



The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #84

The Doceff/Long Family

I caught up with Peter and Mavis Long recently, along with their daughter Kaylene, who gave me a lot of information about the connection of Tailem Bend and Jervois with the Doceff/Long family. The history goes back a long way, but is most interesting and just what 'The Changing Face of Tailem Bend' is all about.

Mavis's father's name was George - he worked in the railways in Tailem Bend and was a strong member of the St John Ambulance Brigade. This is the story as told by Peter, who now lives in retirement with Mavis.

**Peether Doceff migrated from Bulgaria in 1912 at the age of 26. He came alone and as I believe, he was one of the earliest Bulgarians to migrate to South Australia. His wife Ivy came out in 1913 with their daughter Sonia (Tsoney) who was 2 ½ years old at the time.

Ivy Doceff took one look at Port Adelaide in 1913 and wanted to catch the next boat back to Bulgaria.

Peether Doceff's early employment was on building the railway line around Yeelanna-Cummins, then the Port Lincoln to Thevenard line.

From there they went to Mypolonga looking for work, but to no avail, so Peether walked to Tailem Bend to the Jaensch property. There, they started growing vegetables.

They then moved to Morphett's at Woods Point and grew vegetables on the swamp land. They remained there until they were flooded out. They then went to Broken Hill where Peether worked on the South mine and by this time, there were quite a number of Bulgarian people working there. He was a powder monkey in the mine, a skill no doubt, learnt on the railway. The long miner's strike in those early days forced them out.

They then came back to Paringa in 1920 to grow vegetables, but they had a lot of trouble with people pinching their vegetables, so they left there and went back to Woods Point, back to the Morphett Property, where they again, grew vegetables.

In 1927, Jervois West was opened up and the Doceff family were allocated the last block towards Wellington. It was 39 ½ acres of swamp land. This block contained the summer residence of Governor Jervois. From here, they again grew vegetables and as the enterprise grew, they had a vegie round that included Wellington, Jervois, Narrung and a retail outlet in Tailem Bend.

Glasshouses were first built in 1935-36, to grow tomatoes, cucumbers etc. The number of glasshouses grew to about 60 in the 1940s - 1950s, with several families working them on a share basis. Some of these family names included Georgeff (Peether's sister married a Georgeff), Santin, Cazzolato, Bellon and Long.

Dairying was introduced by Peether in about 1940. Again, this was done by sharefarmers. These included the family names, Santin, Fabian, Kluske, Long and Vanderzon, until Peether's retirement in 1961.

The property was divided into 2 sections - the dairy and the glasshouses. The dairy was taken over by Peter and Mavis Long (nee Burnett), and the glasshouses by Brian Doceff (one of Peether's sons).

Some of Peether Doceff's achievements were:

- 18 years a Councillor for the District Council of Mobilong
- Founding Director of Jervois Coop Dairying Society until about 1961

Wartime anecdotes - Some of the troops that enlisted from Jervois used to send messages back home from the Middle East, how they missed pinching Peether Doceff's watermelons.

Ivy Doceff - (b1890 - d1963) died aged 73 Peether Doceff - (b1886 - d1973) died aged 87 They had three children - Sonia, Roy and Brian

Sonia married Ron Long in 1935 and managed the Doceff Grocery in Willow Street Tailem Bend, They had two boys – Peter, b1936 and Kevin, b1938.

Peter married Mavis Burnett in 1957 and they had five children: Susan b1958, Kaylene b1960, David b1964, Gregory b1966 and Paul b1969.

Kevin married Bessie Rehn and had three children: Graham b1962, Christine b1964 and Ann Marie.

The family also made available to me Naturalization papers filled out by Peether, he was 27 and stated on the Statutory Declaration that he was born on the 25th day of October 1886 and at the time lived at Woods Point. He arrived in Australia on the 12th day of April, 1912 and disembarked at Pt Adelaide. A reference paper for Naturalization was signed by Archie Thomas, Woodard Postmaster Tailem Bend in 1914.

The application was approved and Peether took the oath of allegiance before Special Magistrate Thomas Gepp on the 2nd day of September, 1914.**

What a wonderful Australian he turned out to be. The Naturalization process of course, was a lot more complex than shown here, but the hand writing was small and difficult for me to present accurately.





History of Quilt Display at TB Hospital

The history of The Masonic Quilters & Craft Group (MQ&CG) Quilt Display at the Tailem Bend Hospital

Each month the MQ&CG display one of their members' quilts in the hospital's main foyer, a practice that has been much favoured by patients, residents, staff and visitors. The quilts prove not only an attractive display but also a talking point as people admire the colour schemes, workmanship and variety of designs that make up these quilts.

The practice has become so enshrined in the club that it's genesis has become misted by time and so to preserve what we know, this little piece attempts to set a sort of record.

It would appear that the practice of displaying quilts began around 2008 when one of the aged residents, Lois Bryant, herself a quilt maker, donated one of her quilts to the Aged Care facility that is part of the hospital, as a decoration in the dining room. However, there was no suitable space within the actual dining area and so a wall space was identified in the adjoining reception area. A permanent wall mounting and rod for the purpose of hanging the quilts, was erected on a suitable wall.

This first quilt created a lot of interest and conversation amongst the public, residents and staff and was greatly admired.

At that time a member of the MQ&CG, Jenny Ellison and her husband John, were much involved in fund raising for the hospital. Following one particular cabaret, Jenny approached the MC&CG and the hospital, with a suggestion to add their club members' quilts to the display, so as to provide variety as well as a way of promoting the art of quilting. As a result a member from the club will volunteer to display one of their quilts for the month with the exception of December when a purposeful made quilt by the late Jenny Ellison is hung in memory of this wonderful quilter and friend.

From this beginning, the association between the MQ&CG and the Tailem Bend Memorial Hospital has continued and strengthened over the years and in addition to the quilt display, the club also raises funds through their Bi-Annual

Quilt Exhibitions and other fund raising events for the hospital. As the current EO/CEO, Suzanne Nagel states,

"The quilts are amazing, they tell a story and are made with love and to give love to their families and friends - anyone visiting, admires them. Each time they are changed over, a story about the quilt is given to the hospital administration staff, who type it up and it's then placed on the wall next to the quilt. Information about the quilt, who made it and when, the story behind the quilt, how long it took, are all questions staff get asked. This information is felt to not only promote quilting as a hobby, but brings the community to the people looking at the quilt and makes for interesting conversations."

With thanks to Suzanne Nagel EO/CEO and staff for providing many details on the genesis of the program and for the kind words of appreciation of the members' work.

Pangarinda in Bloom Last October

EREMOPHILAS - October 2018

Flowering along the walking trail at Pangarinda Botanic Garden is the beautiful Eremophila (name means desert loving) platycalyx (name means broad calyx). A grey leafed, compact, upright shrub with large deep salmon pink broad calyxes, which remain after the purple spotted cream flowers have fallen.

This 10 year old Eremophila platycalyx is difficult to grow the reason Pangarinda has only one plant and often grafted onto Myoporum species so is not seen for sale.

Planted in many areas at Pangarinda will be seen Eremophila maculata. This is a hardy, easy to grow shrub, will tolerate a great variety of soils. Flowers come in many colours reds, yellow, apricot, deep pink through to very delicate pink. Has a long flowering period from autumn to early summer, attracting many birds.



Broken Ground - McDERMID Val


When a body is discovered in the remote depths of the Highlands, DCI Karen Pirie finds herself in the right place at the right time. Unearthed with someone's long-buried inheritance, the victim seems to belong to the distant past - until new evidence suggests otherwise, and Karen is called in to unravel a case where nothing is as it seems.



It's not long before an overheard

conversation draws Karen into the heart of a different case, however - a shocking crime she thought she'd already prevented. Goodwood -THROSBY Holly



A delightful novel of secrets and small town obsessions from Australian musician and songwriter, Holly Throsby. It wasn't just one person who went missing, it was two people. Two very different people. They were there, and then they were gone, as if through a crack in the sky. After that, in a small town like Goodwood, where we had what Nan called 'a high density of acquaintanceship', everything stopped. Or at least it felt that way. The normal feeling of things stopped.

Goodwood is a small town where

everyone knows everything about everyone. It's a place where it's impossible to keep a secret.

In 1992, when Jean Brown is seventeen, a terrible thing happens. Two terrible things. Rosie White, the coolest girl in town, vanishes overnight. One week later, Goodwood's most popular resident, Bart McDonald, sets off on a fishing trip and never comes home. People die in Goodwood, of course, but never like this. They don't just disappear.

As the intensity of speculation about the fates of Rosie and Bart heightens, Jean, who is keeping secrets of her own, and the rest of Goodwood are left reeling.

Rich in character and complexity, its humour both droll and tender, *Goodwood* is a compelling ride into a small community, torn apart by dark rumours and mystery.
