.

Things to Do This Month:

- Compost autumn leaves.
- Collect perennial seeds and divide overgrown perennial plants.
- Start planting new trees, shrubs, climbers, annuals and perennials – remember to water regularly until they establish.
- Relocate evergreen shrubs (can be done either in autumn and early spring).

- Harvest autumn bearing raspberries, but leave canes unpruned till late winter-early spring
- Finish pruning canes that have fruited from summer fruiting raspberries.
- Plant new strawberries
- Remove autumn leaves from ponds and water gardens and thin out aquatic plants
- Stop feeding container plants
- Cut down asparagus foliage as it starts turning yellow and mulch the plants generously

Vegetables and Herbs to Sow:

Beetroot, Broad Beans, Broccoli, Cabbage, Chinese Cabbage, Cauliflower, Cress, Garlic, Leeks, Lettuce, Onions Parsnip, Parsley, Spring Onions, , Shallot bulbs, Silverbeet, Spinach, Swedes, Strawberry runners, Turnip.



Ally's Canine Column

With all the Christmas and New Year holidays over and done with, we have ensured (to the best of our ability) that

any leftovers over the course of this period were adequately disposed of (in the direction of our food bowls, where-ever possible!)

Now comes the time to wonder why our fur coats are making us look a little more round around the belly area.

Some easy to follow weight loss tips are things such as several small meals throughout the day, separate us from you when you eat, one person only is responsible for feeding, feed only from our food bowl, give us a smaller food bowl (WHAT!!), reduce or cut out treats (WHAT!!), provide non-food related attention such as walks, play ball, and swimming. 

MY POINT OF VIEW

We are very fortunate to have Locums servicing our community in the time of need and if they cannot sort out your health problem, they will send you for further advice. The Locums work Monday 8am to Saturday 8am and after hours. All you have to do is present yourself at the hospital after hours and you will be attended by nurses - if a Doctor is required the Locum who is on call, shall be called in.

Saturday and Sundays if you have a problem, present yourself to the hospital. Nurses with high qualifications will attend to you and if need be, they consult with Murray Bridge's 'Doctor on Call' and they will assist verbally to assess your situation. If your condition is unclear, you will be sent on to the appropriate hospital for further advice.

Since 2014 our Hospital has been involved in the 'Saves Project' (which I did not know about). This is amazing modern technology which allows the patient to be viewed by camera through a television link and your problem is assessed and verified through a Doctors Call Centre and our staff are informed of treatment or once again, sent on for further advice.

SA Country Health and the Health Advisory Council (HAC) are pursuing Doctors for the acute patients, aged residents and community clients that present themselves to the Tailem Bend Hospital and Medical Clinic .

The HAC has full management of all our medical buildings and houses.

Our Locums are amazing Doctors and if you are not committed to your own personal Doctor for ongoing health problems, give our Locums a go, once again, if further care is needed you are sent on to the appropriate place.

Please, can we also support our Chemist - this must be tough for them going through this stage of uncertainty. Remember, as we get older and maybe have to use a gopher, we need our Chemist and Doctors in our town for our future (The highway to Murray Bridge is far too busy for our gophers!!)

As you can see with what I have stated above, my opinion is we are being looked after very well and we need to stick together, stay united, support all our local businesses, otherwise we may not have them for our future. I have faith that we will get what we need, but in the meantime we are well catered for.

As a long term local resident, I sometimes feel we are kept in the dark, particularly when information we have a right to know, is withheld from us. As long as the facts are right, I'm happy to be criticized, as I feel there is nothing that I shouldn't say - it's your prerogative if you don't want to know about. We need to work as a team, not as individuals.

MEDICAL CENTRE UPDATE

Statement to be attributed to Acting Regional Director Riverland Mallee Coorong, Tanya Lehmann:

Negotiations with one prospective operator of the Tailem Bend Medical Practice did not proceed, as one of the doctors withdrew his interest for personal reasons.

We have commenced negotiations with another prospective operator of the practice.

Tailem Bend requires highly skilled doctors, who are credentialed to work in general practice, treat hospital inpatients, care for aged care residents and respond to emergency presentations.

These workforce requirements present a recruitment challenge to prospective operators.

As part of the negotiation process, we are working with prospective operators on this challenge, and supporting them to identify the training and supports available to doctors who are willing to provide the full range of high quality medical care to the Tailem Bend community.

I thank the community for their ongoing patience during this process and their continued support for the Tailem Bend Medical Practice.

We are committed to maintaining quality health services in the town and your ongoing support of the locum doctors during this process, is appreciated.

The Ghost of Taillem Railway Station

When the dust settled, I discovered an array of rusty old mechanism connected to the control levers in the signal cabin above. The machinery wasn't in great shape, well overdue for a grease and oil change. It occurred to me this could be the very reason for the closure of the station – they couldn't get any blokes or gals with enough courage to enter this ghastly place to do the maintenance work.

I had a horrendous sensation that someone other than me was there. My skin tingled. A sudden draught of cool air made the hairs on my arms stand on end. It felt like the ghost was there, in front of me.

Then I remembered something I had read which said that ghosts are invisible to the naked eye, but their images can be captured on camera. So, I fired up my camera and slowly panned the dungeon, taking several shots as I went.

You won't believe this, but when I opened the camera's viewing screen to see the results, well, to be frank, I was astonished at what I found - that the rumour is true! There really is a ghost down there, probably an old maintenance worker who must have spent his last hours before being entombed in that horrible place.


I got out of there fast, frantically climbing the rickety stairs. Shuddering with fear, I was glad to have survived the ordeal. But you won't get me back there again!

After all the work put into renovating, refurbishing and refitting the shop since purchasing it in 2014, the Alleman's are selling up and have their sights on a new project.



LETTER TO THE EDITOR (February 15, 2018)

I would like to respond to Adrian Pederick's extraordinary letter in February 2018 Topics.

Our Member Of Parliament began his letter "this candidate ..made allegations that are simply incorrect and nothing more than inflammatory." Where were they incorrect? Why were they inflammatory?

He then goes on to write: "...it was found that Taberefta had been operating in a non-compliant manner since its inception." In what way was Taberefta operating illegally?

Mr Pederick's statement is no less than public vilification of all the wonderful volunteers who built and operated the Homes For The Aged and Disabled as a Public Benevolent Institution for the past 30-odd years.

In a later paragraph: "...no longer allow volunteers ..work at Taberefta..as a result of bullying and intimidation by several residents.. volunteers ridiculed for their hard work... bullying and intimidation has also extended across all facets of the village.."

I ask, as a resident and voter, has a Member Of Parliament the right to publicly vilify residents of Taberefta Homes in this manner? Has he any credibility when he publicly vilifies whoever the "several residents" are without first stating facts and offering these "several residents" any right of reply?

Again, "the candidate" and I ask:

TABEREFTA's Constitution clearly states "... as a Public Benevolent Institution ... build homes for Elderly & Disabled Persons" In plain language, as a Charity build homes for Elderly & Disabled Persons.

And Taberefta operated very successfully as a simple Charity up till Adrian Pederick became Chairman of Taberefta's Board – and until he became Chairman, it's operations and finances were open to residents & the public, a real Taillem Bend success story.

During Mr Pederick's first year as a Board Member, the Board took Taberefta further down the Charity path as readers can see if they Google acnc.gov.au and find the charity "Taillem Bend Homes For The Aged". The Charity's ABN number then shows on the left, and if you enter this number in the ABN Box, full details of this Charity are revealed, including the Constitution and other information.

This path, which included extensive research confirming every past and present resident at Taberefta was homed for their lifetime, resulted in the ATO refunding just over \$99,000 in previously paid GST.

The previous Board also looked to build more homes for the Elderly and Disabled by working towards become a Charity with Tax Deductible Status, and had a plan to work with Coorong Council and its' Mayor to obtain more land once this was achieved.

Once Mr Pederick became Chairman, the Real Estate Agent/Property Manager resigned rather than work with him, the retired Accountant was hounded off the Board, and the practicing Accountant stood himself down under Conflict Of Interest rules as he was at the time the Board's Tax Agent as well as pursuing the GST refund from the ATO. (And was rejected by the Board when he offered to

re-join it after the refund was received).

The greatest concern I have as a previous Board Member and Taberefta Charity resident is Chairman Pederick completely ignoring the previous Board's agreement that weekly paying residents were "paying off" their lifetime residency donation to the Charity, just as every weekly paying resident did before them.

And of greater concern, that Chairman Pederick appears to have ignored Section 5.2.(2).2 of the Retirement Villages Act he voted on as an MP, and gained the Minister's Exemption for 3 mature Ladies who were previously enjoying a stable lifetime residency but have now been subjected to a great deal of stress through shortened residency times.

The questions that puzzle me are why did Chairman Pederick take Taberefta in a different direction to that of the past 30 years? Why change a simple Charity into a 3 Division bureaucracy rather than get a Ministerial Exemption? Why subject 3 elderly ladies to 5 year leases back-dated by up to 4 years? Why remove and ban from the Board the residents who helped successfully build and operate the homes over the past 25 years?

All I ask for is my local MP to have credibility, conflict management skills, compassion, and a sense of ethics. All I am reading in the last 2 issues of Topics are sweeping statements in print (and on the radio) vilifying others (the "troublemakers"?) who simply raise questions with Chairman Pederick.



And throughout the worlds, other destinies entwine with Darrow's to change his fate forever:


A young Red girl flees tragedy in her refugee camp and achieves for herself a new life she could never have imagined.
