

# The Changing Face of Tailem Bend #128

A long-running series submitted by Peter Connolly.

This month we continue with more early history from Wendy. FROM THE CORNERS OF MY MIND. BY Wendy TAKOS (Nee Carter)

As I have previously written, my father was a Railway man, from age around fifteen to his retirement at age sixty five. He was born in Bendigo in 1899. After a short service in the Victorian Railways he transferred to South Australia around 1924 where he took up further duties in Port Adelaide. In Port Adelaide he gained most of his Railway experiences for advancement in varied duties with Certificates for 'Lock and Block Working',' Train Control', 'Ticket Collector & Examination' and Porters Rules' Etc.

It wasn't until around 1940 that he moved to Tailem Bend. By that time he had done a stint in Port Lincoln, had married and had a first child, a son, named Robert (Bob). The railway house allocated to him was cottage 732 Railway Terrace, Tailem Bend. This was one street back from the main street and handy for where he was to work as a Shunter, Porter, on trains or in Signal Cabins both on the Tailem Bend Station itself or in the shunting yards. Most of the trains that went through Tailem back then were 'goods' trains carrying supplies to Victoria. Once a week the 'Bluebird' passenger train stopped at the station to pick up or set down passengers. Other than that was the occasional steam train which I know we would catch when going to Adelaide.

The war years from 1939- 1945 were tough years for most, I was born in 1945 but have early memories of food rationing and of our windows being taped up at night to block out the light. So I would say that until the early fifties people struggled by. As the war faded into history a life totally new to us war-time kids dawned. New motor cars were on the road. At first Vauxhalls, Morris's and Austin's and by 1948 Australia's own car the Holden. Mind you it was only mainly on race days that we saw any real numbers of them. It was 1950 before mum could afford a refrigerator, prior to that the ice –man delivered ice for our cold chests. And before the electricity it was kerosene that was used for lanterns and heating.

Following the beginning of the arrival of migrants around 1947-48 (new Australians), new motor cars on the road, test cricket and league football came out of the mothballs, and a housing boom began in the city. Jobs were easy to get with the minimum age that employers were allowed to put on was 14 years. In 1955 all males over 18 years had to complete 2 years of National Service, made up of 90 days fulltime (rookie training) and the balance of the two years in regular weeknight and weekend training, plus too 14 day camps (12 months apart) at El Alamain army facility near Port Augusta. Some were also of course called to air force or navy training, but the vast majority went into the army.

Migrant huts were established down in what was dubbed 'Tin Pan Alley' just north of the rail crossing and also some were put just up past the Tailem Bend Primary School. Most of the migrants worked in the railways too. The mid-fifties saw a swing with what was also known as the teenage movement, akin to todays 'bikie gangs' where males were known as 'Bodgies' and females as 'widgies.' One of my greatest memories is of the day mum purchased a 'Radiogram' along with a few LP's that featured 'Rock around the Clock".

Another memory is of Guy Fawkes Day. The attempt to blow up the British Parliament by Guy Fawkes in the seventeenth century that had been celebrated on the 5th November every year recommenced in 1945. Huge bonfires were built, and kids began collecting crackers (fireworks) and wood weeks in advance. The GUY was a scarecrow-like-dummy which burnt on the bonfire in the manner of witches in the long gone past. Guy Fawkes Night was abandoned in the mid-60 because too many children were getting injured. I did enjoy those nights but once a cracker burnt me on the cheek and there after I kept my distance.

Other exciting things that occurred was the big Earthquake that South Australia experienced in 1954. I remember it happened during the night as my parents gathered all us kids and we huddled together under mum and dads double bed.



The next day there was talk of big holes in paddocks just outside of town and on our way to school we saw a rather large tree with branches down in the main street about opposite Eudunda Farmers. Our parents warned us not to shelter under trees if any after maths were to occur. Then there was the big floods in 1956 where the River Murray broke its banks and flooded the Jervois side of the river. That was where the farmers allowed there cows to feed and I can remember going to stand on the top of the cliffs to see all that water. The hairdresser – "Haddy's", had a house boat moored on the Tailem side of the river, which I believe survived the rising floods.

Dad was transferred in 1958 back to the city where he completed his Railway life. Unfortunately he passed away in 1966, my memories are still of him in Tailem bend either on the phones in that little signal cabin in the shunting yards or leaning out of the side window of the station to say a quick how do you do as I walked along the station on my way home from school.

# Well I hope some of these thoughts will revive some of your reader's memories.

Thanks Wendy, it's a long time ago but I am sure many old timers will still remember. I am one of them. I know my brother Bob is another, so too is Bob Elliott and Rene Lynch, Others could add to the list. I would love to hear from them.

### **MURRAY BRIDGE POOL & SHOPPING BUS**

The TBCC minibus travels to Murray Bridge on Wednesdays to either the MB heated pool (near the hospital) or MB Marketplace, but not both. With the BankSA branch shutting in Tailem Bend, there is a possibility of stopping at the BankSA branch in MurrayBridge.

The bus will pick you up from home (if you are more than 5kms outside of TB, we can meet you at TBCC) and will depart by 8 am. The bus will arrive back in TB by 11 am. The cost is \$5 per person and pool fees will be payable at the pool reception. Bookings are essential. If you have any questions or wish to book a seat, please give us a call.

This option of transport is available to people of all ages. If you are over 65 years (or 50+ years ATSI), then you will need to be registered with My Aged Care (1800 200 422) and have a transport referral in place. If you require help with this, we can assist and guide you through the process

The Cancer Skin Screening bus which was at Tailem Bend was very successful with 136 people being screened over the 2 days and with a 23% referral rate onto their own Doctors. A very worth-while exercise if we only save one person from a serious skin cancer. For those of you who missed out the Skin Screening bus will be in Murray Bridge in August.

Streetscape planning is underway for the townships of Tintinara, Coonalpyn and Tailem Bend within the Coorong District Council.

Following consultation undertaken in 2022, conceptual plans have been developed and will be used to spark further inspiration, input, comments and feedback from the community. Residents and ratepayers across the district are encouraged to help guide the Council on how they would like the three town's streetscapes to look, feel and function.

Developing the main streets will enhance community character and town pride and provide opportunity to improve essential infrastructure requirements and increase community connectivity.

"Greening our communities came through as a strong theme when Council undertook it's community consultation for the Community Vision Plan in late 2019, as did enhancements to town amenity, comfort and improved character," says Coorong District Council's Mayor Paul Simmons.

"The community has asked for improved streetscapes, town entry statements and greener communities, and now we are delivering on that through the development of some high-level master planning," says Mayor Simmons.

# Formular E Car to Arrive at The Bend

In an Australian first the fully electric GEN2 ABB FIA Formula E car will be on display at The Bend Motorsport Park this month.

We have found a couple areas of loam where a number of the species are growing reasonably happy. Most are found growing in the wild in heavy clay soils often in depressions.

The futuristic racer will take centre stage within The Bend's Welcome Centre from March 15th with patrons expected to be blown away by the unique appearance and technical features that the vehicle possesses. The display has been orchestrated by Formula E naming rights sponsor ABB and the vehicle is expected to remain on display at The Bend for an extended period in between other display commitments.

Displaying the vehicle is a huge coup for The Bend with this being the first Formula E car to grace Australian soil given the international series has never raced in the country. The Bend's Managing Director Dr Sam Shahin was honoured that ABB would be displaying the electric racer at The Bend.

"We're incredibly excited to be hosting the GEN2 Formula E car here at The Bend for its first Australian appearance.

Our welcome centre has hosted some amazing vehicles, but the Formula E car is something truly unique that South Australians and interstate travellers will be able to enjoy firsthand.

This reinforces our commitment to the motorsport community in delivering world-class international experiences and displays at a world-class facility."

Formula E was inaugurated in 2014 as the electrified equivalent of Formula 1 and received official FIA world championship status in 2020. The electric-powered cars boast 250kW (335 Brake horsepower) electric motors and typically race on temporary city centre street circuits with the 2023 calendar including locations such as Monaco, Rome, London and Mexico City. The series is known for its untraditional and innovative style of racing highlighted by the Fanboost feature used for 9 seasons which allowed fans to vote for their favourite driver with the leading vote-getter gaining an extra burst of power to be used during the race.

ABB as a global leader in the development of the world's fastest charging technology, has been the title sponsorship partner of the ABB FIA Formula E World Championship Series since 2018. "With the interest and following this series has had globally over eight fantastic seasons we are delighted along with the Bend Motorsport to be able to showcase this innovative vehicle for the first time in Australia" said Steve Amor Marketing Manager for ABB's Charging Portfolio.

For Season 9 of the ABB FIA Formula E World Championship, ABB will take on a new additional role within the series as official charging supplier. Working with engineers from motorsport governing body, the FIA, and Formula E, ABB has developed a dedicated compact, reliable and safe solution for charging the new Gen3 cars before race day and between sessions. Each portable fast charger can deliver a maximum power of 160kW and are able to charge two vehicles with 80kW of power simultaneously, before the race.

The GEN2 ABB FIA Formula E car will arrive in Australia on the 11th of March and remain in the country for an unspecified period with a considerable amount of this time set to take place within The Bend's world-class Welcome Centre.


# **BOOK REVIEW**

### **VOLUNTARY ASSISTED DYING UPDATE**

Voluntary Assisted Dying (VAD) has now been available in South Australia for more than six weeks, giving people with a terminal illness the right to make the choice to die with dignity under the Voluntary Assisted Dying Act 2021 (the Act).

The Act is operating as intended since it was passed on 31 January 2023, with all safeguards in place working effectively. Under the Act, a person with a terminal illness may access voluntary assisted dying in South Australia if they meet all eligibility criteria.

In the first six weeks since the legislation was passed, 32 people have made a first request to commence the process to access the pathway, and 11 permits have been issued by SA Health.

For many reasons, not all people who make a formal first request or who receive a permit, proceed to the final stage of the VAD process. SA Health is aware of at least six South Australians who have died after being administered or self-administering a voluntary assisted dying substance in accordance with the Act.

Under the new laws, people considering voluntary assisted dying should speak with their doctor for more information, with health practitioners legally unable to initiate discussions with individuals about VAD.

Access to voluntary assisted dying depends on the participation of eligible, willing, and trained practitioners. 44 medical practitioners have now completed the mandatory voluntary assisted dying training, and a further 54 have registered but not yet completed the training.

Alongside doctors, Care Navigators from the South Australian Voluntary Assisted Dying Care Navigator Service are available to assist people with accessing VAD. These are nursing and allied health professionals with experience in complex and end of life care who manage queries, encourage connections between services, and support referrals to participating medical practitioners.






