### The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #108


#### Brian McLoughlin and the Rowing Club.

When we talk about the Tailem Bend Rowing Club it's very hard to not include Brian "Jack" McLoughlin in the Clubs outstanding achievements.

Brian was born 8/4/1932 at Glendo - Lough Pompoota Farm. He arrived in Tailem Bend in 1953 where he joined the South Australia Railways and retired after 34 years' service. He started as a Porter and was promoted to Assistant Shunter, Guard and finally the position of Yardmaster.

He married Margaret Chaplin in 1954 and the couple were blessed with 7 children. Mary, Michael, Christopher, Liz, Gabby and twins Andrew and Catherine.

For his strong community commitment he was awarded Citizen of the Year in 2004, add to that in 2015 he was presented an all Australian Sports Clubbies Accolade, and the inscription read Best Club Stalwart Brian "Jacky" McLoughlin Tailem Bend Rowing Club. Also he managed to spend many hours as maintenance man at the Tailem football Club.

He reminisced about his 14 years with the Ambulance Brigade when he would get calls day and night to drive someone to the RAH. It was on the old road that had many twist and turns and the ambulance wasn't all that streamlined in those days. On one occasion he had the Matron with him who was urging him to go faster saying we will lose our patient!!! His reply was' I can't I'm doing 120 MPH on this nightmare road as it is!!!! Mission Accomplished, made it on time with the patient.

#### **Rowing Club Achievements**

Tailem Bend rower Matthew McDonald beat Mannum's Sunny Lombardi by four seconds at West Lakes to take out the U14 State Schoolboys title. This was Tailem Bend Rowing Club's first State schoolboy title. In the 4th grade Tailem's men's fours ran a close second to St. Peters College going down by just 3 seconds. In his first sculls race Kim Tomkinson finished second to Mannum, as did McDonald to Adelaide Rowing Club in the 4th grade men's scull.

Neville Lokan normally a strong rower was slowed in the open men's scull competition finishing 5th after celebrating the birth of his daughter Ellen Lee the night before.

#### **Tailem Tops Country Rowing 16/3/82**

The local Rowing Club has won the Country Premiership for the second successive year, with one regatta remaining before the end of the season.

It is the third time the club has won the title since it was reformed 15 years ago, the other was 1973/74. The premiership was assured with a good win by the clubs maiden fours crew in a regatta at West Lakes. The club was told after the regatta by a SA recorder that Tailem Bend had clinched the premiership, even though the final points scores would not be released until later in the month.

It was known however that Tailem had exceeded 100 points for the season and had won the title the year before with less points. Coach Brian McLoughlin said he could not attribute the premiership win to any one thing. He added that Tailem people are generally good at sport, overall in summer games cricket is doing very well and tennis has teams in the final.

Tailem oarswomen won their first race in Division One defeating Scotch College by half a length, Tailem Women finished 4th in Div. 2 and third in Divvy 3. The season's final Regatta was held at Pt. Adelaide where Tailem nominated crews in nine events.

#### **Back to Tailem Bend 1981**

Highlight of the celebrations turned out to be the culmination of an 8 year battle by the Tailem Bend Rowing Club to build a new boathouse on the foreshore of the River Murray. The original Boathouse was built by Squatters lease in 1913, and when the need for rebuilding became obvious the site for the new premises became contentious. Mobilong Council, Highways Dept., Lands and Marines all laid claims to various areas. Finally a 22 year lease was obtained from the then Meningie Council (Now Coorong Council based at Tailem Bend) A grant of \$6,000. was obtained by club members through the Australian National Railways, and because of a variety of club social events a further \$4,000 was raised for the new premises to go ahead.

The new boathouse gave the rapidly growing club more space for it's rowers, as many of them travelled long distance's from their farms etc to attend regular training sessions for competition during the season. The new boathouse was opened on Oct. 11 by District Council Chairman Mr. Ron Hughes.

#### Buying the "Eight" 1981/82.

The local rowing club will now be able to compete equally with other clubs in eight oared events following its purchase of a racing shell from Scotch College.

The club bought the boat immediately after finishing a close second by a metre in the maiden eight at West Lakes. The maiden four crew won its event easily from five other competitors.

Tailem's top women's crew won division 2 and also finished second by only half a length in division one which was won by Lakeside. Tailem were once again second in the novice and youth fours but showed enough skill to be soon first over the line.

Thanks Brian, wandering through your club house showed me clearly what amazing success and vital history the club has developed over many years, no doubt because of keen rowers and good stewardship. Plenty more about the rowing club with more records and plenty of photos in another edition.

Next month Sister Michele Madigan is along with her life and times and much more in the pipe line to come. See you then, in the meantime we remember a Tailem Rowing Club Motto.

### Mischief & Mayhem - This Month's Recipe

#### Our talented cook for June is Glenys Cocks.

Glenys, who was a long-term resident of Tailem Bend now lives in Murray Bridge and celebrated her 85th birthday earlier this year. She arrived in Tailem Bend in 1960 with her husband Merv and three sons, Stephen, Kym and Tony. Her youngest son Randell was later born in Tailem Bend. The boys played cricket, football and the family enjoyed being involved in the community.

She then joined the staff of Tailem Bend Primary School as an SSO, working in the Library, in the classrooms and also with students who needed extra care, supporting them with cooking, art, speech programmes, life skills and general learning programmes. She found her role very rewarding and she was a popular presence at the school for 26 years. I'm sure many former students reading this now would remember Mrs Cocks fondly and there would be a story or two to tell.

## Glenys worked at the Tailem Bend Bakery for seven years and also waitressed at the Tailem Bend Hotel and the Riverside Hotel.

On school camps, Glenys was not only the first aid support person, but she was also the cook. This was quite a job with many mouths to feed but she handled it well, often ably assisted by Mrs Dani Schubert (nee Pierotti). Spaghetti Bolognaise was always a favourite, but Glenys's expertise in the kitchen extended far beyond the ordinary.

Before the days of KFC, Glenys would cook 'Battered Rabbit' for her boys, which they always loved and she is sharing this recipe with us. Rabbit, a white meat was quite a popular meal in days gone by. It is lean and tastes a bit like chicken although it has a stronger, earthier flavour. A family friend, the late Chris Miegel would often provide the rabbits. Chris had two ferrets, one named Glenys and the other named Rene (sorry Rene). Ferrets are long sleek animals and the perfect size to fit into a rabbit burrow and chase the rabbits out into a net and this is one way of catching rabbits.

#### **BATTERED RABBIT**

- 1. Place the rabbit on its back and cut slightly into the back legs and remove them. Remove the front legs in the same way. Cut open the rib cage and remove the organs. Halve the rabbit and cut it into cutlets.
- **2.** Soak the rabbits in salt water and boil with a diced onion until tender. Cool and remove from the water.
- **3.** Make a crispy batter with egg, water and self -raising flour.
- **4.** Deep fry the battered rabbit pieces and serve with mashed potatoes or chips and salad.
- **5.** Keep the stock as it makes a great pea soup!


#### **Peter Telford**

#### From the Chamber

Items of business from the monthly Council meeting on 18 May 2021 included discussion of a potential public toilet facility within the Tailem Bend train playground. At present there is no accessible connection point for wastewater disposal; Council has agreed to investigate further and conduct a feasibility study for placement of a standalone toilet and septic within the playground.

Council will also review its list of breastfeeding friendly facilities within the district and make this information available to the public on its website.

The proposed fee structure for 2021/22 dog registrations was agreed upon by Council, which will see registration fees for the next financial year remain the same as current charges.

Council will submit a \$1.53 million funding application to the Special Local Roads Program to upgrade Carcuma Road. If successful, the sealed portion of Carcuma Road would be widened, a further 2km of seal constructed, and corners widened to enable heavy vehicle movements.

Council also approved its unsealed roads capital works program for 2021/22. A full list of roads can be found in the May 2021 Council meeting agenda.

#### **Projects Update**

Repair works to the **Meningie North Jetty** will take place in June to replace some of the existing boards. Once complete, access to the jetty will be improved for the benefit of all users.

Works have commenced on the **Tailem Bend public toilets** upgrade, with underfloor plumbing, septic tank and concrete slab completed. The building is to be delivered in late May and the project will be fully completed by end of June 2021.

Consultation on transformation of the **Wellington East Reserve** has now closed and feedback is being reviewed. A report will be provided to the landscape architects, incorporating changes to the design based on feedback received. Project construction is expected to be completed before the next summer holiday period.

### **News From The TB Historians Association**



### FEDERAL GOVERNMENT EXPANDS LIFE-SAVING ROAD SAFETY INVESTMENT

The 2021-22 Federal Budget commits an additional \$1 billion to the Road Safety Program, as part of the Australian Government's ongoing commitment to improving road safety and getting Australians home sooner sand safer.

Member for Barker Tony Pasin said the \$1 billion funding injection will back two additional six-month tranches, extending the program from June 2022 to June 2023.

"This investment builds on the previous \$2 billion over 18 months announced for the Road Safety Program as part of last year's Budget." Mr Pasin said.

"Now totalling \$3 billion, the Road Safety Program continues our commitment to reducing the number of deaths and serious injuries on our roads, because we know one death or serious injury is one too many." Mr Pasin said.

"To date, the Road Safety Program has seen \$11,220,000 delivered to Barker through tranche 1 for road safety projects due for completion by June this year." Mr Pasin said.

This investment is expected to provide a boost to local jobs, further supporting Australia's economic recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic.

"The Road Safety Program is aimed at delivering lifesaving road safety upgrades on rural and regional roads throughout Barker and providing better protections for vulnerable road users," Mr Pasin said.

"We are funding crucial upgrades through the application of road safety improvements including shoulder sealing and the installation of rumble strips, to support the safe return of vehicles from the shoulder into the travel lane; physical barriers to prevent run off road crashes and median treatments to prevent head-on vehicle collisions." Mr Pasin said.

"This investment complements a suite of other Australian Government initiatives such as investment in driver reviver upgrades, innovative road safety technologies and education campaigns."


