What's there to do in Tailem Bend?

How many times have you been asked and actually had to think about it. Then you realise, you need to look at our area like a tourist.

• We have 3 Caravan Parks, Westbrook, Big 4, The River's Edge and the Football Oval also accommodates self-contained vans as well as the Motel and various BnB's.

• Visit 'Old Tailem Town Pioneer Village' which is now Australia's largest Pioneer Village.

• Our playground in the main street is a happy place for children with lots of room to run and play and a variety of equipment to play on. Seating, shelter and barbecue facilities are also available. The 'Uneek Animal' display is also located near the playground. The Tailem Bend Bakery, the Pizza Shop and just a little further down the street the Little Local Co, all provide a variety of delicious foods, and refreshments.

•More activities for the children: The BMX Track and the Basketball ring, 'The Hooporium' are just down the street from the playground, on the other side of the old CFS Station.

•Our great Dog Park is on Railway Terrace just past the Rotunda. Room for your pup to run.

•Either go down the ferry road or if you're feeling fit take the staircase from the top of the ferry hill down to Dickson's Reserve river front. Take a book, take the children for a picnic lunch or use the on-site barbecues. Add the fishing rod, maybe a camera or just sit awhile and enjoy the peace and serenity. Take the ferry and do the round trip back on the ferry at Wellington. Check out Wellington Marina, guite a fast growing community.

•Are you into walking, the River Bend Heritage Trail on the Jervois side of the river, travels along the bank through to the Murrundi Reserve, then on to lunch at the iconic Wellington Hotel. The Trail connects to Tailem Bend beginning (or ending) near the Meningie turn off at Tailem Bend, the Mowantjie-Willauwar Conservation park, check out the Wellington Cemetery and Pangaringa Arboretum, then maybe back to the Wellington Hotel.

. In Tailem Bend, we have a walk around town with information signs in front of iconic landmarks. The Tourist Information Centre is a must, to have browse and a chat. The volunteers are very helpful.

· Venture out to the Motorsport Park, even if you aren't into car racing the coffee is always hot and meals are available. We have two great hotels in town if you want a great pub meal.

• Day trips from Tailem Bend are an easy drive which ever direction you go. Meningie, The Coorong, Narrung and the lakes... some stunning views and great photo opportunities.

• A day trip to the Fleurieu Peninsula, Milang, Goolwa, Pt Elliott and Victor Harbor and get off the beaten track and check out more communities.

• Just 40 minutes away we have Langhorne Creek with some award winning wineries. Even if wine is not your choice of drinks, these wineries cater for the food lovers as well.

• Venturing east there is Karoonda with its beautiful silo art and metal structures...at certain times a light display on the silos...an hours drive and you are in the Riverland, Loxton, Berri, Renmark and Waikerie being the main towns.

· Right next door to us is Murray Bridge, Mannum, Birdwood just to name a few.

There is plenty to see, explore and enjoy....sometimes we need to checkout our own area ourselves.

The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #111

This month we welcome the life and times of John F Schwerdt's years in Tailem Bend. His story of achievements will take your breath away.

People who come to live in Tailem Bend come for different reasons. As long-time resident Les Scott answered when asked why he came to Tailem Bend, he answered *"I don't know, I guess I was just lucky"*. John Schwerdt agrees with Les. His father Jack was sent there to be in charge of the Police Station in the mid 1950's.

Being at Strathalbyn at the time, he didn't want to go to Tailem Bend, but when it was time to leave and go to Mt.Gambier, he didn't want to leave. John's job on a farm at Netherton *(near Peake)* ended in 1956, so he came to Tailem Bend where his father got him a salesman job with Tower Motors, the dynamic Ford dealership which operated where the Shell Roadhouse is now. Having been a poor student at school, he now had to start learning-fast. Tom Jackson was the manager of Tower Motors and among many things, was the chairman of the Hospital Board. Tom was hell bent on building the new hospital and John got caught up in this bold new venture. 105,000 pounds was the cost. The community had to raise 1/3rd of this.

A Hospital Supporters Club was formed to raise this money under the chairmanship of Ross Irvine from Cooke Plains. One meeting, Ross said we needed a younger person to lead, he got up, grabbed John by the shoulders and placed him in the chair. That began his "baptism" into public life. The amount of money to raise in those days was gigantic, but the people all got enthused to make it happen. Some of the biggest money raisers were the Queen competitions and the Amateur Hours where the voting for the contestants was done by "penny votes". It was a huge job, but it was accomplished.

The highlight of his life was when Lelene Hein of Pallamana agreed to be his wife. They were married in the Monarto Lutheran Church on 4th April 1959. Their marriage produced 5 children, Karen, David, Jonathon, Veronica and Tanya. They have 8 grandchildren.

Being a Christian and following the Lutheran teaching, gave the opportunity to become involved there, and over the years he held all positions in the congregation and the parish. He often said the only thing he didn't do was to be the President of the Ladies Guild. In the 1950's there was just the Church. No Hall. They wanted a Hall. Who would draw the plans and get them passed through Council. The job fell to John. The plans were passed, builder John Wise erected the hall and it is still standing. Pity we can't do that nowadays.

Then came the hall extension, guess who not only got the job of the plans, but also the overseers job? John had watched how the builder worked on his own house, so it wasn't so hard.

He worked for Tower Motors for 4 years before they went broke. As the company was winding down the staff left. John couldn't as he and his wife, Lelene had bought their own home at Tailem Bend (almost all the other staff were renters) and their 2nd baby was imminent. This meant he was on the lowest salary and experienced all jobs and ended up being the secretary. The day Joe Winter (the Bailiff) arrived he hired John for several weeks. Not a pleasant duty, but got a lot of experience. He then sold cars for Dutton Motors at Murray Bridge for a short time before moving to Adelaide to manage a Used Car Yard for Claridge Motors at Unley. 18 months later he was offered an agency with AMP and the opportunity to return to Tailem Bend. Going into partnership with Colin DeVos and living in Murray Bridge for a short time as their Tailem Bend home was rented, they arrived home in August 1994. It was very difficult for the first 9 years, establishing an insurance business from scratch and Lelene resorted to many austerity measures. The rest of the 31 years and 2 months were much better as the business was now established and twice they expanded their home, even building a Squash Court in the 2nd extension.

Rotary was a big part of their lives at Tailem Bend hosting 15 Exchange Students and supporting the Asian Nurses Training Scheme, and they still have close contact with their "daughter" Sara in Malaysia. Following a successful Mock Wedding that Brian & Julia Teusner organised for Rotary, Cathy Scott and John devised the first Music Hall. Those first years were a "sell out" and lots of fun. He was involved in the first 13 of them and thrilled to see them still going strong.

Mischief & Mayhem – This Month's Recipe

Our talented cook for September is Bev Piggott. Bev is one of the volunteers with the Friends of the Hospital Catering Team and is happy to share her Wonder Berry Pie recipe with us.

Friends would often wonder what berry was in this pie, hence the name. It has always been a popular dessert.

WONDER BERRY PIE

Pie Crust

- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup of plain flour +
- 1 dessertspoon self-raising flour
- 1/2 cup of custard powder
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence
- 1/4 cup of sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon of salt
- $^{1\!\!/}_{\!\!2}$ cup of butter or margarine and 1 egg
- Rub softened butter into the dry ingredients
- Add beaten egg and vanilla. Mix well.
- Roll out and line a tart plate.
- Bake in moderate oven until golden brown.

Filling

- 2 cups of currants
- 1/2 packet of raspberry jelly crystals
- 2 cups of water
- 1 small tablespoon of cornflour mixed with water
- Bring currants, water and jelly crystals to the boil.
- Boil for 5 minutes and then thicken with cornflour and water.
- When cold put into baked tart shell.
- Top with lots of whipped cream. Enjoy!

The Tailem Bend Photography Group lost one of their founding members late last month. Losing his battle with cancer on the morning of Saturday July 31th, 2021, - Douglas (Duggie) Stilgoe will be sadly missed.

Doug was born on April 10, 1944 and was a keen photographer and gardener. He was a quiet gentleman who loved to learn new technologies *(especially Adobe Creative Cloud).* He always had time to listen to others and was a confidant to many.

Doug's neighbour, Beryl Humphries of Tailem Bend, told us that he was born in the United Kingdom and moved to Tasmania at the age of 15.

"He stayed in Tasmania, looking after his mum until she passed, then move to sunny Queensland, before deciding to move south, to north of Adelaide," Beryl said. "Then he moved to the country and Tailem Bend – I recall Doug has lived here for about twelve years."

Doug never chose to have his own family, but it never stopped him from being like a second father to his niece and nephew in Launceston, Tasmania.

After the passing of their father, Debbie Say and Chris Stilgo, were unofficially adopted by Doug. Doug's nephew Chris, explains what his Uncle Doug meant to him and his sister.

"His kindness, sense of humour and wisdom have always been generously given to us and all those he has known over the years," Chris says. "Anyone who knew our Uncle Doug, would know exactly what I'm referring to."

"He enjoyed his photography and loved just hitting the road to see where he'd end up - then photographing what he found to within an inch of its life!"

Needless to say – Doug will forever more reside in his beautiful Tailem Bend Garden and the town he loved.

From the Chamber

During July and August Coorong District Council held two Special Council meetings in addition to the August Ordinary Council meeting.

On 29 July, Council adopted its annual business plan and budget for the 2021/22 financial year. The final document, which details the program of activities to be undertaken in 2021/22, can be found online: www.coorong.sa.gov.au.

During the 17 August Ordinary Council meeting, members endorsed a funding application to the Black Summer Bushfire Recovery Grants Program for improvement of mobile coverage at Colebatch and Narrung; if successful, Council will work with Telstra to install new base stations to improve mobile coverage at each location.

Coorong-wide poll: Should the Mayor be elected by the community or from within the Chamber?

The elector representation review currently being undertaken within Coorong District Council will determine whether the Council would benefit from an alteration to its composition or ward structure.

Submissions received through the community

consultation process showed strong support for the Mayor to be elected by the community, for wards to be abolished, and a reduction in Council Members.

A final report went to a Special Council meeting on 12 August 2021 which agreed in principle with the direction outlined above.

The final step in this process (which is required under legislation) is to conduct a poll of Coorong residents to reaffirm the proposed change to the method of electing the principal member (Mayor).

Residents will be asked: Should the principal member of Coorong District Council be chosen by the Councillors or elected by the community?

Soon all electors within the Coorong District Council will receive ballot papers (via post), asking to them vote on this question. We encourage all Coorong residents to consider voting in the poll when you receive your ballot papers in early October 2021.

Should the community support the Council proposal to change to an elected Mayor, the change will come into effect at the Local Government elections in November 2022.

Coorong community groups can now apply for up to \$5,000 in funding for worthwhile local projects and events, as round one of Coorong District Council's Community Grants program for 2021-22 is now open.

Community groups involved in local sport and recreation, cultural, community development, and social and welfare activities may be eligible to apply for grants between \$1,000 and \$5,000 in one of three categories; Small Community Grants, Community Event Grants, and Community Project Grants.

Applications are due at 5:00pm on Friday, 24 September 2021. Applicants can apply online (www.coorong.sa.gov.au) or download the application package and find more information on Council's website.

BOOK REVIEW A Room Made of Leaves GRENVILLE Kate

The novel takes the guise of the imagined secret memoir of Elizabeth Macarthur, wife of British officerturned-wool-baron of early colonial Sydney, John Macarthur. Written history has much to say about John, the ignoble man whose ambitions for power and status were matched only by his general detestability, but all that survives of Elizabeth are a precious few politely-written letters. The Elizabeth of Kate Grenville's imagination is nowhere near so polite.



Readers are taken on a journey from Elizabeth's humble beginnings in rural England to her unlikely marriage to the brutish Macarthur, her new beginning as one of very few *"ladies"* in the new colony of New South Wales, and her eventual success as the true pastoralist that commanded the massive expanse of the convict-run Elizabeth Farm at Parramatta.

Grenville's Elizabeth is a woman of independent thought, spirit, passion, and her own private desires. She finds satisfaction in her world by acting outside of her powermad husband's knowledge. As part of this personal freedom, Elizabeth has contact with some of the Gadigal and Cammeraygal women of the Sydney coastline. Based directly on the historical Elizabeth's surviving letters, these were the moments I was most fascinated by in this story. They are wisely cast in severe contrast to the violent episode of the so-called "Battle of Parramatta" that occurs in later chapters.

An ingenious tapestry of history and invention, A Room Made of Leaves is a novel of womanhood, motherhood, secrets, lies, obsession, transformation and the loss of innocence.

Joyce inducted as a new member the well-known Tailem Bend identity Don Green who would be a very welcome addition to the group.

Some discussion took place as to the future of the club in these difficult times and further discussions on this matter will take place at later meetings. Tailem Bend Probus Club is due to celebrate its 30th Anniversary in October and discussions will take place as to a suitable way to celebrate that occasion.

The annual Probus Area Friendship day due to take place at Lameroo has been cancelled due to uncertainties relating to COVID. Guest Speaker Organiser, Peter Connolly, introduced arguably one of the most interesting and entertaining guest speakers ever to appear at a Probus Meeting - Accomplished Australian pilot, Captain Rod Lovell, a man who has flown just about everything you can think of from tiger moths to multi-engine freight and passenger aircraft and even the Mirage Jet Fighter. He flew for many years in the RAAF and for commercial airlines.

But during an otherwise distinguished career Rod experienced a pilot's most difficult and demanding experience, the sudden ditching of an aircraft with 25 mainly teenagers on board, on take-off from Sydney Airport. It was in a Douglas DC3 one of the most reliable aircraft ever to have blessed the skies. Within seconds after the wheels left the ground the left engine shut down and Lovell within the next few seconds followed all the appropriate procedures, but the aircraft failed to respond, and the aircraft ditched in the water. No-one perished. Thirty-six second is all it took.

Something similar happened in the US in the Hudson River and the pilot was hailed a national hero and they even made a movie about it. No similar accolades have been afforded to Captain Rod Lovell for reasons which "the authorities" have yet to adequately explain, why he has not been given the hero status which he deserves. But importantly, the people who know this man as a man of quality and outstanding integrity, and as an accomplished pilot and a proud Australian, and the people whose lives he saved that day, and the population at large, all regard Captain Rod Lovell as a Hero!

Rod has published a book "Hero to Zero" - worth a good read!

Wellington East resident Glynis Taylor is well known for her cooking at the RSL Tailem Bend

where she is also the Secretary, and also recognised for her community engagement as an elected member of the Coorong District Council, as well as being a published author. What's not so obvious is her lifelong love of extreme and adventure sports.

The lengthy list includes: off-road motorbike riding from Usuaia in Patagonia (*Argentina*) to Machu Picchu in Peru; circumnavigating Rajasthan on a Royal Enfield; scuba diving the WWII wrecks of Chuuk (*Truk*) Lagoon in Micronesia; riding a husky dog sled across the Taku Glacier near Juneau in Alaska; diving with whale sharks in the Maldives; swimming with wild dolphins off Key Largo in Florida; spending 2 years on the road travelling around Australia; skydiving, bungee jumping, zip lines, hot air balloon trips, helicopter flights and the list goes on and on. So why would this, her 60th year, be any different!

On November 18th she will put Capt. YODA, a 5.3m expedition kayak in to the River Murray at the Hume Dam to paddle solo, the 2220kms to the Southern Ocean near Goolwa, arriving some-time in January (lockdowns and border closures allowing).

Apart from being a huge personal challenge, Glynis is raising money for the Prostate Cancer Foundation of Australia. Having lost her Step-Dad in 2005 to aggressive prostate cancer after a diagnosis eleven months earlier, and now with another very close family member falling victim to the same aggressive cancer (prognosis of a maximum of five years left to live), Glynis feels without people who are willing to raise much needed funds for research, treatments and care, the cure is a long way off.

Glynis and her husband Chris own Black Kite Farm, where they produce raw honey and run numerous animals. Glynis's lengthy resume includes ten years as a Principal Lecturer in Information Systems (and Head of eLearning) for Sheffield Hallam University in the UK, and she is putting that experience to good use now as a motivational speaker.

For over 30 years Neighbourhood Watch (NHW) volunteers and SA Police have been working together to prevent crime. The NHW program is the largest South Australian crime prevention program that focuses on safety, security and issues impacting the wellbeing of the community. Neighbourhood Watch SA is currently establishing a range of digital initiatives in order to engage more members of the public in an online setting.

The Neighbourhood Watch SA Facebook page has been launched, aiming at spreading crime prevention messaging and encouraging community members to become involved with Neighbourhood Watch and assist in reducing preventable crime.

The Neighbourhood Watch SA website contains information about how to join NHW, a subscription option to stay up to date with NHW news and an interactive map to find local NHW groups and relevant contact details.

PROPERTY MARKING

Police encourage owners to mark their valuable property and record all details of the items. Identifiable property is more difficult for thieves to dispose of, and if caught in possession of the stolen item the marking enables police to quickly establish the owners' details. There are four effective ways to mark your property: engraving, ultra violet pen or other permanent means, or microdots.

Engraving/Ultra-violet Pen

• Mark your valuables with your driver's licence or Proof of Age Card number preceded by the letter 'S' for South Australia e.g. 'B23456' would be 'SB23456'.

• If your property is stolen, the chances of items being returned to you by the police are increased. Ensure your address details on your driver's licence or Proof of Age Card are current.

• Mark each item in a similar area e.g. power cord entry, adjacent to serial number.

Some items are not suitable for engraving or marking. These include jewellery, special collections, silverware, stamps or coins, paintings and antiques. These items should be photographed.

• Use a good quality camera or digital camera and use full frame views, with a general photograph from two sides, place a ruler beside the item to give an indication of actual size.

• For jewellery, place the item on a strongly coloured background (e.g. red or dark blue).

• Take a close up photograph, if possible, to identify unique features or serial numbers of the items.

• Try to photograph items of value in your home or business "in situ" to show where they belong.

• For objects with a flat side, try to take the picture on a slight angle to avoid the flash reflecting back and creating a 'hot-shot' (reflection) in the picture.

• Store the photographs with your other valuable documents.
