THE BABY TRAIN

Who can remember the Mothers and Babies Health train? And I mean train! Not me and a lot of Mums around Tailem I have spoken to, don't go back that far - they remember the Clinic, but not the train. I have been lucky enough to have come across a story about the train and carriage that might jog a few memories, I hope so, it sounds very interesting.

Memories of the "BABY HEALTH CENTRE" car, (**BELOW**) which used to be based temporarily at Tailem Bend when on duty, were revived at a special lunch in the town (I don't know the date - **RIGHT**). The bicentennial lunch was organised by the local branch of the Childhood and Adolescent Family Health Services, formerly the Mothers and Babies Health Association, which operated the carriage.

Among guests at the lunch, was former baby health sister, Mrs Dorothy Mitchell, who was clinic sister from 1953 to 1960.

Mrs Mitchell said the baby train comprised one carriage fitted out as a clinic with living quarters and was towed along the Alawoona, Pinnaroo, Bordertown and Murray Bridge lines, stopping at almost every siding. "It was a 600 mile circuit and took a month to get around," Mrs Mitchell said, "and I would have seen a maximum of around 400 babies on each circuit." The carriage was left on a loop line at most stops but was often moved at all times of the day and night, sometimes even when the Clinics were being held – when freight trains or the Melbourne Express came through.

While visiting Tailem Bend, the carriage was placed safely away from the main lines - long time resident Bob Elliott, remembers while on shunting duties, the baby health car named the 'Willochra' was positioned in the railway yards near the town crossing, opposite the Anglican Church. The only way of getting near it he said, was through a gateway that led to the goods shed, roughly opposite St Vinnies.

Babies were weighed, measured, immunised and records kept of their progress, then many of the statistics were sent

to the Public Health Department (as it was named then), which is where averages were compiled.

But it wasn't only babies Mrs Mitchell was called on to assist with.



One day at Keith, a farmer called to say he was having trouble with a herd of valuable cows, a veterinarian, who was unable to come to the farm had told the farmer that the cows needed an enema, the farmer tried but wasn't having any success. Mrs Mitchell told him how to go about it and supervised. The exercise was a success she said, but you can imagine what the paddock looked like after giving 40 cows an enema!!.

Every three months the carriage was taken to the railway workshops at Islington for maintenance, it stopped running in the 1960's because upkeep became too expensive and the government considered car travel would be more economical. It was about that time, Mrs Mitchell said, that the sister's living quarters were established near the Tailem Bend Hospital.

She went on to say the clinic carriage was opened in 1949 by Lady Patricia Norrie wife of the then state Governor Sir Willoughby Norrie. Lady Elizabeth Bonython was Mothers and Babies Health Association President at the time.

Branch secretary Mrs Maralyn Ackland said Tailem Bend MBHA was formed in 1962 and like other branches state wide ,changed its name in 1981. The Tailem Bend branch was opened on July 21 1962 by the then SA Minister of Health, Sir Lyell McEwin.

A total of 34 people attended a lunch, among them Mrs Nada Heyen, who had been Branch patron for 20 years. In presenting the patron with a basket of flowers, Branch President Mrs Judy O'Connell, said Mrs Heyen still attended meetings every month.

Before a lot of track upgrading, the railway trains was quite often prone to derailments and accidents and the Baby Train was no exception, being involved in a collision at Brinkworth, luckily no one was on board. There could have well been a tragedy though, as Sister Lapworth who was in charge of the Mothers and Babies Health Association, escaped injury when an engine pushed a water truck violently against the Baby Health carriage where she was standing watching the shunting operations.

Seeing that a crash was inevitable, Sister Lapworth shut her eyes and clung tightly to the side of the carriage. The carriage had to be returned to Islington workshops for repairs before resuming its tour. The committee of the MBHA stated that the visit of the train to Gladstone, Tanunda, Angaston, Kapunda, Eudunda and Morgan will be delayed and an amended time table to be announced. Before the collision, the carriage was standing between another vehicle and a water truck, as the brakes of the water truck were not on the truck was pushed forward by the engine resulting in the health carriage receiving the full force of the impact.

Some windows were broken, others were cracked, and most of the interior fittings were disarranged.

It wasn't unusual for the train to travel up to 900 miles (1448 Ks) to isolated country mothers for advice concerning the welfare of their children, with each tour scheduled to last about two months. The carriage was towed from place to place attached to convenient trains and well equipped as



a clinic, Sister Lapworth's quarters included a kitchenette, shower, ice chest and sleeping berth. Photo shows it to be very comfortable, but at times I am sure it would have been very tough going, especially when being shunted around from place to place, day and night.

Just another outstanding example of so many services by so many dedicated people assisting the needs of country folk near and far.

One edition to go before the New Year and there is still plenty of stories to tell.

Later, motor racing in various forms became a driving force in his life and in 1965 he competed in his first stock car event at the iconic Rowley Park and later, raced at Renmark, Murray Bridge and Swan Hill, Victoria.

Today, Bobby remains involved in racing, now mainly motor bikes and is a qualified Race Official at Motorsport Park.

Amid all this, his talents as a musician and vocalist in a rock'n'roll band, saw him perform before many large audiences around South Australia, including competing in the TV series "Stairway to the Stars" where his band lost in the Grand Final.

Married to Kaye, herself an accomplished sportswoman and apparently a virtual dynamo on the netball court, their fascinating and eventful life endures to this day. Their home is in a bus and their life is a ball!






Lost at Tailem Bend ... Two Small Steam Locomotives

Before the First World War, two small steam locomotives were imported from Germany. They came to be owned by the South Australian Irrigation and Reclamation Works Department who used them in the Tailem Bend area until 1932. The two steam locomotives were left to rot where they ended their last journeys. One next to the present day S bend just south of the Jervois Ferry. The other on the then marsh land opposite Wood Point.

Over the next 40 years, the two locomotives were then progressively souvenired and demolished by railway and history enthusiasts and by 1990 there was nothing left.

The Milang Railway Museum is creating a display based on the story of these locomotives and is keen to include any parts of them. One set of wheels has already been recovered from a backyard in Murray Bridge. If you have any of these components then the museum would love to display them, either by loan or donation.

Our monthly Sunday roasts were attended well in the off season, a handy fundraiser, a huge thanks to Issy Koop and her helpers.


We are the host club for the finals in March 2020 and we would love to see the community support our events and cheer the teams along.






