Christmas comes to Tailem Bend

Father Christmas came to Tailem Bend aboard a CFS truck as the town heralded Christmas with a parade on Wednesday evening.

Crowds lined the main street as a parade of about 25 entries including floats, horses and vintage cars, as well as about 30 youngsters on decorated bikes, travelled from the football oval to the town Centre. Following the parade, Tailem Bend's third in recent years, Father Christmas met the children at the town hall, handing out sweets. The festivities also included train rides and a bouncing castle for the youngsters as well as Tailem Bend Line dancers, carol singing by Random singers, and entertainment by Noel Kneebone and Darren Gurney from Mallee Blue. Wendy Drew, who organised the parade for Tailem Bend and District Development Program. Said she was pleased with the event and the crowds that watched it. Meanwhile, a popular spot at Tailem Bend on Christmas Eve was Peter and Linda Weidenbach's home, where Christmas lights and Father Christmas drew about 130 youngsters to the spectacle. Just on 10,000 globes have been used in the display, which Mr Weidenbach said he had done each year since living at Tailem Bend for three years and at Murray Bridge before that. "I do it for the Kids - to me Christmas is for Kids," he said, adding that he was already planning to add to the display for next year.

Mallee Blue to Launch CD

The much awaited album released from popular local band Mallee Blue will take place on Saturday June 13th at the Tailem Bend Institute Hall.

Titled "Mallee Blue", the five man band comprising Brenton Ahrns, Tony Eckerman, Darren Gurney, Anthony Hodgen, and Noel Kneebone funded the CD themselves. The boys have been together for four years and are excited about the release of the 12 track CD. "We are just a group of local blokes who have had a decent go" Noel said. "Just to have it and listen to it is really great. It was a great experience, and if this one goes well we will do another. We have already got plenty of songs." A County music icon Wally Sparrow has been invited to release the recording, produced by another well:known musician Peter Miller. Eleven of the tracks are originals, covering a wide range of 'Australiana' including up:tempo and slow ballads. It also features a cover of 'She's my baby' by Aussie rock legend Johnny O'Keefe. While the release of the CD is the highlight of the evening, the show is for a good cause. Open to all member of the public, the celebration is aiming to raise funds for the renovation of the Aged Care Wing at the Tailem Bend hospital.

Admission is by gold a coin with bar facilities and supper available. The band will kick off around 8pm with a few cover songs followed by the launch of their album and its song including Mad Man from Moorlands (based on a true story) This Old House is Sad (family breakup) Out On The Street Again (comedy) Coming Home, Our River and Let It Rain (children's ideas on why it should rain) CD and cassettes will be on sale on the night as well as available from Soundzone. Meanwhile the band is Barmera bound this weekend for the Riverland Music Festival. Regarded as South Australia's premier county music festival, the local lads will play their stuff at three separate venues on Saturday and Sunday.



Mr Hughes said last Sunday that he planned to build a sully within the year, and then provide children with an opportunity to ride in the sully. *"The ponies also have to be educated to get used to a sully behind them." "Passers: by on the highway often look twice, when they see me leading the ponies on the roadside." "The idea of miniature Shetland ponies and sully rides has been popular in New South Wales and Southern Queensland" Mr Hughes used to have deer on his property before dogs broke into their enclosure, while he was away at Coober Pedy one weekend. <i>"Dogs might have to think twice before attacking the ponies"* he said.

The event highlighted the vital work of the Tailem Bend Country Fire Service (CFS), providing the public with a rare opportunity to get up close with the equipment and techniques used in emergency situations.

Throughout the day, the CFS team demonstrated their skills in road crash rescue, including the use of the *"jaws of life"* to simulate a car extraction. Spectators watched in awe as the team deftly worked through a mock scenario, cutting through metal with precision to rescue simulated accident victims.

Fire trucks were on display, and visitors learned about the range of equipment CFS volunteers rely on when responding to emergencies like bushfires and vehicle crashes.

One of the key goals of the day was to generate interest in new memberships, and the event did not disappoint. Several locals expressed their desire to join the CFS to Captain Dwayne Martin, who is optimistic about growing the team.

"It was great to see so much support from the community," said Captain Martin. "We're hopeful we'll see some fresh faces joining the ranks soon, helping us continue our crucial work."

The Tailem Bend CFS looks forward to expanding their team and preparing for the upcoming fire and holiday season with new recruits on board.

The Bend makes history to claim the fastest speed and quickest time ever recorded in Australian Motorcycle Drag Racing.

Monday, November 11th: Top Fuel Motorcycle racer Damian Muscat has recorded the fastest and quickest pass in Australian Motorcycle Drag Racing at Saturday's Drag Bike Nationals Presented by Harley Davidson. Muscat crossed the line "We headed into the finals and managed to run the best number of my career, and it just happens to be the fastest in Australia so we're pretty happy with that. It's also number eight in the world, just to add that one in so I couldn't be happier for all our sponsors for believing in us. It wasn't all smooth sailing for Muscat when after crossing the line at 377KPH in the first round he was unable to come to a stop before the sand trap. "In the first round, we went super:fast but put it in the sand pit and look the team worked tirelessly, I

in **5.800seconds** at **394.96KPH** to set the new benchmark. The landmark occasion follows Phil Read setting the country's quickest time ever in his Top Fuel Car just 20 days prior at the October Spring Nationals.

The Dragway at The Bend now holds the Australian record for the top tier of Car and motorcycle Drag Racing and is now arguably the fastest track outside of North America.



owe all this to them because we couldn't have turned all this (the bike) around otherwise."

The Bend's Managing Director Sam Shahin has immediately set about to raise the bar once more.

"Australian records that have remained unchallenged for years have now been broken at

Damian Muscat and his

team travelled **3200km** from Mackay, Queensland to achieve the feat and in doing so he also returns home as the winner of Round1 of the 2024/25 NDRC Top Fuel Motorcycle Championship.

Muscat's journey to the hallowed 5:second pass has intensified in recent times, falling short at Queensland's Willowbank Raceway in June, before knocking the existing record out of the park right here in South Australia on Saturday night.

When speaking after claiming the record Muscat stated that his team's run also put him in the top 10 in the world for Top Fuel Motorcycle Drag Racing.

The Top Fuel Motorcycle Class was joined by over 90 of Australia's best motorbike Drag Racers in the first running of the Drag Bike Nationals and The Bend commends presenting partner Harley Davidson on getting behind this unique event at its inception. The next opportunity for records to be broken will be at the Summit Racing Equipment Track Championships on Saturday November 23rd.

Celebrating 33 Years in the Murraylands

The Flaming Sambucas, a band beloved by many in the Murraylands, recently celebrated their 33 year milestone with a spectacular tribute show featuring the timeless hits of ABBA at the Murray Bridge Performing Arts and Function Centre, Saturday, November 9, 2024.

Formed in 1991, the group has continued to ignite the passion for live music across Australia and beyond, capturing the hearts of audiences both young and old. The band's ability to transport their audience back to the golden eras of the 60s, 70s, and 80s has made them a fixture in the local music scene. As the band looks ahead, they hope to return to Tailem Bend with another unforgettable show. Terry Nicholls, a founding member of the Flaming Sambucas, reflects on the band's journey and the legacy they've built.

"We formed the Flaming Sambucas back in 1991, 33 years ago, and have been performing our ABBA Gold Show since 1995," he shares. "That's nearly 30 years of performing those iconic songs.""We started playing music that we knew would resonate with the crowd that was supporting the live music scene at the time, and it just so happened that it was the music we loved and grew up with." As the years went on, Nicholls and the band realised that the music of the 60s, 70s, and 80s transcended generations.

"These songs are ageless," Nicholls adds. "At one point, we had a repertoire of 600 songs. Our main goal has always been to share music that brings people joy, and once we saw that we were doing that, we knew we could make a career out of it." For Nicholls, the band's passion for music has evolved into something deeper—a recognition of the profound impact music has on people.

"The real drive for me is seeing how music connects with people. It brings them back to important moments in their lives, and to see how much joy it brings them is incredibly rewarding." The Flaming Sambucas decision to perform ABBA's music was a natural fit. "ABBA had two female singers and two male instrumentalists, which matched our lineup perfectly," Nicholls explains. "But more than that, their music, full of messages of love and kindness, aligns with what we want to share with the world."

Over the years, the Flaming Sambucas have not only entertained audiences across Australia but also brought their music to international stages. "Our overseas trips hold a special place in our hearts," Nicholls recalls. "We've played on Australian chartered cruise ships, including one of the first to dock in Phuket after the Boxing Day tsunami in 2005. We've also performed from Los Angeles to Acapulco in Mexico with 2,000 Aussies on board. In fact, all of our international shows have been for Australians in exotic locations, and it's always been such a warm, welcoming experience."

Despite their international success, the band stays committed to performing in rural areas across Australia. "We've played everywhere, from mines in Western Australia to Birdsville and Alice Springs," Nicholls says. "We love playing in rural areas because of the kindness and enthusiasm of the people who invite us into their communities."

Stephen Lee, The Flaming Sambucas' promoter, echoes Nicholls' sentiments about the power of live music. "There's nothing like seeing the joy on people's faces during a live show," Lee shares. "Music brings out every emotion—happiness, nostalgia, even sadness—and The Flaming Sambucas do an incredible job of connecting with their audience." Lee emphasizes the strong connection the band has with its fans. "Terry is a master at engaging with the crowd and taking them back to the special moments in their lives," he says. "Their shows always sell out, and the feedback we get is overwhelmingly positive. We're so thankful for the music and the stories of ABBA and Elton John that they bring to life."

Looking to the future, Nicholls hopes that the band's performances continue to inspire audiences. *"I hope that through our music, people feel joy, peace, and love,"* he says. *"We've been so lucky to play a role in making people smile, laugh, and come together through music. Music will always connect us and unite us, and I hope it inspires young people to keep the tradition alive."*

As the Flaming Sambucas enter their next chapter, one thing is certain their music will continue to bring people together, spreading love, joy, and nostalgia with every performance.



COUNCIL SNAPSHOT

We took a moment to acknowledge the passing of Malcolm Piggot, a dedicated community leader from the former District Council of Peake. Malcolm was a passionate advocate for his community, playing a key role in beautification projects in both Peake and Tailem Bend. During the meeting, we elected a new Deputy Mayor. It was unanimously agreed that the tenure would extend until the end of the current term, with Cr. Jonathan Pietzsch from Tintinara appointed to the role. We extend our sincere thanks to outgoing Deputy Mayor Cr. Arthur for his active involvement in various activities over the past six years. I raised a question about maintaining the Coonalpyn Pool's water temperature, but the response was unclear, so I'll follow up. On a positive note, it was acknowledged that the pool blankets need replacing. The Pool Committee was informed by Council that a second person is now required to assist the lifeguard during morning swim sessions. We've asked Council to explore options that avoid needing additional volunteers, such as assigning the Coonalpyn/ Tintinara Services Crew to work nearby, funding an extra lifeguard for two hours each morning, or equipping lifeguards with Medi-Alert bracelets for emergency alarms.

Following a workshop to assess Community Grant applications, Elected Members approved funding for

Five projects:

Tailem Bend Community Centre: \$5,000 Tailem Bend Netball Club: \$5,000 Meningie Progress Association: \$3,585 Tintinara Golf Club: \$5,000 Keith Shooting Club (their land sits within the Coorong Council boundary): \$4,950

Six submissions were received, requesting \$28,535 to support over \$56,655 in community projects and activities. One submission was not approved. A 3-year funding agreement was agreed to between the Council and the Coonalpyn Community Hub to support operational costs and activities for Coonalpyn and surrounding communities. We agreed to allocate \$8K from the 2024/25 budget to "drought support activities" to support gatherings aimed at bringing people together to talk about the season and its effect, not just on farmers, but communities as well. The Coorong region has now recorded the second driest year in 100 years. In October 15-20mm was received across most the district which provided some respite; however, this additional soil moisture will be running out very soon. The Mayor, Cr Pietzsch and I had the pleasure of attending the "Up-The-Shed Mallee Farmers BBQ" organised by Emily & Daniel Morgan on their farm in Jabuk. Around 180 farmers and their families came together for a free feed and to share the burden of this year's dry season.

The Aussie Hay Run saw over \$180K worth of hay and other goods, donated to struggling farmers in the Murray Mallee Region. Pat on the back to the Tailem Bend Lions Club for serving over 60 meals to the truck drivers. Council financially assisted with some money for food and other items. In August 2024, Council resolved to explore alternate options to improve safety on Tynan Road and Kulkawurra Road where they intersect with the Mallee Highway, focusing on low-cost and a short timeframe. A design has now been received from The Dept. for Infrastructure & Transport (DIT) that will see raised sealed audible rumble strips, improved traffic control signage and improved line marking installed.

The EM's ratified the election of office bearers to the Section 41 Committee, Coonalpyn & Districts Soldiers Memorial Swimming Pool and Caravan Park. Chair: Vicki Jacobs; V/Chair: Marcia Camac; Sec: Karen Schmerl; Treasurer: Cass Lutze; Canteen Manager: Chris Bishop, Roster Coordinator: Vicki Jacobs; Carnival Coordinator: Katie Dow. Thank you to these ladies and the Committee for all that they do.


