Carslake Corner can be found past the main street and left over the railway line on Granites Road, opposite the Anglican Church.



The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #81

VALERIE SPARROW - ARTIST

This month, we look at the life and times of renowned local artist, Valerie Sparrow, with her husband John, market gardeners, travellers and much more, as you will read - they are now our gain as residents of Tailem Bend.

Over to Valerie....

**My love for art first started with china painting. I attended a class in Stirling in the 1970's, run by Helen Steinwedel. With a passion for old world pieces, (which were readily available in white porcelain) I was able to get some, which I still treasure today. Eventually I bought my own kiln and started a small class - six students attended in our home at Scott Creek.

One class day was extremely hot with northerly winds "Ash Wednesday" and the roads were cut! Out of our four children, two were at Urrbrae, one at Heathfield High and one at Scott Creek Primary school, there was no communication, my Mum was with me and Dad was back in Bridgewater and no way of knowing how our family was. Fortunately we had a market garden, with acres of irrigated vegetables around our home and we escaped unscathed. It was a very frightening and devastating day for the hills.

In 1983 my Grandmother passed away and while clearing out her home, Dad found her small wooden box of charcoals and a roll of paper with an unfinished drawing and reference material. I completed the drawing and I was hooked! I love the freedom of using charcoal and working on a larger scale.

In 1985 my husband took up a post at Kalamurinna Station west of the Birdsville Track, its western boundary was Lake Eyre, John and I lived on the Warburton River about 60kms from the homestead - we were very isolated but the scenery was an artist's dream and, with a fair bit of time on my hands, my next trip to Adelaide for supplies, included prints and boards. Cowarie Station, our closest neighbours, commissioned a painting of their homestead and word spread, via the flying Doctor radio, (our only means of communication) and I had orders from Pandi Pandi, Marree, Calana and Mucumba Stations. Kalamurinna station also had an interest in an area on the Birdsville Track at Mungarannie. John and I spent some time there helping to set up the road house and worked there on a relieving basis when needed. It was yet another out-let for my painting, along with the Marree Caravan Park.

When we left, John worked in Kingston S.E. and Willalooka, where I was able to continue my painting. Colours and atmosphere were very different from the northern pastoral zone. The years we were in the S.E. were very wet. The Double Swamps at Taratap filled, and the water course on West Slopes, where John worked, was only navigable in a 'tinny'. I loved painting the water birds and scenes there.

In 1990, we bought our own property North of Keith. My spare time was very limited then, working part-time and helping on the farm, so, no time for painting.

We had a mixed farm, fine wool Merino sheep, fat lambs from our terminal mob, and forty breeding Angus cows. Some cropping/pasture renovation and a small paddock of irrigated Lucerne by the house. We joined the local golf club and made some very good friends.

In 2002 we retired. As John had had an altercation with a truck and a shed back on the market garden in 1966 and his injuries were becoming more of a problem with age, we felt we could no longer do justice to our farm. As our children were otherwise employed, we decided to move and bought a scrub block, ten kilometres South of Tailem Bend. There we built a home and carved out a garden eventually taming the horehound and onion weed and reducing the rabbit population. Our garden gives us a great deal of pleasure and is another source of inspiration for my painting.

We recently hosted an open garden for the Bridge Art Group, of which we are members. Once the heavy work was completed and with time on my hands, I joined local art groups, attended workshops and completed a certificate course in Botanical Art.

John is very keen on photography, especially birds. He won a People's Choice Award for his "SWANS OVER THE WATER". I use some of his photos for my work.

In 2013 John and I attended a garage sale at Pauline and Neville Merritt's home, where they were cleaning out a stone dwelling in the rear of their garden. This building was originally the home of Henry and Kath Tiller and later, Pauline's laundry. The light was beautiful and I fell in love with it straight away.

After much discussion, this room, which has many memories for the Merritt families, was offered to me as a studio. We had a grand opening on the weekend of October 25th and 26th, 2013, where over 80 guests attended. There was a good smattering of local folk and others from as far away as Kingston S.E., Tintinara and NSW.

Pauline, Vicki Stokes and Patsie Morouski, did a wonderful job with the food, serving scones and quiche and salad, in a beautiful garden setting. As the day was also a fund raiser for the Murray Bridge Hospital Chemotherapy Unit and with Rhonda Riggs manning the till, \$800 was raised to go towards a trolley for the unit.

My studio, aptly named *Val's Studio*

Battle Over Mallee - Council Elections 2018

Have You Voted Yet?

"Government is at its worst when you have apathy from its citizens" Quote by Jesse Ventura.

The battle of Mallee Ward is almost over, when voting closes 5pm Friday, November 9, 2018. Unlike other State and Federal elections, it's not compulsory to vote in South Australian Local Government council elections - however, council elections are by far the biggest single voluntary civic participation activity in the state.

With seven candidates contesting for four Councilor vacancies in the Coorong's Mallee Ward, the 2018 Council Elections are set to be extremely interesting and highly competitive - also in Tailem Topics distribution area, the Parks Ward has three vacancies.

Tailem Topics asked Candidates these Questions:

With so many rate payers demanding accountability and improved transparency from their Local Government, Tailem Topics asked candidates the following questions for publication on Social Media and in November's issue:

- Do you support Rate Capping? If so, why If not, why not?
- Government reductions in road funding, what do you suggest the Coorong District Council should do to fund improvements and maintenance of roads in the District into the future?
- If costs need to be trimmed by the Coorong District Council to meet Ratepayers requirements, what do you suggest needs to go?

These Candidates responded in writing to our questions:

LISA ROWNTREE -

Q: Do you support rate capping?

<u>A:</u> In essence yes, I support rate capping on residential rates. There are too many rate payers paying an unsustainable amount in rates, and when it starts affecting their ability to live in Tailem Bend, then there is something definitely wrong with that scenario. I believe that prior to amalgamation, some of the Councils functioned perfectly well with rate capping. It's all about living within your means.

Q: Roads:

A: The whole road programme needs to be looked at more closely by proper experts. It is hard for me to comment much on this as I really need to be able to see what's happened in the past and what is planned for the future. What I do know, is that the current protocol and associated expenditure is not working. Our roads have never been in poorer condition and something has to be done before someone is killed or seriously injured. We've had good roads before, so looking back at what worked in the past

and consulting with local experts, will be one of my objectives if elected.

Q: Costs:

A: I am very keen to look more closely at the actual costs of running the CDC. As a business woman I find it hard to understand why it costs so much to run the Council and why we need so many people. Perhaps once in, I will find some of the answers to my questions. If I ran my business like the CDC, I would be broke. The answer might also lie in not necessarily finding things that "need to go", but doing things in order of priority and in a cheaper, more sustainable manner.

GLYNIS TAYLOR -

Q: Do you support rate capping?

<u>A:</u> I support rate capping on residential rates. Without some form of well thought out capping system which takes in to account the ability to pay, the current one size fits all approach to rates increases is unsustainable. There must be a system which more closely reflects actual wage and pension annual increases.

Q: Roads:

<u>A:</u> All departments must live within their means. Blaming Federal or State departments for funding cuts is not good enough. Any project, and roads are no exception, requires an expert assessment of need, an annual schedule of works, prioritisation for roads which carry farming input and output, a proactive approach to upgrades, and tightly controlled budgets. But more importantly, consultancy with local experts who have local knowledge.

Q: Costs

A: The incoming council will need a full analysis of the current financial position. To drill down in great detail in to departmental spending and costs. To actively seek out unnecessary and wasteful spending and eliminate it. To take tighter control of projects, their scope and their budgets. Fiscal efficiency and sustainable spending can slow and stop uncontrolled rate rises, making the district affordable and attractive for business and families.

Q: Do you support rate capping?

A: In theory, I must say no, unless charges are capped as well. REASON: Year 2009/10 your bill was as follows RATES \$406 FIXED CHARGE \$295 CWMS \$178.50 Total \$879.50. With same valuation for year 2018/19: RATES \$540.92 FIXED CHARGE \$360 CWMS \$605 WASTE \$325 total \$1830.92 Rate rise for period \$134.92 Charges rise for period \$826.50

Q: Roads:

A: We had a change in procedures a few years ago which has proved catastrophic Staff have been blamed for not bringing roads to a suitable standard but you can't do this without a basic commodity "rubble" The complaints I receive about roads and damage done to vehicles is never ending. We were recognised for the quality of our road network but not any more. I will fight to get us back to a position where we are once again have the road network to be proud of.

Q: Costs:

<u>A:</u> Any business must take a complete review of the revenue and expenditure needed for the business to run in an efficient and sustainable manner. This is something I hope the new Council will do because continuing deficit budgets are not viable. If this was a business the manager would be having a good look.

"We've been looking at Tailem Bend for years, well before we opened our Bridgeview Family Practice in Murray Bridge," Dr Sabharwal said. "With all the growth in the region we're expecting a demand for improved medical services in the area and we believe that Tailem Bend is well situated to become a Medical Hub for the district."

"We have a strong team of five Doctors servicing Tailem Bend and all are highly skilled and fully credentialed to work in general practice, along with servicing hospital emergencies and Residential Aged Care."

"We're also pleased to be working with the Special Projects Team of the Tailem Bend Progress Association in promoting a Cultural Festival, incorporating a Food Fair, along with a Local Produce Market and possible Show-N-Shine in the town, early 2019."



Jury Road Orchard

Growing up across the lake at the Van Den Brink Farm, Margy Gambling (Nee......) of Meningie daydreamed about what was beyond the gates of Jury Road Orchard – not knowing that her husband's love of single piston motors would bring her home, establishing a peaceful resort on the shores of Lake Albert.

Situated in the world-renowned Coorong region and after years of toil working away from home, Margy is finally organized enough, to start sharing the tranquilly of her unique piece of paradise.

"Butch, my husband, loved the sound of his Southern Cross Stationary Diesel and if it wasn't for the neighbors complaining, he would have never surprised me with Jury Road Orchard,"

Margy said. "He found a home for his motor, but it has taken years, and I mean years, before we started to build - it's such a shame Butch never lived long enough to see what Jury Road Orchard is today."

With the lingering smell of old crude oil in the air, Margy braves the dusty shed and begins uncovering what is now a family treasure *Butch's Southern Cross*.

"I'll never forget the day Butch surprised me, opening the gates, we walked over the hill in a gentle drizzle of rain, the lake was calm and still like a mirror, Swans honked and you could hear the roar of the Southern Ocean in the distance – I fell in love, I knew I was home."

Whilst establishing her distinctive Bed & Breakfast and matchless self-sufficient camp grounds, Margy unearthed a number of fascinating artifacts leading to local Aboriginal Elders affirming that the land is the last gathering place of trade for the Ngarrindjeri people.

The Southern Cross Single Piston Stationary Diesel Motor

The Toowoomba Foundry is best known as the maker of hundreds of thousands of Southern Cross windmills over almost a century, from 1876 to 1973. The company also made thousands of small engines, many of which were used for pumping water on farms when the wind wasn't blowing. This small diesel engine was one of 1646 Southern Cross engines manufactured by Toowoomba Foundry between 1938 and 1945, a significant period in the company's history. The engine's design incorporates some innovations that resulted from research carried out at the foundry and that were later copied by other makers in Australia and overseas. These include oil-primed starting, which greatly simplified the engine's mechanism compared to other diesels, and an internal oil filter, which contributed to the engine's reputation for reliability. The engines were easy to start, even in cold weather. Although they cost more to buy than similar petrol or kerosene engines, they were cheap to operate because they could be fuelled by crude oil.



Weather you are a young family looking for a "forever" mate or one of the wonderful retired folk who have a lifetime of stories to share, owning an animal is one of life's pleasures.





Prisoners And Pups - Main Street



Prisoners And Pups follows the highs and lows of a small group of women prisoners, who have just eight weeks to transform retired racing greyhounds into obedient, house-friendly pets, ready for adoption. The film explores the journey that gives the greyhounds and the prisoners a second chance.

- The dogs, born into breeding kennels, have never known the sights and sounds of life beyond the track. Trained as racing dogs - they need to learn how to assimilate and become companions to humans in the next stage of their lives.
- For the women, this is their last chance too. Some have spent most of their lives behind bars and others are first time offenders. While consistent themes of substance abuse and violence echo throughout their stories, the hardest test turn out to be facing up to themselves. Can the prisoners and the dogs work together to prepare for their new lives outside?
- Following all screenings, there will be a special Q&A session with filmmaker Shalom Almond, about her experiences behind the scenes making the documentary. At many of the screenings, she will be joined by special guests, including the ex-prisoners from the film, to discuss the triumphs and challenges of rehabilitation and reintegration into the community.

Situated on one of the busiest sections of the Princes Highway and given these estimations, a grand total of approximately 1.2 million vehicles pass through Tailem Bend every year.

If Tailem Bend could attract an additional 3% of those vehicles passing its Main Street that would equate to an additional 102 vehicles (possibly 204 visitors) to our Main Street every day.



The Clockmaker's Daughter MORTON - Kate



Take Nothing with You is a sadfunny comedy of resilience and survival. While being given radioactive iodine therapy, which involves spending a little over 24 hours in a lead-lined hospital suite wearing only disposable clothes and with no






