The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #96

The arrival of migrants and soccer.

There is no doubt the arrival of migrants brought with them many of their home country customs that changed our lives forever. Whenever we dined out, the menu read Steak and Eggs, Fish and Chips and Mixed Grill. All pub drinking was done at the bar, sitting at a table was unheard of, that all changed.

In 1959 more than a million migrants entered the country since the Immigration programme was introduced. These people from different lands brought their customs, traditions and sports and attempted to adapt the Australian way of life. Some have been successful, others have failed.

In those early day's soccer was one of the success stories and several South Australian country towns had their own teams, one of these was the Tailem Bend club.

This all started in 1958 when a Scotsman and an Austrian called a general meeting. This was well attended by a band of new arrivals who had been kicking a ball around for exercise. The result was that a president, secretary and 30 members formed the district's first soccer club.

Mr. W (*Billy*) Burns from Ayreshire, Scotland, was elected President. Billy had 15 years Country soccer behind him, as player, captain, and coach. Frank Hoesler was elected secretary and organiser, Frank Mussger was made referee, Frank from Austria had many years' experience in big European matches.

Soon after the meeting, club members made their own portable goal posts and launched their first matches on Sunday's against other country towns like Loxton, Lobethal and Renmark.

They had a fair measure of success and their aim was to hold inter district association matches on Sunday on the rehabilitated Jaensch Park.

The players worked hard at the oval and had an agreement with the Progress Association for use of the ground on Sundays.

Mr. Burns tried hard to install interest among the children at the local primary school, their biggest thrill was a visit to Adelaide to see an international match played, he also hoped to introduce midweek schoolboy matches.

One of his star pupils was his 12-year-old son Brian who was captain of the soccer, Aussie Rules, and cricket teams, he also found time for a game of tennis at which he also excelled.

Soccer, from a viewpoint of spectators at Tailem Bend during this time was a complicated affair, but it did win supporters and at one match 200 spectators turned up which Billy Burns was quite pleased with.

Soccer was played for the first time in Murray Bridge in December 1957 between 2 Adelaide teams Cumberland and Pt. Adelaide.

To promote the game at Tailem Bend the officials knew they had to explain the rules to potential players and spectators, not an easy task. (*Probably still isn't, remember we are talking 1959.*)

Anyway, the message got out, 11 men to a team and one is a goalkeeper, he is the only member of the side who is allowed to use his hands to stop the ball. There is a lot more to it than that and perhaps the modern game may have changed a bit to suit TV.

The formation of the Tailem Club raised the question of a Murray Bridge team, Billy made the point that there was a lot of youth out there whose only social life was dances and films, and then sport was mainly Aussie Rules, cricket and tennis, so soccer was another outlet.

In his interview with the MV Standard all those years ago Bill went on to point out some issues like dedication to the task ahead forming a new club. The club needs enough members who are willing to work, the next hurdle is equipment which of course means money.

Lastly and the most important is a playing arena, it is remarkable what can be done to an area of wasteland, this need was undertaken in an area near the golf club. Like all other spectator sports, a thorough knowledge of the game must be gained before one can really enjoy watching 20 men chase an air-filled ball from one of the grounds to the other.

Bill Burns was employed as a carpenter in the railways and having worked alongside him I know how dedicated he was to get a soccer team up and running in Tailem Bend. The game flourished for a long time but with Murray Bridge players in the Tailem team it eventually transferred to Murray Bridge.

Robby Hales passed on to me this soccer story contained in a 1959 edition of the Standard, it also revealed that Tailem Bend at that time was very well represented by numbers in the Lower Murray Tennis Association. Every small town and siding had tennis courts in those days as the following will show, A and B Men and Women; Tailem Bend Gold, Tailem Bend Town, Tailem Bend Railways Institute Blue. Methodist, Lutheran, Granites, Callington, Monteith, Mypolonga, Methodist Red, Chapman's Bore, Methodist Blue, Brinkley, Rockleigh. There were also courts at the Tailem Methodist Church, but I am not sure where they fitted in.

Thanks for preserving that bit of history Rob. No doubt found under the lino. Talking about clipping from under the lino. I would like to hear from anyone who has any, it's good history.

New Tailem Bend CFS Station

In March of this year, construction started on the new Tailem Bend CFS station.

Located on the corner of parkland tce and golf course road, the Tailem Bend CFS is part of the South Australian Country Fire Service, which has 16,000 volunteers in 430 stations throughout the state. Our main emergency response activities are fires and road crash rescue, but we cover all emergency incidents in the area.

The new station will have four appliance bays to house the brigades two fire trucks and one rescue truck with room for an additional vehicle if required in the future. It will also include upgraded facilities including separate male and female toilets, kitchen, laundry, meeting/training room and an office.

Construction is expected to be completed in August 2020.

Looking for local support!

With room running out at the National Rail Museum in Port Adelaide, Tailem Bend has the potential to become one of South Australia's prominent railway destinations.

Local rail enthusiast, Steve Moritz of Murray Bridge, is urgently looking for local support to see this opportunity become a reality. Proclaimed as a town one year after the railway rolled through the area in 1886, Tailem Bend is a renown Railway town.

Steve explains that the town's Railway Roundhouse precinct, currently being used for restoration and maintenance of passenger carriages and locomotives, has the potential to become a substantial mainline tourist train hub. *"It has to be driven by the local ratepayer base"*, Steve said. *"We can help, but the community will need to form a group - it's bit hard to have public meet at the moment."*

"There's a big opportunity for Tailem Bend to house an substantial rail museum, but we really need local support to make this a reality," Steve said.

"The Coorong District Council has offered support in the past, but we need the local enthusiasts to make this a sustain project."

In Memory of Ray Bolt

Ray Bolt was born in Mannum SA on 3rd October 1927 and died in Tailem Bend Hospital on 23rd March 2020 aged 92 years.

Ray was the eldest and last of 5 siblings. They were raised on a Farm at the one hundred of Bandon, Copeville and went to school there. Ray left school after Grade 7 and worked on the family farm for a while before going to Adelaide to join the Police Force where he stayed for around 2 years.

Following that time, he had decided he really wanted to drive trains and after another short stint at the farm he joined the SA Railways at Mt Gambier in 1948.


Moving around was part of the job starting off by living in Adelaide in 1949 where Ray and Greta were married at Christ Church North Adelaide in September that year making it 70 years. They had known each other for 72 years when Ray died.

Their next home was in Karoonda in 1951 then off to Wolseley in 1955 before finally moving to Tailem Bend in 1958.

The railways was Ray's whole life for many years and even in his retirement he kept it very close to his heart by doing tours of the Railway Museum. Both he and Greta volunteered at the Museum Information Centre which he loved doing. He helped put it together and lent some of his own things to the Tailem Bend Railway Station Museum.

Some of the many things that Ray was involved in within the Tailem Bend area over many years were Probus, Historical Society, Meals on Wheels, Friends of the Hospital, Tailem Bend Hospital Board, Murray Bridge St John the Baptist Anglican Op Shop and Tailem Bend Singers. Ray was also a JP in the area for many years.

There were two things that Ray was involved in for many years and put his heart and soul into, the first being St Luke's Anglican Church in Tailem Bend and the other being the Railway Museum and Information Centre at the Tailem Bend Railway Station.

AQUATICS CAMP AT TAILEM BEND

2020 Maitland Lutheran School Aquatics Camp at Tailem Bend

We welcomed the year 6 & 7 Students from Maitland Lutheran School to The Lodge on Murray for their Aquatic Camp they were accompanied by 18 Teachers, Assistants, Boat drivers and Helpers.

The Students enjoyed a week of Aquatic Sport experience at Tailem Bend under the very watchful eye of Principal David Field and his very energetic Staff.

After practising erecting their tents on the school oval in the days before, a flagged area at Tailem Bend was mapped out and the Students had to pitch their own tents.

The Students Aquatic Sport Program with 6 boats, 7 canoes, and 2 dingy's. Knee boarding, tubing behind ski boats, single and double skies, dingy handling and compliance through a course, fishing – *the students successfully caught 42 carp for the duration of the camp.* Canoe safety and handling, wave running and competing.

All students went through safety in the water program, ensuring they knew how to identify if they had the correct life jackets, and making sure they wore them at all times always waving to the boat driver if they have had a fall or slip up indicating they are okay.

It was a thrilling time with beautiful weather and no one wanting to go home.







Anthocercis littorea, a neglected Genus in cultivation.

Endemic to Australia with about 20 species, littorea found growing on coastal lime sands from Esperance to Geraldton in Western Australia.

For the last two months at Pangarinda Botanic Garden this 2 metre, narrow shrub has massed the ends of the stems with bright Yellow, showy, star-like flowers, striped purple in a bowl shaped centre.

Hasn't required watering throughout the dry.
