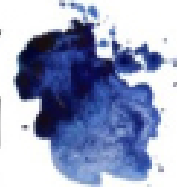

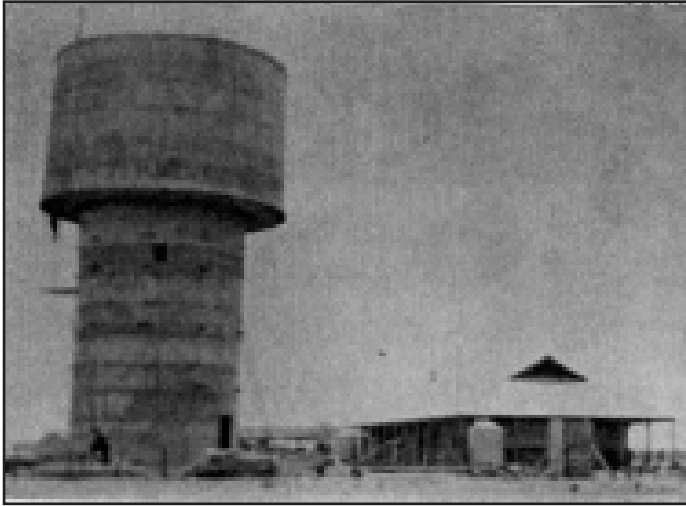

CALL TO RETAIN WATER TOWER

If my memory serves me correctly, there were once four water towers in Tailem Bend, the railways owned two that were situated near the old barracks (and I mean old, probably built around 1920) roughly at the end of Webb Street and just around the corner to the left. Not far away, stood the majestic coal gantry. Both were demolished after serving their purpose, no doubt without much fanfare, as was the case in those days.



This brings me to the one that once occupied space where the RSL memorial garden is now and a lovely feature that does present, perhaps the tower could have blended in with it. Anyway, the council saw it as a safety issue and decided it had to go, whereas the people of Tailem Bend wanted it retained and requested the council to do all in its power to ensure the unused tower was kept. A meeting called by the Tailem Bend and District Development Committee (as it was known then) reported that the Council and State Transport Authority were in favour of demolishing the tower. The committee believed however, that the tower had history value and could be an asset to the town as a tourist attraction and should be heritage listed.

The committee did agree that considerable work needed to be done, but it could be brought up to a standard to be simply retained as a monument to Tailem's history and as a means of displaying murals. (In view of what's been happening lately, wouldn't the murals have been a good idea in the main street? Especially as the only tower standing, dodged a makeover).

It was claimed the tower was one of three outstanding features of Tailem's main street - the others were the railway station and the recently built playground.

Council members at the meeting accepted the concerns and agreed to take the matter up at Council level.

TAILEM'S WATER TOWER TUMBLES

A Tailem Bend landmark has vanished from the skyline - the water tower in the main street dating back to early last century around 1910 has been demolished. It provided water for the steam engines and business areas - water was pumped from the structure via railway reserve land.

Locals expressed sadness that the tower had disappeared, especially when it was noted that several other areas had used old towers for historical determinations and one had been turned into a lookout. The tower had been removed after a question of possible liability because of deterioration, it did, however, take over two days to complete the demolition - **BELOW.**



PRIMARY SCHOOL WELCOMES NEW BUILDING

On a much brighter note, we talk about something that went up and not down. Around 1985, the Tailem Bend Primary School was a hive of activity, welcoming the arrival of a new portable classroom building, replacing the one that was destroyed in a recent fire.

Principal Neville Gotch, (**OPPOSITE PAGE**) said the two room block would be used as a specialist art and science department, readily available for teachers who used their rooms to teach these subjects.

Another addition under way at the school, was the first of two cricket practice pitches and nets, being installed at a cost of one thousand dollars - these were used by school cricket teams and the Tailem Bend Cricket Club.

The school's Ethiopia fundraising fortnight realised a total of \$435, which was much higher than Mr Gotch expected. Highlight of the fortnight included a hot dog day which raised \$80 and Mr Reid's Disco, added a further \$41.

Media Studies students were also busy and their film making efforts were rewarded at the YOUNG FILM MAKERS FESTIVAL. TAILEM BEND PRIMARY was the only country school to enter the competition and won a total of five awards for Fireball, Tailem Terrors, A Tailem Affair, Bomber Attack and Killer Cars.

An array of sterling performances was on display and I can imagine a few 'Oscars' being handed out on awards night. Also, I wonder how many past students out there still remember their night under the stars.....and who were the DIRECTORS?

1985 / 86 - Tailem Bend Rowing Club

The local rowing club made the headlines, being the first in Australia to use a boat 'four' using a lightweight German mould. Club members put the boat in the water for the first time, watched by its builder, Adelaide man, Allan Smith at a cost of \$7300 - the boat replaces a 15 year old craft which became obsolete.

The old 'four' was the only one in South Australia to have a forward cox, the type used in the Olympics, but club president Brian Mc Loughlin said this type was not good for lower grade rowers to use because the cox cannot keep an eye on the pace. Brian said the community got behind the project - raising funds to buy the boat, the local Lions Club donated \$1000, Riverside Hotel \$1500 and Tailem Bend Hotel \$3000.

It was the first new 'four' purchased by the club since 1975 and the first new addition since a Scull was bought in 1973.

These club improvements followed on a good season for Tailem, resulting in the club winning the 1985/86 country premiership, this followed wins on two other occasions this decade, 1980/81 and 1981/82. The original rowing club shed was built around 1915 (Near where the old ferry landing is now) and replaced by the new one in 1981. On display in the shed is the 'four' bought by Tailem in 1919, the only complete hulled oak clinker of that vintage in South Australia.

WADE STEVENS AND AUSTRALIA POST

We are still in the 1980's where a young lad accidentally stretched the resources of Australia Post to the limits. Wade Stevens, (**ABOVE**) an 11 year old from Tailem Bend, can consider himself lucky to have received some information that he wrote for, to the West Australian Museum. Lucky that is, that the publications department and Australian Post combined to get the information back to him.

When Wade, a year 6 student at the Tailem Bend Primary School, wrote away for information, he overlook to put his name and address on the letter.

Not to be beaten, the Museum put together all the information Wade had asked for and seeing the Tailem Bend post mark clearly imprinted on the envelope, sent it back to that Post Office. With the material, was a request for the Post Office, if possible, to identify the writer.

Some detective work on behalf of Tailem Bend postal manager Trevor Crane and the school led to the discovery that the anonymous letter had been Wade's work.

In this instance Mr Crane said, "Australia Post certainly lived up to the motto 'WE DELIVER'.

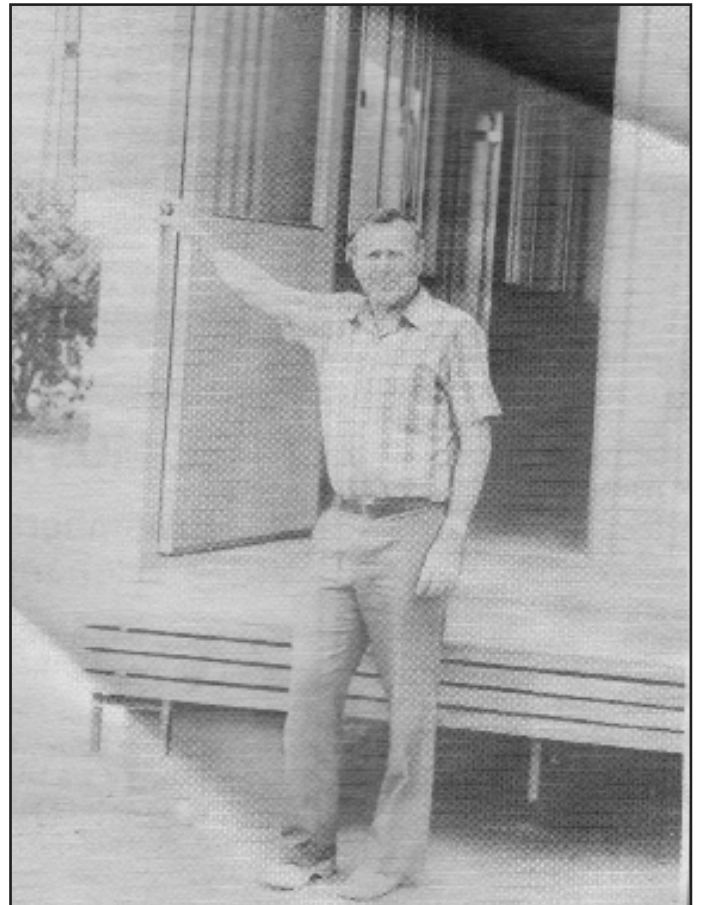
In his letter at the time, Wade said he'd asked for information on numbats, quokkas, dugites and the trapdoor spider and added he had always been interested in nature and animals. He also had work after school tending for horses in his uncle Laurie's racing stables.

His mother, Vicki Stevens, said Wade had written four letters on the topic and simply forgot to put his name on this one.

Ms Julie Green, manager of Australia Post's State Communications Office, said she thought the incident was a good example of the many people who cared and went out of their way to help.

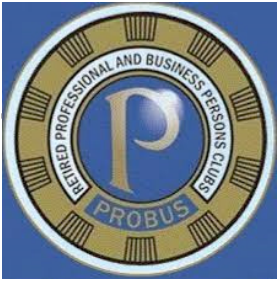

GUEST SPEAKER – DON GOODALL

Guest Speaker Organiser Peter Connolly introduced new member Don Goodall, who bravely stepped in at a moment's notice to act as Guest speaker. Don delivered a comprehensive summary of the many farming activities undertaken by his large family group which began with his grandfather, who was also a wheelwright, way back in 1886, starting off in the Coomandook region. "In those days, farming was real hard yakka," he said.

The Goodall family acquired and developed many Mallee properties, converting large areas of scrub. Don said that in those times, families were very large and health and medical conditions, meant that child survival rates were very low. Don ended up working mainly in the Coomandook, Yundi and Ki-Ki regions.

He remembers very clearly the disastrous 1944 drought and depression, when at times they were unable to obtain fuel to power their tractors. This was well before the advent of telephones. In 1970 he survived a nasty accident which decimated his right hand, with which he is now able to give very different "up you, too" gestures!

Don has long been President of a "closed society" known as "Harness and Horsepower" which raises funds that are donated to the Coomandook Area School.

He was warmly applauded for his presentation and was thanked and awarded a Certificate of Appreciation by senior Member, Ron Whibley - RIGHT.

Don drew the door prize raffle winner who was Frank Miller. The meeting closed at 11.45 am.

CEO Resigns

COORONG COUNCIL CEO RESIGNS MEDIA RELEASE – 15/08/19

Coorong District Council Chief Executive Officer, Vincent Cammell has announced his resignation effective as of Wednesday, 7 August 2019.

Mr Cammell joined the Coorong team in 2013 having previously served with the City of Adelaide, and bringing with him over 20 years' experience in local government.

The most prominent achievement under Mr Cammell's watch has been the development of The Bend Motorsport Park. Other deliverables include the successful 'Creating Coonalpyn' arts and urban renewal project, Meningie Stormwater and Streetscape project, rollout of new tourism signage and Council branding, multiple playground upgrades and attracting significant funding to develop the Murray Coorong Trail.

Mayor Paul Simmons acknowledged Mr Cammell's contribution and wished him well in his future endeavours. His departure follows the resignation of Council's Community and Corporate Director, Nat Traeger, who has been appointed as Kingston District Council CEO.

"We now have a great opportunity with a new Council and new executive team to re-chart the course of Council, especially given we have budgeted in 2019/20 to undertake a review of our strategic plan, service levels and rating policy," Mayor Simmons says.

"While the departing experience will be missed, new ideas and a fresh set of eyes will be invaluable to these review processes," he says.

The search for a new CEO will start immediately.

"A process for recruitment will be presented at the next Council meeting with the aim being to promote the vacancy nationally," Mayor Simmons says.

Mayor Simmons also noted that staff had stepped up to ensure business as usual during the leadership changes. He particularly acknowledged the contribution of the Infrastructure and Assets Director, David Mosel who has been Acting CEO for several months.

It is unlikely the organisation will return to full staff until early in 2020. In the interim, options for existing staff and external resources to temporarily backfill vacancies will be explored.

New Trespass Laws

PROTECTING FARMERS FROM ANIMAL ACTIVISTS

Tough new farm trespass laws to protect Australia's farmers from the unlawful actions of animal activists have now passed the Australian Parliament, following passage of the Bill through the Senate yesterday.

Member for Barker Tony Pasi MP, said the *Criminal Code Amendment (Agricultural Protection) Bill*, showed Australia's farmers that Australians were on their side. "Militant animal activists have invaded farms across the country trespassing, threatening and harassing farming families," Mr Pasi said.

"These have not just been farm invasions, they're also home invasions. Farming families that have done nothing wrong have a right to feel safe at home and in their place of work,"

"If activists don't like animal farming there are plenty of ways to make their point without breaking the law.

"This Bill makes it a criminal offence to publish material, via a carriage service like the internet, if you intend to incite trespass, property damage or theft on agricultural land.

"Animal activists who use the personal information of family farmers to incite trespass risk imprisonment of up to five years.

"The Morrison Government is serious about deterring those who want to disrupt and intimidate our farmers, fishers and foresters in their homes and on their properties."

"Activists need to understand that they can't just descend on someone's home and place of work, interfere with their business and steal their animals," Mr Pasi said.

A Coorong District Council panel has been formed to help recruit a new Chief Executive Officer - Councillors Glynis Taylor, Lisa Rowntree, Jeff Arthur, Sharon Bland and Mayor Paul Simmons will assess applications and make recommendations to all Councillors, who will in turn, interview the final candidates.

Wellington Strawberry Fete History

On July 4th 1961, 20 members attended the first meeting of the reformed Wellington Progress Association and during those early years, the Wellington West Hall Fund (now known as Wellington Hall) was absorbed by the Progress Association and much of the business dealt with the completion of the Hall and upkeep of the fencing and reserve owned by them.

The inaugural meeting of the Wellington CWA was held in July 1961 and from then on, meetings were held in the newly built hall which incidentally had no flooring at that time. It was this inconvenience and balancing act of walking over floor joists during meetings that prompted the first ever Strawberry Fete to be held.

The original Strawberry Fete (which was the social event of the year in the district) was first held in January 1962 and was known as the CWA Strawberry Fete. It was run during the day and culminated in a dance in the evening. Funds raised the first year by the CWA amounted to £103.12.0 and of that £100 was donated to the Progress Association to help pay for the new floor which was urgently needed in the Hall. The CWA existed for another 16 years and after its demise, the running of the Strawberry Fete was taken over by the Wellington Progress Association (which still owns the Hall) and was subsequently held in November each year.

The date was changed in the late eighties to Sunday of the October Labour Day long weekend, to coincide with the vast influx of visitors to the area, which increased the profits three fold from the previous year.

Local residents of Wellington speak of their families involvement in the Strawberry Fete and one of our locals, Wendy, tells the story of her late grandparents, Dave and Lil Thomas, being involved from the early sixties. She remembers well, that as a young four year old, it was very exciting to attend the fete with her grandpar-

ents and her grandmother having a stall where she sold home-made handbags, dressing table sets, table cloths and shell figures. Her grandfather, Dave, drove each year to Cherry Gardens to pick up the strawberries being sold at the fete.

I am also told that some of the local families back in the eighties, being Chesio, Johnson and Cazzalato (and currently still reside in the Wellington and Jervois areas) were also involved in the fete and word has it that they used to load a keg in the back of their ute and enjoy a refreshment or two on the day!

From humble beginnings, the annual Strawberry Fete, currently steered by a very organised and enthusiastic Wellington Progress Association Committee, now attracts wide interest from the region and each year attendance has grown with over 600 people attending in 2018. Karoonda Drought Support Funding

KAROONDA BENEFITS FROM DROUGHT SUPPORT FUNDING

Member for Barker Tony Pasin has officially opened the new Karoonda Early Childhood Centre and Community Hub funded through the Morrison Government's Drought Communities Program, on August 13, 2019. The purpose built facility will be home to childcare service and provide additional space to cater for a range of community and social activities.

The \$550,000 piece of infrastructure was funded entirely through the Federal Government's Drought Communities Program.

Mr Pasin said eight eligible councils across Barker were eligible for \$1 million dollars to undertake projects to deliver outcomes for communities in drought.

"While each of these councils are in various stages from planning to completion, I'm extremely proud that I can point to projects that are making a real, direct difference to residents experiencing drought in communities across Barker," Mr Pasin said.

"I'm seeing projects roll out that are increasing local employment, stimulating local economies, and improving services and amenities for our regions, like the new childcare service here in Karoonda which is providing a desperately-needed service for many families across the Mallee."

"While we can't make it rain, our Government is supporting our communities in drought. We're backing in our farmers, and we will always stand up and support our drought-affected communities," Mr Pasin said.

The Drought Communities Program supports communities in the most drought-affected regions of Australia and builds on more than \$7 billion of Liberal and Nationals Government drought support measures. Funding is available to eligible councils for local infrastructure projects and other drought-relief activities. Project funding is intended to provide short-term support, including by boosting local employment and procurement, and addressing social and community needs.

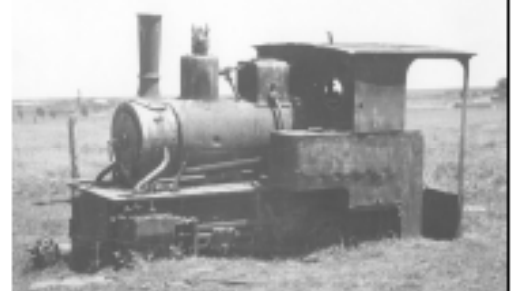


Lost at Taillem Bend ... Two Small Steam Locomotives

Before the First World War, two small steam locomotives were imported from Germany. They came to be owned by the South Australian Irrigation and Reclamation Works Department who used them in the Taillem Bend area until 1932. The two steam locomotives were left to rot where they ended their last journeys. One next to the present day S bend just south of the Jervois Ferry. The other on the then marsh land opposite Wood Point.

Over the next 40 years, the two locomotives were then progressively souvenired and demolished by railway and history enthusiasts and by 1990 there was nothing left.

The Milang Railway Museum is creating a display based on the story of these locomotives and is keen to include any parts of them. One set of wheels has already been recovered from a backyard in Murray Bridge. If you have any of these components then the museum would love to display them, either by loan or donation.

Word is out in the community and eligible people of all ages are now making the most of our friendly and efficient, volunteer driven comfortable cars, to attend medical appointments that are outside of the hours and areas serviced by the Medical Bus, or to access shopping, banking and other similar services not available locally. Community Passenger (CPN) transport is door to door, from your home to your destination and back again.

One of our "frequent flyer regulars" from Meningie sometimes adds a stop at McDonalds for lunch, a bank visit, and / or a spot of shopping to his transport trip while in Murray Bridge!

Recently one of our Tallem Bend folk was transported to the Adelaide Airport to fly out to visit family interstate, and next month we

are taking folk, who have no other way of travelling there, to attend the ABBA concert in Murray Bridge!

The comfortable, airconditioned and wheelchair accessible Medical Bus runs every week day from Keith, picking up eligible clients of all ages from their door along the way and delivering them to their medical appointments (which must be between 11am and 2pm). The clients are transported by tax experienced, friendly drivers who navigate their way easily to the various medical facilities.

To make a booking on either the Medical Bus or the Community Cars, or to enquire about your eligibility to access our services, please call Dani on 8572 3513 (Monday to Friday 8am to 4.30pm).

Please note that the Medical Bus will not be available between December 13th 2019 to January 13th 2020, while they take a well earned break.

The Community Passenger Network will also give our hard working volunteer drivers a break from December 23rd resuming January 6th 2020.
