# TB Historians Assoc. Community Event of the Year

The Tailem Bend Historians Association Inc. has been awarded the Australia Day - Community Event of the Year for Tailem Bend - for their History Exhibition "The Life and Times of Tailem Bend" and the Opening of the History Room in May 2021.

"The Life & Times of Tailem Bend" Exhibition was held in the Coorong Council Gallery from March 2021 to the end of May 2021 and introduced to the wider community a visual display of historical information researched, collected and processed by members of the Tailem Bend Historians Association Inc.

With over 300 photographs, as well as artefacts of historical interest, the Exhibition informed the public about the way of life of the Yaraldi people and the European settlement and development of Tailem Bend within the Coorong District Council area. It was held over a six week period and was two years in the planning. Local

street window displays were featured and have been ongoing since the event. The Exhibition coincided with the State of South Australia History Month, held annually in May.

The History Room, located at the Southern end of the Tailem Bend Station Information Centre, was opened by Mayor Paul Simmons on Friday 21st May 2021. This was a special day during the Exhibition period with over 150 attending. The Historians Association acquired the use the History Room through the support of Coorong Council and external grant funding as well as many voluntary hours of work to complete renovations. The room is an extension to the function of the Information Centre as a tourist attraction. On the same day the book "Howard Hattam's Memoirs" was launched. This book describes one man's life growing up in Tailem Bend during the town's early settlement days.

Many positive comments were made on the day of the event. The Association continues to receive commendations for their ongoing commitment to researching areas of historical interest in Tailem Bend and its surrounding district.

The Historians Association is a volunteer not-for-profit organisation and each person brings special talent and skill. Their diversity of knowledge is an asset to the ongoing work of the group. We welcome anyone with an interest in preserving and maintaining local history to join us or contribute their story to the group.

# The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #115

Peter Squires Finished his stint at Gilbert Motors and returned to Tailem and even though he travelled a lot he always called Tailem Bend his home. This month we go on many long journey's with him, he will tell us all about it.

While I was away my mother married Aub. Heyen who managed Wilf Bartlett where the Shell Roadhouse now stands. Then he started Heyen Motors Motors in the main St. and obtained the Chrysler and Standard Agencies. I ran the sales department, painted and panel beated the used cars. In the 1950/60's Tailem got flooded with Standard eights and Van Guards, the more richer farm people drove Dodge's and Desototos's.

At the age of 24 years I decided to go around the world, much to the disappointment of my family. I first went to New Zealand, where I spent a year panel beating in Auckland, then a drink waiter and barman in O'Connells Hotel in Queenstown. After that I caught a boat and went to Durdan in Africa where I was determined to get the best job ever. After a trip to Victoria Falls and Krueger Park I went job hunting in Johannisburg. I found the owner of Sydney Clow Motor Company who employed three thousand people and assembled Chrysler, Peugot and the BMC cars in Capetown.

His secretary wanted to know if I had an appointment to see Mr Oates who was an Australian which I had already found out. He invited me in for two minutes, gave me a job and then talked about Australia for ten minutes, in which time he rang the general manager who became my senior contact. I spent nearly two years with them and had a wonderful experience in the motor industry.

Africa ended up one place I yearned to return to. I left there and went to London where I worked for Barkley Square Garages and sold cars to Londoners. There I was talked into sailing home, so I spent the next year learning to navigate, reading charts and studying to sail. With a South African and an Englishman for my crew we set off from

South Hampton to Dartmouth. At the needles our mast came down from the front stay coming apart. We had a Lancaster Bomber circling us for thirty minutes until they saw we had back on. We sailed into the night and our first call was Dartmouth, then off to Lisbon then Portricle where they made us honorary members of their club.

We covered much more territory before ending up in Durban, South Africa. This was home to one of the crew members. To tackle the six thousand miles of no land was a daunting thought so the yacht was sold so I flew home through America, Japan then back to Tailem Bend where I have remained to this day.

In 1968 I met Betty Mason and we decided to marry. At the time Heynen Motors was going extremely well. We had just acquired the Chamberlain Tractor Agency and money started to flow. We bought a house in Railway Tce. East and on January 7th 1969 Daniel Ernest Squires came into the world. Aub Heynen, my step – father, made Heynen Motors a limited company which included Nada Heynen, myself and Neville Meritt. I became very important in the district along with Dutton Motors, as we employed many people from around the district over the years.

# In 1986 Aub. Died and Neville and myself kept Heynen Motors going until 1993 where it came to an end of a era.

My Grandmother Irene Jaensch passed away in 1974. I decided to go to Swan Hill and saw their Pioneer Village. Encouraged by my son Daniel we wanted to start our own Pioneer Village called Old Tailem Town. My wife didn't like the idea and decided a life would be better somewhere else. So then it was up to Danny and his Father to go it alone. We put the Peake Railway Station across in the paddock, and from the Council you may imagine there was hell to pay. So a battle with the State planner went on for three years until a vote was taken and we had three in our favour out of five.

# Thanks to the Council and the Hon. Peter Lewis Old Tailem Town was started.

After going out to the Coomandook Strawberry Fete in 1986 I met a girl named Margaret. I asked her to come and see my village, I only had three houses at the time. Now she is special member of the team and also my wife. Her Daughter Janelle works at the Tailem Bend Pharmacy.


Some weekends we would go driving down back tracks recording all the abandoned transportable houses, then when we could afford one we would get it and turn it into whatever we thought would be in the town. So after some scepticisms of the value of the project but also enough encouragement especially from the Council Old Tailem Town began to take shape.

In 1986 we opened it on a Sunday so the Government could have another for their Jubilee year. This went on until we finally thought there was enough exhibits to open, so in 1989 Old Tailem Town was officially opened every day from then on.

Work was going on in the Village all the time now with lots of changes taking place. Webb House Movers were called in five or six times each year and streets were being made. Enthusiasts like Dawn and John Shepherd built a large engine shed to show off their articles, also the Myponga Fly Wheelers made a shed for their engines. Barry White and Danny turned the Murray Bridge railways goods office into

a sixty seat movie theatre. Don Moyse was employed on various jobs, and so the village grew at a good rate.

It was exciting to be told that Old Tailem Town was in a television show in Germany, and to date we have had an hour and an half television shows in Australia, state and National wide. People from interstate Australia and all over the world are over half of our customer base. So Tailem Bend has been put onto the World national map over the years. Two films Village road shows, Disappearance and Twin Rivers were filmed here. So things do happen in Tailem Bend from time to time. Also we get an average of 40 school visits each year.

My life has had its ups and downs, I feel guilty because the world which I live in offers me so much, but all I can say is "We become what we think about, then one day it will be yours, so long as you keep it on your mind."

Thank you for this opportunity, now you know who I am and I will always be a part of Tailem Bend. Thanks for your contribution Peter I know how you feel as I am born and bred Tailem as well. Thanks also to Doris Connolly for arrangements with the photos for each publication.

I had read the journal put out by the Australian Plants Society, S.A Region reporting on Local Group activities and plants. Members report on growing these plants, soil requirements, problems growing seeds or plants, seed banks to exchange seeds. Leaders receive all this information, then compile and send out to members. # Time for a Fresh Start

Here we are at the beginning of another year. When I send my Christmas greetings I generally wish everyone a better New Year.

We tend to think of each new year as being a new start; a 'clean slate'. We want to try again, and maybe a new year will mean things can be different, easier, more enjoyable or bring good luck. The Romans had a year with only 10 months. They began the New Year in March as that was the start of their growing season. Later the start of the year was moved to 1st January.

Julius Caesar realised that the years were not in line with the solar year, (the time it takes the earth to move around the sun). Instead of the practice of adding 22 or 23 days to each year, he made the year 12 months, (365 days), and brought in the idea of adding a day every four years.

There are cultures, now, that start their new year on a different day, in a different month to others. God set the Sun to rule the day and the Moon to rule the night. (Genesis Chapter 1 verse 16). The rotation of the earth around the Sun gives us our seasons, and the rotation of the Moon around the earth gives us our lunar months.

# Harvest Report





If the season could be summed up in one word it would be "challenging". Crop yields were adversely affected by little summer rainfall and no real opening rain at the beginning of the growing season.

The Bureau of Meteorology's (BOM's) promise of a wet spring also didn't materialise in our region meaning many of our crops experienced a dry finish. The BOM's six monthly rainfall decile to 30 September 2021 showed the Coorong district had an average or below average rainfall for the period.

A short bout of heavy rainfall in late October brought with it damaging winds and patches of hail which affected yields as did a smattering of frost, the affects of which were fully realised at harvest time.

All was not lost however, some farmers, particularly those in the Upper South East, experienced a more consistent season with decent rainfall allowing for respectable yields.

The saving grace for most was the prospect of above average commodity prices. For example prior to 2021 a "good" price for Canola was considered to be \$650-\$700 per tonne. This harvest the value of Canola peaked at around or just over \$1,000 per tonne which provided some compensation for below average yields.

Despite the season's unpredictability one thing remained constant; the dependability of our fellow farmers. Across the district machinery breakdowns, fire events and time pressures were all readily overcome with the help of our neighbours. It is this support that will get us through the next season and any future challenges.


# 2022 Update

"We're open from 6 am to 2 pm, even on weekends. It's working a treat for travellers and fits like a glove with my musical lifestyle," Simon said.


Simon's Bass Café and Bonney - Hill Studios is looking forward to becoming a part of the community and as well as an integral part of the thriving regional music and theatre scene.

(or plucked) string instrument in the modern symphony orchestra (excluding unorthodox additions such as the Octobass). Similar in structure to the cello, it has four, although occasionally five, strings.

The Bass Guitar, Electric Bass or simply Bass, is the lowest-pitched member of the guitar family. It is a plucked string instrument similar in appearance and construction to an electric or an acoustic guitar, but with a longer neck and scale length, and typically four to six strings or courses. Since the mid-1950s, the bass guitar has largely replaced the Double Bass in popular music.

Building on the popularity of the parklet (outdoor seating) installed on Railway Tce in late 2020, an extra parklet will soon be added, with others to be installed across select Coorong district towns for the use and comfort of the community and visitors.






