## The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #95

I would like to present a few railway stories that I have gathered from extracts made available from clippings, that were to be part of a book to be published by the late Peter Dickson. Peter was a true railway man and always very supportive of Tailem Bend.

It was unfortunate that he passed away before his dream go to print. With Geraldine 's approval I hope in a very small way I can bring a few snippets of his dream alive.


"Tailem had many trains, passenger and freight, servicing sidings through the Mallee right up to the Riverland 3 or 4 times a week. Alawoona will be our first port of call, such was the demand for freight delivered to sidings for farmer and shop pick-ups that the train crews from Tailem only made it to there before their time was up for them to go into barracks."

"In September the Loxton line was to be started from Alawoona, and the contractor hoped to have the engine in the town in the next 18 weeks. Thirty six men with large quantities of sleepers and rails were already working at Alawoona putting down the Government section so the contractor could begin. The Loxton railway was opened in January 1914."

"A weighbridge was installed and by December 1914 eighty tons of mallee roots per week were being sent by train. Railway barracks were built and a loco turning triangle and stock yards were also established."

"The Riverland was also a destination for Tailem Bend train crews. Renmark in the busy days had a significant railway staff presence consisting of, Stationmaster, 4 Clerks, Checkers, Labourers, Electrical Mechanic, Ganger and 4 Packers, 4 Porters, Charge man and Coal man. An RX engine was there with resident Engineman and Fireman. The RX was sent to Tailem Bend for maintenance and one from Tailem was sent in its place. A staff of 24 with possibly 4 more when the Tailem crew arrived was eventually reduced to nil."

Still on the Mallee a letter for the book came in from John Morcon who was a Guard at Tailem Bend in the middle to late 1940's. John worked the Mallee route before moving on to Train Controller Adelaide, he describes in his writings just how tough it was for the Gangers, Labourers their families and our guards a scattered in small Towns and sidings throughout the rail system.

Not too many people would know where Peebinga is, the line out there via Karoonda is long closed, but one time our train crews worked there out Monday back Tuesday.

Over to Guard John Morcom.

"With only one service a week it was always heavy work in each direction and we had to maintain a schedule. Some of the take outs and pickups handled to Peebinga and back were, cream, egg crates, mail, parcels, rabbit and sheep skins. Then there were corn sacks, wool bales and hardware of all types."


## The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #95

Before his passing Peter Dickson was a well-known Tailem Bend railway man and community worker, he spent a lot of time collecting information about the history of the Murray Bridge division of the State railway system. The administration was based at Murray Bridge and the operations centre at Tailem Bend.

He was prompted to write the book by another retired railway man who discussed with him the possibility of holding a reunion of those who worked in the division, adding that he would like to see as many as possible of his old workmates before he died. This made Peter think about all the unrecorded history we could be losing, and so he thought it would be a good idea to hold the suggested reunion at a book launch.

Peter said that in the 1950s and 60s one in every four families in SA had at least one member in every four families worked in the railways.

Peter's Grandfather was a carpenter with the railways, his father was an engine driver, Peter was a yardmaster, his eldest son Daryl and engine driver and his Father in law a yardmaster.



#### Peter had an unusual vision.

He got an idea for a unique tourist attraction when he heard that Coorong Council was planning to build a storm water drainage pond on railway land opposite the railway station, Vinnies and the Catholic Church.

His plan was to transform the 500 metres or so into a scale model of the River Murray from its source at Corryong in the Victorian Alps to Lake Alexandrina. At one end a temporary rubbish dump would be created and when high enough could be covered with soil and represent the mountains.

#### **GUEST SPEAKER - BOB SHURVILLE**

Guest Speaker was Probus Secretary, Bob Shurville. Born in 1939, when World War 2 began, he recalls German aircraft and rockets flying overhead on their way to bomb London and was lucky to survive the bombing of a factory behind his house.

At age 16 he left home and joined the Royal Air Force as a boy apprentice which eventually saw him posted to Australia in 1959, at age 19. He told of his eventful journey by air to Australia which took two weeks and included visits to Cyprus, Teheran, Columbo, North Borneo, Darwin and Maralinga - where the British had tested their atomic bombs -eventually arriving at Edinburgh Airfield, Elizabeth.

Perhaps, he said, in future he might tell members the story of his next 5 years in Adelaide and then Canberra, which he described as having been "the best years of his life". Bob was thanked by President Joyce Medlow who awarded him with a Certificate of Appreciation.

"Art is an expression. It drives study of things at a deeper level than most people experience day by day," John said. "This is important in understanding things around us."

John's high school passion of drawing and painting led to a watercolour landscape exhibit in the Advertiser Open Air Art Exhibition in 1965 – following in the same year, a first prize at the Royal Adelaide Show for a sculpture of two Aboriginal warriors. A day at the South Australian School of Art resulted in a scholarship, but unfortunately, John had already accepted an Apprenticeship three days earlier in the Construction Industry.

"Being inquisitive, I was consumed with collecting things and after 17 years excavating, collecting and rescuing fossilised bones in the Naracoorte quarry it became scientific – leading to publishing several scientific and popular papers, a book and lots more arts."

His love of gardening morphed into another art form, resulting in his wife Julie and himself winning several awards for their 'Daisy Patch' garden in Coonalpyn. - both have been Pangarinda Botanic Garden committee members since its inception. With the success of the Creating Coonalpyn Art initiative both abandoned their plans to retire elsewhere and decided to set up a studio.

"I find true joy in art, simply painting a leaf and passing that skill onto my grandchildren is very satisfying."

## **Pangarinda Gardens**

#### Calostemma purpureum growing in SA

Pangarinda recorded very little rain. The highest for a week in February was 12 ml, so was a surprise to find the Calostemmas in full bloom as was only a fortnight since watering in this area and no sign then of these delightful Australian bulbs.

#### Calostemma luteum can be found in the drier areas of SA Vic NSW Qld along flood plains.

Bright yellow clusters of flowers held erect on long stems appear in late summer after rains. Leaves appear after.

## Calostemma purpureum is found growing in SA Vic and NSW, tolerating drier conditions.



Leaves are strap-like with two to three to each bulb which dies down before flowers appear. Late summer terminal heads of Reddish-purple flowers on 30 to 40 cm stems appear. 100's of these blooming in their native areas is a wonderful sight. On Hills around Callington and on Lower Yorke Peninsular to name a couple. The pale pink form is local to this area flowering on sandy soils towards Meningie.





Clancy of the Overflow

## It was one of Australia's greatest romances.

The story of Clancy of the Overflow, who gave up so much for the woman he loved and admired.



And now their story will be written as Jed McAlpine has persuaded Nancy to tell the story of her grandparents, Clancy and Rose.

But other tales lurk behind the folklore that surrounds Clancy and those are the stories of the women hidden in Australia's long history. The Honourable Flora McPherson, who travelled from England to marry Clancy and was then stranded on a drought-doomed property and lost all that was dearest to her. The brilliant but tragically flawed Maria, forced to hide behind both a man's name and a veil, and the extraordinary Mrs McKenzie, stolen from her Indigenous mother to work in the Government House kitchens, now a 'drover's boy'. And finally Rose, the last of her people, who escapes chains to eventually capture Clancy's heart.

The final book in the magnificent Matilda Saga, this is a book about the many kinds of love. Clancy's love of the bush, immortalised in Paterson's poem. Nancy's deep understanding of her country, and her need to pass it on. But perhaps the most moving love story of all was the one that never happened, between Matilda O'Halloran and Clancy of the Overflow.

But now there is another Matilda, and another Clancy. They will waltz beside the river, as a young Matilda did in 1894, as Jed writes her book and gives a voice to the forgotten: those strong and remarkable women who forged a nation.
