ANZAC DAY DAWN SERVICE - 2018

A serene, motionless morning with cooling river fog, welcomed the growing crowd at Tailem Bend's annual ANZAC Day Dawn Service, held this year, at 5.45 am at the Tailem Bend ANZAC Memorial, April 25, 2018.

Since August 2014 until this year, the community has quietly been commemorating the centenary of the First World War - remembering the national pride, the local sacrifice and the scars left behind over the past 100 years.

With the National Flag at half mast, Major Sumner AM

(**PICTURED RIGHT**) of Adelaide and Camp Coorong, Meningie emerged from the mist, greeting all to Ngarrindjeri country and with smouldering native plants, began to spread wisps of spiritual smoke over the crowd to cleanse their souls, protect them and welcome the ANZAC spirits of the past.

The service and proceedings of the morning continued under the watchful eye of Tailem Bend RSL President, Keith Wood, followed by a short seven minute audio visual presentation - even a passing Freight Train showed it's respect by slowing and rumbling quietly by like the sound of a heart beat.

People sang and reflected, the Last Post and Reveille sounded, wreaths were laid and with that the first of many bells rang out, introducing hand held placards of each of the local diggers who paid the supreme sacrifice during WWI - carried by the children of the Tailem Bend Primary School (**PICTURED BELOW**) accompanied by candle light, to erected white wooden crosses.





This act was truly appreciated by the past and present diggers attending.

Anzac Day goes beyond the anniversary of the landing of Gallipoli, it's the day when our nation remembers all, past and present, men and women, who have served and died in war.

The spirit of Anzac, with its qualities of courage, mateship and sacrifice, continues to have meaning and relevance to our younger generations and for our own sense of **national identity.**

The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #75

This month we get an introduction to the many harrowing experiences by migrants far from their home land, while starting a new life in Australia and eventually Tailem Bend,. This time it is the Tournoy family from Holland.

**Hi, my name is Mary Tournoy. My husband, John and two children, Monica and Richard and myself, arrived in Sydney on the 3rd of April, 1963. A taxi picked us up from the airport and gave us a tour of Sydney before arriving at the train station. From there we went to Bonegilla. We stayed in Bonegilla for at least a month - our first impression was it was very hot. One day we decided to go for a short walk up to the dam, not realising how far it was. Everything seemed so far away and so open and big. By the time we arrived at the damn, I had blisters on my feet. On the way back, a car pulled over and asked us what we were doing in the middle of nowhere. They seemed surprised that we had to walk that distance, and then kindly offered us a lift back to the camp.

My feet were so sore, I was so happy that we didn't have to walk back. They had been out shooting rabbits, all night and were kind enough to give us a rabbit for our supper. We stayed in army barracks, consisting of two bedrooms and that was all. Showering was a different thing altogether - the showers were lined up with partitions in between, but no doors. I always selected the first shower because when somebody walked in the door, it would actually keep me out of sight.

On the 2nd of May at 6am in the morning, we left the train station out of Bonegilla а n d travelled to Melbourne. arriving at 12pm. There were also other foreigners waiting for



the train as well. Because my husband John Tournoy spoke English, he was able to help them get on the right train.

While walking around in Melbourne, we had Italian people following us everywhere, as they were too afraid to leave our side because they weren't sure how to get back to the station and where to go from there. But they knew we were on our way to Adelaide, so felt safer sticking with us. We had a walk around and something to eat before leaving Melbourne eight hours later to begin the journey to Adelaide.

We also had a little bit of difficulty with some Russians who didn't understand that they had to switch trains to get to their destination, but my husband made sure they went in the right direction.

When we got to the border of South Australia, we had to surrender all of our fruit. But the Italian family was not willing to give up theirs - they had so many grapes with them. They tried to eat as much as possible and give the rest away, but it was just too much. Let's face it, no one wants to get the runs on the train. When we arrived in Adelaide, I was amazed to see so many foreign women cleaning the trains.

I was disappointed at first, thinking that if I had stayed in Holland, I would have been able to buy a house already. As I looked around, I felt like I would have to work hard to be able to achieve this goal now - not that my husband would let me work while I still had two children at home. We were sent to a hostel in Glenelg. We were allowed to stay there for up to two years, so that we could save for a house. However, I found the conditions there quite disgusting. Toilets where only cleaned once a day, so by the end of the day you could imagine how dirty they were. The hostel housed over 200 people.

The meals were made at certain times, so that when my husband got home from work, there was no food available because the kitchens were closed. I ended up buying a little stove and making his food through the day so that I could heat it up at night when he got home. This sort of lifestyle was not for us. We survived in this situation for two weeks.



PICTURED ABOVE - Near Unley Oval, we ended up renting half a house, sharing it with an Italian family, who also had two children. I had no furniture and was told if I went to the shop and made a deposit I could get furniture. They told me I couldn't take everything at once, so I thought, "well, I'm not leaving without it!." I couldn't understand what they were saying, I knew I had to put a deposit down and that, I had already done! I was told that if I did not leave, they would call the police. I was not budging, I was determined to get my furniture. Finally a lady came in and explained that I had to put a deposit on each item. When the manager found out how much I had already put down, I had paid for half of everything I wanted! He shook his head and laughed, "had you told me that you had so much money, I would have let you take it all straight away!" These were some of the hard barriers to cross when you couldn't connect or speak English. We finally settled into our house and I was happy to be in the country. Things were looking up. After living here in Australia for a year we realised how much we did miss our family. But I suppose when you travel to a different country these things happen, we slowly adjusted and after a while felt at home here. We have had many happy and bad times and troubled times through our life, but have, in the long run, always survived. I suppose it doesn't matter what part of the world you come from, everybody has a longing for their Homeland or family - that doesn't change in any culture. I have two sons and a daughter (with their children and grandchildren) living in Australia and two daughters living in Belgium, (with their children and grandchildren of their own), as well as other family members - HOWEVER, Australia is home to me now and I still reside in Tailem Bend.

Mary can often be seen travelling around the town on her Gopher or she will be at home on face book, keeping in touch with family members still in Holland.

Thank you for your contribution to Tailem Topics, Mary.



The Making of Meningie

Meningie was made just over 150 years ago in 1866, but the land has always been here, it just didn't have a name, or did it?

A history/art exhibition 'The Making of Meningie - Winmun Meinanggun' has been many months in planning and was officially opened at the Coorong Gallery 95 - 101 Railway Terrace, Tailem Bend, during April.

Neville Bonney, South Australian native plant expert, ethno botanist and published author, opened the exhibition Sunday, April 29, 2018 and visitors are welcome to view the exhibition during business hours, with groups asked to give notification of their visit via 1300 785 277.

The display tells the story of the making of Meningie which began long before 1866, with art works by George French Angas in the mid-1840's and works by local artists depicting the area before and after white settlement. It takes visitors on a journey through the decades showing the buildings, education, religion, agriculture, sport and other aspects of the community and district, developing and evolving in time, through photographs, historic artefacts and works of art by local artists, some of which will be available to purchase.

Exhibition conveynor, Marianne Cunneen, said the exhibition contains more than 120 items specific and unique to Meningie, Narrung, Raukkan, Salt Creek and Ashville. Marianne added that the display contains a fraction of the number of items of historic interest that exist, but hopes that it gives a broad insight into the districts' uniqueness.

The exhibition is housed in Tailem Bend, as the result of an offer made by the Coorong District Council for such an event to be held in the Coorong Gallery. Marianne said she could not refuse such a great opportunity to display Meningie and its history and hopes that people throughout the Coorong District Council area and further afield will take the opportunity to view the display, which is open until July 6, 2018.

Under the Dog and Cat Management Act dogs must be registered from 3 months old (owners must be over 16). Rego discs must be worn in public (no PA, on the dog, not the owner!) When taking us for a drive (yippee, but mum, oops PA, won't let me drive) we must be restrained by a leash on the back of an open vehicle, in a cage or similar enclosure. The same applies in a car, perhaps with a safely belt harness. You humans are being naughty if you drive with us on your lap!



• Rates are going up again, the differential is going up 3% + 1% growth

• the fixed charge is going up \$10 from \$350.00 to \$360.00.

• Introduction of a fairer, transparent user pays system for ratepayers benefitting from the water scheme at Wellington East and Peake. There will be a connection fee of \$235 (\$315 in 2017-18) for every property connected to the scheme and 0.60c/kl for those consuming water from the scheme

• Hopefully the Council will adopt a fairer, transparent user pays system for the CWMS as well and not charge the same for Vacant Land, with nothing, as the Residential Blocks with Septics – currently \$605.00

• Kerbside Waste Management will remain the same \$325.00
