## The Tailem Bend Football Club Grand Finals

Tailem Bend travelled to Jervois on Saturday, September 17 with all three junior grades contesting the grand final against Imperials.

The under 14s side was first to kick off and the young Eagles put up a gutsy effort against a classy side. The Eagles were without star player Patty Loller who unfortunately suffered a serious knee injury just weeks prior. His team mates rose to the challenge however and put in a brave fight and at three-quarter-time, the scores were level, 2.2 each.

However, it was all Imperials in the final moments as the wind which would hang around all day, started to blow to the Blues' end and Tailem Bend conceded four majors and the match.

#### The Eagles went down 6.3 to 2.3.

Second-half effort saw the Tailem Bend under 16 team win the 2022 River Murray Football League grand final by 7 points over Imperials on Saturday.

Eagle Captain Kylan Krueger-Gould led out his side but unfortunately lost an important toss and Tailem Bend were forced to kick against a stiff breeze. The Eagles' midfielders and defenders stood up early and continued to weather the storm in the early stages of the first quarter. However, Tailem Bend eventually started to concede goals and Imperials kicked four majors to lead by 27 points, 4.3 to 0.0.

At the quarter-time break, the rain started to fall and the wind died down a touch and Tailem would have to produce something special to get back into the game. Imperials held the momentum and Tailem's defence stood tall until Sam White was able to open the Eagles' account with a clever right-foot goal after finding space through traffic.

When White kicked a second goal - this time a snap on his left - Tailem Bend was starting to look dangerous. However, two goals with a strong breeze were not enough and Tailem Bend was down, 4.4 28 to 2.0 12 at the long break.

The Eagles had to do the hard work into the wind in the third term if they had any chance of winning, and that they

did. Paul Agalidis, White and Krueger-Gould were strong in the middle and Lincoln Pitt and Jake Thomas were taking marks and getting dangerous as Tailem Bend was coming back.

A clever goal by exciting Tailem Bend playmaker Tyrel Long was a highlight of the grand final and when the talented Jamain Wilson kicked a goal after the three-quarter-time siren, Tailem Bend had all the momentum and went into the final term just five points down, 4.6 to 4.1.

Tailem Bend forward Brock Pedler - who won the under 16 leading goal kicker award - took a big contest and converted and Tailem Bend was soon up by a point.

Later in the quarter, Jamain Wilson kicked his second and the Eagles held their nerve to record an awesome 7-point come-from-behind win, 6.1 37 to 4.6 30.

Tailem Bend's best players were Sam White, Lincoln Pitt, Jamain Wilson, Paul Agalidis and Joel Wilson.

In the under 18s match, Tailem Bend wasn't able to replicate their second semi-final victory over Imperials and suffered a heart-breaking 4-point loss.

The Eagles kicked with the aid of the breeze but only held an eight-point lead at quarter time, 3.3 to 2.1. The Eagles were good in the second quarter and managed to score into the breeze set up by clever play by Jacob Wilson. Tailem Bend trailed at halftime by five points, 4.8 to 4.3.

Again, the Eagles didn't make good use of the breeze in the third term and a three-point lead (5.6 to 4.9) did not seem like it would be enough. However, the Eagles dug deep in the final term and kicked a goal and the Tailem Bend defenders held firm to set up what was a likely victory until in the final seconds of the game a goal to Imperials saw the Blues in front with time expiring soon after.

A dramatic end to the game saw the Eagles lose, 6.7 to 6.11.

## Our Journey to Say Goodbye to Our Auntie Nancy

This month we took our last journey to say goodbye to our auntie Nancy in Peak Hill, in New South Wales. I am the eldest son with four brothers, my late father Don after having married my late mother May, left Peak Hill in 1939 to join the South Australian mounted police force.

My mother's family included 11 children born to Arthur and Maud Stanford of Lynda Vale, Peak Hill. Every Christmas my mother and father would pack up for a one month holiday with all of my uncles, aunties and cousins and stay at 'Lynda Vale'. Incidentally, dads family consisted of 10 children making the Christmas dinner at times exceeding 50 sitting around the dinner table.

I can still vividly remember our first trips across to Peak Hill were by train. I can remember pulling up at Tailem Bend where sausages and mash were served for a meal and the gravy tasted oh so good.

We were spoiled by aunties and uncles. We would play tennis and in particular, Auntie Nancy was a district champion, and she was single and doubles pair champion grass lawn bowlers of North West New South Wales. Auntie Nancy was an amazing cook, her chores at home were to assist grandma and cook for 13 as a minimum sitting at the table. She was very active for the community groups and working tirelessly with the CWA and the RSL where her husband uncle Keith was President.

One very memorable occasion was when the rabbit plague was racing across New South Wales. In one night on their property, with everybody on board, over 1500 rabbits were caught and sold. We soon learned how to gut a rabbit for the markets!

Last Saturday week Judy and I left the Peak Hill, making

our way around and through the Lachlan River breaking its banks, and then the Murrumbidgee running a banker.

Her service was held at Saint Stevens Anglican Church Peak hill, where in 1950 she, with her twin sister Auntie Valerie, who married Uncle Allan Neil, had a double wedding. I also can remember attending the church with my dearest mother playing the pedal organ, of course now, they have a lovely large organ.

The church was bursting at the seams with her niece Judith Stanford conducting. A very memorable and heartfelt service and afterwards we said goodbye to her at the Peak Hill Cemetery, followed by refreshments at the Peak Hill bowling club.

Auntie Nancy was the last of 11 children, all now deceased.

#### **ESSENTIAL EIGHT ASSESSMENT**

TBCC has recently completed the Australian Cyber Security Centre's (ASCS) Essential Eight migration strategies. This assessment tool is to assist organisations on how to implement strategies to better protect themselves against various cyber threats. Recommendations from this are to use strong passwords, use secure methods to share sensitive information, provide security awareness training, carry out regular security testing and undertake post incident reviews. Upon completing this assessment, TBCC is at Champion level, indicating that our approach to Cyber Security is relatively sophisticated.

#### **MMCPN**

Our Tailem Bend Shopping Bus is up and running every Thursday morning. It is available to people of all ages who are transport disadvantaged. If you are over 65 years, you need to be registered with My Aged Care and have a transport referral (TBCC staff can assist with this). All passengers will need to complete a Tailem Bend Community Centre consumer registration form, which can be done over the phone.

#### **WEEKLY SHOPPING BUS**

The bus will pick you up from your home (within a 5km radius of the Tailem Bend post office) and take you to the main street (usually Foodland and the chemist, but our driver, Trevor Coombe is flexible and can usually accommodate other stops). We have a transport companion, the lovely Sharon Coombe, who can assist with carrying grocery bags and boarding the bus, so the service is ideal for people needing a little extra help during shopping.

Bookings can be made up until noon the day before, by contacting either Lauren or Sam at TBCC (8572 3513) and we would appreciate a gold coin donation.

#### **HANDPICKED FESTIVAL**

#### **MMCPN VEHICLE**

As accredited operators of passenger transport vehicles, we are required to have all vehicles inspected annually by an approved inspector of the Department of Transport and Infrastructure. This was completed recently at Regency Park and all vehicles have maintained their Certificates of Inspection. Thank you to our fleet of volunteer drivers who got the vehicles down to Regency Park for inspections – your help with this huge task is appreciated.

#### **MMCPN PRICING SCALE**

A reminder that our new pricing scale is now in effect, with both subsidised and non-subsidised pricing. We offer transport services to transport disadvantaged consumers of all ages, and if you are over 65 years of age (or 50 years for Aboriginal and Torres Straight Islander people) you will need to be registered with My Aged Care and have a transport referral in place. Again, we can assist with organising this. Non-CHSP consumers (ie. those on Package Level assistance or NDIS are welcome to access our services for the non-subsidised fee and we can directly invoice your package provider). Please speak to Sam if you are unsure of your eligibility.



To our loving family, Bronwyn, Vince, Patrick, Carolyn, David, Brayden, Lachlan, Kirralee, Derek, Anne, Nelson and Jamie. The sad news reached us as the moon was descending over the river Murray early this morning. I rose early to share this with you all.

Early in 1954, I had achieved all of the prerequisites required to receive the Queens Scout award, after which I worked very hard to then achieve the Bushmans Thong Award. This award is in recognition of the highest proficiency award that any scout in the world can achieve.

Before her Majesty's first visit to Australia, I received directions from the Governor of South Australia who was the "chief scout," that as I had not turned 16 years of age, her gracious Highness is unable to present my Queen Scout certificate and congratulations on my achievement.

However, the Governor advised her Majesty that as soon as Bruce was 16 years of age, he will invite all of Bruce's family, scouting dignitaries and friends to a function to be held at the government house where he would present my Queen Scout certificate.

I can still vividly remember the beautifully manicured lawns and the presentation which I had worked so hard for. Those moments have stayed with me all my life.

I then received an invitation to be a member of the guard of honour at the ANZAC memorial services whenever The Governor was in attendance. This itself was a very moving experience with getting up at 5 am, being at the cross of sacrifice and then at the saluting Dias King William Road and afterwards at the memorial gardens service.

#### I receive that honour for the four following years.

I have undertaken to be an Ambassador to the Lord Baden Powell society for a long time, and now that I have received Honorary Recognition as A Patron Of Lord Baden Powell society, who was the founder of THE BROTHERHOOD of SCOUTING. My certificate, State Scarf, brass Baden Powell woggle, and the bronze Replica of Lord Baden Powell transcends my memories of how proud I am to be the recipient of the Queen's certificate and now a patron of the Baden Powell Society

## Black Dog Ride To The Red Centre

Article submitted by Sandra Douglas.

I started riding motorbikes about 5 years ago and have been on various adventures, the first was 2019, where I joined the WRWR (Woman Riders World Relay) through Indonesia.

There were approximately, 20.000 women, from 80 countries, taking a baton around the world raising awareness on the number of women riders there are throughout the world, this was the start of my passion.

In August for the last two years, I have joined the National Black Dog Ride to the Red Centre, riding to raise awareness for depression and suicide prevention. About 3,000 Australians end their lives each year – about eight people a day. Suicide is the third leading cause of premature death from injury or disease, and the main cause of death among people aged 15 to 49. We lose more people to suicide than die on our roads each year. It affects all ages, genders, and ethnicities.

The history of the Black Dog started with Winston Churchil: who suffered terrible depression, he called his "Black Dog" so our Mascot is Winston, who makes the rides with us every year. I have to say, my reasons for joining the ride were selfish. I loved the idea of a long ride and this year was 5200km and I had never been to Uluru and Alice Springs. I had no idea just how amazing the adventure would be.

This year we started in Angaston, where eight women riders from W2W (Woman 2 Wheels SA) joined us. After breakfast and a catch up, we headed off to Mildura. That morning was amazing, there were approx. 30/35 bikes of all types and sizes registered for the ride. We rode from Angaston to Mildura - 318kms, Mildura to Broken Hill - 295kms, Broken Hill to Whyalla - 489kms, Whyalla to Port Lincoln - 220kms, Port Lincoln to Port Augusta - 213kms.

Here we met 45 bikes from WA, who had ridden across the Nullarbor to join our ride. Now we had over 70 bikes riding from Port Augusta to Coober Pedy – 540kms and then Coober Pedy to Alice Springs – 687kms.

Once in Alice Springs we had a few days to recuperate, which we all needed and to do our washing, clean our bikes, get any repairs done or new tyres fitted, before the ride home.

This year was a national ride, so there were approx. 450 motorbikes converging on Alice Springs from all corners of Australia, Darwin, Qld, NSW, Vic, Tassie, SA & WA. On Saturday a "Thunder Ride" through Alice Springs had been organised, with 450 bikes taking to the streets ... all I can say is WOW!

This year I spent time talking to other riders, listening to their stories, most have visits from the "Black Dog" so these rides are vital to let them know they are not alone and there is help and support out there. If you suffer from depression, please know you are not alone, there is help, out there. Talk to a friend, your doctor or contact:

How good is it to be able to entertain our relatives and friends in our own homes once more? We are able to visit freely, whenever we wish, without restrictions; with some exceptions in the health care areas.

Our isolations during covid reminded us how important our 'social life' is to us. We say, 'hello', smile at, and often chat to neighbours and other people we meet. However, we need stronger connections with our friends and families to know we are loved and valued.

In Genesis 2 verse 18, God says, "It is not good for man to be alone. I will make a helper suitable for him." Thus, woman was created. Couples create their own homes, families and social circles.

In Luke 9 verse 58, Jesus said, "Foxes have holes and birds have nests, but the Son of Man has no place to lay his head." Christ left His home and family in Nazareth to travel on foot and reveal God's plan of salvation for man, through His death and resurrection. Although Christ had no home of his own, he gathered a group of disciples and he was never alone unless he went to pray by himself. Jesus was invited into peoples' homes. ## **Medical Practices In Tailem Bend: Part 1**

From the beginning of the settlement of Tailem Bend there have been several buildings utilized as hospitals. Originally the closest hospital was at Strathalbyn.

The first hospital/medical building was a mud brick dwelling situated on the riverbank at the Southern end of the town, which was built in 1870. This building was used for births and medical practices in the 1890's and early 1900's it was here that Clara Neumann (Nagel) was born in 1912.

The first doctor to reside in Tailem Bend was Dr Cherry who came in 1913. He lived on Karoonda (Kulde) Rd he would drive his buggy around to visit the sick in their homes. He left in 1915 leaving the town with no doctor once again. In 1920 Dr Leslie Linn, with his wife Gladys, came to the town after graduating from university. Their belongings were destroyed by a fire at the Coffee Palace where they were staying. Dr Linn's hands were quite badly burnt in helping to extinguish the fire.





As a mid Wife Mrs Murphy was frequently called upon to assist births in the early 1900's. She apparently lived in a small, galvanised iron cottage in Pretoria Street, between Trevena Road and Pontt Street, her home was also used as a maternity hospital in later years.

Another residence that was used as a medical Residence, was that of Reverend Williams, which was built between 1908 and 1911, by the Congregational Church in Main Street (Mawson Avenue), for the minister and his family. The builder was Mr George Slade.

Dr Linn and his wife established a surgery on the North-eastern edge of the town in the early 1920's. There was no electricity, so when performing surgery operations at night they would drive the car to the theatre window, leave the engine running and his assistant would hold a portable spotlight. He made the comment "I have seen more real poverty in the mallee scrub than I have ever seen elsewhere". Kath waterhouse from Adelaide, joined Dr Linn in 1922 as a district nurse. Often Kath not only looked after patients, but also helped farmers to keep going by taking over the farm duties of the sick person.

Dr Linn, his wife and their three children left Tailem Bend after being in practice there for eight years, His parting comment was "the Tailem Bend Practice was definitely for a young man" Dr Linn was only thirty-four.

The Ministers wife was a registered sister and operated it as a maternity hospital. This house is situated on the corner of Mawson Ave and Queen St.




#### **BOOK REVIEW**


