Purchasing her Railway Terrace home over ten years ago, Tammi Schubert of Tailem Bend had a strong feeling that the Main Street property would one day be a place of healing. With no idea of how it would come about, Tammi began her restorations, seeing her personal vision evolve into a place of revitalisation.

Tammi's "Revival" Art Café, incorporating a Makers Gallery and Art Therapy space, along with its first-class accommodation, will be opening soon. With years of service in the medical field as a Regional Nurse Consultant, a Riverland Mallee & Coorong Age Care Specialist with SA Health, a Murray Bridge Care Coordinator at Rest Haven, a Nurse Unit Manager and a Relieving Director of Nursing for the region, it now seems obvious that her dream project would be in therapeutic services to the community.

"I have always enjoyed being busy and helping others, I've also been a volunteer for 28 years for the South Australian Ambulance Service," Tammi said.

"I ended up as a Training Coordinator and the Regional Zone Secretary for some time."

Tammi still volunteers - helping families cope, through Family Connect. "It's a wonderful 12-week support program for families affected by severe emotional dysregulation such as Border Personality Disorder." Therapy for emotional dysregulation includes cognitive-behavioural therapy that unites approaches like mindfulness, acceptance and emotional regulation and in some cases, antidepressant medications may be required. "It's been a fascinating two years - I have finally put the final piece into my resurgence dream project puzzle, having recently completed a two-year Advanced Diploma in Trans Personal Art Therapy with the College of Complementary Medicine, Sydney," Tammi said. "I'm hoping to work closely with the NDIS and other government departments so as to secure grants, enabling me to offer my services to people in need - at no, or at least low cost."

51 and 53 Railway Terrace, Tailem Bend, has had an interesting history. "I believe the building was initially a Billiard Saloon and over the years it has been many things," she said. "I understand it was an Ice Factory at one stage with a huge chiller out the back. Then it became a Rabbit Factory - thousands of rabbits would be frozen in the old ice works chiller, put into train carriages and sent by rail, to the Melbourne markets."

"The massive, old diesel engine room, once housing the huge engine that generated the electricity to run the freezers, is having a long 12-seater Art Therapy table, placed straight through the middle of it," Tammi said. "The property has six bedrooms, two kitchens, several bathrooms and everything else I need, to make my dream of rebirth come true." Art Therapy helps people interpret, express and resolve their emotions and thoughts.

The art helps them find resolutions to issues, by exploring their emotions, understanding conflicts and the feelings that are causing them distress. "I've been chipping away in my spare time and I'm now only weeks away from sharing my dream of renewal with everyone," Tammi said. "I've always wanted a place to support our local people, a place to come to and show their beautiful homemade wares - most people are creative, it's just that some don't know it."

"I'm very proud of the Makers Gallery, it's a beautiful space for locals to sell and share their beautiful items," Tammi said. "It can be anything from food to paintings, to jewellery to homemade papers - absolutely anything they create." "The Art Therapy workshops will start in July, with group and individual, one-on-one therapy," Tammi said. "We are all artists in our own way, everyone can receive help from Art Therapy. I'm fascinated with the outcomes achieved from simply scribbling and chatting about the scribble and there are so many mediums, techniques and styles we can use."

"I've already been running weekend candle making workshops to teach people how to make Ukraine Candles - and I'm planning on getting in specialists for other kinds of creative workshops," Tammi said. "We also have weekends planned, using our accommodation next door, for people to come for a weekend of art immersion."

"Revival" will be opening within weeks, offering opportunities for locals to show their wares, frame their artworks, take part in classes and creative workshops - and partake of amazing, dine-in or takeaway, artisan coffees and teas and delectable locally made desserts and cakes. **"I hope Revival will make your heart sing."**

The Changing Face of Taillem Bend #139

A long-running series submitted by Peter Connolly.

This Month we look at a Rail Ramp.
Raylene Thomas and Rod and Val Ball.

Rail revamp threatens roads, Taillem Bend to lose character 1992.

Feared regional rail closers would mean massive road degradation in the Murray lands, according to local government leaders.

"I don't think our roads can take much more, they are not coping now, Murray lands Local Government Association (LGA) president and Karoonda" – East Mayor Doug Fullston said. "If they do close (the lines) there is trouble in the camp" Last month regional LGA meeting heard that broad gauge feeder tracks could be dispensed with once the Adelaide – Melbourne line had been relaid with standard gauge. The meeting prepared for the worst, despite Australian National assurances that no decision had been made. Correspondence from the authority had not been promising. *"(AN) did not think it financially viable to make (small lines) standard gauge,"* Mayor Fullston said.

At Meningie, District Council Chairman Cr Henry Angas's prompting, the association called on Minister for Transport Development Ms Barbara Weise to convene a meeting of federal and transport authorities, local government representatives and marking bodies. *"What I want to see is an independent assessment of rail and transport"* Cr Angas said.

"We want an overall picture." He said the merits of relaying rail and repairing roads should be compared. *"The cost of keeping (roads) up to standard will be astronomical."* *"Trucks are expensive in capital cost, they are dangerous."* Cr Angas raised the possibility of a bogie exchange centre in Taillem Bend, but admitted it would be cumbersome. He said the loss of regional lines would end of Taillem Bend as the Murray lands knew it. Mayor Fullson said roads in his (Karoonda—East Murray Council) district would be worst hit. The district's Peebinga line, Galga, Loxton lines all faced extinction.

He said rail's importance had been illustrated by this year's reopening of some defunct lines to grain traffic. Existing trucking was unable to cater for a bumper harvest. Even Coonalpyn Downs District Council, with silos spread along the Adelaide – Melbourne link, was concerned. Council chairman Cr Tim Cartledge said trucks passing though the district from Lameroo posed a serious threat. *"I don't think there is any doubt (rail closures) would mean a lot more trucking from those areas,"* Mr Cartledge said. An spokeswoman today said the authority planned to keep the Loxton – Taillem Bend and Pinnaroo – Taillem Bend lines open.

She said AN would consider off – loading and reloading grain at Taillem Bend, exchanging bogies, standardising the trucks or introducing road/railers. The last option was most likely. *"We are looking at developing a road/ railer specifically for traffic on those lines. A faceless welfare town – such would be Taillem Bend's fate if the railway depot was scrapped. "(The loss) would change the town's character"* Meningie Council chairman Cr Henry Angas said yesterday.

"It is hard to see what else is there – there is no longer a market, no longer a large a large stock and station agency." Fellow Councillor and one-time Australian National yard supervisor Cr Peter Dickson said the 80 – 100 remaining AN workers had long been resigned to their fate. *"I have been fighting it for a long time – since '78' Cr Dickson said."* *"Another two years and we'll be a whistle stop"* He nevertheless harboured hope for Taillem Bend.

Alternative industries were the key. Cr Dickson was a part of a committee looking at the town's options and more particularly, how best to spend its share of the \$3.8 million dollars allocated by the Federal Government. The money was intended to set up infrastructure in all areas affected by railways rationalisation. *"All regions have to get a bit of it, first in best dressed"* he said. Cr Dickson said Taillem Bend was well placed to exploit Australia's growing tourism and recycling industries.

The days of milk bars are long gone....but the Ball family's Tailem Bend Snack Bar has continued the tradition. Next Wednesday, husband and wife team Rodney and Valda Ball and Rodney's mother Zebudah, or bud as she is better known, will retire after 37 years of business in the town.

Open seven days a week, the snack bar has virtually been their lives. But their salvation came in the way of customers. "It's been lovely to talk to the customers, it really brightens up your day" Valda 56 said last week. "They do appreciate you. They are really nice."

The customers have also provided rehabilitation for 60 year old Mr Ball, who suffered a stroke about three years ago. "It is this good, old fashioned customer service that keeps them coming back," Valda said.

"It's homely, and many people have said, you wouldn't expect to see an old fashioned shop like this anymore." This is reflected in an autograph book the business has kept for the last 12 months. "Nice people quaint town," one man from the United States wrote.

"We enjoy the atmosphere of the shop and the nice service" a German couple said. The snack bar has also had its share of celebrity customers. Sir James Hardy and Joan Melnnes, of Til Ten show fame, have both popped in. By all means the Ball's and the snack bar are a piece of Tailem Bend history. They remember when Tailem Bend was a bustling railway town, and the main road to Melbourne ran passed their Railway Terrace shop. In their first day of business, a circus arrived via the train across the road, giving them more work than they could handle.

Now they say 75% of their trade is from tourists. From their humble beginnings in 1957 when they leased their first shop, the Ball's now own four shops in the town. "You have to work at it, stick to it, keep going" they agreed.

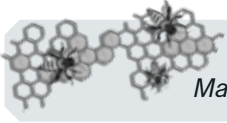

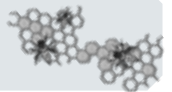

The medical bus is equipped with an electric lift, providing added convenience for passengers with mobility challenges during transportation.

The Coorong Coaches medical bus operates with appointment times, with drop-offs in Adelaide at 11am and pick-ups starting at 2pm. As the most cost-effective transportation mode for appointments in Adelaide, Murray Bridge and Mount Barker, we urge consumers to coordinate with their doctors and health services to align appointments with the Coorong Coaches schedule. Don't hesitate to give us a call at TBCC and we can discuss what options work best for your transport needs.

In other MMCPN updates, Tammy and I attended a driver presentation on February 20th in Karoonda to explore options for establishing CPN car services or accessing hospital cars for transportation in the township. With the absence of a local doctor at the hospital, residents now need to travel to Murray Bridge or Mannum for medical appointments. It's vital to establish transportation options for Karoonda residents in order to maintain access to essential services.

Tammy's presentation was well-received, with ten drivers expressing interest and undergoing the Volunteer Driver Accreditation Program. We are still actively seeking drivers in Murray Bridge, Lameroo, and Meningie to meet demand. If you know anyone interested in becoming a volunteer driver, please encourage them to contact Mel at TBCC, and we can provide further details about the program.

Our station, vehicles, equipment and protective clothing are all provided by the government which is funded by the emergency service levy but it is up to us as a community to provide people to do the job.

No experience is needed as all the training will be provided at no cost to you. All you need is a good attitude and a willingness to learn. We are predominantly looking for people to become firefighters but we also have roles available in operational support including radio operating, catering, fundraising and logistics. Our brigade was established in 1959 and is currently made up of both men and women from varied backgrounds and of all ages, who all come together when called to help people in their time of need. We currently have 18 active members but need more to continue providing a reliable service. As a volunteer firefighter you will help provide a vital service to your community. We respond to a range of calls including Bush and grass fire, Building and vehicle fires, Road crash rescue, storm damage and any other incidents that may pose a risk to our community.

You are too short to look over the heads of people in front of you. What can you do? Why not climb a gum tree? Great a clear view! Then the unexpected happens. **The celebrity looks up and sees you in the tree. But wait, there's more! He calls your name and tells you to come down from the tree as he will stay at your home today' WOW !!!**

About this time, panic sets in. What are you going to provide to eat and drink, not just for the celebrity, but for his whole entourage? You have no special food or drink. He will just have to accept you as you are. If a major celebrity knew your name and said he was going to stay at your house, that would make you feel like a celebrity yourself. Think how you could boast. **Jesus knows each of us by name.** We are special to him and he wants us to be with him in eternal life in heaven.

How can you prepare for such an event if it were to happen suddenly? You cannot keep food and drink for a feast to celebrate if you do not know he is coming. As Christians, we are asked to stay prepared for Jesus to come again. (*Matthew 24 v42*). We also cannot keep food and drink for a feast to celebrate when we do not know a time.

To prepare we are asked to follow Christ's example and teaching. *"Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and all your mind, and love your neighbour as yourself."* (*Luke 10 v27*). This means we should feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, cloth the needy, visit the sick and the imprisoned, and invite the stranger in. When we do this for others we are doing this for Jesus. (*Matthew 25 v 35-46*).

May God lead us to carry out His will as excitedly as if we are expecting a celebrity to visit us at any time.

Mar - Apr 2024

From the Chamber

At the March Ordinary Council meeting Elected Members considered several key reports, including the adoption of the revised Community Grants, Sponsorship and Funding Policy that will come into effect in the 2024/25 financial year. The policy has been revised to consolidate the community grants program into one round per year, with a new weighting system applied to applications, and simplified application forms developed (which include an online option). Two new introductions into the policy include funding support for watering sporting ovals across the district, and funding support for community/sporting organisations that manage public amenities (separate to Council maintained public amenities).

A new Flag Flying Policy was adopted that will clarify arrangements for flying of flags at each Council office.

Council agreed to lease or provide a permit over three sites within the Coorong district (in Meningie, Tailem Bend and Coonalpyn) to enable the construction of three new RAA EV charging stations. Construction is expected to commence in late March 2024.

Projects and works update

The recent warmer weather has kept the community facilities team busy with repairing irrigation systems across the district, while also managing the now slower summer weed growth.

The Tailem Bend team have also been tidying Railway Terrace and the surrounding parks from the mess caused by high little corella numbers.

Tailem Bend has received new stainless steel bin surrounds matching the Coorong branded bins at other locations around the district.

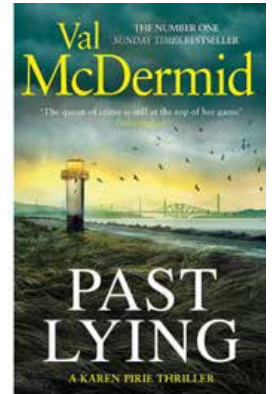
BOOK REVIEW

Plan your trip, drive on major roads and don't take short-cuts. Make sure your vehicle is road worthy and you have sufficient fuel.

Interstate and overseas visitors must carry a current driver's licence when driving in South Australia.

Always drive with your doors locked.

Never pick up hitchhikers. In Australia, you must drive on the left-hand side of the road. When driving long distances, share the driving and stop for at least 15 minutes every two hours. On open roads the speed limit in South Australia is 100 km/h unless otherwise signposted.

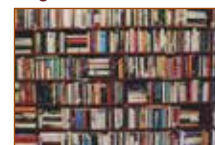

Thought for the Month - Love

As humans we use the word, 'love', in a wide context. We say such phrases as, 'I love your outfit'; 'I love ice-cream'; 'I love dancing'; 'I love going on holidays'; 'I love playing sports'.

In these phrases we could substitute the word, 'like' for the word, 'love'. Somehow the word, 'love', shows a deeper feeling than 'like'.

When it comes to friends and members of our family, we can say such things as; 'I love Auntie, Uncle, Grandpa, Grandma', or whoever. In these contexts we need the word, 'Love', rather than, 'like', to show that deeper emotional connection. Then we have the members of our family who are closest to us; 'I love Mum and Dad'; 'I love my partner and my children.'

This is an even deeper emotion, yet we use the same word, as we really do not have words in the English language to differentiate between the emotional levels of love.

When we love another person on a deep emotional level we want what is good for them, thinking more of their welfare than our own. We want to protect, comfort, help, and support them. We do not like to see that person upset. When they love us in the same way we both find happiness, a sense of purpose, belonging and calmness.

Jesus asks us to, 'Love the Lord your God, with all your heart and with all your soul, and with all your mind and with all your strength. Love your neighbour as yourself'. (Mark 12 v, 29).

This is another level of love. A commitment of heart, soul, mind and strength in loving God, and then loving our neighbour as ourselves.

If we look upon anyone around us as being our neighbour, then we should be treating them as we treat the 'loved' best friends and members of our family; as being worthy of our help, understanding, comfort, protection, support and anything for their wellbeing.

If we feel unloved, then we know how others can feel and we can extend the hand of friendship to those who feel the same. Then we are 'loving our neighbour'.

God so loved us that He sent His Son to die, paying for our sins instead of us. If everyone in the world tried to love those around them then there would be peace not war.

Then God's Will would be done on Earth.

May you find the strength to love everyone around you and feel their love in return. May you also feel the love God has for you.

LABOR FAILS ON ROAD SAFETY DATA

The Albanese Labor Government continues to kick the can down the road on data sharing as Australia's road toll continues to rise. Shadow Assistant Minister for Infrastructure and Transport Tony Pasin MP, says the latest figures from the department show that deaths on Australian roads for the month of February 2024 were 15per cent higher than the average February over the previous five years.

"110 Australian's lost their lives on our roads last month. Monthly figures continue to tell us that we are well off track to achieving National Road Safety Strategy targets," Mr Pasin said. Mr Pasin said the need to collect and share data was paramount to measure the effectiveness of road safety initiatives and investment.

"We need a coordinated national approach to road safety data. The former Coalition Government was committed to establishing a national data sharing agreement with States and Territories. Despite Labor making an election commitment in 2022 to, improve the timeliness and quality of road trauma data and look for opportunities to extract better quality road safety data from states and territories in return for funding of road projects, after almost two years in the job and a with new National Partnership Agreement set to come into effect from July, it seems to be yet another broken promise from Labor," Mr Pasin said.

Current data collected by States and Territories is not coordinated nationally, and it lacks details in many key areas such as serious injury. *"Every death on our roads is tragic. While each death is so much more than just a number the statistics are vitally important as the data collected should be informing the path forward for policy makers,"* Mr Pasin said.

"Labor's failure to facilitate the timely, consistent, and open reporting of national road safety data after almost two years in government is preventing Australia from quantifying its road safety problem, developing evidence-based responses, or evaluating their effectiveness."

"Labor is failing Australians on road safety," Mr Pasin said.

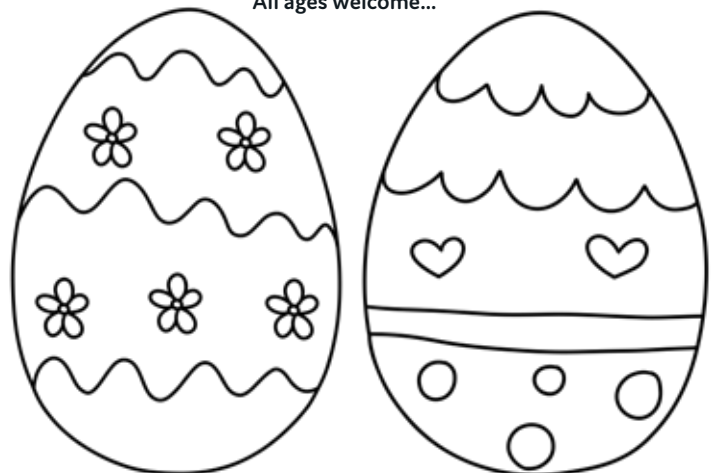
