

Construction is underway on the Tailem Bend Hybrid Project, which consists of the 87 MW Tailem Bend Solar Project Stage 2 and 41.5 MW Tailem Bend Battery Energy Storage System.

Once operational, Stage 2 will be capable of supplying enough power to satisfy the average annual needs of 45,000 Australian homes. Several innovative and advanced technologies will be utilised for Stage 2 including bifacial panels which allows for the absorption of solar irradiance from both sides of a solar module and mounting solar panels on single-axis trackers to follow the movement of the sun, increasing energy production.

The Tailem Bend Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) will commence construction in late 2022 and is to be located within the Stage 1 site area. The BESS can provide direct benefits to the State by stabilising frequency fluctuations in the electricity grid and assisting with the uptake of more renewable energy generators into the grid.

Vena Energy is proud to have supported several local initiatives over the years such as installation of Christmas parade lighting at Railway Terrace, re-development of the clubroom at the Tailem Bend Cricket Club and conducted an educational site tour of Tailem Bend Solar Project Stage 1 for thirty young adults from the Tenison Woods College in Mount Gambier. Meals on Wheels

2014 - More than a Meal

A friendly smile, an ear to listen and a warm healthy meal, that type of service is all too familiar for Tailem Bend woman Fay Brook. For more than three decades, the mother of four and grandmother of seven has volunteered her time to the Tailem Bend Meals on Wheels group and has clocked up enough hours to be named its longest serving member.

Her service has had a place in the hearts and homes of Tailem residents for 33 years, helping frail and older people and also the young disabled in the community to stay in their homes where they are most happy.

Tailem Home

Mrs Brook first moved to Tailem with her parents in 1941 and joined Meals on Wheels in 1981 less than two years after the program was established in the town.

She was a housewife at the time and joined the group to keep her mother on the odd shifts when no one was rostered on. If there were five Fridays in a month there would be no one rostered on the fifth and we started doing it. And went on to do it regularly serving it twice a month.

Volunteers

Each meal drop required two volunteers, a driver and a dispenser and for 20 years Mrs Brook had served with the same partner, Raelene Ellis. The two set off together every fortnight and delivered about 250 meals each year. Fay said since her first outing things had changed quite a bit.

It started at \$5 dollars a week and we would have to collect the money when we dropped off the meal that was cooked by the Hospital cook.

Meals

We used to drive a Council owned station wagon and go to the Hospital and collect the meals for delivery. We used to have an insulated billy can and dish the soup out individually, and whoever was last on the list would get out their saucepans and would have what was left over for the weekend.

Transport

As technology improved over the years so did the hassle of service, we went to direct debit which was a lot quicker, although I did enjoy having a chat writing out the receipts Fay said. Then the Council eventually got power steering on the Station Wagon but we started to use our own cars. The number of meals and the diversity of the audience also changed over the years with anything up to 20 meals being quite standard in the early days.

The group started to deliver about 12 meals just in Tailem, there used to be a lot of bachelors when I first started but ladies soon become involved also Fay said.

Friendship

The only thing that hasn't changed over time is the friendly service and the extent to which it is valued within the community.

Fay always continued to encourage Meals on Wheels clients to not look at their inability to shop and cook as an obstacle to autonomy.

She always greeted them with a friendly smile, have a bit of a chat and provide them with a nutritious meal. Leading up to Christmas Fay would work with the Tailem Bend group to help create Christmas hampers for their clients, to again give them a reason to smile and ensure they will be well fed over the holiday period. After 37 years' service Fay retired in 2018.

We now move on to the State CEO

S.A. Meals on Wheels branches have delivered 60 years of service to clients around the State. Since it was founded in 1953, the organisation has delivered nearly 47 million meals allowing people to live independently in their homes for a lot longer. Meals on Wheels S.A. chief executive said at the time during one day over 4,000 meals were delivered to people who needed it. For the past 60 years our remarkable group of volunteers has delivered a daily meal to many thousands of clients who are unable to shop or cook for themselves with ease, including older people, those with a disability of have a carer role the CEO said.

Client's Safety

In addition to serving up a nourishing, tasty meal, volunteers also provide a friendly smile, welcome social contact and a check that people are safe and well, which is invaluable to both clients and their families.

President Joyce said at the time 30 volunteers celebrated 35 years anniversary in a small way while continuing to deliver up to 20 meals a day. Joyce went on to say "It's a wonderful service for people living in their homes who are unable to shop and have community contact, we enjoy what we are doing and see it as a valuable service."

Currently 2022 - Joyce Updates Us.

Due to the Covid – 19 epidemic and the many delivery restrictions, it was decided to deliver frozen meals, just one day a week. This enabled our clients to receive their meals using a very small amount of volunteers.

Tailem Bend meals are obtained from Adelaide M.O.W kitchen fortnightly. With only five clients this concept is working very well.

Deliveries are only within Tailem Bend Township, however clients from outlying areas may collect frozen orders from the TB Hospital at an arranged time.

Medical Practices in Tailem Bend: Part 2

Submitted by Angie Tomkinson, on behalf of the Tailem Bend Historians. Researched from information from Mrs Pat Wehl - Connolly, Mrs Rhonda Mik, & Peter Connolly.

There was a Private Hospital situated in Pretoria Street, run by Sisters Ida and Ella Young. The house was originally the Pontt Family home and is at the top end of Pretoria Street.

Past Doctors who have practiced here have been Dr Cherry & Linn, in the very early days of settlement, then came Drs Cornish, Turner, Lloyd and Coats, there was also a lady doctor, Dr Hensley she worked with Dr Coats. Dr Gooden came to Tailem Bend in 1951 and he practiced for many years after that. Dr Gooden's surgery was across the road from the Bakery where he saw patients until he moved in 1989 to the Medical Centre by the hospital on the cliff.

The first registered hospital is on the corner of Second Avenue and Trevena Road (*Granites Road*) and is now privately owned. A German woman Mrs Geriche gave instructions for this to be built.

Which was run by Sisters Joyce and Hayes in 1928 with primitive medical facilities. It was called St Margaret's Hospital, run by the Church of England. Former staff members can relate many stories of medical miracles performed.

This hospital closed for a few years in the late 1930's and was reopened again in 1939 and was staffed by the Bush Nursing Society until 1962 when the new hospital was built.

The first chemist was opened in 1923 in the shops next door to the hotel, where the hairdressing shop was. (*This could be either side of the Hotel*)

It was opened by Mr FA Heddle of Murray Bridge. Mr Griffiths took over the business. Eventually it moved up the street where the row of shops were. (Now part of the Shell Truck Stop)

Mr Lance Manning purchased the Chemist in 1947, and was later joined by Jeff Nottage who eventually took over the Chemist when Mr manning moved away from the town in the Mid 1960's. The Chemist then moved back by the hotel in the late 1980's, where it is now.

The present Hospital took 7 years of fundraising from the Hospital supporters club and was opened by Sir Eric Bastyan, Governor of South Australia in 1962.

It was a 26-bed furnished and up to date hospital with a two story staff block which was also built along the cliff. The move to this facility was overseen by Dr Phil Gooden. And later a medical centre was built along the cliff where he and other doctors came to the practice.

Some of them have been Drs Obrien, Goldacre, Horare, Pye, Entwistle and Fensak to name a few.

These beautiful seats are completely made from recycled plastic bags. Landscaping around the seats to be completed. Kaye Bartlett sitting on one of the seats.




BOOK REVIEW

THE COAST

By Eleanor Limprecht

A stunning novel of love and courage by the bestselling author of The Passengers.

Alice is only nine years old in 1910 when she is sent to the feared Coast Hospital lazaret at Little Bay in Sydney, a veritable prison where more patients are admitted than will ever leave. She is told that she's visiting her mother, who disappeared one day when



Alice was two. Once there, Alice learns her mother is suffering from leprosy and that she has the same disease.

As she grows up, the secluded refuge of the lazaret becomes Alice's entire world, her mother and the other patients and medical staff her only human contact. The patients have access to a private sand-stone-edged beach, their own rowboat, a piano, and a library of books, but Alice is tired of the smallness of her life and is thrilled by the thought of the outside world. It is only when Guy, a Yuwaalaraay man wounded in World War I, arrives at The Coast, that Alice begins to experience what she has yearned for, as they become friends and then something deeper.

Filled with vivid descriptions of the wild beauty of the sea cliffs and beaches surrounding the harsh isolation of the lazaret, and written in evocative prose, The Coast is meticulously researched historical fiction that holds a mirror to the present day. 1. Aim High in Steering

Look well ahead when driving your vehicle. Steer the vehicle using your lower fringe vision. Look in the direction you want the vehicle to go, especially in bends and corners.

TREVENA RD, Tailem Bend

2. Keep Your Eyes Moving

Don't fix your eyes on any single object for more than about 2 seconds. Keep moving your eyes from object to object otherwise danger could threaten your vehicle from another source without you being aware of it.

3. Get the Big Picture

By moving your eyes, you are able to check the far distance, the middle distance and the near distance directly in front. In addition the mirror should be checked on average at least once every 10 to 12 seconds. This constant checking ensures that the driver is fully aware of everything that is going on around the vehicle.

4. Leave yourself an 'out'

When driving, always have a plan of 'escape' should the traffic conditions quickly change. If a vehicle is tailgating, leave more space in front of your vehicle as this reduces your braking requirements. Offset your vehicle where possible to the vehicle travelling alongside. This allows space for other vehicles to 'escape' if they should swerve suddenly.

5. Make Sure Other Drivers See You

Look at the faces of other drivers to see if they are looking at you. Get eye contact with those other drivers. Use your signals in plenty of time so they are clearly understood. Position your vehicle in such a way to clearly show your intention (eg. when turning left). Where possible do not travel in blind spot areas of other vehicles. (When you are approaching from behind, if you can see the eyes of other drivers in their mirror they have a better chance of seeing you.)

With just one mouth to control, or attempt to or not control, we have the ability to bless someone, or cause ourselves and others much trouble or pain with what we speak. (Whether intentional or not). It is just as well we have only the one mouth. On the other hand, (or is it head) we have two ears to listen with and (understand, or fail to understand), hear what is being said by others as they share their thoughts, opinions and time with us.

"I could eat a horse, & chase the rider." "I could kill for a decent steak dinner right now." "I read it on Facebook so it must be true."

Or when your mother says, "keep it up! Go on, just keep on doing what you're doing".

Prov.18: 2. A fool has no delight in understanding, But in expressing his own heart. (NKJV) *Fools have no desire to learn; They would much rather give their own opinion. (CEV)

There are times when we all have difficulty in conversation and discerning the words being spoken. Could it be perhaps that there are times we listen too little and speak too much and\or too soon? Prov.18: 13.He who answers a matter before he hears it, It is folly and shame to him. (NKJV) *It is stupid and embarrassing to give an answer before you listen. (CEV) To receive instruction (knowledge) we must first listen, and to become wise we must understand. To understand we must pay attention to (the meaning of) what the speaker has to say so that we receive the information correctly. It is only when we receive the correct information of what is said, that we are able to discern the truth of what we hear.



Since its inception in 2019, the program has provided \$72.7 million in funding for 132 projects within the Basin.

"The Murray Darling Basin Economic Development Program was all part of the former Coalition Government's commitment to the 2.6 million Australian's who call the Basin home- to build regional strength, and keeping communities at the heart of the Basin Plan," Mr Pasin said.


