
The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #69

This month we delve more into the life and times of Old Tailem Town founder Peter Squires - he certainly filled his life with adventure, confidence and ambition. Again this month, I will present it in his own words. It is much more bona fide that way.

**When I finished at Gilbert Motors I came back to where I belonged, Tailem Bend. In the time I was away, my Mother had married Aub Heynen, who managed Wilf Bartlett Motors where the Shell Road House now stands. Aub then started Heynen Motors in the Main Street and obtained the Chrysler and Standard agencies, where I ran the sales department and panel beat the used cars. In the 1950/60's Tailem got flooded with Standard eights and Vanguards and the richer farm people drove Dodges and Desoto's.

Heynen Motors was going extremely well, we had just acquired the Chamberlain Tractor Agency and money started flowing. Aub, my stepfather, made Heynen Motors into a limited company which included Nada Heynen, myself and Neville Merritt. It became one of the two main motor houses in the district along with Dutton Motors - we employed many people from around the district over the years. In 1986, Aub died and Neville and myself kept it going until it closed in 1993, bringing to an end, another era in the history of Tailem Bend.

At the age of 24, I decided to go around the World, much to the disappointment of my family. I first went to New Zealand where I spent a year panel beating in Auckland and then I worked as a drink waiter and a barman in O'Connel's hotel




in Queenstown. From there it was on to Africa, where I was determined to get the best job ever. After awhile, I met the owner of Sydney Clow Motor Company who employed 3,000 people and assembled top line cars in Queenstown. He invited me in for two minutes, gave me a job and talked about Australia for about 10 minutes, in which time he rang the general manager who became my senior contact. I spent nearly two years with them and had a wonderful experience in the motor industry.

The Pioneer Village in Swan Hill inspired me to want to do the same at Tailem Bend, the council supported me but a battle with the state planner went on for three years. Eventually we got a start and in 1986 Old Tailem Town opened and by 1989 we had enough exhibits to be open every day. It was exciting to be told that Old Tailem Town was in a television show in Germany and we also appeared on shows in Australia - state and nationwide. People from interstate and around the world, make up over half of our customers, so over the years Tailem Bend has been put on the map. Two films from Village Road Show, 'Disappearance' and 'Twin Rivers' were filmed here.**

There is a lot more to Tailem Town that we will look at in another edition.

The Tailem Bend Progress Association watched over the affairs of the town in 1954 with Mr OJ Walheim as President. The association took over control of the swimming pool (shallow section of the river) and spent \$800 making it a safe pool for the children. Police Sgt J Connell, while stationed at Tailem, spent a good part of his spare time at the pool, along with Hurtle Green, Reg Tilbrook, Bryce Jaensch and Jack Butler.



The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #69

Much loved and respected Flo Both, before passing away a few months ago, would have been 97 years of age - our oldest living resident. Flo made sure she didn't take a host of Tailem Bend history with her - in fact her son Macka, presented to me 12 giant albums, chock-a-block full with photos and clippings of almost everything that happened in Tailem, compiled by Flo over the years.

To get the ball rolling on Flo's records, I have included a letter to the editor of our local paper, sent in by the late Bill McMorron, when our Hospital was under threat of closure. Bill was a local butcher who opened Coronation Meat Store in 1953. His family has a long history with our town and still has a connection through offspring. It's a letter from the heart with a bit of humour, I'm sure, attached to it. This is how it goes:

**To the Editor


I sincerely hope that, with the help of all concerned residents, Tailem Bend Hospital remains open and the local doctor remains to attend our needs.

You see I can't drive to Murray Bridge to see a doctor, so I reckon I would have to rely on my friend Wally, if in the foreseeable future, Mr Bannon and Mr Cornwall get their own way and close the hospital.

Say for example, after the local hospital is gone, I take sick – my blood pressure is playing up.

I make an appointment in Murray Bridge and the doctor says come in at 2pm because that's the only time he can fit me in. Wally said he would take me to Murray Bridge if I ever needed to go, but he doesn't knock off until 5pm. So Wally takes a couple of hours off work, the doctor gives me a couple of pills and says 'Come back at the end of the week. Once again, the only appointment I can get is before 5pm, is Wally expected to take some more time off work? He does, and after a few more trips my blood pressure is fine, until I get sick again.

How can I repay Wally? I can't drive him to the doctor if he gets sick, we would have to rely on some of our other mates. I could get Lindsay, Tiger or Len to take Wally, if they can't, I could ring Murray Bridge and get Wacka to come and get him. Or Ginger could come and get us, he's 73 but can still drive and would help us.





Myself and Wally seem to be taken care of, but what about the rest of the Tailem Bend and district residents who rely on the Lower Murray District Hospital. Do they have to go through similar situations? No. Keep our hospital and our doctor.

Cornwall and Bannon – Wally and I will be voting for Liberals next election.

Onya Bill, with letters like that no wonder we kept our hospital open.

Still to come, the Gumi races, local boys make good, more about the horse racing industry and a further look at the railway prefab houses.

Memories from an Interstate Reader of Topics

Earlier this year I came across Tailem Topics online and with much reminiscing of my own, have enjoyed reading all the issues currently available there. I am very impressed with Tailem Bend's community spirit, wealth of activities and the obvious determination to keep improving the amenity of the town and district.

I grew up in Tailem Bend, but left in 1954 for my secondary schooling. I have not lived in South Australia since 1958 when my family moved to Perth, but still pass through 'The Bend' from time to time en route to Murray Bridge and Adelaide for family visits, from Canberra.

Here are a few of my memories from the 1940's and 1950's: Every year as Guy Fawkes Day approached, we children would save our pocket money to buy fireworks and pester our parents to get supplies ready for Bonfire Night. This would be held on the old wharf, high above the river and families all joined in the fun around the bonfire, letting off our crackers - bungers, tom thumbs, pinwheels, skyrockets, sparklers and roman candles...and what did we call those that shot high in the night sky before releasing wondrous displays descending towards us?

The annual Show was always much anticipated, with its travelling sideshows, merry-go-rounds, the displays and judging in numerous categories – agricultural,

livestock, craft, floral, cooking – and kids let loose to wander freely among it all.

Other community occasions included events such as maypole dancing (practised at school to prepare), judging of decorated bicycles, slow bike races and probably running and egg and spoon and three-legged races.

The Institute (now the Town Hall) was the venue for 'The Pictures' and for the annual Strawberry Fair, Deb Balls and Fancy Dress Parades. I remember tagging along as the women prepared the hall for the Balls. They would cut long packs of crepe paper into streamers which were then twisted and draped up high, and the floor would be prepared for dancing. Would it have been candle wax which was applied to enable shoes to glide on the floor? And of course, there was generous preparation of country fare for supper.

I also remember Amateur Hour concerts being held outdoors, across the former side road from the Institute where there is now an attractive reserve.

This Month in the Garden

For our Temperate Climate, try planting artichoke, beetroot, cabbage, capsicum, carrots, chillies, eggplants, French beans, kohl rabi, leeks, lettuce, parsnip, potatoes, sweet corn and watermelon. In the herb garden it's time for basil (both sweet and purple), parsley, sage, pyrethrum, lemon grass, oregano, rue and marjoram. Mint is ready to go too, but you might want to keep it in a nice sized pot, just to prevent serious mint invasion.

In the flower garden, it's now time to plant nasturtium, dianthus, Livingstone daisies, verbena, snapdragons, petunias, chrysanthemums, Shasta daisies, marigolds (French) and celosia. These plants are great at attracting pollinators and beneficial insects to your patch.

Of course, this is just a guide, as you get to know what micro climate will be created in your own garden, due to location and extremes in weather. The one thing that remains the same for all zones and regions is that sustainable gardening doesn't mean 'no maintenance' gardening, you will still need to spend some time to pull some weeds and enjoy your patch of paradise.

In October with the weather warming up nicely, there's no better place to be, than the backyard. Remember to use all your senses in the garden. Sit and **listen** to the birds and bees, **watch** for pest issues, **feel** for soil moisture, **smell** your soil...and your flowers...and most importantly, **taste** the fruits (or vegetables) of your labours.

Weeding - is a great job to do this time of year. It may sound tedious, but it's incredibly rewarding. While the kids are on school holidays, why not give them a "buck a bucket" for each bucket of weeds they remove? It's good for composting, plus it gets them out in the sun, having fun and learning about nature.

Tomatoes - It's time to plant everyone's favourite – tomatoes. Don't forget their companions - Basil and French Marigolds, these will help ward off unwanted pests.

Sunflowers - Find a sunny spot where you would like to see some sunflowers later in the year and plant the seeds to double the depth of the seed. Cover lightly with soil and wait... they'll be popping their happy heads up in no time.

Remember to mulch and if you have any 'free' time, give your gardening tools some TLC. Give them a good clean, then sharpen and oil them - it's really rewarding and will save you money and plant problems in the long run.

Healthy Happenings

FEVERFEW

Ancient Greeks and Egyptians used Feverfew for general aches and pains including menstrual pain.

In medieval Europe, Feverfew was used for a multitude of conditions and was a popular plant in cottage gardens. In times of plagues it was planted around houses to protect the occupants from the disease.

Feverfew is a perennial plant that can be quite invasive in the garden. I remember one year I grew it in the ground and the following year was constantly finding new plants everywhere. Therefore, I now grow feverfew in a pot and monitor its ability to invade. Seeds can be easily sown in early spring; it likes a well-drained soil and prefers a sunny but protected position.

Suggested uses of FEVERFEW include the preventative and alleviation of pain associated with migraines. It needs to be taken over a 1 to 2 month period to act as a preventative. FEVER-FEW is often combined with other herbs for allergy symptoms.

Tablet formulations are available or if you grow the plant then consuming a leaf or two directly from the garden may also help prevent migraines. The leaf does have a slightly bitter taste therefore may be easier to consume with food. Excessive heat in the drying process can easily destroy the active ingredient in FEVERFEW so if taking a supplement and it is not helping, try another brand or eat it fresh daily.



## Will There Be A River For Our Children??

Dear Editor,

Like many who watched *Four Corners*, I was of course appalled at the very serious allegations of water theft and corruption in New South Wales raised by the program. And I am adamant the allegations be fully investigated and resolved as quickly as possible to the satisfaction of all relevant stakeholders.

To date, the allegations are the subject of *four* separate inquiries and investigations; the NSW independent review led by Ken Matthews announced on 26 July, the Murray Darling Basin Authority's review of compliance with state-based regulations governing water use announced by the Prime Minister on 30 July, the Australian National Audit Office's review into the Department of Agriculture and Water Resources' efforts in monitoring water use in NSW, and not least the referral to the NSW Independent Commission Against Corruption (ICAC).

The latter has similar powers to a standing Royal Commission, and we've seen premiers resign and former ministers jailed as a result of its activities.

Nevertheless, should all of these investigations fail to satisfactorily resolve the allegations, I will be the first to call for further action.

I would echo the wise counsel of Gavin McMahon, Chair of the National Irrigators Council, urging caution against any sort of hysterical overreaction, and noting the Murray Darling Basin Plan is working regardless of the allegations.

Almost 2100 gigalitres/year has been recovered for environmental flows, and just recently the Murray Darling Basin Ministerial Council – which includes South Australian State Minister Ian Hunter – endorsed the final package of Sustainable Diversion Limit (SDL) Adjustment Mechanism projects delivering more than 600 GL/year in offsets.

This progress has been achieved one way, and one way only: by all Basin jurisdictions working together. We must never forget that only by working together can we complete the delivery of the Basin Plan. The Plan is absolutely critical to the future of South Australia, and we must also never forget that it will be our State which risks the most if it does not work with other jurisdictions to deliver it.

#### Ally's Canine Column

With all the worries Mother Nature is causing in the world at the moment I (well, my PA) thought that we would talk about weather (oops, wrong

'whether') you would know what to do with your pet if a disaster struck, and as we are approaching our bushfire season, the timing seems right to write about it.

The Government actually has a research team heading up a project called MAID (Managing Animals in Disasters) and have come to realise that owning a pet influenced up to 72% of people evacuating to safety and leaving their pets behind and further concerns that evacuation centres would turn away animals, hence at 'crunch' time you humans wouldn't evacuate at all! Awwww, that's why we wuv you guys.

Evacuation centres around Australia use their own discretion when it comes to whether they allow pets or not into their centre. For example: only assistance dogs are allowed in all evacuation centres Australia wide, (latest relevant information my PA will disclose was up to date as at July 2016, so conditions relating to evacuation centres could have changed since then and remember as previously mentioned, your individual council has the ability to decide their own community's welfare in relation to this.)

SA pets are welcome if they are calm and well controlled (no barking or aggression). Well how about some of you people take that same advice in this type of situation, we certainly don't go about looting afterwards (okay PA I am off my little soapbox now!).

So PLAN AHEAD, identify pet friendly accommodation in advance, this could be an evacuation centre, friends, family, pet friendly hotels or boarding kennels. Relocating early to a safe area will alleviate relying on emergency transport, as it can be refused at a critical time (as pet owners found in



the 2013 Bundaberg floods.)

**PET EMERGENCY CHECKLIST** You will no doubt have some personal emergency supplies of your own, but don't forget us! Some basic items to include (maybe in our own specific backpack type of bag) are: small bag of dog food/ treats/blanket/bowl for food and water (you can buy ones that fold up so take up less space) poo bags/lead/favourite toy/phone numbers of your vet and relatives etc and medications.

Emergency services find so many lost and bewildered animals in the aftermath of disasters and although micro chipping all animals is unrealistic, having your cat or dog micro chipped is an advantage, as it helps in returning them back to you safely.

I'm going to go and give mum a big hug once I finish typing this now and make sure her 'emergency pack' is ready.....plastic glass (so it doesn't break), wine, cheese biccies......)



#### Letter to the Editor

To whom it may concern ... Coorong Council,

I am writing to express my concern regarding the recent rise in rates. Myself and other Ratepayers on Westbrook Road cannot understand this rise in rates eg. We get no mail delivery, no rubbish pickup and have no sealed roads and no dwelling has electricity. Those not living on the property are charged the same rates as Residences. We went from Rural, to semi-Rural, to Residential and nothing has been done to improve what is listed above. We also have no mains water.

Pensioners will be struggling financially as this rise will take approximately \$42.00 from our Pension per fortnight - we should be considered, as Ratepayers on fixed incomes. We vote our Councilors in to look after our needs, you are paid to do this job.

Pensioners living in the town are also voicing their concerns and worry how they will be able to manage, they have approached me in the shopping Centre. This money from our pensions is a lot of money considering our individual commitments.

I would, as other Ratepayers, appreciate the Councilors to please listen, be a good listener, everyone deserves to be heard, that is how issues are resolved.

#### LETTER TO THE EDITOR - To all Ratepayers,

I have had quite a lot of talks, phone calls, emails and letters from Pensioners, regarding the rate rises and the other charges added to the rates in the district. Imagine how hard it is for a Pensioner, especially on a single Pension trying to survive on their meagre pension. Imagine then being told "what are you complaining about, your rates are only equal to approximately \$40.00 a week, that's only a carton of beer a week". How many pensioners would love to be able to buy a carton of beer a week, they can barely buy enough food??? It is not only the rate rises but the other charges, CWMS and Kerbside Waste.

Only five years ago the CWMS charge was only \$340.00 – now \$605.00, we DID NOT pay the Kerbside Waste charge, now we pay \$325.00 .... I know in 2012/2013 my valuation went down (it has not risen from that drop) but since then my Rates have DOUBLED. What rise have the Pensioners had? Have their Pensions doubled? Are they/we getting anymore services, value for money?

Some other figures to consider: since 2009, with no increase in the value of your property your rates have risen just over 36%. CPI over this period is only 13.0%. CWMS Charges have gone from \$178.50 in year ended 2010, to \$325.00 in 2017. Waste management charges have gone from nothing in previous years, to \$190 in year ended 2014 and now are \$325.

It is stated in the Council's Strategic Management Plan, that the Council Rates and ALL other Council charges WILL CONTINUE TO RISE every year until 2026 .... We need to stop it now, enough is enough, join us and make a stand now.

Dear Editor,





#### Book Review SEEING RED - BROWN Sandra

Kerra Bailey is a television journalist on the rise, and she's hot on the trail of a story guaranteed to skyrocket her career to even greater heights: an interview with the legendary Major Trapper. Twenty-five years ago, the Major emerged a hero from the bombing of the Pegasus Hotel in downtown Dallas when he was photographed leading a handful of survivors out of the collapsing building. 
