# RIPPER NAPPY... A Little History

Maybe you remember when Simon's Bass Café was the Ripper Nappy Shop, or maybe you've only seen the signage and wondered about it.

I have been in touch with Betty Smedley and she has provided me with some history of the shop which was attached to their residence.

In mid-1993, Jamie Smedley moved back to Tailem Bend. His parents, Betty and Eric, who are also Darren's parents (from Smedley Tyres), followed in 1994.

Ripper Nappy was started in Murray Bridge and then the family moved to Tailem Bend. Jamie was making the reusable baby nappies and in early 1994 he started making adult jeans as well. People who wore his 'Tailem Bend Jeans' loved them but making them all individually wasn't profitable, plus overseas imports didn't help. When disposable nappies really took off that also put an end to making the ripper nappies.

Betty also made machine knitted rugs in AFL colours as well as various other merchandise.

The Shop was closed in late 2001 and Jamie moved to Adelaide and started working as an aged carer and is still a nurse working in aged care.

# **NOW SIMON'S BASS CAFÉ**


Simon opened the Bass Café on January 5th 2022 in what was formerly the Ripper Nappy Shop.

# The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #122

Jervois Primary School - The First 100 years.

This month we join our Jervois community as they celebrate a magnificent milestone. It is often said that Tailem and Jervois share friendly rivalry. It is not about that, this time the door is open for history about a small community's achievements, especially schooling.

Michelle Afford is Admin. Officer at the Jervois School and I was fortunate enough to have her present the following article. Excerpts taken from the 'Jervois Primary School history book celebrating 70 years of school life':

The Jervois Primary School opened at a time of extreme hardship, most of its pupils came from families of men employed on the erection of the levee banks and the draining of the swaps. The homes for the levee workers were primitive tin cubicles grouped together, known as 'Tin Town'. They were hardly sufficient to keep out the wind and rain. Tin Town was situated south of the current Dairy Vale (now Bestons) Factory. From there, pupils walked to school: approximately 4 kilometres.

The nearest schools were at Woods Point and Wellington East. The Education Board was petitioned to open a school at Jervois.

So it was that Miss Alice Silver arrived at Jervois in August, 1922, to open the school. She had gained her Teaching Certificate that year at 'Wirrulla'. The first school was a room in a house owned by the Pahl family. The house is still occupied today, situated on the bottom road on the ferry side of today's Post Office.' (The house where the original JPS school room began, is now owned by Steve Gazzola; a past student and parent of the school).

Two years later, in late 1924, the school moved to its present site, in a single stone building, which is the current administration building of today.

'The stone building was a handsome structure on the barren stony grounds. The pupils would have been very proud of their school as they stood at attention every day, to raise

the flag and quote the Oath.....The school toilets were a wood and tin lean-to with a bucket, emptied by the School Committee. Behind the out-house were neat little hay-stacks, with bags of chaff to supply the ponies hitched to the nearby fence.'

Some of the original families who enrolled at the school in the first year were: Bartholomew, Cameron, Geisler, Green, Henningson, Merritt, Probert, Rhue, Ross, Spender, Ward, Weidenhofer, Whittaker, Joyce, and Grist.

Many of these families still have ties in the Jervois community today, with a long family history in the Jervois area.

Various modes of transport were used to get to and from school: horse & cart, horseback, bicycle, and walking. Horses were hitched behind the school, near where the current water tower stands, eating chaff and resting while students were in class.

#### Some significant dates from the earlier decades:

**1931 –** An appeal by Jervois West settlers was successful: Jervois West School opened on land donated by Carl Froman. For about 40 scholars, the long hard road was shortened and the days of the long-suffering school ponies was eased. Jervois School was also relieved by the decrease (in student numbers), as conditions were very crowded.

# In 1934, a stone shelter was built which also still stands today.

**1941** – Purchased a motion picture projector and a fine wireless set.

**1942 –** Nine concrete pipes were obtained to use as air raid protection. Very wet weather in April, one day only 6 students attended school.

**1945 -** The school milk scheme commenced, with every student receiving a free drink of milk: the scheme was sponsored by the government for health reasons.

**1947 –** The inaugural meeting of the Jervois Welfare Club was held in April. A bank account was opened up for the Welfare Club with the Savings Bank of Sth Aust at Tailem Bend.

**1949 –** The annual school picnic was held at *'The Willows'* on the lakes about 17 miles from Tailem Bend: practically all parents and a number of local residets attended.

The Welfare Club held a mock wedding to raise funds for the library – A most successful evening with a record attendance. A profit of 26 pounds 10 shillings was raised. Merv Lokan was the blushing bride and Edgar Kluske the rather short groom!

**1950** – A party of 36 children, 3 parents and 2 teachers went on an educational trip to Adelaide and Port Adelaide: grades 1-3 visited the zoo, Museum Railway and Fire Brigade Station. The upper grades journeyed to Port Adelaide to inspect the wool store and river Clarence: a large oil burning collier and some other ships in port. For many, this was their first trip to the city: traffic lights were a great amusement.

**1951 –** The Jervois West School closed, which increased enrolments at JPS by over 50% in the last term.

**1952** – A new portable room was purchased to house the year 1, 2, 3 students. A bus service commenced in March travelling from Wellington to Murray Bridge for High School. The former Jervois West students used the bus to get to Jervois Primary School. The first School Miniature Debutante Ball was held in the local Jervois Hall, the start of a tradition which continues today.

**1954 -** 'A fine 42 year old school bell was purchased at a cost of 20 pounds'.

1955 - electricity arrived at the school!

**1956** – A second portable room was erected, solving the accommodation problems for the next few years. The '56 flood impacted everyone, including the school. Mr Beaton, the Head Teacher, was also involved in patrolling the banks at night; checking for breaches of the levee bank. On September 2nd the levee protecting Jervois swamps broke

during the night, taking 3  $\frac{1}{2}$  days to completely fill the 11 mile swamp

**1957 –** Pumping began to drain the swamps, with the ferry connecting Jervois to Tailem Bend finally reopened at the end of April, after 8 months of inactivity.

**1960 –** Tenders for the bus were called, which Mr DJ Kluske accepted. (the current bus service is still provided by the Kluske family – now run by Sam). Bus transport from Wellington to Jervois with 37 students using the bus. A cricket pitch was laid. In the Principal's absence, 2 Grade 7 boys took keys, opened the cupboard door and destroyed the school cane. This was apparently because one boy had been caned by the relief teacher – the parents of the 2 boys concerned have agreed on disciplinary action.

**1963 –** 20 children and their teacher, Miss Miller, travelled by bus to greet Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, the bus left at 9am, returning at 6:30pm.

**1964** – Enrolment numbers at the start of the year exceeded 100 for the first time, with 111 students. A new classroom arrived in November to alleviate some congestion. A Victa 2-stroke self-driven mower was purchased for \$39-64.

1967 - A busy bee was held to level and plant lawn

**1971** – New toilet block was 'finally put into use'. Giant step by the small community into the age of technology!

**1975** – Initiated World Vision sponsorship (which still continues today). The 'cow wall' was built – a brick wall on the lawn used for games. It gained its name from the cow painting which used to be on it – the painting has since been removed, but the name has stuck.

**1976** - New library 'dmac' building installed and officially opened.

**Sport –** Was and is an integral part of school life: Sports Days and Inter-school Sports Days were a very important schedule on the calendar. Inter-school matches of football, basketball (later netball), tennis and athletics events. Over the years there has been many different schools involved in our Inter-School Sports Days: combined with schools from Murray Bridge, Tailem Bend, Woods Point and other areas involved: Monteith, Point McLeay and later incorporating Langhorne Creek & Milang, and more recently Mypolonga. Currently there exists many opportunities for students to be involved with a range of sports through SAPSASA and local inter-school competitions.

**Technology** – Has made a significant impact on learning, with iPads, computers, internet, printers, and smartboards all providing broad access to information and different ways to produce work and learn.

**Changes –** There has been many changes to the buildings and grounds in the more recent decades, with upgrades to play equipment internal and external buildings, gardens and surrounds. The most significant of these is the internal renovations of the main building, and the removal of the old dmac library; being replaced with a beautiful and spacious new building. And who can remember the old lunch shed? It's now an enclosed room used for well-being and visiting student support ventures.

#### Four Generations of Families!

Keeping the school history connection, these 2 family branches both have 4 generations who have enrolled at Jervois Primary School:

- Neil Morris *(enrolled 1955)*; his daughter Allyson Morris; her daughters Taylor Morris & Allanah Eyles; and their daughters Mia & Ruby
- Sylvia Ross (enrolled 1928) (who later married Clarrie Hicks); her son Denis Hicks; his sons Shawn & Tim Hicks; and their children Ben & Isabella and Thomas, Fraser & Sophie. Kellie (one of Denis' daughters) was also a recent staff member of JPS as well as being a student.



Locals have completed half of the track, which has been modelled on the US I-55 Speedway in Missouri. Once completed, it will be the first of its kind in Australia and, hopefully, draw enthusiasts from across the nation.

"This is a fantastic example of locals getting behind a project for the good of their town. They know the economic benefits that this track will provide to Bordertown, and they are helping make that happen."

"I look forward to welcoming other Shadow Ministers to the region in the coming months."


# The Lamp Lighter

The lamp lighter was a Railway employee back in the 1950's to 1960's and his job was to fill all the signals between Monarto and Tailem Bend with kerosene.

Burt Munn was the lamplighter in our area. He used a trike that was hand and foot powered. He would fill the lamps from Murray Bridge to Tailem Bend Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, and Monarto – Murray Bridge Tuesday and Thursday one week then alternate the next week. The trike was a one-man operation but still quite heavy.

This operation was carried out util mid -late 60's when C.T.C. (Centralised Train Control) which was all electric operated from Murray Bridge Train Control.

One large drum of Kero was on the trike & a small 1 gallon (4.5 litre) can with a spout was used by Burt, he would climb a ladder on each signal and fill two signal lamps. Whilst up there he would clean the lamps on the signals and renew the wick if necessary. These signals were approximately 20 foot (6.096 Metres) high.

Each signal location had a mound of filling alongside with sleepers placed between the tracks to manually take trike off the track to let a train pass. He would have to keep in touch with the Train Controller in Murray Bridge to keep a check on train Movements.

# There was an error in the last topics about David Gollan and Morphett. Adding the amendment from the information of the last submission.

**1839 May 13th** - The Wellington Special Survey was claimed by John Morphett, of 4,000 acres at £4,000 to be selected from a compact district of 15,000 acres extending one mile from each bank of the river Murray and down to the water's edge. These 15,000 acres extended from about 4 miles south of Wellington to about 2 miles north of Tailem Bend. Thus capturing the rights to all the water front of the Murray.

**TALEAM / PINE CAMP -** From circa 1867 Donald Gollan purchased several adjoining sections at East Wellington. Donald Gollan had the property called Pine Camp which was surrounded by a stone wall. Some of it is still standing.

# Thought for the Month - Colossians 1:9-13

Submitted by Pastor Gary, Rehoboth Christian church on the Verandah.

#### Colossians 1:9

What do we pray for people if we want the church to grow, and particularly as we desire to hear God's will? (We don't just go to Church. We are the Church) If we read the above scripture, the answer is simple, pray that each individual is "filled with the knowledge of His will in all wisdom and spiritual understanding" It isn't as difficult as we tend to believe or make it if we follow Paul's example.

It doesn't mean following a ritual or praying the way someone else prays. We should first of all pray for ourselves, that we hear from God, so that we can pray in the knowledge of His will. Praying with the Holy Spirit's leading means putting aside our own will and that is exciting! Suddenly we find ourselves praying differently from our own self-centred words. We find that we are able to say things that just don't seem to come from ourselves. Thoughts naturally form into words and our prayers are more focussed and satisfying.

If we focus our attention on verse 10 we see God's purpose for verse 9-praying for wisdom and spiritual understanding leads us to please God, grow closer to Him and do good works, bear fruit, for His purposes, not our own,

#### Colossians 1:11

By praying for spiritual understanding we, and the believers we are praying for will be strengthened in God's power and we will not be robbed of the joy of the Lord, regardless of our circumstances.

#### Colossians 1:12

In verse 12 we are encouraged to recognise God's leading and give thanks for the privilege of being involved in God's great plan. We really don't need to pray like anyone else, when the Holy Spirit leads our prayers God hears our hearts and the words are understood by Him. It doesn't have to be elaborate prayer just pray for knowledge of His will and spiritual understanding. Spend a few minutes just quietly listening as you focus on the Lord & His voice speaking for your attention.

Read Colossians 1:9-12 each day so that you become really familiar with it and begin to hear what God is saying.

Set sometime aside each day when it best works for you and pray for each person you care about, and those you don't think you care about. God will begin to show you who HE cares about. Most important, ask the Holy Spirit to lead!


