

The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #70

The mighty Murray River winds its way right past our doorstep and I often wonder if we really appreciate it. There is no doubt it is still being used, but certainly not for prolific swimming or fishing, the odd regatta or two or just relaxing on a pontoon moored by the swimming pool. Do we ever simply sit on the lawn by the rowing club and watch the sun set? I remember the swim through Tailem Bend Carnival, the race distance was held well over a kilometre, with the start at the western end of the town and finished roughly where the old ferry landing is. Hundreds of people lined the river bank cheering their favourite swimmers home.

This brings me to a couple of stories about fun on the river; The first was an initiative by Tailem Bend in 1961 and was promoted as the first Henley on the Murray ever to be held. It was a highly successful day and night carnival that raised more than \$800, for the Lower Murray District Hospital. (a massive amount of money in those days!!)

Commencing at 10.30am with a procession through the Main Street, it went until the last note of the Hi Tones Orchestra sounded out at midnight. The fixture held on the river frontage adjacent to the lawns of the Westbrook Speedboat and Ski Club went with a swing.

It was organised by the LMDH supporters club assisted by the Westbrook Ski Club.

The speed boats came from Goolwa, Milang, Westbrook and Murray Bridge, they put on their usual stirring display of fast turns and rapid acceleration in their races. In addition,

water skiing held the attention of the crowd throughout the afternoon. Single and double skis, surf board towing and bare foot skiing, were all featured. Early in the afternoon Bruce Frazer and Brian Fox kicked off their skis and skied successfully, bare footed. Other skiers were Geoff Klingbiel, Jack Ross, Kevin Wiebricht, Bill Lumm, Ray Orr and Miss Marilyn Gilbertson (A Miss South Australia, I think!!) The PA Commentators were Tom Jackson (Chairman of the Hospital Board) and John Schwerdt, both combined brilliantly with the boat-master who relied on them for perfect timing for events.

Mr GA Bywaters MP declared the function open and said it would go a long way toward making the proposed hospital a reality. Mr Irvine introduced 'Miss Charity 1960' (Miss Mary Berry) who along with Mr and Mrs DL Brougham, judged the 10 girls aspiring to be 'Miss Henley on Murray'.

The honour went to Miss Meryl Allen, a nurse at the LMDH.

Mr LH Manning (Local Chemist) conducted a contest for the title of 'Champion Pillow Fighter of Australia' (Probably sold a lot of bandages and ointment). Balanced precariously on a parallel bar, the contestants provided amusement and excitement before the elimination bouts brought Peter Campbell (Murray Bridge) and Kevin Kropinyeri (Tailem Bend) to fight out the final for the title, which Peter won. (What happened, Kev? I didn't think anyone from The Bridge could beat you at anything!)

The open-air ball on specially laid boards on the decorated lawn drew a 1,000 people who danced the night away to the music of the Hi-Tones.

The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #70

Another fun day on the river was the Gumi Races, I am sure many people of the 1980's will not only remember the Gumi's but can reflect on building the boats as well as taking part in the races.

Committees were formed to formulate the rules and have stewards in place to enforce them, it was serious business. From my memories Brian Tuesner brought the Gumi's to Tailem Bend, as he had come across the event while holidaying and thought it would succeed at Tailem Bend.


The craft can be of any shape or size, as long as it is made with air-inflatable rubber tubes. Propulsion must be man powered, no sails or motors.

The committee comprised of four representatives from Tailem Bend and four from the Rotary Club. Secretary Anthony Vowles, said anyone can enter as long as their craft complied with the rules.

As we are in the grain season I thought I might turn the clock back to 1959. The grain intake in that year set a new record for the area, the agents for Smith & Mitchell, Carriers MC Lokan and Sons, stated that it was certainly a record for Tailem Bend, Naturi, and Kulde. Final figures expected to be Tailem Bend 35,000 hessian bags of barley, Naturi 15,400 and Kulde 11,000.

A steady flow each day was recorded, the maximum received on one day being 2,700 bags at Naturi, and 2,500 at Tailem Bend. It was also reported that these quantities were easily handled by the **Lumpers**, Bill & Geoff Lokan, Mark Wilson (Senior) and Bob Connolly.

I best explain what the term **Lumper** means for the benefit of the non farmers; the bagged grain weighing 80 KG for wheat and 68 KG for barley, was brought into the stack site at Tailem Bend (In the railway yards roughly opposite the weigh bridge) by road truck and unloaded close to an elevator (**See Photo**) then bag after bag it was conveyed to the shoulders of the **Lumpers**, who built a near perfect stack. Certainly a hard day's work, mostly in searing heat with a canvas water bag nearby.



More to come next month including a chat I have with Bob Hutson, whose father was the site foreman when the pre-fabs were being built.....Some good photo's also.





This Month in the Garden & GIANT Pumpkins!!

Get ready for those Summer salads, by planting capsicums, chilli, cucumbers, squash, tomatoes, sweet corn, eggplant, lettuce, zucchini and rocket.

How about adding some great herbs like basil (both sweet and purple), parsley, sage, pyrethrum, lemongrass, oregano, rue and marjoram. Mint is also a great herb for adding to Asian style dishes, salads and drinks, but it'll take over, so plant it in a pot to keep it contained.

Some colour in the patch isn't only pleasing to the eye, but can help us de stress and relax. The pollinators and other good guys will love it too. Try some nasturtium, dianthus, gerbera, verbena, snapdragons, petunias, marigolds, phlox and celosia.

Build some muscle into you and your soil by planting green manure crops like, cow pea, mung bean, soy bean and millet. Next season's hungry plants will love it and you'll get a great workout when it's time to dig them in.

Top up the mulch on all your garden beds in the approach to Summer. Make sure you choose sustainable, low environmental impact mulch, that'll enrich your soil as it breaks down.

It may seem a long way off, but, it'll be hot before you know it. Plan for the heat by making a couple of shade cloth tents. They don't have to be elaborate, just simple, moveable structures, that you can put over the top of some of the sun sensitive vegies.

Check your garlic, if some of the leaves are turning yellow and the stalks softening, it's time to start harvesting.

Remember, conditions and climate in your patch varies from town to town, so take the above information as a general guide. Spending time in your patch will help you understand *your* climate, microclimate and seasonal variations.

As always, remember to visit your local nursery or garden centre for all your gardening needs, tips and advice.

Potted seedlings will be available in about three weeks' time for \$10, which will cover half the entry fee for the competition.



Twenty Five Years of Topics

Sprouting from a small single bi fold newsletter in 1992, Taillem Topics, then cheekily named "Above Standard", has had many proud volunteers over its busy life of bringing local news to the community.

It was first printed by the Taillem Bend Lutheran Pastor Paul Smith and Edited by Taillem Bend Progress Association (TBPA) member, Katrina Hogarth. Katrina still remembers the night when Leonie Hutson of the TBPA moved that someone should prepare something every month for Meningie's community newsletter, 'The Lakelander'.

"I was a little indignant at that meeting and responded, "why would Taillem put something in Meningie's newsletter - let's have our own," Katrina said. "I quickly learned the perils of opening one's mouth in a meeting when it was promptly moved and seconded that I, should do just that".

With some confusion about how Taillem Topics (TT) originated, from a Lutheran Church publication named "Dove" and the Taillem Bend Community Centre's "Our House Newsletter," TT has had ten proud Editors to its credit and many supportive volunteers over its twenty five years.

Launching with Editor Katrina Hogarth from 1992 to 1995, followed by Kathy Weidenbach, Gwen Ryan, Bruce O'Connell, Dianne Lloyd, Karina Harwood (2010) Kellie Jaensch (2011 - 2013) Narelle Blackett (2013 - 2014) Russell Hunt (2015) to Barbara Power (2015 - Current) the Community's publication, boasts 1800 well read copies, with more recently, full colour pages.

Adopting a logo designed by the Taillem Bend Information Centre Committee in 1997, Taillem Topics continues to use the logo to this day.

The Taillem Bend Progress Association, incorporated in 1956, supported the town's first local publication before handing the baton over to the Taillem Bend & Districts Development Program and with the loan of a photocopier from Murray Computers in Murray Bridge, the printing of 150, then 500 copies, soon became 1500 copies.

Operating from the front room of Persello's home on Station Drive, Taillem Bend, Taillem Topics moved back to the team of the Taillem Bend Progress Association.

Currently, Taillem Topics is brought to the region by Editor - Barbara Power, Printer & Financial Manager - Greg Black, Advertising - Glenn Power, Regular Contributors - Peter Connolly and Glenn

Power, Distribution Coordinator - Margaret McLachlan, Distributors - Margie Jaensch, Raylene Thomas, Bob and Raelene Ellis, Pam and Allan Clark, Raelene and Heinz Varga, Brenton Qualman, Janette Dahlitz, Di Clapp, Doris and Peter Connolly, Cath and David Kleinig and Margaret and Ian McLachlan.

Magazine content came from a box in Peter and Geraldine Dickson's shop, with some being gleaned from shop front windows and posters - now, most arrives via email, with the odd note in the red box at the Post Office.

"For the first edition I went down the street, door to door, explaining the concept to shop owners and asking them to place an ad" Katrina said. "I remember Bill Ackland who had a deli in the main street, saying there'd be nothing to write about because nothing ever happens in Taillem Bend, but Bill bought a five dollar ad anyway and supported us as long as I was involved."

"After it was copied I used to fold them all and divvy them out to our volunteers to deliver, unfortunately in those days there weren't enough volunteers, so often I ended up doing the whole town at night after the kids were asleep."

One of Katrina's children, Dylan Hogarth, (**PICTURED BELOW**) continues his family's Editorial bloodline and is now the Editor of the "Above Standard" - apologies, correction "The Murray Valley Standard", Murray Bridge.

From all in the current Taillem Topics team, a big thanks to those involved in the past and into the future, for supporting our town's 'top little magazine'.

A special thanks to Evonne Whibley, Leonie Hutson and Katrina Hogarth for their help in preparing this story.

Property Matters

Don't miss this **important** time to check your home's health while the weather is favourable.

We've all heard that old saying "A stitch in time saves nine," how true it is. I've been in the building industry for 30 years or more and have repaired or worked on several hundred different Dwellings and Structures around South Australia and Queensland.

Water damage: This alone, if not detected early, can cause significant damage to your property. The most common areas to check are roofs, gutters and timbers. Often, some roofs initially may only leak when it rains with winds from a certain direction. You may not even be aware your timbers and electrics are getting damaged until you have a short circuit or the ceiling becomes discoloured in places. The tell-tale signs are stains or bowing on the ceilings or walls. Don't forget to check the eaves as well. Staining often takes awhile to appear as eaves are usually made of denser material, like asbestos or cement fibre. Outside staining can indicate leaking gutters. If left, your timber fascia's can develop timber rot and may need replacing or repairing.

Now don't go climbing up a ladder and onto your roof to check for broken tiles, eroded mortar or loose screws (unless you're experienced!) Why? Well, statistically the **biggest killer** of men in this country over the age of 40 is from falls. **DO NOT ATTEMPT IT YOURSELF.** Instead, get the right **experienced, licensed, honest tradesman, who has the right equipment**, to inspect it for you.

Next month I'll give you some more tips on property matters, until then stay safe and look after your biggest investment and it will look after you.



Ally's Canine Column

Hello everyone it is me, Ally here again, a month closer to xmas!

Micro-potatoes (oops, micro chips) were carried out by the Council last month which is another way to ensure we get back to you safely if we get lost, sometimes those name tags and collars can come off you know! Plus it will become a "must do" as of the middle of next year same as our registration already is.

Well this month I (well my PA) decided to go down a totally different path and I will talk about some of the things you, albeit, very loving owners do that annoy us. Don't worry it is not a very long list as we understand that you are just trying to show how much you love us in your own 'weird' way although we subtly try to roll our eyes at you or use body movement to show we are impatient that you haven't picked up on what we are trying to tell you but I know of a few humans that use the same tactics on other humans as well (is that called marriage PA?)



Like humans, individual dogs have their own "personal space bubble" (whoa, I like that PA). 




